MEMORANDUM OF THE G.E.L.CHURCH PASTORS FORUM

Respected Sir,

During the G.E.L.Church Pastors Refresher Course, about twenty(20) pastors/candidates met for an informal consultation on the 1st of April 2001 at 10.00 A.M. in Gossner Middle School premises, Ranchi. Inspired by the talks given by the teachers during the Refresher Course, the matter of exploring ways to make mission and multidimensional ministry more effective was taken up. After short deliberations it was felt that a suggestion be proposed before the ministerium meeting. Accordingly five issues were selected on priority basis and it was submitted to the Secretary of G.E.L.Church ministerim. The ministerium resolved to endorse the matter and forward it to the Central Council for consideration. But since the matters were not sufficiently discussed, it seems necessary to explain the main points through this memorandum.

We the ministers of G.E.L.Church, working in different areas and at different capacities acknowledge the fact that G.E.L.Church has made significant contributions while working among the downtrodden people. But with the change of situation new challenges have come up. Since the Head Office of the G.E.L.Church is situated in the Capital City of the newly formed Jharkhand State, along with new challenges, there are ample opportunities of ministry and mission. For example, growing fundamentalism of Hindus seems to threat the management and growth of the Church. The poverty, illiteracy, ethnic/racial conflicts seem to weaken human bond/relationships. Under such circumstances it is more crucial to preserve and promote the unity and integrity of G.E.L.Church and at the same time co-operate with other Churches of this region for more effective ministry. In view of such challenges we propose to give more attention on the following issues with planning, training and execution of the programmes in which more pastors as well as lay persons may be involved effetively:

1. Worship and Music: We ... believe that spiritual revival is the key of all successful activities and effective ministry. Taken thus, worship of the Triune God should get first preference. Liturgy and music, that are part and parcel of God's worship and of community life, require more attention for making them live. The need for modification and indigenization of Church Liturgy have been proposed now and then. More recently, the need for expanding the collection of hymns of SAXIBANI and printing it with TONIC SOLFA has been felt more vigorously. Some persons of Jamshedpur have already initiated it. This should

to be rather patronized by the Church. We already have people who are interested and competent in doing the work if trained properly.

- 2. Counselling: Families, communities/society, churches at various levels are disintegrating for various reasons. This calls for the ungency of giving importance to the ministry of reconciliation through proper method of counselling. Apart from this, the breaking of marriages, ill effect of alcoholism, drug addiction, AIDS are the matters of concern for the time. Enforcement of laws, however effective, seem to be wanting and insufficient. Here, the preservation and promotion of the unity and integrity of the G.E.L.Church is more crucial from the point of mission and ministry. To constitute a Counselling Cell at the central level seems essential.
- 3. Education of Management: For the success of any organisation, company or institution, the managerial efficiency has got top priority in these few years. In the light of this development, the education of financial, office, a,d personnel management could be arranged for pastors who are incharge of parishes and institutions/organisations. The training programmes organised by the Christian Institute of Management, Chennai could be availed.
- 4. Planning & Encouragement for Higher Education:
 Only few pastors/candidates seem to venture for higher theological education, maybe due to lack of information or due to various problems that cannot be solved on personal level. This results in scarcity of future teachers/leaders. To identify the interested and competent persons for higher theological and secular education and encourage them needs special attention.
- 5. Development of Communication Facilities: Telephone, Fax, E-mail, News papers, magazines and other communication media are powerful tools not only for spreading information, but also for ministry. But the sorry state is that most of us are deprived of these facilities. It is sad to hear that even the printing of the only Church Magazine GHARBANDHU and other religious books at G.E.L. Church Press is badly hampered due to lack of proper management and lack of modernization. If we lose this it will be a shame for the Church.

While raising the above issues, we felt the need of a forum, which, at the initial stage was constituted of the following pastors:

- 1. Rev. Sushil Jojo-Vice President, South West Diocese, Rajgangpur, Orissa
- 2. Rev. Nelson Lakra- Vice President, North-East
- Diocese, Assam

 3. Rev. John Dang- Headmaster, Gossner Bible & Buniyadi Vidyalaya, Govindpur
- 4. Rev. Jorong Surin- G.E.L.Church, Mango, Jamshedpur 5. Rev. Manmasih Ekka- Vice Principal, Gossner Theological College, Ranchi.

The above five pastors were named considering their experience and competence in various fields. All of them have consented to contribute their service in whatever way they can. At this initial stage Rev. Manmasih Ekka was made convener of this unnamed forum. The forum may be expanded, reshaped as per need and approval and suggestion of the Central Council, the highest decision making body of the Church. At the same time we propose that a Board/Committee in the line of Synodical/Diocesan Board of Social Service (S/D.B.S.S.) of the Church of North India be formed for planning and execution of emergency relief works.

All the above proposals have been made in view of the Renewal of the Church for mission and ministry:
in the present changing situation. We request that the matter be discussed in the Central Council meetings and we anticipate for further guidance and suggestions.

Christians to raise Rs.10 cr. for rehabilitation project in Orissa

CHENNAI, JAN. 3. The All India Christian Council is raising nearly Rs. 10 crores for a rehabilitation project in the cyclone-devastated Orissa.

The council president, Dr. Joseph De Souza, and the spokesman, Mr. John Dayal, told reporters today that four model villages were proposed to be built in two blocks of Cuttack district. Each village would have 250 houses. The rehabilitation would provide basic infrastructure in the blocks.

The council, an umbrella organisation of Churches and Christian NGOs, would bear the entire cost from its funds without seeking any matching grant from the State administration. It would bring in state-of-the-art technology in setting up adequate early warning systems and cyclone shelters in the coastal belt.

The emphasis would be on the sustainability of the project by providing avenues for local employment, health and education centres, besides roads, communication systems and drinking water facilities, would be set up, they said. The council would be willing to participate in long-term comprehensive plans for ensuring maximum benefit to the maximum number of people.

The rehabilitations would be accompanied by a literacy and medicare campaign, they added.

In a separate statement, the council, along with the All India Catholic Union, the Muslim Coordination Committee of Tamil Nadu and the Makkal Sewak Sangh, condemned "attempts by vested interests" to divide India's minority communities.

It called for peace in Bangalore, where the members of the Muslim community had demonstrated against a newspaper for carrying an "offensive" article. "Any continuation of violence will be playing into the hands of the vested interests," the council said.

It appealed to the Press Council of India, the Editors Guild and other media organisations to ensure that "freedom of expression was not jeopardised by a small section of people who were making political capital out of their attacks on Christians, Muslims

and Dalits."
Mr. John Dayal, while objecting to Mr. Arun Shourie's continuance in the Union Ministry, wanted the Prime Minister to clarify whether he endorsed Mr. Shourie's writings that defamed Muslims, Christians and Dalits.

He also urged the Chief Minister, Mr. M. Karunanidhi, to take up this issue with the Prime Minister.

THE TENTH ASSEMBLY OF THE LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION

Dear Friends,

While it may seem rather early to be writing to you already now concerning the Tenth Assembly three years will have passed in July 2000 since the Ninth Assembly of the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) took place in Hong Kong. The LWF Constitution stipulates that "The Assembly shall normally be held every six years with the time, place and program to be determined by the Council" (Article VII, paragraph 2). In the light of this constitutional requirement, the LWF Council will consider at its meeting next year whether the Tenth Assembly should be held in 2003 or later. With this letter I intend to expedite the specific responsibility of the Council.

LWF member churches wishing to host the Tenth Assembly are asked to extend their invitations. The following overview of where previous Assemblies were held may assist you in your planning: Lund, Sweden (1947), Hanover, Germany (1952), Minneapolis, USA (1957), Helsinki, Finland (1963), Evian, France (1970), Dar-es-Salaam, Tanzania (1977), Budapest, Hungary (1984), Curibita, Brazil (1990), Hong Kong, China (1997).

Please send your invitation letter to my office no later than 15 March 2000. Invitations will be placed before the Council at its next meeting from 14 to 21 June 2000 in Turku, Finland for consideration and decision. Please bear the following factors in mind when you discuss this invitation in your church:

- Adequate and reasonably priced conference facilities and accommodation for more 1. than one thousand participants;
- 2. financial commitments for specific internal preparatory work, e.g. local committees and assigned local Assembly Coordinator;
- 3. assurance that delegates will not be denied entry into your country for political reasons:
- 4. printed or visual material may be included in your invitation to facilitate the Council's decision-making.

In order to close the chapter on the Ninth Assembly in Hong Kong, it may be helpful to draw attention to the fact that an evaluation process was initiated two years ago.

The Council appointed an Assembly Review Committee with the purpose of looking back at the Ninth Assembly and evaluating the parliamentary working style, the significance of the resolutions for the member churches and the effectiveness of the present model. It also discussed the financial implications of holding assemblies. The Committee met again during this year's Council meeting in Bratislava and examined observations made by delegates and other participants at the close of the Ninth Assembly. The evaluation and comments are part of a report that will be given careful attention by the Assembly Committee which is to be appointed by the Council in Turku.

When talking about assemblies, it is of the utmost importance to examine the financial implications for the member churches, especially in view of the fact that the assemblies of the World Council of Churches (WCC), and of other organizations belonging to the Christian World Communions as well as some of the regional ecumenical assemblies normally follow one another closely. For example, both CEC and LWF held their assemblies in 1997 and the WCC in 1998. Since most of the LWF member churches also hold membership in the WCC and regional and national ecumenical councils a reasonable spacing of the assemblies is essential.

