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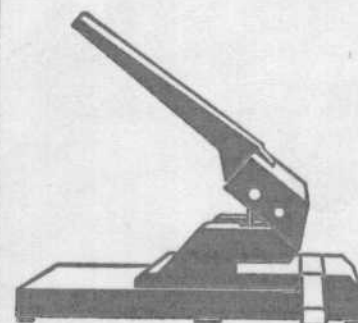
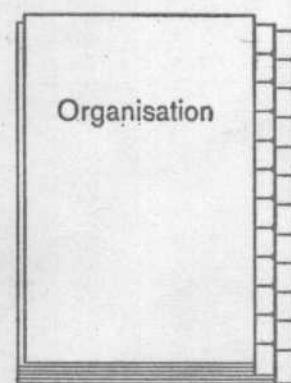

Subject:- Education Policy of the Gossner Church.

Dear Brother/Sister,

Since a long time the Gossner Church was trying to adopt certain policy on education in the G.E.L. Church, but without success. But fortunately the recent visit of Dr. Grothaus enabled the Board of Education to adopt a policy on education. The minutes of the Education Board dated 28.10.72, and the report of the Commission set by the KSS regarding education policy matters dt. 5-6 Nov.72 are enclosed herewith for your information and perusal, as Appendix I & II, both approved by the KSS vide item No. 37 of the KSS minute of its meeting dated 3-8 Nov.72, which reads:- "Much discussion was made on the priority list of the Education Commission regarding projects and final list was made as follows:-

I (a) Topmost priority for salary to teachers.

For this the KSS decided to create the Central Education Fund for general education. For the Middle and Primary schools the fund of Rs. 100000/-, and for High schools and Training school Rs. 500000/- will be needed

(b) Salary for two Executive Officers, Office establishment, salary for staff and office equipments etc. One Executive officer will supervise the Middle and Primary schools and the other will supervise High schools. The expenditure on these two officers will be Rs. 7000/- per year.

Thus to get such a huge amount we appeal to you to help us in creating the General Education fund, and in managing the schools in a proper way. Please help bear the expense on the above projects so that the Church may be able to serve its people through education.

II. The list of Major projects and Minor projects approved by the KSS are also given below. In this connection I have to say that the plans for two to three years be made so that the construction and repair works on buildings may be completed.

Secondly the priority list for projects was made after a good deal of deliberation. The list of the projects are made in such a way that it covers the entire area of the GEL Church. If the work is not done according to the priority list then there will be misunderstanding among the people, as the GEL Church consists of members from different communities. The KSS does not want that such a situation should arise, and it does not want such work where projects be taken up in one particular area. Therefore I request you that while considering the projects to be sanctioned the priority list approved by the KSS be taken into mind, so that peace and unity of the members of different communities in the GEL Church may not be perturbed.

4. Science building at Takarma H. School
5. Pumping set and compound wall at Marcha H. School
6. Bethesda Girls High School-- completion of school hall and renovation of H. school buildg.
7. Gumla-- Fence and Science apparatus.
8. Bethesda Womens Trg. school-- development of land.
9. Chainpur- Pumping set and fencing.

Out of the above mentioned priority list the following have already been submitted to CDS/LWF.

1. Project request for Gelel Ras Girls High School, Govindpur
CDS-P-40
2. Kinkel High School-----CDS-234
3. Womens College hostel Khunti---CDS-P-70
4. College Boys hostel Ranchi----CDS-P-36

The above priority list are for first phase which the GELC wants to complete in three years with the help from abroad. The Education Commission which produced the list of first phase has also been requested to submit list for the second phase in future.

This is a great step taken by the Gossner Church to maintain its schools and to reform them which it cannot do without the outside help. Your attention towards the Gossner Church undertakings will be a great help. So the step was taken in the right moment with the help of Prof. Dr. Grothaus.

We appeal to the CDS and the Gossner Mission to extend their helping hand, sympathetically so that we may proceed further in the service of the Lord through education.

REPORT OF COMMISSION (POLICY)

The Commission appointed by the 2nd Headmasters' Conference, the same duly endorsed and approved by the Board of Education and the KSS respectively met under the Chairmanship of Sri. H. Samad, Chairman Board of Education on 5th and 6th November. Dr. Grothaus was present on both days to guide and help us in our deliberations.

Aim of the Commission: The aims of the Commission have been to work out details of the entire educational programmes on the lines prescribed at the page 3 sl. number (a) to (i) in the minutes of the Education Board held at Gumla on 28th October. For want of sufficient and suitable time the commission could not cover all the points as detailed at the afore-said page 3.

Therefore the Commission limited itself to two main points namely:

- (1) formulating policy regarding education in the church and
- (2) setting priorities.

1. Policy for Education: Policies formulated by the Commission are as follows:-

- a. That we maintain all the existing schools - Primary, Middle High and training.
- b. That door for opening new schools is kept open considering future needs and situations.
- c. That we emphasise on opening of kindergarten schools at all important Church stations, keeping them entirely free from any outside interference and control. (Government)
- d. That adult education be taken up.
- e. That projects be taken up Anchal wise or in another manner be terminated by the KSS.
- f. That wherever possible combined program for constructing halls, science buildings, playgrounds etc. be planned for a family of schools.

2. Ways for maintaining our institutions:

- a. That salary for teaching staff be so arranged as to ensure regular and timely payment.
- b. That buildings be built a new or improvement be made to existing school buildings to house our institutions.
- c. That hostels for pupils and other purposes be erected.
- d. That resources be developed.

3. Setting of priorities: I. Criteria for priorities:-

- a. That new buildings for such schools as have no resources to maintain them be not constructed.
- b. That schools intending to introduce vocational training be given priority.
- c. That centers of learning with possibilities for development be given priority.
- d. That schools which undertake special training in religious subjects with a view to produce Candidates for Pastors for the church be given priority.
- e. That places which have special situation from numerous points of view be given priority.

II. Priorities set are as hereunder:

- a. That teachers salary be given topmost priority.
- b. That hostels for boys and girls separately be constructed.
- c. That each Anchal be given on major project such as constructing a new school building or development of resources.
- d. That minor projects such as science apparatus, teaching aids, furniture and equipments be made available to all schools at a time.

4. Powers and Functions of Executive Officers: It was agreed that powers and functions of the executive officers be defined by the board and be approved by the KSS.

5. Relationship between Education-Department and the Board of Education Agreed that relationship between the Department and the board be defined by the Board and approved by the KSS.

6. The Commission could not give a final shape to priorities for want of time. It is left to the KSS. Some supplementary notes are submitted by Dr. N. Minz and Dr. Grothaus to complete the recommendations.

THE MINUTE OF THE EDUCATION BOARD
HELD AT GUMLA ON 28.10.72.

The Education Board met in the office of the Headmaster, Lutheran High school Gumla beginning with a word of prayer led by the Chairman.

The following members were present:-

1. Mr. H. Samad, Chairman 2. Mr. A. Lakra, member 3. Mr. Th. Ekka, member 4. Mr. P. S. Barjo, member 5. Mr. J. S. Topno member 6. Rev. N. Ekka Secretary.

The minute of the 2nd Headmasters' conference was put on the table. After going through the contents of the minute the following actions were taken.

(1) Resolved to adopt the findings of the 2nd headmasters conference held at Chainpur and endorse to the KSS for approval and the further needful. The findings read as follows:-

"This conference pronounces that the church educational institutions are by their very existence and nature centre of creative activities and are God's instruments to transform the human society by accepting the challenges of the time. Our society to-day is faced with rapid industrialisation and its allied activities on the one hand and the rapid socio-economic changes on the other. The church has a special role to get itself involved in this situation in order to witness Christ in all activities of the society. We are aware that the country which is being prepared to achieve socialism has also greatly being influenced by radicalism in the socio economic field. The church as an instrument of God must play its role in consonance with the teachings of the Lord. The church must give emphasis on the positive value of Christian stewardship in its various activities in the society. It must teach social education and to this end we feel that Christian educational institutions must be maintained and fully equipped for their positive role.

" This conference, therefore lays down the following aims and objectives which are to be achieved through the educational programme of the church namely:- (a) Total formation of the human person. (b) Welfare of the society of which he is a member. (c) Building up of a world that is fully and (basically) human and at the same time open to the demands of the extra human. Stress is laid on the formation of the human person in the context of the society he lives in.

How this is to be done is further clarified:- (a) Training of personal freedom and self discipline. (b) Cultivation of positive quality of mind that can take on the challenges of adult living. (c) Personal skills for earning a living and contributing to the welfare of the society.

Society is never static. It changes continually. Education is the most powerful agent in determining social changes. It is therefore the responsibility of christian education to bring about social transformation so as to bring about a happy welfare society. Christian education therefore endeavours--to promote social justice--to wipe out distinctions of race or class--to proclaim by word and deed equality and brotherhood of all men.--to wage war on attitudes which tend to isolate certain privileged groups from their less fortunate fellow countrymen.

Consistent with its objectives the building up of a happy home christian education seeks to develop in man personal intelligence and skill, making him creative and enabling him to perfect the things around him and harness them to his needs.

(II) Resolved to adopt the recommendations of the conference to the KSS endorse to the KSS for approval and the needful.

The recommendations read as follows:-

That a department for University, Secondary primary education and training be established under the KSS. In its functions it will have two executive officers who will be full time employees of the church. The department will have an independent budget under the KSS for the purpose of administration. This department will be Central administrative body. The present Board of Education will be a link between this department and the KSS. It is understood that the Board of Education and the KSS will not interfere the general administration of the Education Department.

The Department of Education will maintain a central Education Fund for its developmental and emergency work. For its administration the Department will have its own budget. It will be a sort of revolving fund.

It is acknowledged that under the present constitutional set up the Ilakas are directly responsible for the maintenance and up-keep of the educational institutions. Similarly the Headquarters Congregation is responsible for the Schools within its jurisdiction. This is in keeping with the conception of christian stewardship in which the individual member of the congregation express themselves towards their responsibilities.

The Department will have to prepare projects for generating funds for its programme. Such projects should include among other things the project of constructing shops for rent in places wherever possible.

The Department under the Education Board will have the following responsibilities:-

- (a) It has to determine priorities in its programme.
- (b) It has to locate and identify the real needs of Institutions.
- (c) It has to plan and implement vocational courses.
- (d) It has to arrange regular courses for the training of teachers.
- (e) It has to maintain close contact and proper relationship with Govt. Departt.
- (f) It has to find out the possibility of inter-church aid.
- (g) It has to implement religious curriculum in the school. This will also include revision of the curriculum if and when needed.
- (h) It should have a programme of good Christian hostels.
- (i) The department should correspond with the different agencies through the Pramukh Adhyaksh.

This conference strongly feels the necessity of appointing a Commission consisting of seven persons namely:- Sri.N.E.Horo M.P. 2. Dr.N. Minz, 3. Sri. H. Samad, 4. Sri.C.A.Tirkey, 5. Sri. A.Lakra, 6. Miss H. Bhengra, 7. Miss S.M.Bodra to work out the details of the entire educational programme aforesaid. The KSS is requested to immediately approve this commission in its first meeting.

The conference recommended to create one Central Education Funds for high schools , training school , primary and Middle Schools.

For raising funds for the Central Education Fund the conference decided to implement the decision of the last conference and to use the following means on Ilaka level -- 1. Contributions from bigger Ilakas @ Rs.50/- and from small Ilakas Rs.25/- per annum.
2. Special offering on one Sunday once a year.
3. The allotment of landed property to schools.

The fourth means of approaching old students for contributions should be used for raising fund for the schools. It was suggested to make a list of all the ex-students and to approach for contributions.

The following priorities were enumerated for the use of Central Education Fund:-

1. Salaries of Executive officers & Office - expenses.
2. Salary to High Schools and Training School.
3. Development projects including primary and middle schools.
4. Teachers' training (Refresher course)

It was decided to hold the next Headmasters' Conference at Khutitoli during Puja holidays. The proceedings of the Conference were closed with vote of thanks by the Chairman of the Education Board on behalf of the Conference.

Eine Stützung von designierten Fonds für Mitarbeitervergütungen, die möglichst zentral verantwortet werden, halten wir für möglich und ratsam.
12. Zur Zeit scheint die Lehrerbesoldung besonders problematisch zu sein und durch die sehr verzögerte Auszahlung der staatlich zugesagten Zuschüsse schlecht zu funktionieren. In zweiter Linie kommen die Theologen und Katechisten.

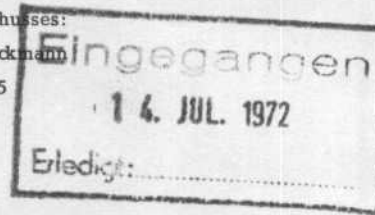

Am 22./23. Februar 1972 hat der Deutsche Evangelische Missionsrat (DEMR) beschlossen, einen ad hoc-Ausschuß "Hilfe für Partnerkirchen in Übersee" einzusetzen, der sich mit der Notlage der Mitarbeiter in vielen mit Ihrer Arbeit verbundenen Kirchen befassen soll. Am 30. März 1972 hat der Präsident der Gossnerkirche an Sie und Dr. Eberhard ein Schreiben gerichtet, in dem er über die Einrichtung eines zentralen Education-Fonds in der Gossnerkirche berichtet und um Zuschüsse von deutscher Seite bittet.

Die Einrichtung eines solchen zentralen Education-Fonds halte ich für notwendig. Dieser Fonds soll die Regelmässigkeit der Auszahlung der Gehälter an die etwa 600 Lehrer der Gossnerkirche gewährleisten. Der grösste Teil der Gehälter dieser Lehrer basiert auf Regierungszuschüssen, die aber mit zwölf bis fünfzehn Monaten Verspätung und in Ausnahmefällen gar nicht ausgezahlt werden. Der zentrale Education-Fonds soll den Gehaltsausfall bis zur Auszahlung der Regierungszuschüsse zwischenfinanzieren und gleichzeitig eine zentrale Besoldung der Lehrer ermöglichen, die wiederum eine zentrale Planung in pädagogischer und administrativer Hinsicht voraussetzt. Professor Dr. Grothaus/Flensburg will im Herbst dieses Jahres die dafür nötigen Vorbereitungen treffen.

Zur gleichen Zeit ist durch die AG-KED ein Plan für interne Kirchenunterstützung in Vorbereitung, der sich mit den eben beschriebenen Fragen beschäftigen wird. Zu Ihrer Kenntnisnahme füge ich den Durchschlag eines Vermerks, den ich für das Mitglied des "EAGWM-ad hoc-Ausschusses für interne Kirchenunterstützung in der Dritten Welt", Dr. Christian Berg, geschrieben habe, bei.

Ihnen, liebe Frau Urbig, will ich diese Information mit der Bitte geben, diese Verhandlungen im deutschen Raum abzuwarten, damit - hoffentlich schon im Herbst - eine konzertierte Aktion möglich ist.

Betrifft: EAGWM-ad hoc-Ausschuss für interne Kirchenunterstützung
in der Dritten Welt.

