Dear Mr. Abraham,

Yours of the 19th inst, thanks. Regarding your query I have to let you know that our school had been in administrative turmoil during the last few years. We have just straightened the matter and all our arrangement is new at present. The old headmaster is no more in the school now, and his registers are being handed ax over to the new officers.

In 1941 and part of 1942 we had more than 100 boys at the Hostel. This I say for we received the Government grant for the hostel on the basis of 100 boys.

At present we have a mess and not a hostel, owing to the requisition of our School buildings by Government. The boys manage their own feeding.

There is no printed rule for the hostel. I am sorry I cannot supply you now, anything in print.

The General Manager Tata Iron and Steel Works Jamshedpur.

The Lutheran Parish Committee Jamshedpur, through their Secretary Mr.P.D.Kandulna B.A., Assit. Land Officer Jamshedput approached me with a request that Imight take steps to make arrangement for a Lutheran Colony within the Company's jurisdiction, as has been done for the Anglicans and possibly for the Roman Catholics.

I can not say what has been done for the Anglicans and the Roman Catholics to group them together by themselves, but I can see several grounds why the Lutheran Christians may be granted a special locality within the Company's jurisdiction, to make their homes. The following may be mentioned among other reasons:

There is alarge Lutheran Christian Community in the service (4) of the Company, now settled at Sonari and Mohulbera within the Company's jurisdiction, besides many Lutheran Christians living outside the Company's area, though in the service of the Company.

The Lutheran Christians are converts from the Mundas, Uraons, Santals and Hos in whose homelands the Tata Works are situated. They have their own culture, customs and manners carefully preserved for generations and they would like to preserve them among the internatio-

nal inter-racial, modernistic society of Jamshedpur.

(c) The Lutheran Church is a large body consisting of over 150,000 members spread over five provinces viz, Bihar, Orrissa, Central provinces, Bengal and Assam. This is the largest protestant Church of Bihar and Orissa, and there will be a constant flow of the members of this Church into Jamshedpur which they consider as belonging to their own home.

For Church distipline, Sunday Service, schooling and other (d) religious and social advantages, it is better that they live together in one locality. A well disciplined life of the workers will be an asset

to the Company.

The people of Mohulbera have to evacuate by Company's order (e) and the Lutheran Christians of Mohulbera can be shifted to such locality as the Anglican Christians of Mohulbera are being moved to the Anglican colony.

I would like to know at an early date, if the Company is prepared to grant an area for L utheran Colony. If so, I would like to have an interview with you and present a plan for such colony.



In connection with the Provident Fund of my father, Exk

That the money from the Provident fund of my father was withdrawn by the Headmaster, Gossner High School, on 6-5-42. My mother who is the nomonee of my father was then at Kanke for medical tractment. As I had a great need of money the Head Master advanced me and sum of Rs 100/- from the Provident Fund money of my father. Aftre my mother's return from Sanke I informed the Headmaster of her return and asked him to hand over the money to my mother. He told me that he would come to my place and give away the money to my mother. But to my great disappointment he never turned up. After that I daily used to go to him for money. He would sometimes tell me to take the part of the amount for the maintenance of the family. I was really very sorry to hear him telling me that he had spent a part of the amount in the payment of coolies. The condition of mother was going from bad to worse and so my uncle Philemon Lakra obtained a letter from It. Col. C.B. Hill. In that letter to the Head Master, so far as I remember, Mr Hill wrote that as the nominee was insane and/ was not able to sign so her son Remon Khalkho might be made to sign for her. Mr. Hill did not write as Mr. Tirkey wrote to the Inspector of Schools, that the money must not be given to the nominee. It was riday night (7th June) when my mother expired and on that day seeing the worst condition of my mother I again went to the Hd. Master and told him about the serious condition of my mother. I also prayed for the payment of the money. He then assured me saying that, as the secretary of the Managing Committee he could give the that, as the secretary of the Managing Committee he could give the money to me. But now I am put in the greatest difficulty when the Inspector of Schools requires a Succession Certificate from me in order that I may get the Provident Sund money of my father. The obtaining of the Succession Certificate will take a long time besides heavy expenses.

I, therefore request you to be so good to me as to make arrangements for the earlier payment of the money, for which act of I shall be very thankful to you.

- " President's matters :-
- (1) Pracharak Santosh Guria of Kemedi's T.A.Bill dated 4-8-1943 :- This Pracharak has been Sent from Tujur to Kumdi which is a new field for Evangelisation and hence he submits T.A. Bill :The Bill was handed over to the C.C. Treasurer for checking and payment.
- request. (2) Rev.C.K. Vengra's letter dated 1943 for a communion flagon for Takarma Parish :- The Communion flagon is generally purchased by the Ilaka and not by the Church Council. The lis therefore directed to purchase it out of the Ilaka funds. The Pastor
- (3) Mr.D.M.Panna's letter dated 26-8-1943 for Christian Literature :- Postponed for the full Church Council.
- Rev. Nainsukh Tirkey's letter dated 18-8-1943 regarding Kahupani Case :- The matter has already been postponed to the full Church Council.
- Rev. Eliazar Ekka's letter dated the 12-8-1943 regarding centralisation of all Church income in the Ilaka :- Postponed for the Enlarged Executive Church Council in which all the Gangpur State Pastors concerned are also invited.
- (6) Rev.C.B.Ekka's letter dated the 2-8-1943 regarding Pracharak Masihdas Mundu of Philingbahal :- Postponed to full Church Council or to enlarged C.C.