Concerning the above, the Council passed a resolution at its meeting in Bratislava, of which an excerpt reads as follows:

"to ask the General Secretary to prepare a preliminary discussion for the Council meeting 2000 for possible coordination in the future of LWF assemblies with those of the WCC and regional ecumenical councils in view of better stewardship of resources as well as increased cooperation."

This resolution was shared with Dr Konrad Raiser, General Secretary of the World Council of Churches, who informed the Central Committee at its recent meeting. The Central Committee accordingly adopted a resolution confirming the WCC's willingness to work with the LWF and other Christian World Communions as well as regional ecumenical organizations on the coordination of future assemblies. It goes without saying that this process needs considerable creativity and careful planning. Discussions between the WCC and LWF secretariats have begun in follow-up of these resolutions. When these meetings have been completed, I will report to the Council in Turku so that it can take appropriate decisions about when, where and in which form the Tenth Assembly will be held.

I very much look forward to your invitations.

AN OPEN LETTER OF THEOLOGICAL TEACHERS TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES IN INDIA CHRISTIAN CONFERENCE OF ASIA WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES AND ITS MEMBER CHURCHES

We, theological teachers from various South Indian seminaries under the Senate of Serampore College, belonging to CNI, CSI, Baptists, Presbyterian, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, Orthodox, Mar Thoma, Pentecostal and other traditions would like to place before you our grave concern, apprehension and protest at the way ecumenism is promoted and practiced in various fora of the national and international ecumenical bodies.

The NCCI which is the National Ecumenical Forum of India (consisting of 29 member churches, 14 regional Christian Councils, 13 All India Christian Organizations and 7 related agencies) along with the CCA, WCC and other ecumenical bodies are looked up to as real models of ecumenism where churches and organization come together to share their faith and commitment to Christ and are challenged to go out to share the fruits of the faith with others.

In this context, we are deeply disappointed to note that, time and time again very little of the ecumenism that has been propagated, is practiced at various levels. Ecumenism as we have observed and experienced reflects the 'survival of the fittest' which is the law of the jungle, rather than being the sign of the aspiration of Christ, "That all may be one".

Any ecumenical organization that systematically and repeatedly denies full participation of all its members in ideological, policy and administrative matters can never claim itself to be a representative ecumenical body. Such negation calls into question the claim made by organizations like the NCCI, CCA and the WCC to be the carriers of the ecumenical vision.

The recent appointment to commissions and committees by the Central Committee of WCC is a classic example to prove the case in point. Among the 14 members recently appointed. 10 out of the 15 members representing India are people belonging to one state, Kerala, and 9 out of those belong to Syrian community (either to the Mar Thoma or Orthodox churches). Also information has been shared with us regarding the way a person from Kerala and from the Syrian community was propelled into an executive position at the WCC, Geneva.

We in India have been independent for over 52 years. However an examination of those who have been either commission members or staff members of the WCC and CCA indicate that those have been overwhelming from particular communities, such as the Syrian or Nadar caste or race. We ask:

How was it possible that favoritism has been shown to a few and discrimination against many? Where are the true signs of the vision of Christ for justice and integrity? What does ecumenism mean today? We would like to be informed whether there is a paradigm-shift in the notion of ecumenism today?

The WCC, CCA and NCCI and other ecumenical institutions cannot shirk their responsibility by giving an excuse that the Churches have failed in their responsibility to nominate people. Such excuses provide convenient grounds to overlook the claims of some churches. How is it that a mechanism has been developed to get names from certain groups and not from others? How does the power of patronage operate? We demand transparency at all levels of such transactions, which directly impact on the life, and witness of the Church in India.

We write this letter with prayer, concern and a deep sense of commitment to ecumenism in the true sense of the word to remind the ecumenical bodies to show practical signs of ecumenism which embraces Christ's vision for the least and the lost the voiceless and marginalized, especially for Dalits, the tribals and women.

We urge the organizations to reexamine the mechanisms and policies. Kindly note that this open letter is to express our concern and not to draw attention to the flaw in the administration. We await responses from the general secretaries of the NCCI, CCA, and WCC. Let us strengthen ecumenism in the new millennium and not kill it.

Reconstructing the Lives of the Orissa Cyclone Victims: NCCI Appeal - II

The Supercyclone which ravaged the Orissa coast between Digha to the North and Bhubaneshwar to the South affecting 200 kms of coastal Orissa has left more than 5000 dead, 8 million people severely affected, about 16000 – 18000 cattle dead, 80% vegetation/crops destroyed and more than 100 million Rupees worth of property damaged. The cyclone struck between 25 and 29th October with catastrophic intensity with the speed of 300 kms. The violent rains and tidal waves raging almost 7 mtr high surged ahead and left a path of death and destruction. The total area affected by the cyclone is estimated about 23, 403 sq. kms. and the estimated crop damage is about 1.25 million hectares.

After almost a month of relief work now there is a very serious outbreak of epidemic. Thousands have died. There is a lack of safe drinking water. People are forced to drink the same water, which has caused and is still sustaining the epidemic. The Government as usual claims to have done their best. It has also been acknowledge by them that the NGOs and other organisations have worked tirelessly to bring some kind of relief. Medical doctors, health workers and other medical personnel are fighting a big battle to control the epidemic. Given the infrastructure both before and after the cyclone, it is a tall order. Within the next few months the real damage to life and life supports systems will emerge. What needs to be done now is to seek permanent measures for rehabilitation. The cyclone leaves hundreds of children orphaned and homeless. With existing orphanages almost full and adoption unheard of in the state, the orphaned children have a very bleak future. There is serious need for a permanent construction of houses. The present scenario is this:

- Construction of 1,30,000 houses.
- Rs. 3500 million required for rebuilding
- Each house (2 room house) cost Rs. 40,000
- 5,000 tonnes of food have to be supplied everyday until normalcy is restored.
- 6 million cooking utensils to be distributed
- 12,385 kilo-litres of kerosene required everyday.
- Rs. 4000 million for road and rail repair (with 400 villages are still isolated) due to the cyclone.
- 8,000 villages need electricity and 4000 million rupees is needed for this.
- Nearly 700,000 people have been affected due to epidemic.
- About 100 new health centers needed to respond to the health situation.
- About 60 or more have already died of diarrohea.
- Rs. 240 million required to rebuilt water systems.
- 3 million jobs need to be created for the jobless farmers and 80000 workers.

With the help of assistance coming trickling down a meager relief has been distributed to the victims. The third phase of disaster is always crucial. This is the stage of rehabilitation. Permanent/concrete houses will save them from the next fury. It will also provide with security.

Churches Response

The churches have responded effectively to the situation. Ever since the super cyclone struck the coast immediate relief was rushed in some of our NCCI related agencies like CASA, Lutheran World Service-Calcutta, Diocese of Cuttack-CNI, Roman Catholic Institutions and various other organisations. The ACT International – Geneva (Action by Churches Together) have also risen to the occasion and sent out appeals to raise relief work and our implementing agencies in India have accessed these resources and have provided relief.

Assessing the enormity of the disaster, these efforts and response were very minimum. The situation, which prevailed for the first fortnight also, hampered relief work. The NCCI had also appealed to the member churches to respond with aid for the third phase of rehabilitation. The response of course is just trickling in. The NCCI in its Working Committee which met in November 20-21, at Shillong, Meghalaya have resolved to reconstruct/rehabilitate atleast one small village with the help of our agencies who are already working in Orissa.


Our response to the situation is our faith response. The advent is a time of announcing Good News. What is this Good News to the victims of the Orissa cyclone. It was very heartening to see school children in Delhi and other parts of India who went on a rally to campaign for a cracker free Diwali to support and express our solidarity with the victims of Orissa cyclone. From the staff we have started financial Campaign. The Governing Body has approved our proposal of this Campaign.
During the current session our plan was to cover the Ranchi Head Marter congregation. Rev. M.M. Ekka and Rev. H. K. Baba are giving their time in this Campaign.

I express our thanks to Mr. C.S. Tigga Dibadih for taking interest in our campaign. He has greatly for mobilised the members of the G.E.L.Church Dibadih. They are regularly contributing for this College. He has also engaged the Catechist of their Dibadih Congregation in this work who goes around, collects money and comes to our office to deposit the amount collected. Thanks to the members of the Dibadih Congregation for this ideal way of helping Gossner Theological College. If such serious steps are taken in the congregational level in the "hole church indeed we can hope for a Bright future of this very important Central institution of the Church.







Our dear Ecumenical Colleague,

Greetings from NCCI.

A Special Meeting of the Executive Committee was held at 10:00 a.m. on Monday 26th March, 2001 at CNI Bhavan, 16, Pandit Pant Marg, New Delhi. We are glad to provide you with the following details about the outcome of the meeting.

- 1. The Committee felt the absence of its charismatic leader, the Late Most Rev. Vinod Peter. After Thanksgiving Prayer, the members paid homage to the departed leader and remembered with gratitude the services rendered by him.
- 2. H.G. Geevarghese Mar Coorilos was elected and appointed as the new President of NCCI. Dr. V.S.Lall, General Secretary of Church of North India was elected and appointed as one of the Vice Presidents. Let us remember these new Officers in our prayer.
- The Committee, with due seriousness, discussed the issues arising out of the derecognition of ECLOF-India Board by ECLOF-Geneva. The Committee asked ECLOF-India to comply with the requirements of ECLOF-Geneva and a time limit was also given.
- 4. The rehabilitation work of the earthquake area in Gujarat was discussed in detail. The Executive Committee endorsed the commendable work CASA is doing in the area. Some of the member churches have raised their own funds. They intend to pursue rehabilitation work on their own because they want more visibility of the churches' presence in the rehabilitation area. They have identified the villages for re-building. NCCI was asked to coordinate the efforts of these churches, if possible, also with the assistance of CASA. It was reiterated that NCCI is not an implementing agency, but only a coordinating body in this matter. The Development Unit of NCCI met later and worked out modalities of coordination.
- 5. The Executive Committee discussed with concern the failure of the National Census process to include Dalit Christians in the Scheduled Castes list.