Das Memorandum der EAGWM zur Problematik der Kirchenunterstützung in der Dritten Welt gibt in ausgezeichneter Weise einen Überblick über die anstehenden Fragen.

Die angestrebte Erarbeitung eines Konzepts für die Hilfsmassnahmen birgt die Gefahr, die sehr unterschiedliche Situation in den Überseekirchen zu nivellieren. Die je besondere Lage dieser Kirchen ist die Ausgangsbasis für Aktionen und nicht ein allgemein gültiges Schema, das die Gebergremien ausarbeiten. Jede Kirche hat spezifische theologische, administrative und finanzielle Probleme zu überwinden, und sie wird selbst die Fragen zu beantworten haben, die in dem Memorandum unter 1 - 3 und 6 - 7 gestellt werden.

Allerdings wird man mit den Unterstützungsmassnahmen nicht so lange warten können bis die Überseekirchen diese Fragen gelöst haben.

Für die Evangelisch-Lutherische Gossnerkirche in Indien, die als ein gutes Beispiel für eine arme, aber doch selbstverantwortliche Kirche gelten kann, sind folgende Feststellungen zu treffen:

1. Direkthilfen für Gehälter der im Verkündigungsdienst stehenden Personen sind weder erbeten noch erwünscht, da seit vielen Jahrzehnten die Gemeinden für diese Ausgaben verantwortlich sind.
2. Direkthilfen für nicht im Gemeindedienst stehende Mitarbeiter (Institutionen) sind nach den Erfahrungen der vergangenen Jahrzehnte nicht ratsam, damit diese Institutionen im Bewusstsein der Gemeinden als eigene Unternehmungen erhalten bleiben.
3. Weil solche Institutionen die Finanzkraft der Kirche übersteigen, sind dennoch Hilfsmassnahmen besonderer Art vorzusehen.
4. Solche Institutionen sind die theologischen Ausbildungsstätten der Gossner Kirche und ihre Schulen.
5. Bei diesen Ausbildungsstätten geht es vorrangig um die Sicherung der Gehälter für Dozenten und Lehrer sowie um Unterhaltszahlungen für Theologiestudenten.

6. Seit drei Jahren hat die Gossnerkirche eigene Aktivitäten zur Finanzierung der Personalkosten entwickelt, indem sie eingerichtet hat:
 - a) einen Fonds für theologische Erziehung,
 - b) einen zentralen Erziehungsfonds (für Lehrergehälter).
7. In diese beiden Fonds sind von Gemeindeopfern Beträge eingezahlt worden, die nicht für die z.Zt. laufenden Unkosten verwandt werden, sondern auf Sparkonten gelegt wurden. Das Ziel ist die Erreichung eines so starken Fonds, dass von den Zinsen in Zukunft mindestens ein grosser Teil der laufenden Unkosten gedeckt werden kann.
8. Es wäre sehr zu empfehlen, dass anlässlich der geplanten Massnahmen in Deutschland diese beiden Fonds aufgefüllt werden würden, und zwar in der Weise, dass die Gemeinden der indischen Kirche gleichzeitig ermutigt werden, eigene Beiträge - wenn auch bescheidener Art - hinzuzufügen.
9. Da die theologische Ausbildung in der Gossnerkirche z.Zt. jährlich DM 50.000,-- kostet, ist die Kalkulation möglich, dass der Fonds die Summe von rd. DM 500.000,-- im Laufe der nächsten zehn Jahre als endgültige Höhe erreichen sollte.
10. Die Fixierung des Fonds für die Erziehungsarbeit ist erst im Herbst dieses Jahres möglich, wenn ein Plan vorliegt, der die zukünftige Erziehungsarbeit der Gossnerkirche exakt beschreibt. Der Fonds soll die regelmässige Auszahlung der Lehrergehälter sichern, die durch die sehr unregelmässige Zahlung der Zuschüsse seitens der Regierung gefährdet wird.

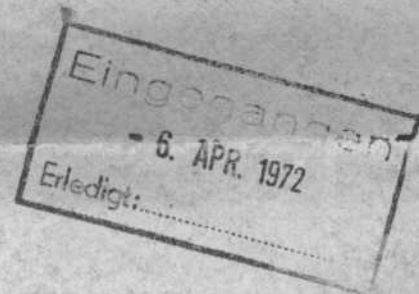



Dear Brother Seeberg,

Congratulation to you for your being elected as Director for Gossner Mission. I received your letter dated 3rd January '72 in time. By the time I returned from there the Director went to Poona. He will come back after about a week. As such my desire to consult him and then ~~reply~~ reply to you seems to be too late. Under the above circumstance now I have decided to fix the date for our meeting of the FTTC Governing Body by myself alone. Pramukh Adhyaksh has supplied you with a programme during your visit to India. Keeping it in view, I want to intervene a little in that programme. MINUTES OF THE HEADMASTERS' CONFERENCE HELD ON 16th AND 17th NOV.71.

The conference started with hymn No.105 and a Prayer led by Pramukh Adhyaksh Rev. B. Minz. Mr. H. Samad, Chairman, Education Board, GEL Church was on the Chair. After prayer, the inaugural speech was made by the Pramukh Adhyaksh.

The Chairman asked for the report of Schools. The report of each School was presented vide form No.126. On hearing the reports of Schools two points were put for discussion:-

- (1) The ownership of Schools.
- (2) The financial aspect of Schools.

The Chairman called upon for discussion on the ownership of Schools. It was stated that in the beginning the Ilakas took the initiative of starting and running the schools and up till now it was the understanding that Ilakas have been supporting the schools. But from the reports of the Heads of the Institution it was found that Ilakas have failed to realise this responsibility.

(1) So, it was resolved that let the Ilakas realise the responsibilities of running the Institution, and the centre should guide the Anchals and Ilakas if and when necessary, on this matter.

- (2) Financial aspect of Schools:-

From the reports of the Heads of the Institution it was found that all the schools are running on deficit. The current deficit on salary due up to October 1971 was calculated, which is approximately Rs.150,000/-. The financial position of different schools was discussed and it was found necessary to request the K.S.S to make arrangements for the payment of this current deficit as soon as possible.

(a) It was resolved that each school to submit to the centre a statement of the Govt. Grant which has not been received since the schools have got half free studentship upto March 1971, to persue the Govt. for payment.

After discussion it was found necessary to create funds to meet the monthly requirements of schools.

(b) Resolved that a central Educational fund for High schools and Training school be created, so that Loans may be given to the schools from this fund due to untimely payment of Govt. Grants to schools.

(c) A sub-committee of three members was formed to draft the terms and conditions for giving Loan. The members were Dr. M. Bage, Mr. M.P. Kongari and Mr. P.D. Lakra. Dr. M. Bage was elected as convener. The draft was put before the committee and was approved which is as follows:-

Central Educational Fund for G.F.L. Church High School and Training School.

Continued.....

1. There shall be an education fund in the Centre under the disposal of the KSS, which the KSS shall operate on advice of the Education Board of the G.E.L. Church.
2. Such a fund shall be created with the help of donations or subscriptions received from friends and church agencies inside as well as outside India.
3. A special account with one of the Scheduled Bank at Ranchi shall be opened where such money shall be kept.
4. Loans shall be paid to G.E.L. Church High schools and Training school with a view to ensure regular payment of monthly salary to the school staff on the following conditions:-
 - (a) The school applying for such loan must have prior ~~regeg-~~ ^{rege-} ~~ation~~ ^{rege-} ~~ation~~ by the Education Board of the GEL Church.
 - (b) The loan shall be paid by the Centre only if the Managing Committee resolves to apply for such loan authorising the headmaster and the Secretary of the school to sign on the declaration form jointly on behalf of the M.C.
 - (c) The maximum amount of loan payable to a High school shall be up to 50% of the total amount of salary payable to the staff per month. The loan so sanctioned shall be drawn by the Secretary of the school.
 - (d) The loan shall be paid to the Institution as required either per month or once in four months, but in no case the loan payable at a time shall exceed the amount payable for four months.
 - (e) There shall be a declaration form signed by the Secretary and the Headmaster of the school assuring that the loan shall be refunded after the Govt. grants are received.
 - (f) The loan taken must be refunded before the end of each financial year by the Secretary of the school.
 - (g) The loan shall not be paid to a High School and Training school which have not paid up the loan taken in the previous financial year.
The High Schools which are not getting Govt. Grant shall not be entitled to receive the loan.

The declaration form shall be as follows:-

" Declaration form for drawing Loan from Central Educational Fund."

We hereby jointly declare that we shall refund the loan of an amount of _____ immediately after receipt of Govt. Grant to our school on or before the end of the financial year.

- d/ The different ways and means of creating central educational fund were discussed and following means of raising funds were decided:-
- (1) Yearly contribution from Ilakas--big Ilakas Rs.50/- annually
 - (2) Annual subscription from teachers @ Re.1/-per year.
 - (3) Friends abroad may be approached for donation.

The matter of raising school fund also was discussed and decided that by following means be used to create school fund:-

- (1) Special offering on one Sunday once a year.
- (2) By approaching old students for contribution.
- (3) By celebrating school day.
- (4) The members also recommended that the landed property be allotted for the schools and for this the KSS may be approached.

Discussing on other matters it was felt necessary that effort should be made as soon as possible for the declaration of Minority school.

Resolved that reports from Radshik High School, Tezpur, Assam and Rajgangpur GEL Church High school be collected on No.126 form.

- (5) The committee decided to hold the conference of the Heads of the institutions atleast once a year convened by the Board of Education. It was decided to hold the next meeting at Chainpur.
- (6) The conference recommended that the point of holding Middle Board Examination on church level after the abolition of M. B. Examination considering that the standard of High Schools depends upon the students coming from Middle schools and for the uniformity of standard.
- (7) Considering on the religious ^{instruction} institution in schools it was decided that there should be a correction of Syllabus for religious ^{instruction} institution, and this should be entrusted with the Education Board. The revision of Syllabus may be made as soon as possible and be sent to different schools by Febr. 1972. The Board of Education may also arrange for the training on religious ^{instruction} institutions for teachers.
- (8) Discussing on the equipment of schools it was resolved that minimum requirements of schools be serially made and submitted to the Education Board through Mr. C. A. Tirkey.

All the members of the conference accorded their gratefulness to the Pramukh Adhyaksh Rev. B. Minz and Mr. H. Samad, Chairman Education Board for convening this conference and their full cooperation in finding ways and means of solving the problem of the schools.

The conference closed with a prayer by Dr. M. Bage.

Dear Rev. Topno,

The Rev. W. Schaeffer who is one of the pastors of the congregation to which I belong has given me a letter he recently received from Mr C.S.R. Topno. I am sending you a photostat copy of the same for information.

For many years an old women circle of our congregation by weekly collections made it possible to transfer quite a remarkable amount to India in order to support the cost of studies of Mr Topno. They never questioned the procedure that their money went as a private contribution to an individual person without the guidance of the appropriate authorities, i.e. the GEL Church. When I came to know about this a year ago I suggested that they should contact the Pramukh Adhyaksh before a new instalment be sent to Mr Topno. Rev. B. Minz replied that the whole matter was a private deal between the congregation here in Berlin and Mr Topno leaving the old ladies without any advice for further action. Now they are confronted with a new request for the modest amount of 3.000,- (threethousand) Rupies only to finance another academical attempt of this Mr Topno. You may imagine that everyone is absolutely disturbed about this proposal. How is it possible that a pastor with BD certificate doesn't find a place where to serve as a preacher in such a widespread church like yours when on the other side donor agencies are approached for financial help for theological education by the same authorities? What an impression of the ability of the church offices is given by the statement that inspite of the appointment of the KSS a church servant seems to be like a job seeker? For the people here in Germany Mr Topno is not somebody individual but a member of the GEL Church and whatever he does or asks or writes is done - at least for the reader here - on behalf of his church. You will certainly agree that the final request for some anonymous crippled man adds to the suspicion that he considers the addressee of his letter a milking cow.

Therefore, dear Rev. Topno, could you please ask Mr. C.S.R. Topno to take up his office as pastor or whatever you decide suitable for him as soon as possible and explain to him what he by his impertinent requests did against the reputation of the GEL Church as a whole and the clergymen especially. Of course I do what I can to rectify the wrong picture he has painted of the many extraordinary kind and reliable friends of the Gossner Church I ever met. But the taste of a whole meal can be spoiled by a single grain of bad massala.

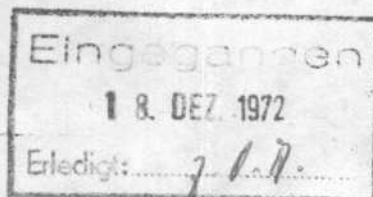

In my memo to you of 18 November 1972 I indicated I would keep you informed of any action which the LWF takes with regard to the possible tightening of currency restrictions in India.



We have decided that as far as the Department of Church Cooperation is concerned, we will transfer that assistance for 1973 for which we have assurances.

Re: Tax on voluntary contributions

We were recently informed of legislation (Finance Law, 1st April 1972) regarding income tax on voluntary contributions to institutions. Therefore, we see it as being of the utmost importance that the G.E.L. Church register the Central Education Fund in the manner prescribed.


The legal definition of income has been extended to include voluntary contributions to charitable trusts or institutions. In short, to obtain an exemption, an application must be made to the Commissioner of Income Tax before 1st July 1973. In cases where the total income of the institution exceeds Rs. 25,000.--, the accounts must be audited annually by a chartered accountant. There are, of course, many fine points and, for this reason, we are sending Mr. S. Bhengra a copy of this letter and also the information we have at hand on the subject.

It is stipulated that contributions to be exempted must be received with the specific direction that they are to form part of the "corpus" of the trust or institution. We shall see to it that all future contributions be made in this manner.

Please keep us informed on progress and developments in this matter.

Dear Mr. Bhaame,

We intend creating Endowment Funds for those hostels where the foster-children whom we are supporting are staying. Our intention is that the children in these hostels will be properly cared for with a good diet, clothing medical aid, sufficient number of staff and all other items falling under child care. It is also desired that the hostel buildings where the children are staying and the various facilities provided for them be kept in good condition.

The children whom we are supporting are poor and needy and we wish to provide them facilities for their care and upbringing which otherwise they could not afford.

For this reason we would like to send Capital Grants for Endowment Funds of these hostels. The income from the Endowment Fund of each hostel should be used for the above purposes but the capital must not be spent. 7

The capital should be invested at the discretion of the South India Council for Kindernothilfe in secured and yielding projects and must not be used for any other purpose.

We hope that you will accept the conditions which we have stated for these Hostels Endowment Funds and that you will act for us as trustees for the above said purposes. On learning from you that you accept these conditions we shall send you from time to time capital grants for hostel Endowment Funds which shall be held in trust for the above said purposes.

MADRAS, Sept. 28 (UNI) Foreign gifts and donations to churches in India will be exempted from the proposed legislation to curb the flow of foreign funds to political parties, Union Deputy Health Minister, Mr. A.K. Kisku announced here today.