Thank you for your kind letter of the 17th.with the letter of Prof. Asirvadam. I have just sent the Taiyaris to the Press. Yes I am very busy, specially the case in the court and the present situ ation of the compound have added to my work. We have to give our written reply to the case on the 20th inst. On the same day there will be a hearing of the case re. injunction. We are preparing for all that. I have to write several reports which I have not yet been able to do. I have just a copple of days now. I ran this morning to the S.P. and I have arranged to get Miss Storims four boxes sent to Hazaribagh. This I asked him to do before also but the boxes have not yet been taken. I was given a promise today that they will be taken today. I must see before I can say anything more. Ilearnt from the S.P. that Mrs. Jellinghaus and Mrs. Klimkeit have been removed to some place. I understand they went yesterday passing the Ranchi Stn. by train, going probably to Bombay. I am trying my best to have a supervision over the furniture which are left in the various bungalo ws but I think it is impossible because the military people are now handling with themnfreely and the D. C. also has not yet been able to give me definite informations as to whether he has any control over them. All the furniture of your bungalow have been removed somewhere and we do not where, I wrote to the D.C. re. this but there is no reply. I have been wrging upon the S.D.O. of Furniture and Store to take charge from me of the furniture in writing but that he has not yet done. He has however been given three copies of the furniture &

I have reported the matter to the D.C.

I am glad with great attempt I managed to get the three thallars stitched within these five days and also the three ephods. Mr. Jorong Surin will take them all. Now about these ordinands I have to write that the Assam Chhoti Sabha asks us to give them work here in Chotanagpur for the time being as, to quote their own words: "Chhoti Sabha dekhti hai ki un bhaiyon ko is samay men pariwar sahit Assam men ana ati kathin hai so Chhoti Sabha Church Council ko arji karti hai ki jab tak larai band nahin hogi Chotanggpur men kam dene ki kripa karen, larai hand hone se turant Chhoti Sabha unko Assam men Prabhu ka kam ke liye bulawegi. I beg most revently to bring to your notice that widow Daya Talani Tiru the wife of Late Rev . Annadmasih Tiru of Jurdag was under our shelter and support from 1939 . The sought our shelter as a refugee, having fled from homen due to her own mia- conduct (a- told by Daud Tiru of Jurdag) . We however give her shelter hoping that she would repent and would earn her honeat living . 30 she was appointed as a assistant to the Midwife Mrs. Esther Dadel (My sister-in-law) the Midwife of Doranda Notified area Committee. After serving for about a year she fled away from here and for some months she was not heard of . Later we found her living at the Sadar Hospital with Mary Soy (a nurse) During that time she was found to be prostituting . Especially the was found to be prostituting with Dukhia (a man serving in the Bangalow of Mrs. Cloette). She became in-famous as a adulterer in Doranda and Kanchi town .

In July 1941 she again sought refuge under us at Doranda and we hoping to reform her gave her shelter . But here too whe was found to be absent absent during night pretending to attend maternity cases. But then she was found by us to be gangx going to Dukhia (a servant of Mrs.Cloette), and we rebuked her much and she promised to live honestly : But after come days again she went to live with Dukhia and this time she carried her daughter too. After some time we heard that she was appointed at the Sadar Hospital as an officiating midwife, but from there also she was turned out due to her miscunduct . She

again sought our shelter and we forging her past conduct gave her shelter but again we found her to be going to Bukhia .

The matter was brought to a crisic when on Tuesday the 9th December 1941, Dukhia came to our quarter for a nurse pretending that he has delivery case at his home. Talani came out to meet him and the man caught her by the waist and began to merk carry her to Mrs. Cloette's Banglow. I tried my best to save her from their hand but they were two and alone as I was I could do nothing Then I called the help of police from Kothwali to free her from his hand. By the time they took away the woman to the bangalow and we visited the bangalow. The two polices which accompanied me refused to search inside the bangalow. The Dukhia was there with his friend and was dead drunk, but Telani was hided by them. In the morning I expected her to return a to us but she did not returne and this shows that she is in agreable term with Dukhia.

Jesus Christ. Our pleading, our prayer, our advice, our threatening, and our scoldingto her proved vain in our effort to reform her.

I hope you would be kind enough to take proper action immediately, to guide that woman to the right path Her case presents a very wicked picture and that she should be punished according to Church Laws. The evidence against her can be given by Mr. Daud Tiru of Jurdag, the mothers of Sadar Hospital and by us.