The Meeting of the Executive Committee and the full bench of the National Commission for Minorities (NCM)

The members of the Executive Committee met with the members of the NCM. The meeting lasted for 2 ½ hrs. The Executive members presented before the Commission the concerns of the Christian community, such as:

- Ongoing atrocities against minorities, especially Christians.
- ii. *Hindutva* groups casting aspersion on Indian churches, calling them 'foreign'.

- iii. Non inclusion of Dalit Christians in the Scheduled Castes list during the Census process of 2001.
- iv. The issue of dialogue with Hindu groups also came up. The Executive Committee shared the following with NCM:
 - Christians are not against dialogue. They are always for dialogue which would enable the strengthening of the secular fabric of our country and bring peace and harmony among religions. However, Christians do not recognize RSS as the sole representatives of Hinduism.
 - Dialogue is not an attempt to prove one-upmanship, nor to find fault with each other. The Committee told the NCM that the Hindutva fundamentalists, especially people like Sudershan, should stop maligning the Church in India to facilitate dialogue.
 - Dialogue of Hindus and Christians will be effective only if it takes place at different levels - levels of *people*, religious leaders and supreme spiritual heads. To start with, the Dialogue Units of NCCI and CBCI would work together the modalities of dialogue, and then the process can be continued at different levels.
 - Subsequently, a small section of the media reported this meeting, giving the impression that the Christian community is split over the issue. It is not so. The NCCI and the CBCI have a clear understanding between them about the need, rationale and process of dialogue. Some expressed the fear that we may be playing into the hands of the Hindutva forces. It is also felt that some mushrooming organizations are speaking on behalf of the Church, wanting to keep the tension going, to satisfy their own personal and hidden agenda. The situation has come that we have to weigh all these issues carefully.
 - The Executive Committee felt that as Christians, we should be open and willing to take risk. Ours is a message of love (even loving the enemies), peace and justice. Dialogue will not be an easy process. We should struggle hard as loyal citizens of the country to bring about peace and harmony. Let us not forget that all the citizens in our country have the same status and dignity and no one can take it away from us through violence of words and action.
 - Finally, let us re-affirm our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and build up communities of peace and harmony.

We request you to respond to this letter after reading this carefully because your opinion will be very valuable and your support and blessings indispensable.

You are aware of the misery caused by the "Super Cyclone" which hit the coast of Orissa and West Bengal in eastern India creating unprecedented damage in Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Kendrapara, Balasore, Bhadrak, Cuttack, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Gunjam, Khurda, Gajpati, 24 parganas and Midnapore districts. The storm that hit the coast on the 29th of October 1999 had wind speed at 260 kms per hour and created tidal waves of 30-35 feet high. The extent of loss of life and the damage caused to infrastructure, crops, houses and other properties is yet to be ascertained due to inability of the government and the armed forces to access the areas due to continuing heavy rain and snapping of all linkages.

Preliminary report indicate that an estimated 15,00,000 people have been affected. From among these over 30,000 families have been left completely homeless. These figures are likely to increase substantially as damage in the interior areas is still being assessed. But the most affected are the poor and the disadvantaged population of the region.

CASA as a National Relief and Development Organisation, mandated also to respond to emergencies is dutybound to initiate immediate relief measures amongst the most affected population in association with the its local constituencies, the partner organisations and the local government.

We have constituted four teams consisting of approximately 40 staff and volunteers. These experienced teams headed by an Additional Emergency Officer of CASA, have already moved towards the affected areas along with the required logistics support.

We have committed to take up relief operations covering 20,000 families and will constitute the following measures:

- ⇒ Distribution of 20,000 relief sets (each set containing one saree, one dhoti, one blanket and 9 pieces of aluminium kitchen utensils).
- ⇒ Distribution of 15,000 Tarpaulins in Orissa (to enable the people to set up temporary homes till alternate arrangements are made for their accommodation).
- ⇒ Distribution of 20,000 dry ration kits to enable the affected families to start cooking their own food as a step towards self-sufficiency.
- ⇒ Provision of basic medical aid facilities at the village and relief camp level to treat minor injuries and to counter outbreak of epidemics.

Prime Minister, Shri Atal Behari Vajpayee has declared the destruction caused by the "Super Cyclone" as a "National Calamity". He has appealed to all citizens to lend a helping hand to the cyclone hit people of the state. "At times of such grave natural calamity, we should all come to the aid of those who have suffered loss of their loved ones, or have lost the shelter above their heads. They need all possible help from their fellow countrymen", said the Prime Minister.

CASA on behalf is committed to respond to this "National Tragedy" collectively with you and our partners and its others constituencies. The magnitude of the tragedy requires collective effort in resource generation as an expression of our solidarity with the poor and the marginalised irrespective of caste, religion and political considerations. Under such circumstances, we earnestly request you to kindly be generous enough and contribute to CASA financially. Your contribution will be of immense value and immediately acknowledged. We will keep you posted on all the latest developments with regard to the impact of the cyclone and our response.

We will be definitely sharing with you our audited statement of accounts as well as a detailed progress report acknowledging your contribution on completion of the programme.

We look forward for your kind support.

Respected Bishop Mohan,

warm Christmas greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

I am in receipt of your letter dated 22 October 1999 and I am deeply sorry we missed to meet at Tezpur. There must have been a misunderstanding, because when we came to your residence we were told that it was unknown when you would return from Ranchi. So no new appointment was made for the next day as assumed by you. I am sorry, if you waited for us in vain.

I longed to talk to you, since we from NMZ are in support of closer co-operation between the Lutheran churches in the North East of India. Rev. Bernd Krause from Gossner Mission Berlin had encouraged me to pay a visit to you and so we came to see your residence to meet with you and to see the Immanuel College.

We stayed at night in the Manager's house of the Tarajuli Tea Estate and the talk we had with him is a matter of great concern to us. In very plain words he explained to us that no new church will be built in his estate, "unless the GELC and the AELC solve their conflict". He made us to believe that the conflict has intensified, since you along with Bishop Topno and Rev. Krause have visited Tarajuli. "The group having split away from the AELC, though small in number, feels strong by the backing of the GELC and this creates disturbance I will not tolerate", he said.

To our understanding we have to take this warning seriously, and it is our feeling that we have to help solve this problem from outside. If we leave the Tarajuli Lutherans on their own, they will not be allowed to build a new church, though the funds are available. It will be to the detriment of both parties, if the conflict is not settled.

What I suggest you to do is to talk to the group feeling close to the GELC and to make them agree to a statement assuring both groups to use the same church at different times. The President of the AELC, Rev. Godwin Nag, has promised to sign a document of this kind. It is up to you to convince the Gossner Lutherans to do the same.

I am sure once the document duly signed possibly also by Bishop Topno and Bishop Prokash is presented to the Manager will make change his mind. So I plead with you to get involved in this peace mission.

It has been a matter of real embarrassment to me that the India Christian Handbook project that we started some years ago could not be completed because of certain unavoidable reasons. One reason was that both Mathew Philip that assisted me in the project and myself were not in India for the last few years. But now that I have returned and am settled in Kerala, I would like to complete the project and publish the Handbook within the next six months. And this is possible, God willing, with the help of the new Assistant Editor, Mr. Joshua Pillai, who has long invaluable experience of research, data analysis and publication. We are

grateful to God for the unique expertise he brings to this project.

In recent years the attitude of some wayward fundamentalist groups in the country to Christians and Christian organizations, has become hostile. But all Christian leaders that I have consulted urged me to get the handbook published. Of course we need to be, and will be, guarded and cautious in the light of the new developments. There is good rationale to go ahead with the project. First, the subversive groups that oppose us do have detailed information on us and our work, So this book will not supply any information they do not already have. They have such details on our organizations and churches that one wonders whether they have informants within many of our organizations.

Second, we will publish correct and true information on us to counterbalance the fabricated and false information and data that the opposing groups constantly churn out. We need to make facts and figures public being at the same time "wise as serpents".

Third, as citizens of India we have the privilege and right to live, worship and serve with courage and in truth that is made open and known. We will not be intimidated by any one and be driven to hiding.

Fourth, for our own information and networking we need this one volume reference work on Christianity and Christian work in India, because we do not have such a resource book for information on all segments of Christianity in the country: in that sense the projected ICH is unique, and it is needed for strengthening our unity and our continued ministry.

It was some five year ago that you sent us data about your church/mission/ organization, and obviously the data will have to be updated.

If you know of other Christian organizations/churches that were established during the last 5-6 years, will you kindly send us the names and addresses so that we can get in touch with them also. We will keep you informed of the progress of the project. Many thanks for your co-operation and help.

Sehr geehrte Damen und Herren, liebe Freundinnen und Freunde,

Advent in frostiger Zeit: Die drohende "feindliche Übernahme" von Mannesmann und die knapp abgewendete Banken-Blockade gegenüber dem Holzmann-Konzern bleiben menschenverächtliche Schaustücke für die "häßliche Fratze" (ARD-Kommentar) des Kapitalismus. Wenn es noch eines Beweises bedurft hätte, hier zeigte sich, wer mit gewaltiger finanzwirtschaftlicher Macht Politik außer Kraft zu setzen vermag. Noch ist die Hoffnung auf politische Verantwortung für soziale Gerechtigkeit national und im internationalen Rahmen nicht vergebens.