The churches will however, have to get clearance from the Central Government for the funds they get to help the suffering humanity. Mr. Kisku said, while presiding over the concluding session of the silver jubilee celebrations of the Church of South India.

Mr. Kisku suggested to the church leaders to make "an open, frank and sincere representation" to the Prime Minister before the regulation was enacted.

Mr. Kisku advised the Indian church to become "self-reliant and allow management by Indian nationals."

If the church did not consider its educational and medical institutions its vested interest, he asked the church to make the board of management more broadbased and keep the account books open. There need not be any hush-hush about it, he added.

True Copy of a letter from Mr. Lüers dt. 2.11.72.

Dear Mr. Unger,

With reference to my previous letter dated 24.10.72 item 4 on page 3 I am enclosing herewith the promised extracts from the new Finance Law which has come into effect from 1.4.1972.

I may be permitted to draw your kind attention to the last but one sentence in para 1 of these extracts which is actually the most important sentence in this context. I quote below the sentence: "For and from the assessment year 1973-74, such contributions will be treated as income of the trust or institution except where these are received with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus of the trust or institution."

This is the reason why we have asked you to send in future all moneys earmarked for selfsupport to India with the "specific direction" that they are earmarked for the one purpose "to form part of the corpus of the trust", with other words a kind of Endowment Fund when the money cannot be utilised for any other purpose and when only the income derived from will be used for the aims and objectives of the South India Council for KNH.

We do hope that this point is now understood.

Page 30: (b) Voluntary contributions received by charitable trusts:

(Sub-clause (ia) of clause (24) of section 2 inserted by section 3(b)(i) of the Finance Act, 1972, Section 12 amended by section 6 of the Finance Act, 1972, Section 12A inserted by section 6 of the Finance Act, 1972 & section 13 amended by section 7 of the Finance Act, 1972).

The definition of the income has been extended, under newly inserted sub-clause (ia) of section 2(24), to bring within its scope voluntary contributions received by charitable or religious trusts or institutions. Up to the assessment year 1972-73, voluntary contributions to a charitable or religious trust or institution did not "constitute" income and as such were exempt from tax regardless of whether such contribution were applied to charitable or religious purposes or not. For and from the assessment year 1973-74, such contributions will be treated as the income of the trust or institution except where these are received with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus of the trust or institution. Consequently, such income will qualify for exemption subject to the conditions specified in section 11 and 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Under the existing provisions, voluntary contributions received by a trust created wholly for charitable or religious purposes or by an institution established wholly for such purposes were not regarded as income and were consequently exempt from tax. However, for and from the assessment year 1973-74, such contributions shall be regarded as income derived from property held under trust wholly for charitable or religious purpose and shall qualify for exemption from income-tax only subject to fulfilment of conditions specified in section 11 regarding the application or accumulation of the income. Further, the exemption will stand forfeited if any part of the income or property of the trust is applied for the benefit of the author of the trust or founder of the institution or a substantial contributor to the trust and the relatives of such author, founder etc. as laid down in section 13.

The income from property held under trust wholly for charitable or religious purposes including voluntary contributions will not qualify for exemption under section 11 for and from the assessment year 1973-74 unless the following conditions are satisfied:

- (a) The person in receipt of the income (i.e. the trustee) makes an application for registration of the trust or the institution to the Commissioner of Income-tax before 1-7-1973 or before the expiry of a period of one year from the date of creation of the trust or

establishment of the institution, whichever is later. The Commissioner can, however, admit, in his discretion, applications for registration which are filed beyond the prescribed period and

- (b) Where the total income of the trust or institution (including income which is exempt under section 11 and 12) exceeds Rs. 25,000 in any previous year, the accounts of the trust or institution have been audited by a chartered accountant or any other accountant entitled to be appointed as an auditor of companies.

Under the amended provisions of section 13, the income of charitable or religious trusts will not qualify for exemption in certain cases as mentioned below:

- (a) Income by the way of voluntary contributions by private religious trusts will no longer be exempt from tax.
- (b) Income by the way of voluntary contributions received by a charitable trust or institution created or established after 31.3.1962 will not be exempt from tax if the trust or institution is created or established for the benefit of any particular community.
- (c) Income by the way of voluntary contributions received by a trust created partly for charitable or religious purposes or by an institution established partly for such purpose will also no longer be exempt from tax.
- (d) Charitable or religious trusts or institutions will not be entitled to exemption if any part or part of their income including income by the way of voluntary contribution enures or is used for the benefit of the author of the trust, the founder of the institution or a substantial contributor or the relatives of such persons etc. referred to in sub-section (3) of section 13.
- (e) A charitable or religious trust or institution will forfeit its right of exemption from tax if any income or property of the trust is used or applied for during the relevant accounting year for the direct or indirect benefit of its author, founder, substantial contributor, their relatives etc. Under the amendment, the exemption from tax will not be available if the aggregate of the income or property diverted in favour of any such aforesaid person during the previous year exceeds Rs. 1,000.

Page 39: II INCOME OF CHARITABLE & RELIGIOUS TRUSTS (SECTION 11)

(1) Income exempt from tax: (Section 11 (1))

- (1) Income from any property held under trust wholly for charitable or religious purposes is exempt from tax to the extent to which such income is utilised for such purpose in India. (Section 11 (1) (a)).
- (ii) In the case of a trust created before 1.4.1962, income from any property held in part only for charitable or religious purposes is exempt from tax to the extent to which such income is utilised for such purposes in India (Section 11 (1) (b)) .

"Charitable purpose" as defined under clause (15) of section 2 includes relief of the poor, education, medical relief and the advancement of any other object of public utility not involving the carrying on of any activity for profit.

(ii) Condition for accumulation of income (Section 11(2))

Upto and including the assessment year 1970-71, income derived from property held under trust (which includes house property, securities, debentures, shares of companies, business undertaking etc.) wholly for religious or charitable purposes or in part in the case of trusts created before 1.4.1962 was exempt, if not less than 75% of such income was actually applied to the purposes of the trust in India in the same year. Accumulation to the extent of 25% of the Income of the trust or Rs. 10,000 whichever was higher for future application to the purposes of the Trust in India was permissible for a period not exceeding 10 years provided the trust has given notice in the prescribed form to the Income-tax Officer, specifying the purpose and the period of such accumulation and invests the accumulated amount in any Government securities or in any other approved securities. Failure to utilise fully the accumulated income exclusively for the purpose for which it was accumulated within one year of the expiry of the period allowed in this behalf would render the unutilised income liable to tax.

The position for and from the assessment year 1971-72 is that only income actually applied to the purposes of the trust in India in the same year will be entitled to tax exemption but not the income which is accumulated and set apart for such application. However, at the option of the trustees, if any portion of such income as has not been applied to the purposes of the trust during the year of its receipt is applied to such purposes during the period of three months immediately following that previous year, it will be deemed to have been so applied during that previous year. The option is to be exercised in writing before the time allowed under section 139 (1) or 139 (2) whether fixed originally or on extension, for furnishing the return of income for the relevant assessment year. In that case, the income so applied will not again be taken into account in calculating the amount of income applied to such purposes during the immediately following previous year.

Any income of a previous year neither utilised nor deemed to have been utilised for the purposes of the Trust in India in that year will be taxed as if it were the total income of an association of persons.

Accumulation or setting apart of any part of the trust income for future application to charitable or religious purpose in India is permissible under the amended provisions also without attracting tax liability provided the trustees give notice to the Income-tax Officer in the prescribed form No. 10 specifying the purpose and the period (which should not exceed 10 years) for which the income is to be accumulated and the amounts so accumulated are invested in Government securities or in any other approved securities or deposited in any account with the Post Office Savings Bank or a banking company to which the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 applies etc. etc. If in any year, the accumulated income ceases to remain invested or deposited in the aforementioned manner, it will be liable to tax as income of that year.

Similarly, if in any year the accumulated income is applied to purpose other than religious or charitable purposes or ceases to be set apart for application to such purposes, it will be subjected to tax as the income of that year. Further, if the accumulated accumulations or any part thereof are not utilised for the specified purposes during the period of accumulation or during the year immediately following the expiry thereof, the amount which has not been so utilised will be liable to tax as income of the previous year immediately following the expiry of the accumulation period.

Page 6: 6. Substitution of new sections for section 12. For section 12 of the Income-tax Act, the following sections shall be substituted with effect from the 1st day of April 1973, namely:

"12. Income of trusts or institutions from contributions. Any voluntary contributions received by a trust created wholly for charitable or religious purposes or by an institution established wholly for such purposes (not being contributions made with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus of the trust or institution) shall for the purposes of section 11 be deemed to be income derived from property held under trust wholly for charitable or religious purposes and the provisions of that section and section 13 shall apply accordingly.

12A. Conditions as to registration of trusts, etc. The provisions of section 11 and section 12 shall not apply in relation to the income of any trust or institution unless the following conditions are fulfilled, namely:

- (a) the person in receipt of the income has made an application for registration of the trust or institution in the prescribed form and in the prescribed manner to the Commissioner before the 1st day of July, 1973, or before the expiry of a period of one year from the date of the creation of the trust or the establishment of the institution, whichever is later:

Provided that the Commissioner may, in his discretion, admit an application for the registration of any trust or institution after the expiry of the period aforesaid;

- (b) where the total income of the trust or institution as computed under this Act without giving effect to the provisions of section 11 and section 12 exceeds twenty-five thousand rupees in any previous year, the accounts of the trust or institution for that year have been audited by an accountant as defined in the Explanation below sub-section (2) of section 283 and the person and the person in receipt of the income furnish along with the return of income for the relevant assessment year the report of such audit in the prescribed form duly signed and verified by such accountant and setting forth such particulars as may be prescribed.

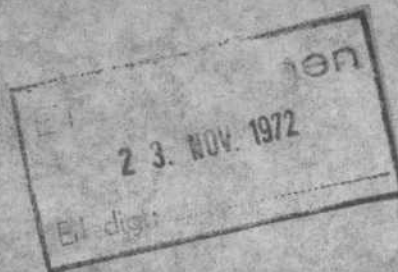

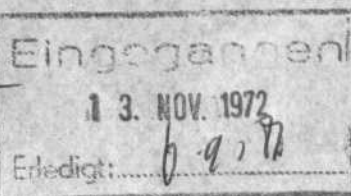

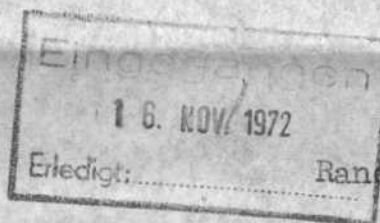

I entered into Church Service on the 1st June 1942 as Candidate and as Pastor on the 27th December '42. In 25 years of Church Service up to 1967, I had the opportunity to serve the dear Gossner Church in various Capacities at five different places and I myself had the satisfaction with my work. But before assuming the highest post of Pramukh Adhyaksh-ship of the Second largest Lutheran Church in India, the Gossner Church I felt sick in 1968 and lost my physical health. Therefore you will please excuse me. You were always my dear elder brother though I am older than you considering age and enjoyed good fellowship with you.

As I assumed office of Pramukh Adhyaksh-ship with my weak health, very often I was dissapointed for not being able to do what I intended. I could have discharged my duties better had I had good health. I myself have no satisfaction with my work, but I was helpless. However, with all my physical and mental weaknesses I could complete my term of office for which I am thankful to the Lord.

Regarding my future Service, I fully depend on the new KSS. It has been my belief from the day I entered into Church Service that the Lord will use me where He thinks me fit and therefore I never approached any man or applied to any Church body in the past.



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

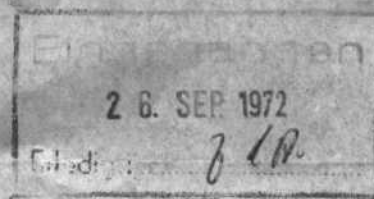

I tried to get it repaired at Ranchi and Calcutta, but it could not be repaired for want of a part of it. So I managed to send it to Germany by our Mission Director Rev. M. Seeberg, Berlin, who very kindly informed me that its repairing will cost atleast 50 DM. Now the Mission Director wants to know what to do with it.

With the hope you will be able to enable me to inform the Mission Director I am writing to you. As I am not able to send 50 DM will you be kind to send near about 50 DM to Rev. M. Seeberg, Mission Director, Berlin ? Or you are at liberty to write to him as you think best.

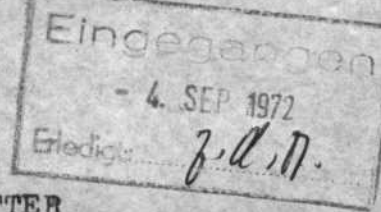

Dear Brother,

Thank you for your personal letter of 18th instant. In this reference I would like to write to you on two points:-

(1) Two watches:- Dr. Minz after he returned from Europe told me that one watch is un-reparable and the other could be repaired but the repairing cost will be equal to that of a new one. So I kept quiet and did not write to you. Since you mentioned in your letter I have to say that the unreparable watch be thrown away. The other one which is reparable should be repaired. This watch was presented to me by a German Engineer Mr. Beyer, who was in the Lal Bungalow last year. Mr. Hertel knows him very well. He is now in Germany, but I do not know his whereabouts. I am sure he will pay the repairing cost when approached. So I am writing to Mr. Hertel to let me have his address and I shall write to him, and then I shall again write to you. The watch was of Mr. Beyer's own and presented to me before leaving Ranchi, but only after a few days it was found not in good condition I sent it to Germany as it could not be repaired in India.

(2) My deceased daughter was not that one who is sick since long. The daughter was the eldest one and the sick one is third. We are sorry to lose the first child of the family. She was sick hardly for two months and it was not serious. But at the last moment she became serious and left the world. However we have consolation for it was

Here is my Address to the New Members of the KSS of the G.E.L. Church, Ranchi which I should like to entrust to you.

Dear Brethern in Jesus Christ,

As is the custom of the Christian brethern in Germany, we wish to extend greetings and best wishes in the Name and Spirit of Jesus Christ to you, the newly-elected members of the KSS assembled for the first time. Since the Gossner Mission is spokesman for the friends of the G.E.L. Church, this message comes on behalf of the Kuratorium and expresses the strong bond uniting the G.E.L. Church and the Gossner Mission which has been and which shall remain. The only difference is that in the past the relationship was one of daughter to mother, but now it is one of senior daughter to a not very old mother. In this case it is a fact that the senior daughter has a great deal of her own experience and her own responsibilities and therefore, the mother cannot interfere very much as the daughter also has her own family. Who, however, knows the growth and problems of the daughter better than the mother?

As the Gossner Mission cannot forget and leave the Gossner Church, she wants to work with the Gossner Church more than in the last century on behalf of several regional churches in Germany in which many discussions about partnership are now taking place.

The new KSS of the G.E.L. Church carries a great responsibility for the future of the church. The Gossner Mission regrets that the work on the new Constitution in the past years has been in vain and that the KSS has to continue to lead the church under conditions which may have been sufficient in the sixties but certainly are not in the seventies. Almost everyone in the Gossner Church knows the weaknesses in the rules of the Constitution but, on the otherhand, there is a lack of unity in attempting to change the prevailing situation. The Gossner Mission sincerely hopes that the new KSS may have more success in this regard.