BIG LAND FORCE MOVE

Extensive Japanese Activity In Salamaua & Lae

TWO KILLED IN DARWIN RAID

No Contact With Australian Defending Forces

LONDON, Mar. 20.

COMMUNIQUE released by the Prime Minister Mr. Curtin states: Japanese activity in the Salamaua and Lae area

is extensive but no clash is reported.

Details of the Darwin raid on the afternoon of March 19th are two killed, one seriously injured and 6 or 7 slightly wounded. The Japanese were over Port Moresby twice on March 19. There was a further raid on the Solomons on March 19 but no substantial damage was done and there were no casualties."

JAPANESE RAID

Port Moresby was raided this morning (Thursday) by Japanese heavy bombers. A communique issued by the Australian Prime Minister, Mr. Curtin, states that the raid lasted about half an hour and was directed against the harbour installations and shipping. About forty bombs were dropped in three runs.

The Japanese were greatly hampered by anti-aircraft fire. Neither casualties nor damage was reported. After the first run one enemy bomber broke formation and ceased to attack.

CONTACT WITH THE CHINESE

A Burma Army Hadquarters communique says:—During the withdrawal of our forward troops on 15th March from operations in the Shwegin area our patrols first contacted the enemy south of Kyauktaga and was followed up. On March 16 the enemy launched an attack on the left flank of our most forward troops as reported yesterday. The attack was beaten off and the withdrawal proceeded.

From reports received from an A. V. G. pilot it is apparent that Bilin and Sittong bridges have not yet been repaired.

ALLIED RAIDS ON MOULMEIN

The Moulmein aerodrome and Satelite landing grounds were attacked yesterday by our aircraft and an approximate figure of 25 enemy aircraft are believed to have been destroyed.

Nine Japanese planes were set on fire and other aircraft on

the ground were machinegunned.

Fifteen Japanese aircraft on the Moulmein aerodrome and on an auxiliary airfield to the south of that city were set ablaze by an attack from two planes of the American volunteer group, states a despatch received in Chungking. Several other stationary machines were riddled by machine gun bullets in subsequent attacks, adds the dispatch.

17th the American Army heavy bombers raided the Japanese held air port of Koepang on the island of Timor scoring several hits on runways and damaging installations.

PLAN OF "BACKDOOR" ATTACK

Japanese troops have begun their advance on Port Moresby, the capital of New Guinea. From their invasion base at Lae their forces are marching up the Markham Valley, 200 miles northwest of Moresby. No contact has yet been made with the Australian defending forces, according to the latest reports from the capital. One of the first objectives of the One of the first objectives of the enemy is believed to be the establishment of inland air bases.

Meanwhile Moresby was again raided this morning (Thursday). The attack, which lasted only half an hour, was directed at harbour installations and shipping, but no damage or casualties have been reported said a communique. Port Darwin on the north coast of the Australian continent was also raided. There were two attacks, but here the Japanese sought out residential areas. Casualties were slight but property was da-maged. One twin engined raider is believed to have been shot down.

Allied bombers have continued their attacks on enemy shipping on occupied harbours. At Rabaul (New Britain) yesterday (Wednesday) a direct hit was scored on the stern of a heavy cruiser and smoke was seen rising from her. Near misses were scored on two other large vessels, which were damaged. Another bomber force raided Japanese air bases at Keepang in Dutch Timor, hitting run ways and buildings and starting fires which pilots could still see for 50 miles on the way back.

Mr. Curtin, the Australian Prime Minister, to-day confirmed the Japa-nese naval and air losses announced from Washington yesterday, and said that they represented the total results of a series of actions during the

past ten days.

A large force of Japanese are now advancing through Markham valley to-wards the interior of New Guinea from their landing point at Lae. It is believed they will soon be in contact with Australian troops who are reported to include a volunteer rifle unit recruited The Japanese advance from civilians. does not yet constitute a direct threat to Port Moresby by overland infiltra-tion but seems to be the start of an attempt to make a "backdoor" attack. Japanese are probably aiming in the first place at a large area of flat country suitable for aerodromes.

LUTHERANS CO-OPERATE JAPANESE

German Lutheran missionaries established for years in New Guinea are co-operating with the Japanese invaders. Australian troops who recently swooped on a number of their mis sions found remains of radio trans-mitters which had been hastily destogether with hundreds Swastika flags made in the local Lu-theran factory. The missionaries had also secretly prepared excellent land-ing grounds in readiness for use by Japanese airmen. At the outbreak of the war one missionary who was a German airace in the last war donned the Luftwaffe uniform, boarded a private aircraft and flew from Alexishafen towards the Japanese occupied Caroline Islands. Children of the local people were taught by Utherans to give the Nazi salute and sing the horstwesel song. These children are now acting as guides for the Japanese. Some observers here suggest that their activities provide a grim

