Billy Graham team Campaign Ranchi by Dr. Akbar Abdul Haqq from 4th Nov.
to 21st Nov. 1965.

The meeting was held on March 26th 1965 in the K.S.S. Office
G.E.L. Church Ranchi at 3.30 P.M.

OVER 5000 ATTEND DR. ABDUL HAQQ'S MEETINGS
SPIRITUAL MEETINGS AT RANCHI.

RANCHI (Bihar):

Over 5000 persons from every walk of life gathered on Friday last (Nov 5) evening at the St. Paul's Cathedral ground, Ranchi to welcome Dr. Akbar Abdul Haqq, an eminent scholar and evangelist from Chandigarh. He is here in connection with the Evangelistic Campaign jointly sponsored by the two main Protestant Churches of Chotanagpur viz., the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church and the Chotanagpur Diocese of the Church of India.

Dr. Akbar Abdul Haqq is scheduled to speak every evening at the St Paul's Cathedral ground till 21 st November on spiritual and moral subjects with which humanity is confronted in the present modern age. He is also programmed to address the student and business community of the city.

Addressing the faculty and students of the Ranchi University Colleges on Sunday afternoon in the University College premises, he called upon his audience to work for spiritual and moral values and to prepare themselves for the wholesome development of their lives. Speaking elaborately of the human achievements in the ~~the~~ fields of science and technology, he stated, that mankind has overcome old superstitions and have shown new truths ~~t~~ hitherto unknown to the human race. But it is a paradox, he said, that scientific achievements have also acquired new superstitions. One of the superstitions they have acquired is that there is no reality or truth beyond the scientific tests. He quoted some eminent scientists of the world to show that there are actually truths and realities which exist and cannot be subjected to test-tubes. The modern man involved in his superstition wants to test the existence of God for instance, which indicates his lamentable poverty in the world of spiritual and moral values.

Explaining further, he said, that beyond the physical phenomenon there is a phenomenon in which God lives and that there is a relationship between God and man. Psychologists have proved that in human brain there is a 'silent area' through which God speaks to man.

Dr. Haqq appealed to his audience to develop a true relationship with God, the Ultimate reality. He said that education according to Christianity is not complete unless man establishes this relationship with God. Christianity aims at abundant living wherein God becomes the master of the lives of mankind. He therefore held the view that scientific and technological advancement is incomplete unless spiritual advancement is made side by side.

Dr. Haqq is a member of the Billy Graham Team, who has just visited Beirut and Teheran where he drew large gatherings in his meetings. He has been visiting Ranchi at the invitation of the local Protestant Churches.

Shri N. Sanjiva Reddy, Minister of Steel and Mines, stated in the Lok Sabha that there were at present five large integrated mild steelworks in the country, three of which were being expanded. These steelworks were expected to yield a total production of 8.9 million tonnes steel ingots per annum on completion of their present expansion programme. He added that it was estimated that the demand for steel in the Fourth Five Year Plan would be of the order of 16.5 million tonnes of steel ingots. The existing steelworks by way of further expansions, as well as the Bokaro steel-works, were expected to yield between themselves, a total production capacity of about 15 million tons per annum. For the balance, it was proposed to set up a new steelworks of about 1.5 million tonnes. However, the entire steel development programme during the Fourth Plan was at present under review. —PIB

Educational Concessions To Children Of Defence Service Personnel Recommended

The Government of India have requested to the State Governments and Union Territories to extend a number of educational concessions to the children of the defence service personnel. Utilisation Of LIC Funds For Housing Schemes

Excess Of Annual Allocations To Be Sanctioned

The State Governments have been allowed to sanction housing projects substantially in excess of their annual allocations, so as to enable them to utilise the funds fully. This decision is a sequel to the representation made to the Government of India that owing to the time-lag between the sanctioning and completion of housing projects, the State Governments find it difficult to spend the entire amount of Life Insurance Corporation funds advanced to them during the same year. 

From The Air Front :—

These, Our Intrepid Airmen

FROM A FORWARD AIRBASE, Friday — The first business of an air force is to fly. And if Pakistan radio were to be believed the Indian Air Force should have been incapable of handling any air traffic or have many aircraft left to fly over the past week, before the cease-fire became operative on Thursday morning, writes a military observer from a forward airbase.

Yet it was evident from the screaming jet aircraft which greeted one, as one approached the perimeter of the airfield, that Pakistan's claims were as amusing as fanciful.

Our fighter aircraft took off at dawn to patrol our skies and assisted our Army, and they did not rest till sun down. This is not to say that Pakistan Air Force has not attempted to destroy our installations and damage the aircraft stationed here. There is evidence of a marauder's visits as also there is evidence of his inaccuracy in hitting the intended targets.