But more important than all the reconsiderations of law and order within the church are the activities outside the church walls. The future of the G.E.L. Church and every church on the face of the earth depends on the strength of the church members and leaders to proclaim Christ among non-Christians.

Good wishes and encouragement for progress in ecumenical work, church work and evangelistic work are expressed in the spirit of this Bible verse which the German churches have chosen as the meditation for 1972:

"It is not ourselves that we proclaim; we proclaim Christ Jesus as Lord."


This was possible, of course, because we were able to meet each other in Ranchi and Berlin. I hope you may remember these meetings as well as I do.

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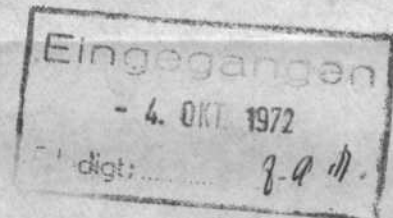

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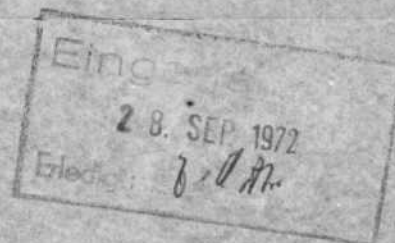

Bage told me that he and the Orissa Anchal wanted to have you as the new Adhyaksh, but of course, this field of work is not easy. Let us hope that towards the end of the year there is a solution in sight and that the Lord may guide you and the leaders of your church.

This summer's drought in India is well-known here but we still hope that sufficient rain will fall in August and that the possible famine can be avoided. In Germany the summer is too wet and we would like, if possible, to send you a lot of clouds and rain.

As this letter is a personal one, please allow me to mention official items in separate letters. By the way, I still have the two watches which you asked me to have repaired. I was told that one of them unfortunately cannot be repaired and that the cost of repairing the other would be equal to the cost of buying a new watch. Re: Takarma Dispensary

Several people have sent us the shocking news of the terrible accident near Kolebira and Surin and Dr. Horo have written to Sister Ilse Martin including a lot of details. At the present she is visiting her mother in East Germany but had authorized us to read the letters beforehand. Last week she wrote to us that though she is informed she is unable to give any good advice from such a great distance.

We all hope that you or Adhyaksh Topno will look after Takarma, encourage the dispensary people, and give consolation to the wife and family of Hardugan Singh. In the meantime all the disturbances must have come to a certain end and having reached this point, the Takarma people now have to consider what they have to do. In your opinion Takarma Dispensary is not affected as much as Khuntitoli and Purnapani Dispensaries. As there is no jeep after the accident, it is difficult, if not impossible, for Dr. Horo to look after those two dispensaries. But the Takarma Dispensary is somewhat independent, and we hope, therefore, that the work there can continue as before. In emergency cases it may be that Rev. Houston from Kamdara could come and help. He informed Sister Ilse by letter that he is tackling the insurance affair.

In his letter to Sister Ilse, Dr. Horo asked whether she could return immediately to India. When we meet with her next week we will certainly have to discuss this matter, but I am sure that she will not be able to return to Takarma immediately. There are two main reasons: 1) we have fixed a great number of meetings in many congregations in West Germany and Berlin for the period from September to December and it is necessary that Sister Ilse tells about the work in India. Therefore, we cannot cancel these engagements. Secondly, she cannot change the present situation. She could return and be in charge of Takarma Dispensary again but without a jeep. In addition she would be unable to visit Khuntitoli and Purnapani Dispensaries.

It is of the utmost importance that somebody, either in Ranchi, Khunti, or Takarma, orders a new jeep. Of course, the Gossner Mission will be responsible for payment.

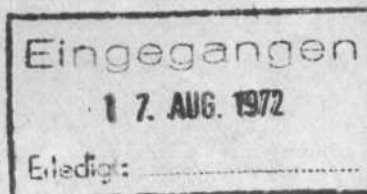

Dear Brother,

In this letter I would like to give you some informations both official and personal, as I like you to know the things going on.

I. Election:- You know very well that this is our election year and as per decision of the KSS Samity meeting, election at the congregation level should be completed by the end of August and as such election at the congregation level has already begun. From 1st Nov. '72 no body knows where and what kind of work will be given to me. Considering my physical health I should be untimely retired, but I have still seven years to reach my retiring age limit. Moreover I have to educate my children and therefore I am expecting some kind of work by the new KSS. to come. Orissa people are willing to elect me as their Adhyaksh but I told them my inability to accept Adhyakshship.

II. Takarma Dispensary:- On the 31st July last the driver Hardugan, had perhaps to bring Dr. Horo, was going from Takarma to Amgaon. Very unfortunately he got very dangerous accident near about three miles from Kolebira and was very badly wounded. Immediately he was sent with other four wounded persons to Simdega hospital, but he expired as soon as he reached Simdega. Other four wounded persons as I was told day before yesterday, are improving. The jeep is under the custody of the Kolebira Police at Kolebira. Rev. J. Topno was to go to Kolebira to get the jeep back from the Police. It is very fortunate that Miss Ilse Martin is on leave.

III. My Family:- I am very sorry to give you this sad news that my eldest daughter Nemhan died on the 13 of July last leaving her husband and two little children. My son-in-law is an employee in the Heavy Engrg. Corporation Hatia, Ranchi, and so my daughter was admitted in the HEC. hospital where she expired at 3,30 A.M. on the 13th. Her dead body was buried in the grave yard at Ranchi at 5 P.M. on the same day, and since then my son-in-law and two children are with me. Due to this I could not work last month.

✓ IV. Rain in Bihar:- Perhaps by Radio Television or paper you might have heard or read that this year monsoon came very late. At Ranchi it rained on the 22nd of June '72 for the first time after which we had good rain for a week only and the whole July month went without rain. In August it is raining but very little. So the paddy transplantation is hampered. Upper land crop is badly affected. In this way we can hardly expect 50% income from the field. Thus famine is inevitable next year. It will surely affect our church income very badly.

Dear brother could you consider in your next Kuratorium meeting for special help to the Gossner Church ? I am sure, it will be very difficult to run the KSS Central office. Our Central and Provincial Governments are alert about the situation to come in Bihar, but it will not help the church. I shall be, on behalf of the Gossner Church, very grateful if you could arrange some special help.

✓ V. JashpurNagar hostel:- On the 3rd of this month I had been to see the work for which you have so generously granted three thousand rupees. I am glad to see, that under the supervision of Candidate Mr. Biraj Kujur much progress has been done to complete the incomplete hostel and before the end of the month students will begin to live in. I shall let you know the final completion of the hostel in very near future.

✓ VI. Visit of Dr. Grothaus:- We are looking forward to see him in the beginning of October next. Mr. H. Samad, with the help of Education Board has drawn up tour programme for him. Programme is such that all High and training schools could be visited and at the end headmasters' conference is being arranged at Chainpur. Let us see whether Dr. Grothaus accepts the tour programme.

✓ VII. So called Ranchi Dharmpradesh:- Since it is declared that the proposed new constitution failed, it could not be passed, and the question of bringing a new constitution is dropped, people are lost. Two Pastors under the so-called Ranchi Dharmpradesh came back and accepted by the KSS. Several congregations, some of them in part have come under the KSS. I am very sure, it will die at the end by which I could see from the very beginning. Third Pastor has applied to the KSS, but he has not yet been accepted. Rev. Lakra tried his best the intervention from outside but he failed, as we did not allow.

✓ VIII. Gossner College:- I am to let you know that irregularly started Gossner College was regularised and the KSS became the proprietor. It is now ~~difficult~~ affiliated to Ranchi University. Class is being held in the newly built Bethesda Middle School. Dr. N. Minz is very busy on the





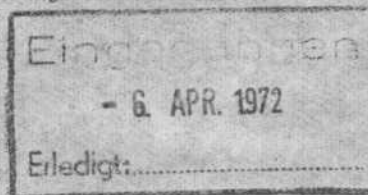

Greetings in Jesus name. As I informed you earlier you know that the G.E.L.C. Pastors' Refresher Course was to be held from 14th to 18th March'72 including one full day Ministerium meeting. Now I am glad to inform you that the Pastors' Refresher Course and the Ministerium meeting was successfully completed. Your letter of greeting was read out before the house and by standing it was received with appreciation and I was asked to convey greetings of the Pastors to you.

Just after the Refresher Course meeting of the Kalishia Sangh had been convened on the 19 & 20th March'72. Many important decisions were made. Though the Kalishia Sangh has constitutionally no executive power, it is only a recommending body, but morally its decisions are of great value and the KSS is to approve it.

One of the important decisions is to appoint an auditor in the church. Need of an auditor was felt since many years, but due to shortage of fund we could not appoint. But now on the decision of the Kalishia Sangh and approved by the KSS we have to appoint an auditor, but there is no money provision in the 1972 budget, and therefore the KSS decided to request the LWF for special help to begin with. Resolution of the KSS item No.11 is ^{attached} appended below for your information.

On the basis of the resolution of the KSS may I request you to help us so as to appoint an auditor from July next. Minimum salary of an auditor for ~~12 months @ Rs.250/- per month~~ will be Rs.250/- per month. It would be highly appreciated if you could help us for the salary of an auditor for 18 months @ Rs.250/- per month, that means Rs.4500/- to give salary from July'72 to December 73. In the mean time we shall make arrangement to find out salary for him. I hope you will consider this request of mine very sympathetically

Dear fellow Chotanagpuris,

The sheet attached here with will explain to you the aims and purpose of founding the Gossner College in Arts and Commerce and in due course science also. The Governing Body has decided to appeal to all Chotanagpuris and to other people of good will towards us to become either founder members or regular donors or both of the Gossner College.

The College started on the 1st of Nov. and was inaugurated by our honourable Chief Minister of Bihar on the 14th of Nov. 71. Since then the College has made a slow but steady progress. At present we have 19 students and 9 lecturers in Arts and Commerce. There is an office assistant and a peon. The Principal is purely honourary servant of the College for the present.


On the 30th of Nov. 71, we have applied for affiliation to Ranchi University. The inspection fee has already been paid and we are hoping that the inspection team will visit our College in January or February 1972.

At present our monthly expenses are Rs. 1500.00. (Rupees fifteen hundred) and we have to look for the affiliation fee early next academic year. We have tried to keep our expenses down this year by paying the lecturers honorarium only with the full salary of teaching and non-teaching staff the monthly expense will be more than double the present amount.

The GEL Church has been gracious enough to set Raja Bungalow Compound apart along Main Road & Club Road for the purpose of Gossner College in Arts and Commerce now and Science in due course. For affiliation we have to have Rs. 25,000.00. (Rupees twenty five thousand) in our account, and 2000 volumes of books, and adequate number of staff, furnished class rooms and offices. For all these we need an extra amount of at least Rs. 30,000.00. (Rupees fifty thousand) by next June.

The above amounts seem to be too heavy for us Chotanagpuris as we all are poor people. Individually, or even for a small group they are heavy amounts. But we want a big company of Chotanagpuris and other people of good will to share this burden together. Please think of one thousand Chotanagpuri and people of good will shouldering this responsibility and the burden will surely be quite easy. Therefore, we appeal to you to be either the founder member or regular donor or both of Gossner College. A quarterly statement of accounts will be sent to you personally for your information. This will keep you up to date with the needs of the College and use of your concrete contribution towards meeting those needs. Please fill up the attached forms and send them back the College.

GOSSNER COLLEGE
(aims and purposes)

Education in Chotanagpur has become a money making business of a few. The offices in education department and educational institutions provide one of the best breeding ground for all sorts of corruptions and malpractices, and the centres of higher learning serve as the most effective instruments of caste jangling under the disguise of party politics of people with vested interests. In this unhealthy atmosphere a process of character damage is going on. The Adivasis and all other sons of the soil of Chotanagpur are being exploited intellectually. Therefore all development schemes and plans for the people of this region have proved to be a failure. They have become a means of livelihood for the outsiders instead of welfare of the needy people here. The above vicious circle of vices is hard to break but it must be broken for the sake of humanity and education.

The founding of Gossner College is a small beginning to try to provide a right attitude and orientation to education in Chotanagpur for the welfare of the sons of the soil. The general Body meeting held on 10th October 1971 decided to start the Arts and Commerce College in GELC, Compound and in due course science also. As the GELC is providing property for physical accommodation of this College, it was unanimously agreed that the name of this College shall be the Gossner College. It is an attempt to give a right perspective and direction to the process of, educating and building up, Chotanagpuri people and their individuality. The following are a few specific aims and objects of Gossner College.

1. To provide a place for and form a community of Chotanagpuri and other scholars of good will for people here to engage themselves in a common task of thinking, planning, and working together towards building up the character and personality of Chotanagpuris. Scholars of all discipline have to put their heads together in a common task of achieving a rational unity over and above the emotional bond of being the Chotanagpuri. Unity of ideas and planning on the basis of their ideas for the development of this region must emerge out of a common thinking and struggle, against all disintegrating forces amidst us. All powers and forces which are for the good of the people here need co-ordination and purposive use to achieve a common good.

2. To provide opportunity for the development of all hidden talents of the Chotanagpuri man (here young men and women). Physical fitness and power of endurance Chotanagpuri man against all kinds of odd situations are well known. The School of physical education in Gossner College would prepare the Chotanagpuri, youth to shine in games and sports on state, national and international competitions.

3. To create a socio - cultural environment for the growth and development of the basic honesty, sincerity, and integrity of the Chotanagpuri man and to provide him with a moral and spiritual strength to face the outsider world with courage and confidence. The School of vocational education will make the Chotanagpuri man efficient and effective citizen and help him work for the honour and prestige of mother India.

4. To instill and promote the spirit of service with a missionary zeal in the staff and students informed by the spirit of Christ. The dignity of manual labour and attitude of selfhelp will be the foundation of building

up the community of staff & students of Gossner College. And thus this College will ~~sow~~ sow the seed of a Chotanagpuri society based on social and economic justice rooted on the Principle, of love thy neighbour as thy self.

In order to achieve the above aims and purposes the following structure of the College is proposed. The Gossner ~~staff & students residing in the~~ College will become a residential College with more than 75 P.C. staff & Students residing in the College campus. The College will be constituted of:

- a. The School of humanities and social science.
- b. The School of natural Science.
- c. The school of commerce.
- d. The school of education.
- e. The School of Religious studies.
- f. The School of vocational education.
- g. The School of Chotanagpuri, language literature and culture.
- h. The School of music, Arts & drama.
- i. The School of physical education.

Details of interrelation of these schools and administrative machinery necessary for the College will be worked out.

The Gossner College is not one more centre of higher learning as any other Colleges in this region under Ranchi University . But it has a unique characteristic of its own and it is fit to achieve aspirations of the people in Chotanagpur.

Dear Mr. Bhengra,

Today I received your letter dated 7th December, and I want to answer it immediately.