"I have just returned from meeting General Mac-Arthur", Hurley said. "He breathes the very spirit of victory. His para-mount purpose is to organise an offensive force for the defeat of the Japanese as rapidly as possible. He wants to relieve his beleagured Philippine garrison and especially so as he is still in command of the Philippines situation. He has the utmost confidence that he will again be back on Filipino

General MacArthur's plans naturally cannot be disclosed, Hurley said and added that they are already in operation. "MacArthur approaches his task with that efficient aggressiveness which has characterised his whole brilliant career. He looks in splendid health"

The Australian Navy's indentity will not be lost as the result of the new plan establishing the supreme command states the Navy Minister Mr. Makin: Although no decision has yet been made it was logical to expect, he said, that the services of experienced Australians would be fully utilised in their respective commands.

A CONSPIRACY OF SILENCE

FULL STORY OF LOSS OF RANGOON

MAYMYO, Mar. 18. From "A. P." special correspondent.

After a lull for just oevr a week a Japanese offensive northward is now under way. Beneath the blistering tropical sun with tanks armoured cars too hot to touch to the naked hand in a countryside of dusty and dried-up paddy-fields, the Battle for Burma has opened.

Our forces now positioned for defence await the Japanese as-sault. The main Japanese thrust is presently up the road to Man-dalay, the former "Burma Road", with Toungoo as the immediate objective. The fact that only our forward troops are at present troops are at present contacting the Japanese forces at Kanyutkwin, which is barely 40 miles from Toungoo, shows that our main forces have withdrawn further north and that the Japanese have been allowed to advance miles from the Shewegwin area with little opposition.

On the Prome Road sector, now officially known as the Irrawaddy Front, Japanese activity on the river presages with Prome parallel push as immediate objective and the Irrawaddy oilfields, 125 miles further north, as a subsequent objective.

Already the Japanese using boats have sailed up the Irrawaddy river as far a point as 20 miles north of the Tharrawaddy. This point is just south of Monyo on the river where they have contacted traitor Burmans pre-sumably with the object of securing their assistance for future infiltration tactics on our flanks. On the front, however, the Japanese are still evidently making only preliminary moves securing all the local support they can since the main forces are still some 45 miles southwards of Tharrawaddy and probably have some 60 miles to go before forces. meeting our own main

It seems certain that the Japanese endeavour to exploit the Irrawaddy River to the utmost using boats seized further down the river in the occupied territory. There are considerable qui There are considerable quanhundred men each. Landing by night these small forces will be used operating between the river and the Prome

While the opening moves of the battle, now about to be fought, tend to focus attention primarily on fronts, the Irrawaddy and Toungoo, the vital jungle country known as the vital jungle country known as "Yomas" separating them must not be overlooked, for it is in this wild littleknown area that the favourite Japan-ese encircling movements may be expected to be attempted.

Assisted by traitor Burmans, who know every inch of the country, they undoubtedly will exploit its potentia-

lities as much as possible.There has yet been no major clasm in Burma, it was authoritatively revealed in London to-day (Thursday). The situation there remains much the same with the Japanese probing and feeling their way forward.

The full story has now been told of the successful break-away of our forces from Rangoon. The Japanese, (See Page 6)

LONDON, Mar. 19.

There is no evidence of fifth columnist activities among Burmese political parties other than among the members of the Thakin Party, stated the Secretary of States for India and Burma Mr. Amery in the Commons on Thursday. The Thakin Party, he further stated, was proscribed last January by the Burmese Minister for Home Affairs on account of its fifth columnist acti-

Replying to the labourite Mr. Sorensen Mr. Amery agreed that the pre-sent Coalition Ministry in Burma is mostly composed of ministers who served under U Saw but added, "there is no reason to attribute the delinquen-cies of U Saw to his colleagues."

BURMA ORDER

The Commons to-day (Thursday) approved the Government of Burma order dealing with the Shan States Federal fund. Mr. Amery explained that the object was to extend for two years the arrangements governing the pro-vision of finance for the partly auto-nomous federated Shan States of Burma as well as the financial relation to the Government of Burma itself pending a permanent scheme governing the relations of the Shan States to the Government of Burma.

The Labourife, Mr. Sorensen asked if the Burmese Legislature had been consulted.

Mr. Amery replied, "I am advised, that the Minister in charge of finance in the Burmese Ministry has entirely approved of this order."—(Reuter).

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Fierce Fighting On Leningrad Front

HEAVY NAZI LOSSES

Reds Liberate More Villages

LONDON, Mar. 19.

Fierce fighting is continuing on several sectors of the Leningrad front, states the Leningrad radio. The Germans are making desperate but unsuccessful efforts to break through the Soviet lines. They are throwing in units of automatic riflemen in several areas in vain to attempt to relieve Soviet pressure. Despite this one Soviet unit has made considerable advance in one area and has captured a great deal of valuable war material. The Germans sustained heavy losses. ENEMY SHIP SUNK

The Soviet mid-day communique states: "During March 18 no material change took place at the front. Our warships sank an enemy transport of 3,500 tons in the Barnets Sea".