Zu Pfingsten nächsten Jahres erwarten wir knapp 100 Gäste aus allen Kontinenten zum "Colloquium 2000" zum Thema "Glaube – Theologie – Ökonomie". In Hofgeismar wollen wir für eine Woche gemeinsam arbeiten und streiten über Alternativen zur neoliberalen Globalisierung. Unsere Gäste sind Vertreterinnen und Vertreter von Basisbewegungen und Kirchen, die seit langem als TheologInnen, Wirtschafts- und SozialwissenschaftlerInnen in ihren Ländern tätig sind. Für mehrere Tage werden viele von ihnen vor dem Colloquium ökumenische Gruppen und Netzwerke besuchen, die sich für Arbeit und soziale Gerechtigkeit, die Bewahrung der Schöpfung und interkulturellen Austausch in unserem Land einsetzen. Missionswerke und –orden, katholische und evangelische Einrichtungen tragen dieses Vorhaben mit, der Reformierte Weltbund und der Ökumenische Rat unterstützen es. Unserem Freund Wolfgang Geller sind wir sehr dankbar, daß er die Koordination für diese wichtige ökumenische Begegnung übernommen hat.

Europa wächst zusammen, doch überwiegt das Gewicht finanzieller Freiheit bis an die Grenze des Freibeutertums gegenüber den Handlungsmöglichkeiten der Politik und einer Orientierung an sozialer Gerechtigkeit. Kirchen gehören zu denjenigen Organisationen, die über Staatsgrenzen hinweg miteinander verbunden und in der Lage sind oder in die Lage versetzt werden müssen, sich für die sozialen und kulturellen Belange der Menschen im zusammenwachsenden Europa unter den Bedingungen der Globalisierung einzusetzen. Die Studienreise der Gossner Mission unter dem Titel "Soziale Verantwortung im Europa der Regionen" zusammen mit der Ev. Erwachsenenbildung Worms zur Waldenserkirche nach Turin hat uns in dieser Einschätzung bestärkt. Dort haben

Eine kleine, engagierte und tief in biblischen Traditionen verwurzelte protestantische Kirche wie die Waldenser kann in dieser Gesellschaft Sauerteig sein und eine Ausstrahlungskraft entwickeln, die weit über die eigene zahlenmäßige Größe hinausgeht.

Präsenz im Stadtteil mit gemeinwesenorientierter Mediationsarbeit, Bündnisse und Kontakte mit verschiedenen engagierten Gruppen und Institutionen auf lokaler und regionaler Ebene und eine biblisch fundierte Sozialethik machen nicht nur diese kleine Kirche in Italien attraktiv, sondern lassen auch uns erneut erkennen, dass es sich lohnt, sich auf den Gott der kleinen Leute einzulassen.

Mit dem Reformationstag 1999 wurde in Augsburg die Trennung zwischen Katholiken und Lutheranern im zentralen Punkt der Rechtfertigungslehre aufgehoben. Eberhard Jüngel hat "das Evangelium von der Rechtfertigung des Gottlosen" - Luthers Botschaft - als theologisches Dynamit bezeichnet, weil durch sie die christliche Leistungsgesellschaft der damaligen Zeit in Frage gestellt und damit auch der Irrtum überwunden werde, als sei der Menschen die Summe seiner Taten oder Untaten. Indes sei ihre Kernfrage: Wer oder was macht mich zu der Person, deren Würde unantastbar ist? Ich mich selbst, meine Leistung, die Gesellschaft? Luther denkt von Paulus her: Der Mensch findet Anerkennung und Ansehen, Würde und Wert allein aus Gnade, nicht durch seine Leistungen. Das Grundgesetz sagt daher: "Die Würde des Menschen ist unantastbar" (Art.1,1 GG). Diese Aussage richtet sich gegen alle Versuche, meine Würde als rechter Mensch mir selbst schaffen zu können oder anderen ihre Würde abzuerkennen. Insofern ist die Rechtfertigung des Menschen "allein aus Gnade" die stärkste Kritik an der Leistungsgesellschaft, wo immer sie Menschen ausschließt, in ihrer Würde verletzt oder herabsetzt.

Wir werden diese nunmehr ökumenisch anerkannte Kostbarkeit noch brauchen, denn jede wirtschaftliche Entscheidung sollte danach beurteilt werden, "ob sie die Würde der menschlichen Person schützt oder verletzt" (Kath. Bischöfe in den USA, 1986). Aber auch im Einsatz für eine humanere Flüchtlingspolitik gilt: Die Würde des Menschen – wo immer sie oder er herkommt – ist unantastbar. Der Mensch ist und bleibt Gottes Geschöpf. Weder ist er ein Stück Ware, das man ausnützen, noch ein willenloser Sklave der Reichen, den man nach Belieben in der Welt herumschubsen kann. Gottes Güte gilt für alle gleichermaßen. Und wer es weihnachtlich lesen will: "Er stößt die Machthaber vom Thron und erhebt die Niedrigen" (Lukas 1, 52). Das heißt: Teilen hat mit Umverteilen zu tun – nicht die Armen mit den Reichen, wie es viele als bittere Realität erleben, sondern die Reichen mit den Armen. Die stärksten Schultern tragen die schwersten Lasten, um das solidarische Band zwischen Starken und Schwachen zu festigen. Ohne Verteilungsgerechtigkeit bricht eine Gesellschaft, ja unser Globus auseinander. "Und die Frucht der Gerechtigkeit wird Friede sein" (Jes. 32,17).

Wir laden herzlich ein zu einem nachmittäglichen Neujahrskaffee am Sonntag, 9. Through this letter we send you our prayerful greetings and best wishes for a very happy Christmas and a meaningful New Millennium. May the Good Lord continue to protect you, uphold you and carry you through in all that you undertake during the year ahead.

We take this opportunity to share with you some of the following concerns.

CHURCH UNITY INITIATIVES: The CSI, CNI and Marthoma Churches joint Council at their recent meeting held in Tiruvalla have decided to become "Communion of Churches in India" surely this is a step forward. They now have a full time secretary in the person of Bishop George Ninan. It was agreed to invite Lutherans and Methodists for the full Membership of this communion. Union negotiations are neither easy nor fast. We however wish that those entrusted with the task of forging unity would leave no stone unturned for the cause of oneness for the mission in our Nation.

ECUMENICAL ASSEMBLY OF THE NCCI-CBCI: We are happy to state that for the first time in the history, the NCCI CBCI have jointly organised a National Ecumenical Assembly in Cochin during the first week of December 1999 as part of the Millennium celebrations. There was an overwhelming response and support from every quarter of the Assembly to bury the past and to begin afresh and strengthen our service to the Nation as an effective witness of our common faith. Following up this, several regional and local joint programmes are to be initiated to promote greater understanding and collective action for the cause of the unreached.

MEETING WITH THE PRIME MINISTER: In view of the winter session of the Parliament, an opportunity was taken to meet the PM Sri Atal Behari Vajpayee on 6th December 1999 in Delhi along with the other leaders of the NCCI and CBCI. Our concerns for the communal harmony with special reference to Gujarat and the issues relating to Christians of Dalit origin, Christian Personal Law, Celebrating the year of the Lord, Stamp Release etc. were tabled with the Prime Minister. Though the PM was non committal, it was a patient hearing with a sense of accommodation. It should be our continued endevour to keep knocking as often as we can though we await the God's providence for the breaking stroke.

CHURCHES IN SOUTH ASIA TO BE CLOSELY RELATED: After a series of meetings beginning from the one in Hyderabad of 1994 to the 5th one in Dhaka 1999, there is an increased awareness among the

Churches in the Sub-region to co-relate their life and service for matters of mission importance. The recent meetings held in Dhaka during the 2nd week of December have crystalised a course of action to reconsider mission in South Asia so as to focus on poverty, fundamentalism and freedom of religion.

RELEASE OF STAMP ON JESUS CHRIST THE SAVIOUR: Readily responding to our request, the Government of India has brought out a stamp to mark the year of our Lord and this stamp will be released in Delhi on Christmas day. While this may not be a fitting tribute, yet, this will surely help a great many of people our Nation get to know Jesus Christ and that we hope that this will be a turning point for many to discover for themselves the Truth which in turn can set them free.

OUR CONTINUING CONCERNS: As you are aware, the devastating cyclone that created havoc in allmost 12 Districts in Orissa have set the clock back by several years to a vast population of Orissa coast. Our relief Agency CASA together with several other Christian and other NGOs contributed their might for the first phase of the relief programme. Now building life is a herculen task and we need to remember the victims for the consolation and all those who are directly and indirectly extending a helping hand for courage and compassion to mitigate the situation. Secondly, the communal tensions in Halmodi of Surat District and several hamlets of Dangs District of Gujarat are a matter of great concern. Sessions of dialogue at different levels are needed and we feel inadequate to carry through them on a time scale. Christmas blessings may dawn on this region in a special way and they should be remembered in a every special manner during this season.

ADVENT - 2000: As communicated, Advent-2000 as part of our Millennium celebrations is to be held between 8th and 10th January 2000 at Hyderabad. The 3 focal points are - Unity of Mankind, Religion for Peace & harmony and Church in the 21st Centuary. Your participation will be a great encouragement.

I remain for the present, with Christmas Prayers and Thoughts to you to the family and to all those you minister unto.