The good news that there is quite a large, unexpected surplus through the exchange was not really such a great surprise to us, as we had calculated this.

I agree with the suggestions outlined in your letter and endorse them as follows:

From the surplus sum of	Rps. 49825.16
Theological Education	5300.00
Surguja Mission Field	12315.00
Dr. Grothaus' Expenses	2000.00

That leaves a balance of Rps. 32210.16 for income taxes, *ju* *corrigent* which may be expected in all probability, and maybe a salary for a part-time financial advisor, if needed, in the light of the new laws in India. This is then the safety fund, dear Mr. Bhengra, about which we have to talk in the course of the new year.

In the meantime, however, you are allowed to use this money for Evangelistic Work as it finds itself in such a tight financial squeeze since the promised funds from the Gossner Mission via the Church of Bavaria have not arrived yet. Today I telephoned the people in Bavaria and, unfortunately, they have not as yet sent that amount. They will do that in the coming days, and you can expect the fourth instalment for Evangelistic Work and the second for Surguja at the latest in January. I am sorry that there has been a delay and I hope very much that nevertheless the workers in the mission field have received their salaries.

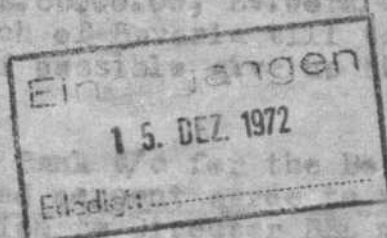

Respected sir,

The Gossner Church is really very happy to receive recently so great an amount from Gossner Mission Berlin; and extends its heartfelt thanks to the Gossner Mission and its Director who has bestowed a sincere love and care for the Gossner Church and no doubt a great favour by sending a huge sum long before it is utilised.

- (1) On 30th November 1972 the following amount of money were credited into our Bank Account.

a, DM. 8000.00 = Rs. 19751.08 (Jubilee fund interest)
b, DM. 200000.00 = Rs. 493825.16 (1973 Subsidies)

In the transaction (b,) we are benefitted by a surplus sum of Rs.49825.16 by exchange. According to your calculation detailed in your letter dt.24th November 1972 the total amount comes to only Rs.444000.00, whereas the actual receipt is Rs.493825.16. May I be allowed to suggest if you dont mind regarding use of this surplus money ?

In last two years we were receiving Rs.25000.00 for Theological Education in respect of Jubilee money interest. This year we received only Rs.19751.08. If you allow, Rs.5300.00 out of the surplus amount of Rs.49825.16 be paid to Theological Education. Secondly, the KSS has given loan to GEL Church surguja work a sum of Rs.12314.93, (which is the lost money by Rev. S.Kujur) which can not be refunded by Surguja A/c unless outside help is obtained, and the KSS will be in a deficit of Rs.12314.93 for long time to come. I suggest this amount of Rs.12315.00 also be paid out to Surguja account out of this surplus of Rs.49825.16.

There will still be a Balance of Rs.32210.16 only. I could request for this balance also. But it would be too much at this moment. I leave it for your description. The GEL Church is going through difficult financial situation. If allowed, may be more request.

- (2) If my suggestions of item No.(1) is agreed, I have nothing to suggest for utilisation of Chainpur High School Account. Then your proposal by letter dt.27-11-1972 to me is final. Let Rs.30000.00 go to Central Education Fund and the rest to TTC Fund.

- (3) We have not received the amount (Rs. 65000.00, Ev. Work + Rs. 20000.00 Surguja) from the Church of Bavaria till to day. Kindly remind them once more and if possible give us the address, so that we may also write to them.
- (4) Regarding point to keep a separate Bank a/c for the Board of Evangelism and Literature, I hundred percent agree to your point. Actually I have given this suggestion to Director BEL myself. The KSS also in its last meeting has come to this resolution that BEL a/c be kept separate. But, we will have to wait for some time and watch Government Policy towards foreign subsidy. We may face difficulty to receive a foreign subsidy to an Bank a/c which is purely ecclesiastical. If every thing seems O.K, we will open a separate a/c for BEL Fund. The money is lent out to other accounts no doubt but up-till-now the refund has been made in time.
- (5) The last point I am afraid is a direct statement. I think I am free to write this atleast to you. The GEL Church has spent about Rs. 2000.00 in all round trips of honourable Dr. Grothaus. This is towards Motor Vehicle expenses. Could it be possible if this sum is refunded to us by the surplus money of item No. (1). Well, GEL Church is not supposed to ask the expenses of a guest, but, it does in this case. This is my request on behalf of the GEL Church. I hope, you will excuse me if you find it rude and feel negative.

Dear Brother,

I am in receipt of your two letters both dated 24.11.72. First one regarding the subsidy for 1973 and the second regarding TTC Fudi. On behalf of the Gossner Church and on my own behalf I extend hearty thanks and express my gratefulness to the Gossner Mission for subsidising five different departments - e.g. I. B.E.L. II. Surguja mission field, III. Amgaon Hospital, IV. T.T.C. Fudi and V. Ambulance (Jeep) of the Gossner Church.

The exchange value of the DM in rupees in India has become Rupees 493,825=16 instead of your calculated value of Rs. 444,000. So near about fifty thousand more. Now the Gossner Church will be able to carry out its works easily and satisfactorily.

Regarding finding out of Government agencies we are consulting other churches, and you will be informed in due time the development of the same.

With regard to your second letter I would like to inform you that I am not a member of the Governing Body of the TTC Fudi therefore I am ignorant of the Fudi affairs. However I can tell you that the TTC land matters have not yet been settled. The matter of negotiation with the Cromelite Co. or the Trust Society has also not yet been settled. It will be taken up in the next KSS meeting.

Regarding visit of Rev. Dr. N. Minz, he is already now in Switzerland. The KSS has authorised him to secure funds from Germany and LWF. for Surguja mission field, and you have already been informed of this. I hope he will visit Berlin when his LWF meeting is over.



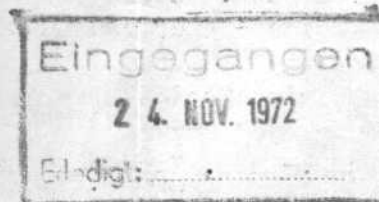

Pastor Gene Ries, LWF Community Development Service Program Director, was also present.


be It was explained that even though the transfer of large amounts of money to India might be prudent -- it was practicably impossible since the funds did not exist.

Both Dr. Rajaratnam and Pastor Peter were not unduly alarmed at the prospect of passage of this law and the effect it would have on future transfer of funds to India for evangelistic and other church related projects. It was agreed however that the FELC-I would discuss this problem and would contact those overseas churches and agencies which assist the churches in India.

With this brief memo I just want to assure you that there will be no unilateral action by the LWF in this matter, and we would appreciate being kept informed of any decisions your boards may make in this matter.

1.2 Die Bedeutung der kirchlichen Schulen für die Kirche

Die Bedeutung der eigenen Schulen wird u.a. deutlich, wenn man sich in die Probleme der Minoritäten hineinversetzt. In den staatlichen Schulen Indiens gehen die wenigen Christen buchstäblich unter (und zwar Lehrer und Schüler). Diese Sorgen haben nicht nur die Eltern für ihre Kinder, sondern auch die Lehrer, wenn sie in nichtchristliche Kollegien gestellt werden. Manchmal schien es sogar die "policy" der örtlichen Behörden zu sein, christliche Lehrer durch Versetzungen zu isolieren und auch aus der Kirchengemeinde herauszulösen. Damit gehen der Kirche wichtige Mitarbeiter verloren, was vor allem in der Sonntagsschularbeit zu spüren ist. Dr. Schäfer (Genf) wusste von solchen Erfahrungen südindischer Kirchen zu berichten, die jetzt bedauern, dass sie ihre Schulen zu früh dem Staat überlassen haben. Noch haben die meisten Kirchen in Indien keine innerkirchlichen Erziehungsfelder entwickelt, die den Verlust der kirchlichen Schulen wettmachen könnten.

Somit kann für die nächsten Jahre aus öffentlichem und kirchlichem Interesse noch nicht auf die kirchlichen Schulen verzichtet werden. Sie müssen möglichst schnell funktionstüchtig gemacht werden, auch wenn sie der Staat in fünf Jahren übernehmen sollte.

1.3 Weitere Bildungsaufgaben der Kirche

Da die Kirchen Indiens damit rechnen müssen, dass ihnen der Staat nach und nach die schulische Arbeit aus der Hand nehmen wird, müssen sie jetzt schon daran denken, solche innerkirchlichen "Erziehungsfelder" zu entwickeln. Wir haben in der Gossnerkirche darüber beraten und festgestellt, dass deshalb den Kindergärten, den Sonntagsschulen, der Eltern- und Erwachsenenbildung und den "hostels" für Schüler und Studenten erhöhte Bedeutung zukommt. Das stellt die Kirche vor folgende Aufgaben: Ausbildung von Kindergärtnerinnen und Erziehern für die Hostels, Erarbeitung von Lehrplänen und Arbeitsmaterial für die Sonntagsschulen und gezielte Förderung von Laien, die Führungsaufgaben übernehmen können.

2 Die besonderen Probleme der Schulen

2.1 Problem Nummer 1 ist die Frage der Gehaltszahlung an die Lehrer, vornehmlich der "high-school-teacher".

Da die Kirche nur mit Mühe die Gehälter für ihre Pastoren und Prediger aufbringt, sieht sie sich bis auf wenige Ausnahmen (z.B. Jamshedpur) nicht in der Lage, die Gelder vorzustrecken, die der Staat laut Gesetz monatlich zu zahlen verpflichtet ist. Oft kommen die staatlichen Zuschüsse mit drei- bis sechsmonatlicher Verspätung. Das zwingt die Lehrer zur Aufnahme von Krediten oder zu Nebenbeschäftigungen. Darunter leiden natürlich die Arbeitsmoral und Disziplin sehr, und der schlechte Zustand mancher Schulen hat sicherlich auch darin mit seinen Grund. Die vernachlässigte Gehaltszahlung beeinträchtigt zudem oft das Verhältnis von Kirche und Schule.

Dear Mr. Bhengra,

Thank you for your detailed letter dated 26th October which dealt mainly with the auditing of the Amgaon accounts. In the meantime you have received a copy of my letter to Dr. W. Horo and my recommendations. But I still have to answer the second point of your letter regarding the Chainpur High School accounts. Many thanks to you again for this hard work done during the construction period and also afterwards. Now after receipt of the last instalment of the Central Agency money, your valuable work seems to be finished.

The balance of Rps. 52,995.33 is to be distributed, and I want you to do this so that part goes to the TTC Fudi and part to the Central Education Fund. I cannot give you the exact figures at the moment because I am not quite sure as to what amount Fudi needs in 1973. For 1972 the contributions to Fudi are sufficient. You have learned in the copy of the letter to the Pramukh Adhyaksh dated 24th November (attached) that part of the 1973 contribution is included in the wholesale transfer, which for Fudi for 1973 amounts to Rps. 48,000. The original 1973 budget for TTC Fudi is about Rps. 80,000 but I am not so sure that all of this amount is needed because there are fewer trainees than expected. So it is my proposal that we foresee Rps. 30,000 for the Central Education Fund and the rest for the TTC Fudi budget for 1973. If your recommendations are contrary to mine, please feel free enough to put them in writing. In the meantime, I want to inform Mr. Hertel and obtain his signature.

There is still another point I want to raise. In regard to the Board of Evangelism and Literature, I learned that in its Director's opinion, it is advisable to open a separate account for evangelistic work. This became obvious since money sent and meant for evangelistic work was lent out for other purposes and was not repaid in time. If I am right, the head accountant of the G.E.L. church should be more careful because some church leaders may not comprehend the situation and therefore I want to underline the recommendation of the BEL for a separate account for evangelistic work.





I regret, I could not write to you sooner than you might have expected me to do so, the various matters which you liked to hear most. As the matter of fact many other engagements led this delay. I hope you would not mind.

1, The Audit of the Accounts of GEL Church Hospital Amgaon :-

It took me ten days to complete the audit. I was there at Amgaon from 13.9.72 to 23.9.1972. The Accounts for the years 1970, and 1971 were audited in full. The Accounts for the period from 1.1.72 to 23.9.72 were only checked. The books were not ready. Even then I pressed Mr. H.D. Horo to complete the books and atleast the Cash Book was made ready. The Bank Book could not be completed. I had to rely upon Cheques to check up the Balance. I stressed in the cash Book, checked up, and balanced it up-to-date. Then, I counted the money kept in the Cash Box infront of Dr. Horo. To my great surprise, I found that the Book Balance did not tally with the actual cash in the Cash Box. There was a vast difference between the Balance of the Book and the actual Cash. The following cash checking report will explain the fact-

I asked Mr. H.D. Horo where this amount of Rs. 9,040.75 had gone, what had happened to it, where was the money etc. He could not give any explanation. He simply said he did not know how the amount came so short. I asked him again if he spent the money for his own purpose or gave it to somebody else. He told me he did not. His last words were " Whatever happens I am responsible for the money and no one else. " " I would face the consequences."

So, dear Director Sahib, this is really a serious matter. An amount of Rs. 9,040.75 is not a joke. A big amount is missing; only the mere figure is shown in the Book. Ofcourse Mr. Hardugan Horo is wholly responsible for the missing money. He alone is to account for the missing cash. It is a problem, no doubt. The problem how to get back the money from him. The problem will be two-fold if he is allowed to continue as a cashier-cum-Accountant any longer. I do not know how this problem is to be solved. There are two points to be taken into consideration -

a, to find out a way to get back money from Mr. H. D. Horo.

b, to see that money is not missing any longer.

If we terminate the services of Mr. H.D. Horo for the good, we can not expect refund of money from him. On the other hand, if we allow him to continue in the same post any farther there will be every danger of more money missing. So, I suggest that he may be allowed to work in the Hospital as an accountant only or any other Officer. But he should not be a Cashier. The cash be handled by the Medical Superintendent or any other honest person. By doing so, we can deduct a definite amount of money out of his salary per month to refund the lost/missing money. And as he will not be handling cash anymore, farther mishandling of money will be stopped. This is my suggestion. It is upto you now to decide. But it must be done before things goes bad to worse. If you agree to my line of thinking, kindly write me soon. We will find out then, how to execute this proposal. The audited statement for the years 1971,1970 will be sent to you later on.

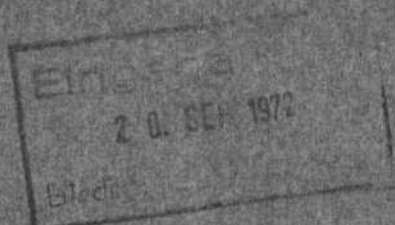

Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter referred to above on the above noted subject, I thank you and the LWF for inclusion in its 1973 Composite statement of needs \$ 6,500 only. On behalf of my church I extend thanks to you and to the LWF once again.

Really it is a matter of joy for us that \$6,500 only was granted, but we are very much worried to find it in the "B" list, which means we may get the amount or we may not. By putting it in the "B" list we are put into uncertainty.