The enemy was left with no option but to approach this airfield stealthily at night; an over-confident first having come to grief, attempt by six Sabres for

for fear of attack, then one look at the activity on the base is sufficient to wash it away from one's eye for ever. Nothing could be more distant from the popular imagination than the calm with which our pilots executed their gallant and arduous duties, or the ceaseless efficiency with which our engineers and other ground officers and men kept the machines in flying worthy condition. The few planes that sustained damage in action were quickly repaired, made serviceable and back to meet the enemy fighters and bombers. This, in itself, must be a considerable morale breaker to the Pakistan Air Force which was under the impression in self-praise that it had damaged our aircraft before they could take off from the ground.

The senior officers at this forward airbase are fine leaders and, thus, thoughtful individuals. Flying is their profession and they have mastered it. Fighting is their duty and they have studi-

ed its implications and, after an encounter or two, could devise tactics against the deadly Sidewinder air-to-air missiles which the PAF's F-104s and F-86s carry as standard equipment. It speaks well of the ingenuity and acumen of our fighter pilots that they were able to outmanoeuvre this heatsealing, lethal missile which, literally, chases the target aircraft and which travels well near three times the speed of sound while their own aircraft travel only at speeds approaching MACH 1. They discussed these tactics with openness and it was encouraging to find just how quickly they had learnt from experience and translated their experience into action.

The Gnat pilots have a swagger of their own. They talk about the excellent job which the Bangalore factory has made of designing and modifying the original fighter. The Gnat was not a combat proven aircraft till this conflict. It must now surely rate as one of the best interceptors in its class anywhere. It took the Indian pilots to prove this to



Young, intelligent men from every religion, every caste and every State are members of this select Air Force community who have the honour to defend our skies and secure our freedom.

But the pilots often stated that such Pakistan counterparts as had the misfortune of having

If it were not for the skill and sense of duty of technical hands, it would not be possible to have such an effective fighting force in the air. The officer airmen relationship and mutual faith and respect that one notices at this forward air base, is what makes the Air Force a happy, united, fighting-fit family it is.

Government of India has prohibited the use of kerosene oil for any purpose other than cooking and illumination. This prohibition has been enforced by means of the Kerosene (Restriction on use) Order, 1965 issued under the Defence of India Rules. The State Governments have, however, been given powers to permit by special orders the use of kerosene for any other essential purposes. The above order does not apply to the use of kerosene by the armed forces of the Union. Any contravention of the order is punishable with im-

Police Personnel In Anti-Pak Operations

Family Pension Raised

The Family Pension of Police personnel killed or disabled in the current operations against Pakistan has been raised. It has been decided that as in the case of Service Personnel, the Police personnel, who were or are killed or disabled to the extent of 75 per cent in the current operations against Pakistan on or after August, 5, 1965, will be eligible to Family Pension to the extent of two-third of the salary for the period of seven years. Thereafter pension would be given at the rate which would be 50 per cent more than the current rate. —PIB

Two Paise Coins In Aluminiums Alloy To Be Issued

A new coin in the denomination of 2 paise in aluminium magnesium alloy will be issued from all Issue Offices of the Reserve Bank of India from October 1, 1965. Subsequently they will be issued from all agency banks of the Reserve Bank of India and

all Government treasuries and sub-treasuries. The new coin will be lighter in weight and bigger in size than the existing 2 paise coin which is in cupro nickel. The metal-composition of this coin is aluminium with 3.5 to 4 per cent magnesium. The coin is eight scalloped in shape with unmilled rim and its weight is 1.00 gramme. The obverse of the coin will bear the Lion Capital of the Ashoka Pillar with the words 'Bharat' in Hindi and 'India' in English inscribed on it.

Agreement Signed Of Soviet Assistance For Power Designs Organisation

A contract was signed at Delhi on September 20, with the Soviet organisation, Messrs. Technopromexport, Moscow, for technical assistance for the Thermal Designs Organisation of the Central Water and Power Commission. This contract has been concluded in pursuance of the agreement reached on June 28, 1965, between Dr. K. L. Rao, Minister for Irrigation and Power and Mr. V. A. Sergeev, Deputy Chairman, State Committee of Foreign Economic Relations,

USSR, during Dr. Rao's recent visit to USSR. Under the agreement, five Soviet specialists in designing thermal power stations will be deputed to work as consultants in the Central Water and Power Commission for a period of three years. They will assist in drawing up designs, standards, norms and guides necessary for the effective development of the Designs Organisation. —PIB

Special Family Pension For Defence Personnel Killed In Action

Government of India have decided that the families of all persons belonging to the Defence Forces killed in action on the front from August 5, 1965 onwards will be entitled to the special family pension equal to two-thirds of the last pay drawn for a period of seven years and thereafter at fifty per cent over the existing rate of special family pension applicable to them. These orders will also be applicable to disability pension in respect of all persons injured in action on the front and whose disability is hundred per cent.