MESSAGE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION

God's promise: "I give you a future with hope"

At the brink of the third millennium of the Christian Era, the Council of the Lutheran World Federation is meeting in Turku, Finland, whose Cathedral has for 700 years been the spiritual centre of this land. We thank the members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Finland, who have so graciously hosted us during these days. We have been inspired through our participation together in worship, prayer and celebrations of the new millennium. We greet the sixty million Lutherans throughout the world who are part of this Lutheran communion, with the word of God: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (Jer. 29:11)

At the heart of our Christian faith and hope is the incarnation of the Son of God, and churches around the world celebrate the Jubilee year in the memory of the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ. In Christ, God came in our likeness so that we might have living communion with our Creator and with each other, and Christ's life, death and resurrection give new life and hope to humankind and all creation.

A pivotal ecumenical breakthrough during the past year, and an expression of our hope in Christ, has been the signing of the Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification by the Roman Catholic Church and the Lutheran World Federation: "By grace alone, in faith in Christ's saving work and not because of any merit on our part, we are accepted by God and receive the Holy Spirit, who renews our hearts while equipping and calling us to good works." We have been encouraged by how our member churches are experiencing ever stronger relationships with Roman Catholics, and recognize the urgency to press for more visible signs of unity through mutual eucharistic hospitality.

At this meeting of the Council, a plan of action for further follow up on this agreement was considered, based on the Joint Declaration's commitment: "The Lutheran churches and the Roman Catholic Church will continue to strive together to deepen this common understanding of justification and to make it bear fruit in the life and teaching of the churches." At the same time we continue to pursue relationships with many other ecumenical partners, some of whom brought greetings to our meeting.

The same faith in Christ that inspires our ecumenical endeavors and commitments, also inspires the Christian love that leads us to witness and service in the world. The reconciling work of Christ calls us to reconciliation with each other. The free gift of justification given by God makes us partakers of God's mission in the world and obliges us to mutual forgiveness and to confronting the injustices that hold us and the rest of the world captive. The changing contexts of the world today challenge us to begin now to take a new look at how we carry out mission.

Many issues reflecting the brokenness of the world have been before the Council in these past few days, including religious intolerance, violence against women, the alarming and increasing gap between rich and poor, armed conflict and the ethical dilemmas of armed intervention to defend human rights. Effects of economic globalization will be addressed through a new theological study process.


We work to strengthen the role of women and youth in church and society, but we know how much there is still to be done in these areas. In addressing these critical questions, we are nevertheless full of a sense of hope, drawn from Christ's message of salvation and justice.

With that sense of hope, in this Jubilee year we call again for the liberation of the heavily indebted developing countries of the world from the tyranny of unsustainable debt. Political commitments have been made to reduce this crushing burden upon the poorest of the poor, but we call for genuine implementation of these commitments and for a renewed effort on the part of the international community to provide a lasting and just solution to the continuing human tragedy caused by debt. We also call upon governments of both debtor and creditor countries to take measures to prevent debts from being undemocratically, unproductively and corruptly incurred.

In all our diversity of cultures, nationalities and languages, our meeting and fellowship during these days has been a visible sign of the communion among the member churches of the Lutheran World Federation, and has enabled us to know ourselves better as a communion of Lutheran churches within the worldwide Christian *communio*. In a world which is becoming at the same time both more 'globalized', and more fragmented, our experience of that global communion gives us hope and strength for our ministry as churches and our witness in society.

May the almighty and merciful God bless us all now and forever.

Dear friends,

From the Annual Assembly of the Association of Protestant Churches and Missions in Germany - in brief: EMW - we send Christian greetings to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

As many of you know from earlier correspondence, we were driven this year to focus in the study part of our Assembly on a closer look at the situation of fellow-Christians in Asia. The theme of the Assembly read: "Christians in Asia: Confronted with Violence, Called to Mission", and the preparatory paper for the Assembly was shared with you in an English translation.

We thought we should not conclude our deliberations without drafting a word of greetings to you, the very Christians who have been the focus of our reflections, and send it to you as an expression of our concern and solidarity and of the long-standing partnership in God's mission which we have enjoyed over the years.

Before talking about conflicts in Asia, we have with some embarrassment first of all to take account of prejudices and even open violence against other communities in our own country. We are struggling to discover for ourselves what it means to live in a pluralistic society and to develop a sense of appreciation and respect of diversity in our own context. And we admit that we as Christians have not always given justice to the witness of the peace of God. We do hope, however, that the mutual sharing in the ecumenical "Decade to Overcome Violence" will inspire and encourage us, along with you, to seek ways of understanding and mutual trust between different communities.

In trying to understand the situation of the churches in Asian countries we felt it most important to listen to voices from Asia. We were therefore very grateful for your responses to our preparatory paper as well as for all material which some of you sent to us, either in the form of articles, statements of churches or personal comments etc. We also felt privileged to have among us a representative from a theological seminary in Malaysia and a staff person of the Henry Martyn Institute in Hyderabad (India) who provided us with first hand information on the situation of the Christian minority in their respective countries. We valued their contributions as well as the additional input from some Asian co-workers from India and Indonesia especially - who serve on behalf of partner churches in Asia in German churches. Their insights, the plenary discussions on papers, and also the intensive reflection in four working groups helped us to grapple with the situation of Christians in some of the Asian countries today and also to reflect on our response to situations of violence and crisis in which churches in Asia find themselves caught.

Of course, we tried hard not to generalise with sweeping statements on the challenges with which churches in Asia are confronted. We know and appreciate the long tradition of tolerance and mutual respect which Asian cultures have nourished throughout centuries, and we are far from condemning any religion or their adherents in general as the responsible force for the unrest, atrocities, riots or the suppression of human rights and the dignity of a human being to make choices of religious affiliation for him- or herself. We are aware of the very complex nature of conflicts, with social, political, ethnic, racial, religious aspects closely intertwined. We tried to analyse and understand the dynamics of globalisation and the search of identity of people which are part of this process, but we also discerned forces who use religious sentiments for the gain of political power, cultural domination or to achieve various forms of subjugation of minorities. We detected forms of fundamentalism in various parts of the world and also within the Christian tradition, and we sadly observe that often women are the ones who suffer most under attitudes of intolerance and suppression.

Our study of the situation of the churches in Asia - with special attention to India, Pakistan, Indonesia, Myanmar (Burma), but also Malaysia and Sri Lanka - and our dialogue with many of you lead us to realise the various forms of subtle suppression and degradation of human rights many people in Asia suffer, whether they are Christians, Hindus, Muslims, Buddhists or members of other communities. In this context we, the churches in Germany, regard it as a challenge to stand on the side of the victims, to get involved in advocacy and to uphold the dignity of human life and affirm our concern for human rights, including the right of freedom of religion. At the same time we want to avoid everything that would fuel conflicts; for it is not the task of the churches to aggravate conflicts but to contribute to the healing of conflicts through actions of mediation and the service of reconciliation.

Some of us also shared experiences of being involved in various ministries of peace-making and reconciliation. In the context of this discussion it was also stressed how significant it is to get engaged in intercessions before God for people who suffer or struggle, to whichever denomination or religion they may belong. In the spirit of Christ we seek the well-being of the entire human family!

We also acknowledged the struggle many of our sisters and brothers have to face every day for upholding Christian life and witness. In the view of this, we are grateful to God for your continuing commitment to live out as "salt of the world" the Christian calling and to embody as a church the values of the kingdom of God which may also foster justice, peace, reconciliation and mutual respect in the society at large.

We hear that the issue of mission and conversion and the presence of free-lance missionaries in some countries of Asia contribute to the heated debate about the integrity of the churches mission. We would therefore like to make it clear that we, the members of EMW who are involved in partnership in mission with many churches in Asia, sincerely discard any form of mission in a "crusading spirit". We certainly regard the obligation to mission as integral part of the Christian identity, but we affirm mission as "Mission in Christ's Way", seeking the upliftment of the poor and downtrodden and the sharing of all in the horizon of the kingdom of God. We are certainly not committed to conquer countries, humiliate other religions, destroy cultures, insult the sentiments of people; in our witness to Christ we are committed to respect and to embrace, to uplift and to heal, to share and to reconcile! We see ourselves as your partners in Asia your struggle to discern God's mission in Asia and to respond to this mission of God in your own context meaningfully!



Information on the Evaluation of Hostels & the visit of Evaluation Team.

- 1.00 The Evaluation of Hostels, which is to be viewed as a learning process, is highly participatory. Essentially, it is to see whether the Hostel programme is making progress towards achieving its objectives and what has been the impact on the children and how the programme could be improved further.
- 2.00 Therefore, each Hostel will be evaluated by a team of three evaluators of whom two are from the partner Churches of HCDI and one is a research associate from the Bosco Institute of Research & Development for Youth (BIRDY), the organisation which has been chosen to offer consultation on evaluation of Hostels and the Director of which is the Chief Evaluation Consultant.
- 3.00 Each team will have a team leader who will be one among the two evaluators from the partner Churches.
- 4.00 The evaluation team will spend two days to evaluate a Hostel.
- 5.00 When the evaluators are visiting Hostels, the concerned Church/Diocese/Conference may ensure the presence of its Liaison Officer or any responsible official.
- The team will administer altogether eight schedules (one for Manager, one for Warden, one for Pastor, one for three teachers, one for five parents, one for ten children, one for ex-fosterchildren and one for all the staff). For this purpose, the team will have to interview the persons/children mentioned above whose presence is very essential and if anyone of the schedules is not administered by the evaluation team and if a blank one is submitted to the evaluation consultant, the Hostel will lose points and so their presence at the time of evaluation is of paramount importance. It is exclusively the responsibility of the Hostel authorities to ensure this.