Since all helps to run our Central administrative office have stopped, we are struggling hard to raise fund from within the church to run the office. We are helpless to support the theological institutions at this juncture if help from LWF does not come.

Your above referred letter was put up in the KSS (Church Council) officers' meeting on the 2nd of Sept '72. The resolution of the meeting item No. 7 is attached for your information.

Dear Sir, in order to run the theological institutions, it is very essential to be sure of getting help from the LWF. Therefore you are requested to assure us whether help from the LWF will be coming in due time. It matters little for us whether you put in the "B" list or "A", but we must be assured that help will be coming.

Our present financial situation is such, that we will be painfully obliged to close down the institutions from July next if we are not assured of help by December next. In fact we are struggling hard to raise fund, but in spite of that we are not in a position to run our administrative office. Since 1969 we are closing our KSS account at the year end with a deficit every year. It is presumed that 1972 account will be closed with a deficit not less than fifty thousand. In this way we are very much worried how to face the situation.

I therefore request you sir, to be kind enough to assure us by December next that the sanctioned amount will be coming in due time. Having been assured whether the sanctioned amount is coming or not, we will act accordingly.

On the 26th of June, I received a letter from the Rector, Serampore College which worried me much. I am attaching a true copy of the letter for your clear information.



Dear Pramukh Adhyaksh,

We thank you for your kind letter dated 14-2-72 regarding the bursaries you have granted for C.L.A. Dungdung and for four other students from your church.

I am asked to convey the following clarification regarding scholarship awards for (1) Rev. Nehemiah Topno, (2) H. Khess, (3) M. Kandulna and (4) S. Topno (if he passes the qualifying papers) from 1972-'73 Session onwards.

The first three were awarded scholarships at the rate of Rs.750/- each per year in their B.D. I class, 1971-'72. Mr. S. Topno was awarded Rs.375/- as a special case as he was preparing for the B.D. Qualifying papers in 1971-'72.

But as per the terms of negotiations and merger between "Gurukul" and "Serampore" the Lutheran Churches of the Gurukul membership sending their students to Serampore are to maintain their own students bearing all expenses. But, for their first year's study the college paid this scholarship for them.

But for their II & III year studies the college is constrained to say that they cannot find sufficient funds to continue scholarship aid for these three students who are promoted from B.D. I to B.D. II now.

By a clerical mistake the financial statement was sent to you for these three students indicating the award of scholarship by the college at Rs.750/- each per year. Kindly correct this mistake and treat them as non-scholarship holders for 1972-'73.

Therefore, from the total amount you have to send to the college for these three students, Viz., (1) N. Topno, (2) H. Khess, (3) M. Kandulna for 1972-'73 for their B.D. II Yr course, kindly arrange to deduct Rs.461.90 sent in excess on behalf of Mr. Anjan Kullu as per the letter of Mr. S. Bhengra, Head Accountant, GEL Church Ranchi, dated 2-6-72 and send the total balance to the Bursar, Serampore College, Serampore.


I am sorry for all this confusion. It was a help, Serampore College could help all your students last year and Mr. C.L.A. Dungdung completely so far.

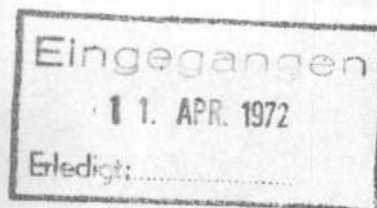

Dear Brothers,

By this letter on behalf of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam I would like to let you know the present situation of the G.E.L.Church.

That for Theological education we have an institution Gossner Theological College up to B.Th.standard. The second institutions is the Gossner Bible Training school. The total expenditure on these institutions is more than a lakh of rupees (One hundred thousand) per year. The Gossner Church meets the expenditure with great difficulty. This difficulty has been caused due to the stoppage of Gossner Mission subsidy and reduction on subsidy from the Lutheran World Federation.

Apart from supporting the above two institutions the Gossner Church is to support 8 (eight) B.D. students outside the Gossner Church in India. Four students are studying in Bangalore, South India and the four at Serampore Theological College, West Bengal. The expenditure on one student is rupees 1057.00 plus Rs.250/- as travelling allowance, totalling Rs.1307.00. Hence the total expenditure on 8 students comes to Rs.10456.00 per year.

These students were sent outside by the Gossner Church on the basis of foreign support. But since 1970 this help has been stopped or reduced to a great extent, as stated above, and the Gossner Church is in a state of financial crisis in supporting the theological students.

The Gossner Church is one of the biggest churches in India where altogether 150 Pastors are needed. But due to shortage of Pastors only 133 have been employed at present. Hence the church requires more Pastors to serve in the field.

The Gossner Church has come to know from reliable sources that your institution is rendering financial support to such theological students in different theological colleges in India. In view of the fact the Gossner Church earnestly appeals to you to extend your helping and to the Gossner Church to enable her to support her students now studying outside the Gossner Church.

As per your direction in your letter dt. 5.4.72 I started correspondence with the Director Kindernothilfe, South India, and as a result of which I have been assured of help for 50, 25, 30 students of the hostels at Ambikapur, Sitapur and Jashpur Nagar respectively. From 12th to 16th April '72 I visited all these hostels and I am to visit again in July 72 for preparation of required Identity Sheets and other information and documents.

In this reference I am sorry to let you know one thing which I should have informed you earlier, and would have talked with you at Ranchi, but it was out of my mind during those days. It is this that the hostel at Jashpur Nagar constructed by TTC Fudi is left incomplete and students are not residing therein, though there are many in need of shelter.

In this reference I am sorry I was not informed of it by the North West Anchal authorities, and now I am to get help for 30 students by Kindernothilfe. Condition is this that identity sheets should be sent only after the completion of the hostel. So dear brother I am in a position to lose this help if I am not helped. With the local authorities at Jashpur Nagar I saw the hostel and considering the condition of the hostel our rough estimate is about Rs. 3000/- (three thousand) Detailed estimate by an expert is under preparation which will be sent to you soon.

At this stage I do not see any way to complete the hostel and respectfully I approach you for special help to get the hostel completed so that students can live in and help could be availed from Kindernothilfe. Completion work could be done even in rainy season.



RESTRUCTURING THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION
IN NORTHERN LUTHERAN CHURCHES

-----X*O*X-----

Changes are taking place within and around us. We cannot keep ourselves aloof from these changes. Circumstances are forcing us to think, plan, and act afresh in order to be more effective in our witness for Christ. The following changes are directly affecting our theological ~~thinking~~ training institutions.

1). Changes within our own boundaries:

The very fact of our organised effort as Lutheran Churches in North India calls for a change of our attitude to each other and to the world outside. Our proposed United Evangelical Lutheran Churches in North India must affect us in our thinking, planning and acting for the promotion of theological education in our Churches.

At Benagaria, we cooperate with the Church of North India through Santali medium. The time is coming soon that we will be cooperating with the Baptists and C.N.I. through Oriya medium. Here the GELC, and Jeypore ELC have to rethink and coordinate their resources to promote Oriya medium theological training at a suitable location either at Kotpad or at a new place. It is gratifying to note that the GELC, MPELC, and NELC have already begun cooperating at Gossner Theological College, Ranchi. It is matter of urgency that we begin to open door for the cooperation of C.N.I. at Ranchi also. This will strengthen our own Lutheran stand, and we will have some experience for negotiation with C.N.I. in future.

2). Changes outside our boundaries

The coming into being of Church of North India must be taken seriously by us. The Chotanagpur diocese, Patna diocese and Hindi speaking constituencies of C.N.I. immediately connected with us. The present arrangement for the theological education in C.N.I. through Hindi medium is still far behind what we are doing at Gossner Theological College, Ranchi. United Theological College Bareilly is at least 1500 miles away from us. There are two theological schools - one at Allahabad and another at Ranchi - Bishop Hubback's Theological College Ranchi. It will take time for these institutions to come up to ~~our~~ our level. But if we don't ^{take} advantage of our opportunities and not build Gossner Theological College up, we may fall behind and lose our chance for ever. Therefore, I propose the following restructuring of our theological education in Northern Lutheran Churches.

3). Restructuring our present set ups

a) The GELC considers active cooperation with JELC in setting up an Oriya medium theological college upto B.Th. level along with the Baptist Churches in Orissa. We must take the realities in the situation seriously and act effectively and all in time. This would mean that the GELC in Orissa State must send students, and if possible staff with necessary financial contribution to run that college. That the College council of the new Oriya medium theological college must include members from GELC also.

b) The GELC considers sending students to Benagaria from the Santali speaking area if any and help if grow up to B.Th. level.


c) The three cooperating Churches - the GELC, the MPELC, and NELC must cooperate in the administration, and finance of the Gossner Theological College, Ranchi. That this college must be jointly run by these Churches with proportionate responsibility both in decision making in policy matters, and sharing the financial and other burdens. A plan should be prepared for this purpose so that the college should not be completely dependent upon the decision of the GELC for its life and service in the future.

d) That the college consider the possibility of inviting a C.N.I. member on our College Council and thus gain the confidence of our neighbour. This will enable the C.N.I. to send students, and if necessary staff also from the C.N.I. For the time being the policy matters must be kept within the bounds of our three cooperating Churches.

e) The above restructuring would mean improving our physical facilities at Ranchi and developing our faculty in terms of academic standard and build up our library.

It might be possible for us to make Gossner Theological College, as a centre of activities in North India. It will serve a good purpose for ecumenical relationships between the Lutherans and C.N.I., and among us Lutherans.

Dear brothers,

To live the Gossner Church, she must have Theological Institutions. Church have two Institutions which all of you knew, namely the Gossner Bible and Buniyadi Prashikshan Kendra (G.B. & B.P.K.) Govindpur and Gossner Theological College, (G.T.C.) Ranchi. Both these Institutions are the life of the Church. No (I) Must exist to have trained Bracharaks and No. (II) to have trained Pastors. Due to financial difficulty, you all knew we have decided to stop admission of students in both the Institutions, but it is not the solution. This matter will be considered very seriously in the next Samiti meeting.

I would like to give you my proposal as "Food for thought" to come prepared for the next Samiti meeting. As you knew that we are sure to get Rs. 25000.00 from Berlin yearly as Bank interest for Theological Institutions, let us request the LWF to continue to give a subsidy of Rs. 35000.00, let us say for indefinite period. In this way we are to have Rs. 60000.00 only as sure money for the Institutions. But the Institutions have a budget of more than a lakh. So to adjust our selves with the above amount I have the following proposal:-

I. G.B. & B.P.K.:-

A stipend to students:- Rs. 40-00 per month.

(1) KSS - Rs. 20.00.
(2) Ilaka - Rs. 15.00.
(3) Parent - Rs. 5.00.

Total - Rs. 40.00.

B. Staff only two.

2 teachers x Rs. 200.00 X 12 months = Rs. 4800.00.

Rev. M.Tete and C.A.B.Tirkey be the pastors of Hd.Qr. Cong.Ranchi. Who will be paid @ Rs. 150/- from the College and the rest from the Congregation .Rev. L.Tete be transfered from Ranchi. One of the four Pastors be appointed as Chairman of the Head Qr. Cong. Ranchi and the Pramukh Adhyaksh be freed , and therefore Rs. 100/- P.m. from the Ranchi Mandli to the KSS be stopped hence forth.

Further suggested that Miss A.Toppo's resignation be accepted and let her go .She has already submitted her resignation. Let Miss S.Horo continue till the age of her retinement who is to retire after a year or two.

After her retirement,there should be only two staff members in the Institution. Girl students may be very few for they have to come with their own expenses .It is not expected at this moment any Ilaka will be prepared to bear stipend ,Special hostel arrangement be made under the direct supervision of the head of the Institution.

Dear brothers, in this way we can run both the Institutions till we get subsidy from the LWF amounting to Rs. 35000/- Therefore admission in both the Institutions be taken from July '72. Here I would like to suggest, Cession of both the Institutions be from July.

All above suggestions are purely mine which I am forwarding to you for your consideration. Please consider and come prepared for the next Samiti meeting scheduled to meet on March 1-3, '72.

Although schedule has been fixed about your coming to India, I am writing this letter. As the matter is very urgent. As already reported to you the money granted for Mikir Hills work is about to be finished. It will be hardly enough to give salary of the workers for the month of February 1972. The matter was put before the BEL (on 17th August 1971 and 15th Nov. '71) and BEL has expressed its concern for the same. As the work in Mikir Hills is getting more fruits day by day the BEL has expressed its desire not to close down the work, but it also feels that from its own source G.E.L. Church cannot run the work. Therefore it is requested that the Gossner Mission Berlin helps the Assam Anchal/BEL to continue the work in Mikir Hills.

Under such circumstances I am compelled to write this letter for your cond consideration to help us for continuing the Mikir Hills Work. If no money is available we have no other way, as I see among the BEL members, to continue the work but close it down.

Hoping to hear a favourable consideration I have advised the Missionary in the Area to give baptism for the catechumen. In 1971 he has baptised some 20 new converts and opened two new centres for the work.

Dear friends,

Many of you have sent news about your work during 1971. Others we have had the privilege of seeing in your own countries, or when you came to see us here in Gossner Centre in Mainz. We are very grateful to be in contact with all of you, and we hope that our relationship, based on a common task and goal for our churches and society, will continue in 1972.

By way of report, you will be interested to know that we completed our 15th 6-months-Seminar (Ecumenical Institute for Urban Industrial Mission) in 1971. The non-German participants came from the USA and Italy. The Italian was a Roman Catholic priest who is now trying to influence his religious order and his priest colleagues so that they may understand better the world of the worker and of dependant labour.

We are enclosing a paper which might interest those of you who are concerned about training programs for Urban Industrial Mission.

Our 16th Seminar will begin in October 1972. The World Council of Churches has set aside 2 scholarships for post-graduates from non-German countries who wish to participate. This is possible on condition that participants have a good working knowledge of the German language and a real interest in the problems of modern society. Please let us know if you would like more detailed information.

In August and September we were privileged to travel in South Africa. "The Interdenominational Committee of the Witwatersrand - Industrial Mission" had invited us to assist with a national course on UIM. We were and are still deeply touched, and cannot forget what we saw and learned. We were able to work together with mixed groups of blacks and whites, not only in Wilgespruit, but also in Edendale. On other occasions we met with Church officials from different denominations. There we were asked to relate South African questions to those aspects of UIM which have been found to be relevant in European countries.

We then visited a Gossner Service Team in Gwembe Valley in Zambia. They work in a rural area near the Cariba Dam where 65 000 Tongas had to be resettled on account of the new dam. Our Gossner Mission colleagues from Berlin have a contract with the Zambian Government which wants cooperation in the field of irrigation and agriculture combined with community development. A visit to the Copper Belt disclosed a tremendous contrast with the rural situation in Gwembe Valley. What a difference between the wealth of the highly technological copper industry and the rest of the country where people scarcely knew how they might survive!