GERMANS DRIVEN OFF

Russian infantry units on the western front (Smolensk front) have driven the Germans from two more villages after severe fighting. 120 enemy dead were left on the field of battle, while Soviet troops destroyed two guns, eight mortars, six machineguns and two munitions dumps states a supplement to the Soviet communique issued on Thursday noon. The captured war material includes eight guns, seven mortars, twelve machineguns, a supply dump of mines and ten carloads of supplies. Some prisoners were also taken, according to the report.

ANOTHER RED SUCCESS

In the Rzhev-Vyasma sector, another strongly fortified point has been captured by Soviet troops, the report continues. The Russian forces killed 400 German officers and men in this engagement and captured 22 machineguns, two mortars, two wireless transmitters and many rifles.

On this front, in a fighting for two villages in another sector, Russian units captured eighty guns of various calibres, 126 motor vehicles, four omnibuses, one armoured car and four tractors with tenders. Two German troopcarrying aircraft were shot down by machinegun fire, according to a Moscow report.

"PSYCHIC" ATTACK

In an attempt to penetrate one Russian position, the Germans undertook a psychic attack, says the report. "Drunken German soldiers marching erect began to advance past our lines Soviet men allowed the enemy approach within a short range and opened withering fire. The Germans fled in disorder leaving over 400 dead and wounded on the battlefield."

ANTI-JAPANESE RIOTS

Tokyo's Protest To Brazilian Govt.

TOKYO, Mar. 19.

Japan has protested to the Brazilian Government against recent anti-Japanese riots and the presidential decree confiscating Axis assets. The Japanese Government warns Brazil that she will be held responsible "for any developments likely to arise."

According to an informal statement issued by the Foreign Office the protest characterised the Brazilian Decree which was issued in retaliation for the recent sinking of Brazilian vessels in the Atlantic alleged to have been by Japanese aircraft as "extremely improper".

It called attention to the fact that it took effect without any previous The protest also stated that warning. the treatment of Brazilian nationals in Japan had been both fair and just and reminded Brazil of the contributions made to its industry by the Japanese in the past. Regret is expressed that "law-abiding peaceful Japanese nationals in Brazil have been thus rewarded for their services."

obsessed with the desire for loot, could not have found in the city much of military value; our demolition plans were quickly and thoroughly enforced, says a press note.

Towards the last days of the battle for Rangoon, part of our forces were holding Pegu in the face of heavy enemy pressure from the north and northeast. An attack against the Japanese, though successful, did not improve the situation; in fact, the enemy pressure became more severe. At the same time enemy parties were trekking across the jungle between the Pegu-Toungoo Road and the other main road north of Rangoon to Prome. On March 6 a counteroffensive was launched to reduce the pressure; but in the meantime the enemy had worked their way round to the west and southwest by means of encircling movements. Thus our troops, returning from the attack, found themselves hemmed in and faced with an attack from the west. This was successfully repulsed; but our men were surrounded and the situation looked

LANDING IN RANGOON

To make matters worse, the Japanese were carrying out landings south of Rangoon in the Rangoon and China Bakir rivers. It was during these landings that H. M. I. S. "Hindustan" captured a boat containing a Japanese officer and 55 traitor Burmans. The Burmans, obviously misguided free-booters in search of adventure or plunder, put up no opposition to their capture, to the great and outspoken disgust of their Japanese leader.

With the dangerous situation brought about by the Japanese landings in the south, the isolation of the Pegu force and the enemy infiltration westward to the Prome Road, it was decided to withdraw our forces from Rangoon to prevent their being surrounded or split up into lone centres of resistance.

DEMOLITION

The demolition order was given at 2 P.M. on March 7 and the work took five hours to complete. Included in the objects completely destroyed were the docks and harbour storage facilities and the oil refinery. Ships and smaller boats which could not be removed were sunk. Satisfied that the enemy was left with nothing of military value, our forces began their march along the Prome Road.

An obstacle quickly presented itself. Twenty-five miles from Rangoon, the Japanese had built a road block, covered by anti-tank guns, and this they strongly held. It was necessary to clear the enemy from this area to make a passage for our vehicle columns.

FIGHTING IN JUNGLE

A strong air attack was put in at 3 P.M. followed by an attack on the road block by a regiment of British tanks, supported by a battalion of the Gloucestershire Regiment. Heavy fighting took place in this jungle, with the enemy holding a very strong position. Although two companies of the 12th Frontier Force Regiment went up to assist the Gloucesters, we did not have

CORRUPTION AMONG GERMANS

Report on demoralisation and corruption in the German army was given at the first conference of German nonwho are pricommissioned officers soners of war in Russia.