- Due to budgetary constraints, the evaluation team has been repeatedly requested to avoid travelling by taxi/private car to distance places ie: from one Hostel to another. Therefore the Hostel is expected to help the team to travel by bus/train (whichever is available and convenient) to the next Hostel by booking tickets and guiding the members to reach their next destination (Hostel), without having to loose much of their time in locating the same.
- 8.00 The Hostel is expected to arrange accommodation for the team in the Hostel guest room or in the Church guest house as it is important that the team gets the opportunity to participate and observe the day to day activities of the Hostel during its stay.
- 9.00 The Hostel is also expected to extend hospitality to the members.
- The members of the team will have to be given the opportunity to go around and see the entire Hostel premises, meet the children and staff apart from those whom they are going to interview. They will also expect the Hostel authorities to show them all or any of the files and records, if necessary.
- 11.00 All the officials of the Hostel are expected to extend full cooperation to the team and to view the evaluation as a positive exercise.

To your birthday I like to send you my heartfelt congratulations and blessings!

The watchword of this day of the Moravian Church which is close together with the Spirit of Gossner is the following (Joh 17,15): "I do not pray that thou shouldst take them out of the world, but that thou shouldst keep them from the evil one."

It is a good word, that may accompany you during the next year of your service and in your family life. The painful experiences Christians in India had to make during the last year will be changed with this watchword into a strong trust.

I will never forget the prayers you held on the occasion of my birthday during my first visit of the Gossner Church in the year 1992. This solidarity will endure.

This year you celebrate your birthday with important events which represent a high point of your period of ministry. However, it is nearly a good anniversary - 155 years - of the "Day of Mission" which the GELC celebrates with the memory of the arrival of the missionaries. Furthermore this year there is the decision of the Gossner Church that also women will be ordained as church ministers. It was a great honour for me and my wife Barbara to accompany Ms. Kandulna for one day in Berlin. This ordination coincides with the event of self-determination in special states in the community of the various Indian people. The Gossner Church and the other churches in Jharkhand are participated on the education of good ruling leadership in an excellent way. The beginning of it was the ordination of Nathanael Tuyn the first Munda pastor who was ordained in Chaibsa by Alfred Nottrott in the year 1872. Paulus Nemo and the Oraon J. D. Lakra belong to this ranks.

Now, we want to draw our attention to the future of the GELC, to the witness of the church and the service in the society. So much we of the Gossner Church and the EMW can do in the partnership with your church and Gossner Mission we want to do in the future.



I'm looking forward to seeing you in Berlin soon if you will participate on the meeting of the WCC-Central Committee.

Sometime it will be possible for me to visit the GELC once again. I am very thankful that your hospitality will endure at any time. It is not sure if I am able to realise my intention to visit you before the end of my period of office in the EMW in February 2002. 

THE LWF MEMBER CHURCHES AND NATIONAL COMMITTEES

September 2000

Dear Friends,

This letter, sent with my most cordial greetings, is intended to draw your attention to the matters discussed, and resolutions taken, by the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) Council at its 14-21 June 2000 meeting in Turku, Finland. The LWF Executive Committee met beforehand on June 13.

THE MESSAGE

The Council meeting was held under the theme "I Give You a Future with Hope" chosen by this year's host church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Finland (ELCF). The choice was influenced by the year 2000 worldwide church celebrations of the birth of Jesus Christ. Under the leadership of Finnish Archbishop, Jukka Paarma, the ELCF was a generous host in every respect and the Council meeting participants were invited to attend a number of official functions. Detailed accounts of the topics addressed by the Council meeting and the inspiring worship life, in which the participants were privileged to share, may be found in *Lutheran World Information Nos. 6 and 7/2000*. The Council expressed its gratitude to the host church on many occasions and it is my pleasure to repeat our thanks here. The spirit in which the Council meeting took place and the diverse themes, addressed by its members who come from all corners of the world representing different cultural and political values, are reflected in the attached *MESSAGE* adopted by the Council at the close of its meeting.

I commend this *MESSAGE* to you and ask that you convey it to your congregations.

ELECTIONS/APPOINTMENTS

With much pleasure, I share with you the election of Ms. Inger Johanne Wremer from the Church of Norway as the Federation's new Treasurer. Ms. Wremer succeeds Dr. Sigrun Møgedal who tendered her resignation in March 2000 following her appointment as State Secretary for International Development in the Royal Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Ms. Wremer holds a bachelor's degree in history and special education from the University of Oslo and is a member of the Church of Norway's board for diaconia and society. In addition, she serves on the board of Norwegian Church Aid, the church's international development agency, which works in collaboration with the LWF departments for World Service and Mission and Development.

The Council expressed due thanks to Dr. Møgedal in recognition of her services as LWF Treasurer. Since her election to the Council by the LWF Ninth Assembly in Hong Kong in 1997 and her subsequent election as Treasurer, she has worked diligently and with unfaltering energy to assist in securing a sound financial basis from which the Federation could operate. Dr. Møgedal resigned from the Council following her appointment to a position in the Government of Norway.

President of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Suriname, Mr. Raymon Wimpel, was elected as a member of the Council and of the Program Committee for Finance and Administration. Mr. Wimpel, a banker by profession, succeeded Ms. Ilse Labadie who died on 14 June 1999 following illness.

The position of Adviser to the Council, which became vacant upon the retirement of Dr. Hans Otto Hahn, was filled through the election of the Rev. Cornelia Füllkrug-Weitzel. Rev. Füllkrug-Weitzel is the director of "Bread for the World" – Diaconal Association of Protestant Churches.

THE 10th LWF ASSEMBLY

Invitations to hold the Tenth LWF Assembly in their respective countries were received by the Council from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC) and the North Elbian Evangelical Lutheran Church [Germany]. The Silesian Evangelical Church of the Augsburg Confession in the Czech Republic, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Iceland and the Evangelical Church in Wuerttemberg [Germany] that had initially extended invitations had withdrawn them by the time the Council met. The Council voted to accept the invitation of the ELCIC to meet in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, in 2003. The exact dates will be determined in consultation with the host church.

You will receive the official letter from LWF President, Bishop Dr. Christian Krause, *calling* the *Tenth Assembly* after the LWF Executive Committee has decided on the exact dates at its end of November meeting this year.

By now, you will have already received a separate letter inviting the member churches to propose an assembly theme. The suggested themes received will be on the Executive Committee agenda for review and decision.

The Council constituted an Assembly Planning Committee with representatives from the seven geographical regions of the LWF. The first meeting of this committee is planned for 10-13 January 2001 here in Geneva, Switzerland.

INNER-CHURCH CONFLICTS

One of the chapters in my report to the Council referred to conflicts and their impact on the Church. I mentioned the conflict-ridden times in the history of the Middle East during the time of the Prophet Jeremiah and the similarities we experience in our own times. We all know about the situation in Nigeria, Sudan, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Angola, the Horn of Africa, Zimbabwe, former Yugoslavia, Chechnya, Northern Ireland, India, the Middle East, Indonesia, the Philippines, and so on. The root causes are different, but these conflicts often find their way into the life of the Church and threaten the unity and integrity of

the Gospel it proclaims. I have learned much about this during my travels and it is of great concern to me. Because religious leaders have a special responsibility for the welfare of their nations, irrespective of religious, political or racial orientation, I wish to keep the discussion alive. Any conflict that arises in a church must be addressed—be it for political reasons or internal upheaval. A divided church is not in a position to proclaim the Gospel truthfully. It will lose credibility vis-a-vis its followers, in ecumenical and political circles. Each one of us, therefore, has a responsibility to assist churches in resolving their conflicts. By request of member churches, the LWF has invested time and financial resources to try to resolve a number of church conflicts. Both the care and counsel extended by neighboring churches have been of valuable assistance in these cases.

In the following paragraphs, I will highlight some of the decisions of the Council pertaining to the various LWF departments/units:

FINANCIAL MATTERS

1. Geneva Coordination Budget

In 1999, as in the previous years, we were able to balance the income and expenditure of the Geneva Coordination budget at a level of CHF 13.5 million (USD 9 million, subject to the exchange rate). I wish to express my appreciation to the member churches and related agencies for their continuous financial support of the Federation's work.

The limited financial resources available make it necessary for the LWF to continue the process of fiscal consolidation and prioritization of its work, carefully evaluating its members' needs. Having said this, I wish to draw your attention to the fact that with the Council's decision to hold the Tenth Assembly in 2003, there is an urgent need for increased funding to fill vacant positions in Geneva. The Geneva Coordination Budget foresees an increase of 1.63 percent over against the 2000 budget. The Council has decided:

- a) that the Geneva Coordination Budget of CHF 15,074,550 for 2001 be approved, and
- b) that, in case of major changes in expected income, the General Secretary be asked to review the budget to avoid a deficit and present it to the Executive Committee for adjustment and approval.

To further stabilize income, the Council approved a 3 percent increase of membership fees for the years 2001 and 2002. The Council also encourages those member churches able to do so to pledge higher amounts in support of the LWF budget.

I thank you for your positive reaction to the proposed new formula recommended by the 1998 consultation on fair and effective criteria for the calculation of membership and assembly fees. I have received, with gratitude, letters from a number of member churches approving the increased membership contribution from their church. The decision is an important strategic step toward increasing the LWF's base capital.

Please note that only an increase in funding that is not earmarked will allow the LWF to implement decisions taken by the Council. This applies, for example, to ecumenical

dialogues, information, publication and promotion, and a number of other important programs that do not enjoy adequate financial support. This needs your urgent attention.