From there we went on to our friends in the National Christian Council of Kenya. Our team member, Jochen Riess, is still industrial adviser to the National Christian Council in Nakuru. The Community Centre there is now under construction. Our friends

expect the work to begin there in midsummer. A number of other programs with people from town and industry have been going on now for awhile and we are impressed by the local Industrial Advisory Committee which is steering the work on an ecumenical level.

In West Africa the first training course for Urban Industrial Mission to be offered in the French language will begin on April 15th and continue until October 15th. Our staff member Rev. Gerhard Mey and his family joined the "équipe préparatoire" last March. He is helping to organize and will teach in this seminar, which will be a kind of "twin" to the pilot course "Ministry in Cities" which was offered in Nairobi in 1969. In both cases the Gossner Mission was invited to enter into partnership with African agencies and the World Council in order to develop an indigenous training program for the African Continent. We are very happy that the Mission Populaire of France has joined this scheme, too. The course will be offered in Douala and Yaounde in Kameroun.

Training for UIM is also our strongest link with India. Last week Rev. Michael Bartelt left for Durgapur. Each year the Gossner Mission and the Mainz Kastel Convention are asked to send a visiting lecturer for 3 months to the Ecumenical Social Industrial Institute in Durgapur.

It is difficult to express in a letter how important ecumenical cooperation is for our work. We feel that we have so much to learn from you. We try to work step by step in our own community and not to lose contact with the every day problems in our factories, housing areas, trade unions, etc. But at the same time we must bear in mind that the problems and tasks in our society have world perspectives.

The second paper which we enclose will give you an insight into our thinking about how the work at the grass roots must be related to engagement on higher levels of society. There is a European challenge to UIM, but are we able to take it up? We hope you will help us to do so.

We wish you God's blessing on your work in 1972.

Problems of investment policy on the international level, of internationalisation of company growth, and problems of the internationalisation of labour force were discussed at meetings of the European Contact Group (ECG) on Church and Industry in 1970/71. The group asked Christa Sprunge to suggest consequences for the work of ECG, and to feed in our experience how to activate apathetic groups. Her article which will be published in "Ecumenical Perspectives" indicates our basic approach to Urban Industrial Mission. We would like to share it with you.

Industrial Mission (IM) has not yet found an answer to the challenge described above. Often beginning with small groups of workers and their concerns, IM is developing only slowly in terms of structures and political approach.

There is a good reason for emphasizing the necessity to work at the grassroots with those who do not participate in decision making, although most of the decisions effect their lives. The Gospel gives a strong reason to stay with men and women who have not learned to voice their interests. They are used to being passed over by the skilled and powerful who know how to master the instruments of information and communication for their own interest, and feel only resentful.

The voiceless in society are voiceless in the church, too. In charity they are being looked after. But it is too tiring and enervating, and takes so much time until they might begin to use information, learn to speak up and act accordingly, that many church people decide to use their time "more effectively" by devoting their work to "key people". This, they hope and maintain, will have a multiplying effect, and eventually reach the grassroots. But the multipliers, too, want to see quick progress in their work and prefer also to devote their activities to others with an open mind and quick understanding. In view of this tendency it must be the express contribution of IM to the churches and to society to enter into solidarity with men and women at the lowest level of industrial society, and not to loose the grassroots, too.

From here IM now must develop further. Its solidarity with the powerless, apathetic, and voiceless, its passion for those who suffer under the prevalent conditions of production is the pre-supposition for activities on other (higher) levels.

Economic and political structures which are hostile to human development must be changed. IM has still to learn how to trace the roots of problems, and how to discern the adequate levels in the economic and political structures where attempts at resolving a particular problem must be located. A group of workers might well be able to influence the shift plan of their shop, or the appoint-

ment of a new supervisor, if they allow no one to break their solidarity. If they want to change the production plan of their firm, other groups on higher levels must interact with the workers in order to achieve this goal. Problems of investment policy on an international scale cannot be solved other than on corresponding levels. This requires not only information and insight, but international instruments of communication and cooperation with political efficiency.

The organisation of IM is strong on the local level, as far as it goes. In most countries it is weak on the national level. It does not exist on the international level in terms of cooperation. This is one fundamental handicap of present IM!

Another handicap is the weakening effect which arises out of the disagreement on the questions which role IM in principle should play. Many people in the churches, encouraged by others in industry, support the status quo of our economic system calling this the "adequate neutral position" which the church should hold. Any attempt to change the conditions of work, wages or participation (co-determination), and any political dimension of IM work which challenges the status quo is regarded as unpermissible interference by the church. It is regarded as a deviation from the genuine spiritual task to preach (to the individual), and to comfort (in a way that man does not despair under the inhuman conditions of his life and work).

Management very audibly voices the interest of capital for an unchanging policy of the church, whenever the action of IM raises vital issues. The analytic work of conferences, the encounter of management representatives with workers arranged by Christian institutions are - in the eyes of those in power - a quantité négligeable, committing no one and changing nothing, sometimes even useful because the distressed worker gets an opportunity to let off steam.

If IM wants to make an impact on industrial society, it is action that is needed. Action well planned and organised according to a strategy, leading to a clearly defined goal. Action which helps people to develop their critical and creative faculties. Action which certainly does not allow for neutrality over against questions of socio-economic and political relevance. What does this imply? What steps should we take?

1) On the European level the IM teams and the European Contact Group for Church and Industry (ECGI) should help to arrange meetings of the representatives of workers and Trade Unions of one particular branch, for instance the chemical industry or the electronic industry. In spite of national differences, they must learn from each other to see their respective problems as part of a common problem. Consequently alternatives must be worked out on how to approach and solve these problems, some of them in joint action, others in separate actions but related to each other.

Of course there is no vacuum in this field. Unions have started initiatives across national borders. Yet often they are subject to the interest of their own organisation or to the bureaucracy which hampers quick and flexible action, and which only too often excludes the non-functionaries.

IM and ECGI might have a little more freedom and independence to move in a terra incognita. They should use their chance by initiating

ing and organising model conferences, which can pave the way for others.

A few years ago in Europe a conference of automobile workers and Trade Union representatives was organised on a multinational level by a German group of industrial ministers. ECG received a report. It should stimulate and encourage further initiatives.

2) ECG should trace in Europe all events where the problems at stake are being taken up on the international level. It then should delegate representatives to participate - not necessarily members only, but experts who are capable of making a contribution to the subject at the event, and capable of feeding back results and new contacts into ECG and national industrial missions.

3) ECG should encourage teams in different countries to study and publicise new forms of economic power as they become manifest in our society. In the same way countervailing actions of industry against industrial mission personnel and activities should be analysed and described. Knowledge and experience in this field should no longer be kept within church and national borders.

In the Federal Republic of Germany during the past few years 2 industrial ministers have lost their church assignments as industrial ministers on account of intervention from industry with the Church Government. There are other cases in which the church refused to oblige industry.

4) New groups and centres which try to control economic power come into being. For instance, groups resisting the Cabora Bassa Dam, or others fighting against the exploitation of the Bantu population in South Africa by European investors. ECG should contact them and discover ways of support and cooperation.

5) Learning how to cope with nationwide and international problems by action will help the ECG to make a contribution to other continents and their IM work, too. In this respect the problem of migrant workers from the undeveloped European countries and from Asia Minor and North Africa holds a key position. From their situation in our countries, we can learn what exploitation means. And this will help us to understand even better the basic problems of Asia, Africa and Latin America. ECG must keep this global aspect in mind, but unless cooperation on the European Continent becomes more real and practical, world wide activities will be up in the clouds.

In doing all this, and hopefully much more, there remains the question whether actions of this kind will not lead to an estrangement between those international actors of IM, and the worker.

It is a sore point in our society that the capitalistic conditions of industrial production lead the majority of dependant employees to apathy and passivity. Their thinking is cyclic, excluding hope for the better. The new is thinkable for them only in terms of more consumption, but unthinkable in terms of a new society with a different economy. "Things have always been bad for us, they will never change." Hence, there is no constructive motivation or driving force to act rationally for a society-related, political goal. When others think and act on their behalf, it has been proved that this does not move their thinking or alter their doing. They must learn to do it themselves. This is the only way of changing the worker.

It is of vital importance that those on the bottom should develop their personal and political capacity at the same pace as progress is being achieved on the higher levels in the socio-economic setup of our society. But how can this be realized?

According to Richard Hauser (London) indignation about an evil, or doubt whether things must remain as they are, or a sense of curiosity can be the starting point, for passing over a threshold which divides the stage of apathy or resignation and the stage of action. If this is true, then each attempt to suppress the outburst of indignation or doubt prevents apathetic or aggressive people from developing. This happens everywhere, foremost at work! At the same time the workers are blamed for their attitude of "I can't care less" or the so called shifting of responsibility.

The outburst of indignation can be the beginning of something constructive, if the people involved are allowed to live and work in a climate of hope that their situation can be changed, in a climate of encouragement that they themselves and what they do matters, and if they are helped to reason out their problems and action.

To create such a climate is one of the foremost tasks of industrial mission on the shop floor level. But as mentioned above, at this stage countervailing actions begin. And those who have not yet learned to solve a problem by means of a planned and corporate action get easily discouraged again. They fall back into apathy or aggression and do not reach the stage of social creativity.

Are there any other structures less repressive, which could serve as a training field for activating apathetic men? Structures where the clash of interests is not (yet) so violent? The urban field seems to us very helpful. Its problems cause acute pressure and sufferings in almost every family - no room and play grounds for children, isolation of old people and women, i.e. neglect of the interests of the so-called non-productive groups, air pollution, etc.

When a group gathers and takes action concerning a problem which they have in common, they succeed at most, in achieving a small change. To begin with, the individuals have been vitalised because of pressure and indignation in their immediate personal sphere. Now they learn to relate their own problem to that of others, and they experience that nothing will be changed unless they themselves act in solidarity with each other. Thus encouraged, the group sets out to tackle the next problem, and learns to reflect on strategies and methods. After awhile all the members of the group understand better how problems are inter-related, their structural aspects, the political and economic powers and interests behind the present urban and industrial development!

According to our experience the urban approach can be an excellent medium to open eyes for structural and political questions, and for the role which economic interests play in each section of society. Engagement in this field often encourages even the timid and unexperienced man and woman to venture on a first small step, then the second, then the next.

It is up to industrial mission to relate this to its specific goals, and to continue the emancipatory process in the work shop. In this sense urban and industrial Mission is needed to take up the challenge of society.

2. Auch dieser Überweisungsauftrag ist mit beigelegtem Kontoauszug hiermit Ihnen vorgelegt (20.10.1970 und 21.10.1970).

Dear Brother,

Greetings in Jesus name. On the above subject let me please explain for your knowledge. When I was the Adhyaksh of North-West Anchal at Gumla, Rev.Dr.K.V.Stieglitz informed me that he was sending 1500 DM for the purpose noted above. I am sorry I cannot give the date of the letter which is in the N.W.A. office. Accordingly I informed the Pastor at Kochedega and Ilaka chairman Kinkel and on May 27'1970 I personally visited the Kochedega congregation and announced the good news from Dr. Stieglitz. After that mistake was revealed that the money was not meant for Kochedega but for the congregation Lukibahar in Kochedega Parish. I had detailed correspondence with Dr.Stieglitz on this subject.

In his letter dated 17th June '70 Dr.Stieglitz made it clear to me that the money was really meant for Lukibahar and not for Kochedega. So to solve this problem Dr.Stieglitz in the same letter writes as under:- " But what about Kochedega itself ? You went to them bringing our greetings and the announcement of some help. The brethren had'nt asked for it. But we think we should send them a small amount as a sign of our love and fellowship. The brethren of Kochedega it seems to us are very wise, using material which is possible to get of their own without foreign help. I think that's the mentality you prefer and like to build in all the congregations. But inspite of that a small amount from our side will be welcome and bring the strange matter of changing congregations by mistake to a satisfying end."

After this letter of June 17'70 I got another letter from him on October 20'70 which reads thus:-

" Dear friend and Pramukh, thank you very much for your kind letter concerning Lukibahar & Kochedega. In this very moment I got 500 DM for the church roof in Kochedega. Now I am happily able to send you the amount of 1500 DM for Kochedega."

Dear brother Seeberg the first amount of 1500 DM as intimated to me by Dr.Stieglitz was received in the KSS office in the first week of July 1970. In this reference my Head Accountant Mr.Bhengra wrote a letter to you on Dec.3'71 in which the date of receipt is given in the month of July 1971 which is a typing mistake. It should be July 1970 instead of July 1971. After receipt of 1500 DM I again received information from Dr.Stieglitz dated 20 Oct.70 according to which he has announced of another 1500 DM for Kochedega. The first amount is meant for Lukibahar and the second amount is for Kochedega which amount has not been received in KSS office.

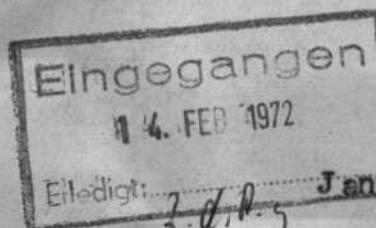

The Budget for the year 1973 has been shown in detail except Part II and VI, and is duly approved by the KSS Samiti, Central Executive, of the Gossner ELC in its meeting dated 11 th January 1972.

As the Audit of our 1971 Accounts have not yet been taken up, it is not possible for us to send you the Receipt and Payment Account and the Audit Report along with this Budget Estimate.

The total expenditure of the Budget for the year 1973 is higher than that for the year 1972. It is due to the inclusion of new items and the increment in every portion of the Budget. We would like to explain item wise in the pages next.

Explanation of the Budget 1973

Part I. Regular Expenses:- (Pages 1-2)

The Church is in a mind to appoint two more Central Executive Officers from the year 1973 in addition to the Education Officer for whom there is provision in the Budget 1972. They will be the Property Board Manager and the Development Officer, each with a salary of not less than Rs.300/- and the clerk. The appointment of these Officers and clerks increases the PART I Budget to an extent. (Part I (1)). Also, there is an involvement of more money in the Development Programme than in that of 1972. So, because of the above addition and expansion the expenditure in this item is greater than that of 1972 Budget. We have no request for IMF Subsidy for this item.

Part II. Evangelistic Work:- (Page 3)

In this item there is the expenses of Evangelistic Work done in three different types of fields.

No. (1) Part II, page 3 shows these Evangelistic Fields which are within the Anchals and the work done on them is purely of Ilakas'.

No. (2) Part II, page 3 points those special Fields of Evan. Work where the work is done with full support of Gossner Mission, Berlin. The Gossner Mission is kind enough to bear all cost as regard to this concern.

No. (3) is the Surguja Field which has been taken over by Gossner Church last year in 1971. It is a heavy burden to Gossner Church. We do not know how it could be managed. Any way the Church does not expect any help from IMF. The subsidy requested for this item is nil.

Part III. Medical Programmes:- (Page 3)

The particulars in this item is the same as was in the year 1972. The request of IMF Subsidy is also the same.