It was revealed in Moscow to-day (Thursday). The conference was held at the end of February and attended by 190 delegates representing all the services in the Nazi army. The conference adopted an appeal to the German army and people which confirms the facts enumerated in M. Molotov's note on the German treatment of Soviet war prisoners. The delegates testify to have seen with their own eyes many monstrous crimes similar to those described by M. Molotov.

On the Smolensk front Soviet troops have retaken several more villages which had been strongly fortified by the enemy, states the Moscow radio. Fighting was fierce and the villages were stormed under a hurricane of Nazi fire. On the south-western front the Soviet airforce has scored new successes in air combats and groundbombing, added the announcer.

During two days the Soviet units in various sectors of the operating Leningrad front killed over 2500 German officers and men, says a supplement to the midnight Soviet communique. It also records the capture of vast quantities of war material. One unit on the south-western front occupied three inhabited points after fierce fighting. The supplement also mentions a schoolboy hero, Peter Neftenenwho under machinegun and mortar fire in three days brought away from the battlefield 14 red army men with their rifles.

NEW OIL FOUNTAIN

A powerful new fountain of high quality oil has been struck in one of the oilfields of Kirovneft states a message from Baku to the Tass agency. This is the first fountain struck on the recently prospected oilbearing area, which extends over a considerable territory and contains large reserves of oil.

GREAT FIRE IN KHARKOV

It is not clear whether he had yet retreatted, though it is becoming daily more obvious that Kharkov is only one of the many points where Hitler has met with what almost amounts to a disaster since he took over from Field Marshal Von Brauchitsch just before Christmas.

The plight of the German armies has reached such a pass that Hitler is preparing to recall Brauchitsch as Generalissimo in charge of all opera-tions. With this end in view foreign correspondents in Berlin were yesterday shown a newsreel depicting the Fuehrer with Brauchitsch and other Field Marshals and Rommel at the eastern front headquarters. Hitler has readymade excuses for recalling his former Commander-in-Chief, since it can be said that the latter has recovered from his illness and the Fuehrer has seen his armies through the difficult winter period.

NEW GUINEA-FOCAL POINT OF WAR

LONDON, Mar. 17.

Port Moresby correspondents declare (cables the "Daily Telegraph's" Sydney correspondent) that it now seems clear that the Japanese drive against Australia is coming by way of New Guinea, with the object of by-passing and outflanking Darwin.

The Japanese know that the conquest of Darwin would only be the prelude to a terrific battle through hundreds of miles of waterless desert, but the conquest of New Guinea would place the watered, fertile and industrially rich eastern seaboard of Australia at their mercy.

The strategic importance of Darwin, it is declared, has been largely nullified by the invasion of Java, but the importance of New Guinea has been correspondingly increased.

Japan is said to be denuding China of troops, which are being embarked for Burma and Australia.

The United States, it is reported, is taking a naval offensive with a fleet of submarines as the spearhead of the attack.

The increasing air activity and continued Allied attempts to break up the Japanese forces in the New Guinea area are a clear indication that this region is becoming the focal point of the South Pacific war.

BEGINNING OF THE END

"When the Japanese attack Australia and New Zealand that will be the beginning of the end of Japan" clared the Australian Minister, Mr. Evatt, who is 'en route' for Washing-

Praising the appointment of General MacArthur, Mr. Evatt emphasised the need for supplies. "There has been much talk of offensive but the Australians in the war have done nothing but take the offensive. To succeed we must have supplies and equipment which I know we will get ".

PORT MORESBY RAIDED

An official communique issued by the Prime Minister, Mr. Curtin states: "Japanese aircraft reconnoitred Port Moresby twice during Thursday. During the raid on Thursday morning 4 runs were made over the target. Aircraft fire. Waves of attacking aircraft were forced to operate at 20,000 to 23,000 feet. Despite this one bomber was hit on the first run and apparently failed to reach its base. There was no serious damage and no casualties were caused.

A further raid is reported on the Solomon Islands area. No substantial damage and no casualties. Our aircraft and those of the enemy are continuing extensive reconnaissance in New Guinea and the Papua area".

on the spit sufficient infantry to carry out any encircling movements. When night fell, the Japanese still held the block, but the Gloucesters and "piffers" were in close contact.

Meanwhile our force at Pegu decided to break out southwards. It was not possible to remove all the transport, but none fell into the enemy's hands; what had to be left was destroyed. Following a completely successful attack. our force broke through to the south, inflicting heavy casualties on the enemy, and rejoined their comrades on the Prome Road.

The following morning, March 8, reinforcements enabled us to make another attempt to smash the block on the Prome Road. The action succeeded, but owing to the strength of the enemy, it was found necessary to picket the road before the transport could get moving. Later that day the rearguard started back towards Tharra-

Simultaneously with this battle; another "action" was taking place some two miles to the west. Unperturbed by the escape into safety of our troops, large numbers of the Japanese were moving south along a parallel road, to get what they could of the plunder in Rangoon.