2. The Endowment Fund

In my report to the Council I pointed out that the Endowment Fund gives member churches an important instrument whereby the financial viability of LWF operations can be secured and the services of the Secretariat to the member churches can be ensured. I hope that the Council members will take the responsibility to interpret the Endowment Fund, leading to better understanding, in their own and in neighboring churches.

I wish to acknowledge once more with appreciation the contributions received from several member churches which, at the end of December 1999, amounted to CHF 2,285,254. A number of other member churches have confirmed their commitment to contribute to the Endowment Fund. To enable member churches to give more publicity to the Endowment Fund, the LWF is designing promotion material that will be made available in due course.

3. The Summary of Needs (SoN)

In addition to the approved Summary of Needs 2000-2002, the Council approved the following supplementary requests:

The new project in the Department for Theology and Studies, "Intercultural Deliberations on Ethical Questions", will be supported by a significant reduction in support of the China Study but will nonetheless require additional funding.

The supplementary requests from the Department for World Service cover assistance to Burundian refugees in Tanzania and to the country program in Zimbabwe.

The respective supplementary requests for the above are attached to this letter. I kindly encourage your favorable response.

NEW STUDY PROJECTS

With much pleasure, I share with you the Council's decision to appoint the Rev. Dr. Karen Bloomquist as Director of the Department for Theology and Studies (DTS). Dr. Bloomquist, from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, came to the Federation on 1 September 1999 as DTS Secretary for Church and Social Issues, a position that she will continue to hold in addition to the directorship.

You will be interested to learn that the Council affirmed three new DTS studies:

"Spiritual Life in Community"

"Holding Economic Globalization Accountable: Challenges and Possibilities through the Communion", and

"Inter-cultural Deliberation on Ethical Questions".

The first study will reflect theologically on spiritual life as it is lived out in local congregations in different cultural settings. The second will focus on the theological-ethical challenges arising from globalization and begin with a study process in member churches.

How might new possibilities be developed to counter the negative effects of globalization through our embodied "globalization" as a communion of churches? An outline, spelling out the study's objectives and its related activities is available from Dr. Bloomquist, E-mail address: kbl@lutheranworld.org. The third study will aim to facilitate consideration of difficult, often contentious, ethical questions facing churches in the communion.

STANDING COMMITTEE FOR WORLD SERVICE

In these ever-changing times, it is important that the Department for World Service (DWS) evaluate current structures periodically with a view to adapting its mandate. Situation changes often imply that conflicts and emergency appeals be scrutinized from different viewpoints. The Council, having received a report on this matter, accepted the General Secretary's recommendation to call a Standing Committee for World Service to strengthen and enable the DWS to respond to the member churches and related agencies with greater efficiency. The committee consists of ten members from related agencies and other aid organizations in various regions. The committee's terms of reference are stipulated in its mandate. It shall meet at least twice a year and serve from assembly to assembly. The committee shall be accountable to the Council to which it will report through the Program Committee for World Service.

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

The issue of violence against women has long been a priority on the agenda of the LWF. The Council, at its meeting last year, in line with the LWF's commitment as a communion to be inclusive, and in view of the World Council of Churches' Decade to Overcome Violence, again encouraged member churches to face the painful issue of violence in all forms particular to their context. The Council asked the Office for Women in Church and Society to propose ways to accompany churches in their efforts to address the issue.

In response, a draft document titled "Churches say 'No' to Violence against Women" was shared with the Program Committee for Mission and Development. A proposal was made to continue work on the document and present it to the Council next year for approval, prior to sharing it with the member churches. But in view of the urgency of the matter, the Program Committee and Council requested staff to incorporate the Program Committee's comments and share the document in draft form with the member churches for their immediate use and feedback, rather than delaying the process further. The Council also underlined the need to identify other ways to address the issue of violence against women.

The document will be shared with member churches shortly.

COMMUNICATION

With much pleasure, I inform you that the Council has confirmed the appointment of Rev. John A. Evenson as Director/Editor-in-Chief of the Office for Communication Services. Rev. Evenson assumed his new responsibilities at the beginning of August this year. Many of you will remember him as the director of the Namibian Christian Communications Trust, London and Windhoek, during the years of Namibia's struggle for independence. Since 1995, Rev. Evenson worked as Media Officer and Editor for the Church Mission Society (Anglican) in London.

In these times, when communication technologies are developing at breath-taking speed, organizations such as the LWF must pay special attention to keeping up to standard and portraying their profile to the outside world through appropriate means. One of these is through the World Wide Web (WWW) to which the LWF has subscribed and which has been in place since the signing of the Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification last year in Augsburg, Germany. This was a tremendous success. Making use of the WWW for other projects needs to be explored. The Council heard a report about the LWF Web site and its possibilities for expansion. The Council voted:

to ask the Executive Committee (in its capacity as LWF Personnel Committee) to consider the staffing of the Office for Communication Services (OCS) to assure a sustainable management and development of the LWF Web site, as a priority for the good of all LWF departments.

Should your church be in a position to contribute to this in a constructive way, either by providing additional funds or by sending an expert in this particular field, then kindly write to my office so that it can be brought to the attention of the Executive Committee.

The Council also voted in favor of a new policy for the promotion of and subscription to LWF publications that will be shared with you in due course.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS AND HUMAN RIGHTS

The Council received a compilation of reports from twenty-two member churches and one national committee on their involvement in promoting and defending religious freedom. It passed a resolution reaffirming the LWF's commitment to the promotion of religious freedom as a fundamental human right for all, and rejecting the misuse of religious diversity for political, military or other purposes. *This resolution is attached for your careful attention*. Please note the renewed invitation to member churches and other expressions of the LWF to provide additional information to my office on their involvement in promoting and defending religious freedom. I hope that member churches that have not so far responded will do so. The information received will be brought to the attention of the Council at its meeting next year for possible further action.

Regarding the situation in the Middle East, the Council affirmed the fundamental right of the Palestinian refugees to return to their places of origin and urged both parties, the Palestinian Authority and Israel, to fully comply with their respective commitments contained in the Oslo Agreements. *This resolution is attached*. Please help to work for a just peace in that area by promoting the Council's decision in your churches and respective governments.

ECUMENICAL AFFAIRS

Follow-up on the Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification is considered a major ecumenical project. The Council affirmed the LWF's commitment together with the Roman Catholic Church to continue their efforts toward reaching deeper and broader agreements on the meaning of justification for the life and teaching of the church, and on the ecumenical significance of the consensus reached.

I presented a Plan of Action to the Council for the follow-up of the Joint Declaration. Ecumenical work will continue on the understanding of "simul justus et peccator" and the role of good works in the life of faith. The interpretation of justification for human beings today will be followed up, as well as initiatives to clarify the broader biblical basis for the doctrine of justification. Regional and national work on the follow-up will be encouraged, with attention to the pastoral and liturgical dimensions. The results will be shared within the LWF and with the wider ecumenical community. An inner-Lutheran task force will be convened shortly to work on the long-term vision of the ecumenical work of the LWF and to prepare a plan for the continued coordination of the various activities contributing to the follow-up of the Joint Declaration. A report will be submitted for next year's Council meeting.

THE ROLE OF VICE-PRESIDENTS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS IN THE LWF

The Council adopted a paper that spells out the areas of responsibility and the specific tasks of LWF Vice-Presidents and Council Members. Although intended specifically for those in question, the paper is attached as information to member churches and their national committees.

NEW MEMBER CHURCHES

The Council welcomed three churches in Asia into full membership of the LWF, the:

Pakpak Dairi Christian Protestant Church (Gereja Kristen Protestan Pakpak Dairi [GKPPD])

The United Protestant Church (Gereja Protestan Persekutuan [GPP]) both in Indonesia and both members of the Communion of Churches in Indonesia, as well as the:

Evangelical Lutheran Church in Myanmar (Lutheran Bethlehem Church) a member of the Myanmar Christian Council.

The LWF now counts 131 member churches worldwide.

Prior to leaving for vacation during the month of August, I paid a visit to the Lutheran Church of Australia (LCA), an LWF Associate Member Church, and made my first visit to the Lutheran Church of New Zealand, a district of the LCA. The visit abounded with new encounters, speeches and a rich worship life, confirming the cultural diversity of our worldwide constituency. I am grateful for the invitation from both churches. I also very much appreciated an invitation from the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Iceland to attend their millennium celebrations of Christianity.

I look forward to hearing from you regarding those matters decided by the Council that are in need of attention and action by the member churches.

In closing, I wish to acknowledge the invitation from Bishop Munib Younan and his church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan, to hold the next Council meeting from 12-19 June 2001 in Bethlehem/Jerusalem. The Executive Committee will meet prior to this on June 10 in Amman. The Council expressed appreciation for, and voted in favor of this invitation at its meeting in Turku, Finland.

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Resolution adopted by the Council of the Lutheran World Federation

The Lutheran World Federation has observed with great concern the rising incidence of religious intolerance and related violence in many places around the world in which LWF member churches are present. The LWF reaffirms its commitment to the promotion of religious freedom as a fundamental human right for all, and rejects the misuse of religious diversity for political, military or other purposes.

In response to a request from the Ninth Assembly, the Council has received with appreciation reports from a number of member churches about their involvement in promoting and defending religious freedom. The Council deplores the instances of religious intolerance and associated violence raised in these reports, and welcomes the involvement of member churches in ecumenical and inter-faith initiatives to promote religious freedom for all.