79) While the structure of the central organization remains as it is, the functions differ. For example, members of local congregation go to the centrally sponsored programmes not as delegates and to listen to what they are told, but the leaders of the centre go to the congregation programmes at the latter's invitation to see and help the work of the congregation.

80) This reversal is absolutely essential, for in my own experience of twenty years of church life, the member of the congregation was never aware of anything that was happening at the centre and above them. For example, the ordinary member of my church including the lay leaders, knew nothing of the vital issue of the Lutheran Church joining the C.S.I. although there have been negotiations for over 10 years.

81) I am aware of many lacunae in this structure of parish and central organization. But my main idea in discussing the whole programme of evangelism within the terms of the life and mission of the local congregation is to suggest action in this direction rather than keep it in a permanent state of debate, discussion and consideration at national and international assemblies and conferences. In one word, what I have suggested in relation to the missionary task and the method of carrying it on, is through "an ecclesiastical syndicalism". A beginning can be made in one congregation as a pilot project in each church.

82) To conclude, let me say, the time has come to prepare a new dictionary of phrases that have been in use in the work of evangelism during the past two or three centuries. Words like missionary, mission compound, mission station, mission centre, preaching, evangelism, evangelist, pastor "ends of the earth", "regions beyond", laymen, missionary task, function of the church, function of the mission, secular society, secular services, all need a completely different interpretation, if they should mean anything to the modern society.

83) I am suggesting that the present hierarchical structure of the church and the mission should be physically turned topsy turvy. This needs vision, courage and above all repentance on the part of every individual associated with this great enterprise of God. We need to turn to God and unload our burdens of power, prestige, intransigence material advantages, etc., at the foot of the Cross and take the Cross ourselves and follow Him and beckon unto many others "to do likewise".



KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Rev. Dr. Marsallan Bage

- 1) It is a great privilege for me to speak to you this evening. We have assembled here for the Second All Asia Lutheran Conference. It was in 1956, almost eight years ago that the first All-Asia Lutheran Conference met at Madras, also in India, but far to the south of this place. This time, most of us were anxiously looking forward to meeting for this conference in Indonesia, where we would have had the privilege of being the guests of the Batak Protestant Christian Church (H.K.B.P.), which is the biggest Lutheran Church in Asia. Unfortunately, due to various political situations namely, that the delegates of some countries could not have entered Indonesia, this conference is being held again in India for the second time. But, this time you are not in the South; you are in the North.
- 2) This place, Ranchi, is the summer capital of Bihar, one of the Federal States of this Country. This billy part, whose centre is Ranchi, is called Chotanagpur and this plateau was originally inhabited by the tribals. However, since a few years this has become a very important part of India. On account of its rich mineral resources it is rapidly changing into an industrial belt of India. Rourkela and Bhilai Steel Plants in the South-West, Jamshedpur and Durgapur in the East have already come into existence. Hatia Heavy Engineering Factory very near to Ranchi is under construction and has already started a little production. Bokaro steel plant is going to be built in the North in the very near future. Thus Chotanagpur is definitely going to be a highly industrialised belt, or the "Rhr of India". This is why hundreds of people from all parts of India are today migrating into these parts. There are rapid social and economic changes going on here.
- 3) Here you are the guests of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church. This Church has been struggling for self-support since 1929, the year when she took over the administrative autonomy of the Church. The Church is trying to go along with the rapid changes taking place in this area. She has started Technical Training Centre at Fudi and one Agricultural Training Centre at Khutitoli. The old printing Press has been modernised by installing new upto-to-date printing machines. It will be of interest to you to know that those of you who have your accomodation in this Compound have been provided with quite new beds which have all been made in the Technical Training Centre, Fudi. You will be the first to test whether they are strong enough ! I have been informed that our Agricultural Training Centre at Khutitoli will be supplying us with eggs and some vegetables. If so, you will have the chance to taste and to find out whether they are good enough for an open market. This all means that the G.E.L.Church along with its newly begun institutions, is very glad to have you all here at Ranchi for this Conference. I, on behalf of the G.E.L.Church and on behalf of these institutions extend to you our hearty welcome and hope that you all will feel quite at home at this place.
- 4) It is in fact a matter of great joy that we, from so many countries have again been able meet. We are assembled here, delegates not only from the ten Lutheran Churches of India;