In an endless stream they rolled on, intent on loot, and took no part in the fighting. Our troops were thus able to get away in comparative comfort. They have since had a well-earned breathing space and have made use of the opportunity to organise and concentrate

During the battle on the Prome Road, our men, both British and Indian, fought splendidly, and gave the Japanese a foretaste of what the enemy will shortly be up against. General Alexander, the new G.O.C. Burma, has spoken highly of their good work .- (A. P.)

CHINESE & JAPANESE

FIGHTING AT FOUR POINTS Fighting between the Chinese and the Japanese has taken place at points along the Thailand frontier, according to a Chinese spokesman here. The Japa nese made several attempts to cross the frontier and invade Burma, but the Chinese repulsed all attacks.

This fighting occurred north west of Chengsen, west of Chien mai and northwest of Meihang, where the main Japanese forces are apparently concentrated with the intention of threatening the allied flank east of Toungoo.

- 2. The Executive Committee : It is clear that the Executive Committee cannot meet so often as it was possible thus far. Work is suffering and will suffer unless precautionary steps are taken. The Executive Committee could be so formed or sp located that the meetings be held without difficulty.
- 3. The High School : Since the last meeting of the Full Council many developments have taken place and the F.C.C. should review the situation and give directions to the Exec.
- 4. Work of the missionaries: It should be seen to which extent the President and the two Miss Sahibs can do their work. Is there any necessity of transering their work to Indian hands,? either in full or in part ?
- 5. Headquarters of the Church Council: It is very likely that Ranchi will have to be evacuated, if so should the office of the Church Council be removed to some outstationand where ? If the Secretariat has to be at Ranchi, where must the Secretary's family live ?

Lakez has been co-opted as a voting member of the Executive Cee. antil the next M.S. He will go to Gavindpur after Easter but he will come for the meetings. Ordinarily meetings will be held on Fridays which he thinks will suit him best.

The B.C.C.Exec. meets on the 7th. April. They can do this it seems. When the Mahasabha has passed it, it will be seen how to proceed next.

Dear Sirs,

I am sorry we are holding the Full Council meetings these da days without you. We feel your absence very much. I thought I should give you a brief report of the actions of the Church Council as far as they have been taken until now. We hope to be through with the Agenda tomorrow. Rev. Lakra could be present with us yesterday. Before that he could not be present as he was not well. We had one session on Thursday with him at his own place. Mr. Soy could not be present on account of weakness. We had one session with him at his own place on Friday morning. I request you to kindly take actions on these decisions in which you are concerned.

Item No. 1. Mahasabha :- The Mahasabha will be held from the 27th of April at Burju. The Agenda remains the same. The Ministerium and the Church Council meetings will be held before the Mahasabha as in Agenda.

Items 3, 35 & 46. Work of the Missionaries: Noted that Miss Diller and Schmidt handed over the work of the Biblewomen in the hand of the Head Pracharika Miss Santoshi Horo. Miss Horo will be paid Rs. 15/- p. m. from March, 1942. When she is on tour she will get a daily allowance of Rs. -/6/- on actual demand. She will submit her Bills to the Secretary who will pass the same and send them to the Treasurer for payment as it is in the case of the Church Supervisor. Miss Horo's headquarters should be at Govindpur. The Ibaka Chairman was asked at the meeting to give her suitable accommodations there which he agreed. The Head Pracharika should be given a permanent advance of Rs. 10/- adjustable at the end of every month.

Item No. 10. Seminary: Those who have come from Assam should be examined locally by the President and the Principal. They should, if found suitable, ordained at Govindpur by the President on the last Sunday of April.

Item 12. Bethesda School: - After the Summer vacation the school should reopen at Govindpur unless the situation changes.

Item 13. Takarma Ilaka 's request for a High School: The Ilaka has been informed the Church Council has asked the Govt. to allow the Gossner High School to be shifted to Takarma for the War time. As reagrds the present Class VIII of Takrama the Council decided to allow them to hold the class in one of the rooms of the small bungalow there. Consent of the Senior missionary is prayed for.

Item 14. Advances to the teachers of the G.H.B. The Treesurer is requested to remind those who have not refunded.

Item 15. Tokad school: The Church Council is prepared to pay Rs. 25/-p.m. in cash and otherwise Rs. 25/- p.m. total Rs. 50/- p.m.

Item 16. Letter from Khutitoly Ilaka re. their school: The Headsupervisor is requested to find out how much the Ilaka is prepared to spend for this school (initial and recurring) and how much the Govt. grant may be given to the school to be found out from some Govt. officers. What can the Simdega S.D.O.do in this connection.

Item 17. Application of Pt. D. Toppo for advance : The C.C. is unable to pay.

Item 23. Case brought by Mr. Tirkey: The Full C.C. approves all the actions of the Exec. Cee and resolves that defence should be taken up as best as possible. Mr. Tirkey has now included Rev. U.E. Kujur, Messre. C.M. Tiga nd M. Khess on the list of the defendants.