The Council VOTED:

- to renew and extend the invitation to member churches and other expressions of the LWF to provide additional information to the General Secretary on their involvement in promoting and defending religious freedom, to enable such additional information to be brought to the attention of the Council at its next meeting, for possible further action;
- to request each member church and other expressions of the LWF to continue and deepen their efforts to promote mutual understanding and religious freedom for all and to address religious fundamentalism, including through ecumenical and inter-faith dialogue and cooperation, and relevant educational and awareness-raising initiatives;
- to encourage each member church and other expressions of the LWF to acquaint themselves with the United Nations and regional human rights mechanisms for the promotion of religious freedom, including the work of the UN Special Rapporteur on religious intolerance; and
- to ask the General Secretary to assist the member churches and other expressions of the LWF in acquainting themselves with such mechanisms through the provision of appropriate materials.

FREEDOM OF RELIGION

Statement adopted by the Ninth Assembly of the Lutheran World Federation Hong Kong, July 1997

No modern state that aspires to be respected as a democratic nation can ignore the issues of religious freedom and tolerance or continue to violate these fundamental human rights, which are enshrined in Article 18 of the United Nations International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. No religion or institution can propagate its own faith at the expense of the innate freedom of every human being to accept or to reject any religion. "Fundamentalism", whether political or religious, is contrary to the basic values of human dignity and freedom and often violates fundamental human rights.

We confess that religious people are often the worst violators of this noble principle.

Many nations have excellent laws to protect all aspects of religious freedom, but their implementation is impeded by ideological or fundamentalist principles.

As incidents of religious discrimination and intolerance appear to be increasing in all parts of the world, even in countries with a strong human rights tradition, the Ninth Assembly of the Lutheran World Federation recognizes the need to call all the member churches and the ecumenical community to redouble their efforts and to cooperate widely in promoting and defending religious freedom in their own societies and internationally.

On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1998, the member churches are requested to focus on religious freedom in the context of other economic, social, cultural, civil and political human rights:

- through prayers and intercessions, Bible studies and worship;
- through educational materials, seminars and public manifestations;
- by participating in programs of cooperation with people of other faiths; and
- by interceding with state authorities and religious authorities wherever necessary in defence of individuals or groups whose rightful religious freedoms are being curtailed or denied.

The Assembly asks the General Secretary to present a comprehensive report to the Council in the year 2000 on the involvement of the member churches in promoting and defending religious freedom.

ISRAEL/PALESTINE

Resolution adopted by the Council of the Lutheran World Federation

The Lutheran World Federation notes the latest developments in the Middle East, including the death of President Hafiz Al-Assad of Syria and the Israeli withdrawal from South Lebanon, and their possible impact on the negotiations between the Israeli and Palestinian authorities.

Bearing in mind the commitments made and the deadlines set for the conclusion of the final status negotiations later this year, the Council VOTED:

- to affirm the fundamental human right of the Palestinian refugees to return to their places of origin;
- to call for the situation of the Palestinian refugees to be fully and genuinely addressed in the final status negotiations, with a view to reaching a durable and consensual solution to their plight;
- to request the Palestinian Authority to urgently finalize the Constitution for the future State of Palestine, including adequate guarantees of religious freedom and pluralism;
- to urge both parties to fully comply with their respective commitments contained in the Oslo Agreements, including that of Israel to release all Palestinian political prisoners;
- to urge Israel to negotiate on the issue of Jerusalem on the basis of UN Security Council Resolutions 242 and 338 in the final status negotiations in order to secure a just peace in the Middle East; and
- to express its grave concern at the rapid increase over the past year in the rate of settlement expansion in the Occupied Territories.

THE ROLE OF VICE-PRESIDENTS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS IN THE LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION

(The following Statement of the Executive Committee is based on the proposals of three (out of four) appointed members of an ad hoc Committee: Ms Parmata Ishaya, President Huberto Kirchheim, and Bishop Julius Filo.)

Based on the theological concept of *communio*, the following areas of responsibilities and specific tasks describe the role of Vice-Presidents and Council members in the Lutheran World Federation (LWF).

1. Home Churches

Involvement of the above in the major activities and decision-making of their home churches is indispensable during their office in the LWF Council. If some of the above are not elected representatives of their respective churches, they should be, based on their election to the LWF Council, included at least as observers into decision-making bodies of their churches. The LWF President and General Secretary should secure their involvement into the decision-making bodies of their home churches.

2. Regions of the LWF

- 2.1 They should from their own initiative and with the support of the Geneva staff, be well informed about the current activities in their respective region and its member churches.
- 2.2 Vice-Presidents should be included in the visits of the President and the General Secretary in the region whenever possible and appropriate.
- Vice-Presidents should meet with Council members (and Advisors) in order to plan regional activities and enable regional implementation of LWF decisions. This should happen not only in relation to the Council meeting itself or occasional regional assemblies (prior to the LWF Assembly) but also between Council meetings.
- Vice-Presidents and Council members should be instrumental in the development of LWF national and regional committees (in situations in which several smaller churches live in different countries).
- 2.5 Vice-Presidents should visit the churches in their region, especially at the occasion of LWF meetings in the region.

3. LWF worldwide decision-making and implementation assistance

- The role of the above in LWF decision-making bodies (Assembly, Council, Executive Committee) is well described by the legal papers of the LWF and function well.
- 3.2 Between the respective meetings, Vice-Presidents and Council members should be involved in implementation processes in the following way:
 - They should be asked for their opinion and advice by LWF staff in issues
 pertaining to the area of their responsibilities, e.g. in case of staff appointments,
 development of the plan of visits, implementation of LWF decisions, and new
 perspectives.
 - Information flow on the implementation of LWF decisions from the LWF staff to the Vice-Presidents and the Council members is essential for the fulfillment of their role in the LWF."



1. CURRENT NEWS

I. Pulse polio program

Pulse polio immunization is a part of national effort to eradicate polio. program started was December 9, 1995.

break the chain of transmission every child under 5 years of age should be immunized.

In India 90% of the polio cases come from 4 burden states of U.P., Bihar, West Bengal & Delhi.

National Immunization days (NIDS) are being celebrated on November 5, December 5, 2000 and January 21, 2001.

In order to give the poliovirus the final 'heave & shove' towards its eradication from the country the Government and coalition partners flagged off their pulse polio program 2000 - 2001.

India hopes to reach zero polio cases by December this year. Though it concedes a spill over in its efforts for a few months longer, the statistics put out on the success of the pulse polio program that started in 1995 are heartening.

The number of polio cases has decreased dramatically from 1934 in 1998 to 121 in September, 2000.

II. <u>Malaria vaccine goes on trial</u>
British scientists have developed what could be the first effective vaccine against Malaria.

The first clinical trials of the vaccine will start in Africa.

If it works, the vaccine will be the best hope of defeating a disease, which claims more than a million lives a year.

The trials will be carried out in the Gambia by scientists from Oxford University.

Malaria the mosquito borne disease causes high fever, muscle stiffness and sweating. It is most prevalent tropical disease in the World. The Oxford team says tests of the vaccine on British volunteers

deliberately infected with malaria have already been successful.

Earlier vaccines were able to attack the parasite before it enters cells. The new vaccine will now be the first to target the disease once it enters the body cells.

If the trials of vaccine become successful, the vaccine could be available within 5 to 10 years.


III. ICDS

ICDS intervenes across the life cycle as early as possible to promote fulfillment of the rights of young children girls and women.

IV. Family Welfare Facts

The six major factors responsible for India's run away population growth despite elaborate family welfare programs and huge spending according to the Prime Minister are: -

- 1. Lack of political and popular will.
- Lack of universal access to basic health care.
- 3. High child mortality rate.
- Low literacy rate especially among women.
- 5. Persistence of high level of rural and urban poverty.
- 6. Inadequate awareness of options and contraceptive services.

2. <u>CHOTANAGPUR HEALTH &</u> <u>DEVELOPMENT PROJECT(CHDP)</u> <u>AMBATOLI (GOVINDPUR)</u> Project * No. 9511 from Project Manager Ms.Basanti Barla about CHDP's benefits in their community

- 1) CHDP project has helped women in gaining awareness related to health.
- 2) They are able to handle common ailments like diarrhoea with ORS and other herbal medicines. They treated children with diarrhoea in their community.
- 3) They have realised the importance of immunization and are following the schedule with out break.
- 4) 20 women have been trained in tailoring and are able to supplement to the family income.

5) Some are maintaining piggeries 15 pigs were given in the project area and the number has gone up to 20. They are able to earn income from them. Because of extra income there is improvement in their life style. The Project Manager feels if they are given small loans, there will be more development among women's group.

3. PCSA Desk

Workshops on evils of drug addiction and smoking were organised for various student groups of different churches. The main topics were how to combat and survive the substance abuse problems.

After the workshop, few students informed that they have stopped smoking. This is really encouraging note.

4. STAFF PROFILE

Mr.Royal Baxla: - He is working as Project Manager for CHDP for the last 4 years. He did his graduation from University of Ranchi. He underwent Community Health Training at Vikas Maitry and CRHP - in Jamkhed. Before joining CHDP, he worked for Church youth leadership, Agriculture Block Development at village level. He feels that for any field work proper training from the start would be an asset.

Mr. Yuhanna Pradhan: He is native of Kalimpong West Bengal. After graduation he joined CMAI in 1993 and worked in various capacities. He was posted in CHD in 1999 and he

underwent Community Health and Development Training, Jamkhed and had two weeks exposure to CHAD -Vellore projects.

At present, he is working as Project Officer in WCH&D projects Bhopal.

He is ever ready to learn and believes learning is a continuing process.

5. IMPORTANT EVENTS

- Video on M.P. and Bihar projects is almost ready and awaiting finishing touches. It will be screened in the conference of "Congregation Based Community Health" scheduled from 13th to 17th November, 2000 at Delhi.