Item 26. Lohardaga Ilaka: Until further orders only two pasters should be there to be in charge of the congregations.

Item 27. Singahni Grant: This should be continued until further considerations.

Item 31 Grent for Precharek Martin Rose : No.

Item 32. Yunas Soy: Noted that the President has written to the Anglican Bishop and Bu. Yunas Soy that all obstacles are over. He should come to the Lutheran pastor for his needs, and they will be attended to.

Item 33. Koronic Troubles: Since the pastor and the Headmaster both have been transferred there is no need of the Commission's going there. The Commission (Rev. L.J.and Mr. D.M.P.O is withdrawn.)

Itam 35. Letter from Diller D/-22.3.42: Sanctioned Rs. 30/- for a Bible Course for 15 days. The Miss Sahibs are r requested to run the class for 15 days because as 10 days is considered too short a period.

Item 36. Letter from the Assam Chhoti Sabha: As the Headmaster has been already appointed he should be paid Rs. 40/-p.m. The Treas. should send for March salary to the Secy. of the Chh. Sabha. In case it is reported that the school will be working in future the same should be done as long as the school will run. If the school is closed for war conditions he must not be paid.

Item 37. Gumla Pakartoly case: No word from Gumla Ilaka about this case since the reply was sent and thus the case is now considered to have ended.

Item 45. Pastor for Singhani for Good Friday & Easter: As Rev. H. Topno goes to Fatna, Rev. Isaac Ekka was requested to go to Singhani. He agreed.

Item 47. Reserve Fund: All those Ilakas which have not yet given any contribution to this Fund should be reminded.

Item 52. Babu Jaimasih Ekka's Magazine. Pleader's advice should be invited.

Item 55. Takarma Repairs. Sanctioned Rs. 350/- The Treasurer to take some money from the available funds as loan to the Repairs a/c- to be refunded from Rs. 1000/- which has been provided in the budget for repairs.

Item 60. Govindour Church Repair. Sanctioned Rs. 350/- to be paid as in Item 55 above.

Other Items are still under consideration. No resolutions have been arrived at.

All members are present except Messrs. C.D.Ekka and D.Tirkey and as described in Para 1 of this letter.

The vacated bungalows have not yet been formally taken charge of by the D.C. He has to be reminded and urged upon to do so. The two hostels have not been released and there is little hope of that. There is no further development except that about 400 soldiers (perhaps including coolies) have put up their tents in the compound and are residing now on the bank of the tanks. We don't know how long they will stay here.

Please excuse me for the deglay. I wanted to write to Please excuse me for the deglay. I wanted to write to you yesterday but again I was disturbed. This morning I saw the Govindpur Chaukidar and I thought I must write a word.

The Seminarists: They are gone and I hope you have begun classes. I understand the rooms which they have to use as their hostel is not yet ready, but I hope they will have it soon.

Bethesda School: The Deputy Commissioner advised us to carry on the classes here in the existing school buildings until no ordinance is out to years it Massached as asked as to get every thing needs. out to vacate it. Meanwhile he has asked us to get every thing ready at Govindpur in order to quit these buildings at a short notice. I think things are moving ahead in the line and we shall be able to move the Bethesda school to Govindpur at any short notice. The Exec. Committee of the Church Council has also accepted this arrangement.

The High School: The Deputy Commissioner again wrote to me advising me to give a holiday for a week or 10 days. He confidentially says that they are considering whether they can release the two hostels although he is not quite sure. I asked Mr. Tirkey to give a holiday, he then wanted to see the Deputy Commissioner. I took him with me to the D.C. and the D.C. repeated the same and told him that the two hostels are now in the possession of the Government and it is now illegal to be in occupation of them. Mr. Tirkey has shifted to Mr. illegal to be in occupation of them.Mr. Tirkey has shifted to Mr.
M. Bhengra's quarters and the teachers have been asked to live in a
mess somewhere.He wanted to hold classes in the teachers' quarters,
but as he did not take any consent from the Church Council, as soon
as kine some of the teachers' left their quarters I locked them and
informed Mr. Tirkey that I locked them and in case he wanted to use
them he had to apply for permission to the Church authority. He did
not do that. He is still taking classes (Roll call and then Chhuti)
near about the bostels near about the hostels. Secretariat: We have moved the Secretariat to the Binko Kumba, Kungutoly, Ranchi (Mr. M.D.Minz's house) as the D.C. wrote to me that in case the two hostels could be released by them the C.C. office could go there in one of the corners although I do not personally expect anything will take place like this. I do not hope the two hostels will be at all released. The ither Missions and aalso others are being akked to vacate their buildings. I called for a meeting for yesterday but no meeting could be held for want of quorum. Please find enclosed a copy of the agenda which we had to transact yesterday. Military officers: One Carnal Brown is coming to occupate your house. The Principal bungalow has been occupied, the Main High School Building is being repaired for an Office.