Part IV. Theological Education:- (Page 4-5)

The expenses in this item is the running cost of the Gossner Theological College, Ranchi and the Bible Training School, Gobindpur, P.O. Gobindpur, Distt. Ranchi. The establishment cost and the stipend to students are the main expenditure of the above Institutions. Out of the total cost of Rs.102656.00 the Church will get a sum of Rs.25000.00/- from Gossner Mission, Berlin. The rest, the Church has to find out by any means. We would have requested the remaining sum from IMF, but we hesitate to do so as we know the IMF will not agree to pay more than what was granted last year. So, the request of IMF subsidy in this respect is -

Part V. Secular Education:- (Page 5)

As usual this item bears the establishment cost of Bethesda Women's Training School, Ranchi. The Government Grant is very poor. The School has become of Central Concern. We do not get help from Ilakas or Anchals. Inspite of our usual request we place befor LWF our difficulty to run this Institution. We would be much thankful if the whole cost of this item is born by LWF. Total cost is Rs. 16116.00 only.

Part VI. Development Programme:- (Page 6)

Church is inclined to enforce a Development Programme within the Church which would bring about new life in the sphere of social and economical aspect of G.E.L. Church people. No specific Programme is drawn up as yet. Only an approximate sum prescheduled to the establishment cost of this programme in 1973. The Church will try to get Fund for that. We do not want help from LWF in this respect.

The Church hopes to get atleast Rs. 15000.00 only, a net income from the Properties of Gossner Church after deducting the Property Board's own expenses. The income thus expected is shown in Part I of the Budget.

With this explanation the Budget of the Gossner ELC is forwarded to you for your perusal and final approval. It is requested the amount of LWF subsidy amounting to Rs. 51400.-- = \$ 6354.- in respect of the Budget 1973 may kindly be passed.

More over, other request for Part V may also please be considered.

Dear Brother Minz,

In the meeting of our Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission on the 6th October, the budget of the Gossner Mission was passed for all our fields in India, Nepal, Zambia and Urban and Industrial Missions.


Regarding India, the Kuratorium decided to give grants of DM 100,000 (approx. Rps. 200,000) for 1972 instead of the DM 90,000 given in 1971. The Board of Evangelistic Literature sent us the official request for Gossner Mission grants in early September. It amounted to a total of Rps. 322,107.56 including the Surguja Mission Field.

So I regret very much that the Kuratorium could not grant the total request of the GEL Church. The gap between request and grant is the need of the Surguja Mission Field of about Rps. 100,000.

The Surguja Mission Field expenditures in the last year had been met by the American friends and an extraordinary amount granted by the Gossner Mission. I want to remind you that already then the Gossner Mission expressed their inability to continue in granting grants for the Surguja Mission Field and we proposed to remodel the Mission work in that area. As far as we have learned, the Board of Evangelism could not succeed in doing so. The smaller number of congregations and baptised members need a relatively higher number of full-paid personnel and this will be true also in 1972. At least more are needed than in other parts of the evangelistic field of the GEL Church. Moreover, the GEL has mentioned in several letters, the last being that of 4th August, that the GEL Church is ready for higher responsibility. But up to now we cannot see what financial contributions the GEL Church itself is going to make. Is it wrong that the total amount of expenditures in the Surguja is simply supported by American and German subsidies? As the Kuratorium is really interested in the sound development of evangelistic work of the GEL Church, there may be a possibility of a new extraordinary grant to the Surguja Mission field in the coming months. But I am not sure of that.

I know that there is also the deficit of Rps. 20,000 due to the stolen amount to also consider. You know that the Kuratorium discussed this matter, but as there was no official request from the GEL Church, the decision was to ask the Pramukh Adhyaksh for a more detailed explanation. Maybe there was a hope from our side that in the meantime the police of Ranchi could solve this problem.

As per your letter dt. 29.7.71 addressed to the Pramukh Adhyaksh with a copy to the undersigned in regard with the Budget for 1972 Gossner Mission Grant. I am writing this letter to you giving the Budget amount and request you to kindly consider the same favourably. As per minute of the BEL Executive held on the 17th August, 1971 The total amount requested is as last year's regular Rs. 210,538.36, and including Mikir Hills and Surguja Work the amount comes to the total of Rs. 322,107.56 (Rupees Three Lakhs Twenty-two Thousand One Hundred and Seven and Fifty-six Paise). There are increases in almost all amounts except that of Orissa, this year we have left out eight congregations to be amalgated in the Orissa Anchal. Increase of Rs. 200.80 in Central Budget is due to the pay increments only, no extra item for amount has been included. For Former JMB (SEA) and Udaipur amount is increased due to increments in pay, new appointments and construction works. The amounts in construction is increased as the cost of land, labour, material increased. The amount for Mikir Hills work is meant the minimum amount to continue the work. Last year (1971) there was no Budget, nor any amount given from Gossner Mission, but the work was continued through the balance money meant for Mikir Hills. The work for Surguja work is Ca Rs. 20,000.00 more than for 1971 specially construction works, Refresher Course etc. are included. As per letter of the Secretary, South Asia, Board of World Mission USA dt. 2nd Dec. 1970 addressed to Pramukh Adhyaksh Rs. 50,000.00 will be given for 1972 from the Board. Thus from the actual Budget Rs. 148,940.00 has to be found out from other sources.

The BEL-Executive discussed the matter from various points of view and expressed that as at present Gossner Church is passing through a critical financial situation, it is quite impossible for the church to finance this heavy amount alone. The income of the field is shown Rs. 10,000.00 only and it cannot be raised higher in a year, when the area has been so brought up in a dependent way. Therefore the BEL Executive requests the Gossner Mission to kindly consider the Evangelistic Budget for 1972 favourably including the Surguja Work.

Herewith I am also enclosing my half yearly report.

THE HALF YEARLY REPORT OF THE EVANGELISTIC WORK

(January - June 1971).

Dear Friends,

The Year 1971 is a very important year for the Gossner Church, in regard with the evangelistic work. In the month of January the Gossner Church took over the charge of Surguja Mission Work from the LNMS/Surguja Board under her purview. It is a matter of great responsibility for the Gossner Church as a whole and for the BEL in particular at this stage to take over great responsibility, when the church is struggling hard for the financial stability and when on bilateral agreements the "Home Boards" are withdrawing their financial contribution. In this year and the following years Surguja Field will be a "delicate child" for the Gossner church; a similar situation seems to be ahead in regard with the work in Mikir Hills.

In February the Director made an extensive tour of the Mission Field in Sambalpur and Sundargarh districts. The tour was specially meant for the congregations, where Part-time Catechists are appointed to inform the congregations and to have an on the spot acquaintance in order to arrange their possible transfer to the Orissa Anchal. It has been agreed upon that these congregations be transferred to the Orissa Anchal.

Before leaving for Germany to give report before the Kuratorium, the Director made an informative tour of the Surguja Field. It was necessary to visit the field in order to give a detail report and answer about the field.

For two months Director was out side India, i.e. in Germany and in the Congo. The Director gave report on the Evangelistic Work before the Kuratorium and there after for many "Pastor-Convents", Congregations, Congregation-leaders groups etc. showing the present success, difficulties and future possibilities and problems, in terms of personell, finance and field. The Director afterwards on his return journey visited also the "Jesus-Christ's Church on the Earth through the Prophet Simon Kimbangu. The report has been already submitted.

The Field Reports are encouraging but not without much anxieties and difficulties. The work in the Mikir Hills is progressing, though very slowly. There are five workers, including the Missionary, Rev. M. Baa. Three new stations are being started. In Balipathar a Chapel has been erected. Similarly in Horihojan and Borpong centres are to be opened very soon. At least one new appointment will be a must. In this half year thirteen new converts have been baptised and it is hoped that by the end of the year more converts will be baptised.

The workers of the area are suffering very much from unnecessary inconveniences and uncertainties. So the workers are very much frustrated and are on the verge of resignation. The field needs proper support, guidance and co-operation, but we are failing due to distance language difficulty and financial draw-backs. The Mission Field under Rev. I. Guria Supervisor the work is progressing crossing many hurdles. There are altogether 42 Workers including five Pastors and a Teacher in our only Primary School in the area. In this year Sixty-seven adults have been baptised.

In this half year major transfer of workers specially those of Pastors have been made by the Anchal. It is regretfully reported that Catechist Johannes Melgandi has become Lunatic and is under the S.D.O's custody to be transferred to the Indian Mental Hospital Kanke.

Now or later the mission work must be included in the project of the whole church. The questions of personell, finance, some other things of the mission work must be thought and planned both in long and also short programmes.

The construction work in the area have been carried out in maximum number of places. In nine places the work have been started and major portions of the work have been completed, there were also repair works. Yet there is much to do for construction works.

The Hindu- Festival-Contribution, Land dispute and famine caused by draught and flood have effected the area much. In no places our Christians and workers are involved in court cases with local anti-christian groups.

It is requested that Medical-Box and other equipments be supplied to the workers and encouragement-allowance for the successful workers be provided. Special tour facilities, city or guest allowance be given for the Supervisors.

The Udaipur Mission Work is also in progress but not up to the expectation. There are altogether 43 workers including three Pastors and one Pracharika. Thirty Adults have been baptised in this half year.

The work includes proclamation of the Gospel, Prayer Meetings, Sunday School and Regular Night Schools beside Sunday Services and Sacramental work. Major construction works are that of Pastor Quater in Tolma and Pathalgaon, the two Parish Centres. A chapel and a Catechist's Quater have been built in two other places; in six places either Catechist's Quater or Chapel have been repaired. The Supervisor Rev. Dh. D. Toppe writes that some of the prevailing in the fields are fear of losing "Adibasi Rights" after being baptised. Competition of Catholics and Lutherans as another problem. It is causing much confusion in both the Camps, the biggest and most important problem is our weakness to help the Christians in the field of Education, Agriculture for their better living. The Christians are supposed to be the most backward society in the area. The authority concerned are requested to arrange and plan the work in such a way to make the field self-support in a very near future. Schools, Hostels, Landed Property etc. be provided with.

The Surguja Mission Field has many things to report. Soon after the Field was take over with a new Superintendent, the Superintendent is on a study leave for training in Japan. In this transitional and delicate period North West Anchal Adhyaksh has made a provisional arrangement in the person of Anchal Adhyaksh, the plan and the projects are running in the same line. The "Acting Superintendent" as his part time job has tried his best to keep the cart rolling. There are 71 Pastors in the field including seven pastor. In the field beside proclamation of the Gospel and the congregational work, there are two school Hostels with boys and girls section and one Primary school. The Hostels and the School which are running on deficit have to be supported by grants if found by the Gosner Church.

In this half year 139 adults have been baptised. There are 6012 baptised members and 1735 confirmed members in the Field. The Financial Statement shows that field is running under deficit. The construction work is almost nil in this half year, though there is much need of new construction and repairs. The most delicate and acute problem of the field is that of money, to carry on the work with its various projects to bring the field in the real status of an Ilaka, a self supporting unit.

Through much effort and loss Gharbandhu has been regularised. Beside all efforts and labour it has not yet been possible to make the Magazine self-support. The opinion "Gharbandhu is not sent regularly" is still haunting the mind of the people; in many places due to postal or local irregularities some of the subscribers do not get the Magazine, hence the magazine is not getting maximum subscribers as it ought to be.

In view of the Mission policies and practices prevailing and developing both in "Home Boards" and in "Young Churches" the Gosner Church must be very realistic in thinking and planning for its mission work. Somehow or other the mission work must be included in the project of the whole church. The questions of personell, finance, means and methods of the mission work must be thought and planned both in long and slow range programmes.

We thank God for His continual help and blessing, we also thank all our friends here and abroad for support and encouragement.

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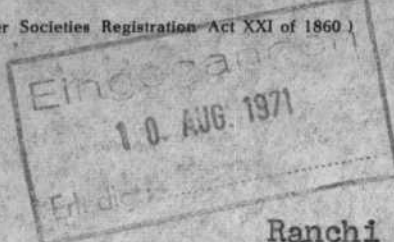

Dear brother-in-Christ,

Many thanks for your letter on this important subject. We would have sent it before October and definitely not in August. Many thanks for your letter in time. On receiving your letter the BEL will meet on August 16, 1971 and the budget of the Evangelistic field including budget of Surguja Mission field will be sent. I hope you will get it in time.

Regarding Surguja Mission field, it is up to the BEL to send definite proposal, but I would like to express my own view points.

A. Strength of the field:- Before taking charge of the field, we were hearing that the number of Christians is more than Seven thousand; but on Rev. N. Ekka's supervision Census was carefully collected and it is found that the number is a little more than Six thousand only.

B. Spirit of Self Support:- Work of G.E.L. Church workers is quite different from that of other Church in India in the line of Self Support. We are sorry, it is lacking in Surguja. Though the Pastors were from Gossner Church, they did not work in this line, rather most of them were of opinion to create a new Surguja Church with their Home Board in U.S.A. Since we have taken charge of it, work has been started, but it cannot be expected of the Self Support of the field so soon.

C. Initiation was taken not by us but by the Gossner Mission for the amalgamation of Surguja with the Gossner Church and therefore it is quite natural to expect grant for the field from Gossner Mission, that was previously being given by the American Mission Board. If the grant will decrease from both sides, dear brother Seeberg, surely we will be helpless to support it, and I do not know what will be its future. It is my own view points, but please wait for the proposal of the BEL.

We are indeed ready for higher responsibility, but unable to jump so high so as to be able to support such a vast Mission field where workers' Salary only is nearly seven thousand per month excluding field allowance to workers and other project expense. Therefore I would urge up on you to consider this issue very carefully and sympathetically.

Concerning the means to be granted for India (Gossner Church) we have to consider the volume of the amounts we are able to grant in 1972 to the Gossner Church. Based on our agreement we are still ready to grant means for the mission work of the Gossner Church, the missionary health service in Amgaon and Takarma as well as for the training program in Fudi. Please be kind enough to ask the BEL for their proposals concerning 1972 they intend to submit to Gossner Mission.

We are too awaiting BEL's proposals concerning the means for the support of the work in the Surguja field. We beg to remind that in 1971 this question was settled preliminary. In 1972 the Lutheran Church of America will pay for the Surgujy field Rps 22.300 less than in 1971. From Gossner Mission too you can not expect receipt of the same amount as in 1971. We expect Gossner Church to accept higher responsibility.

Dear Rev. Minz:

It was very good to have spent several days with you in Ambikapur and to have finalized matters regarding the transfer of the Surguja field to the Gossner Church. Thank you for the circular letter you have sent out following your KSS meetings. We are indeed grateful for the fine spirit exhibited by the KSS.

When the GELC assumes responsibility on January 1, 1971, Surguja field will enter a new stage in its development, from that of a separate mission field to that of being a part of a large Church. Also this new development will mark the fulfillment of the dreams of those who, in 1951, foresaw the future of this field as being a part of the GEL Church.

There are two items about which I now write. The first is the matter of continuing financial support. As I indicated to you in Ambikapur, there are two matters that are important, namely (a) the desire of the GELC to assume authority over the Surguja field must carry with it certain responsibility to assist financially; and (b) that the GELC, the Gossner Mission and the BWM/LCA must guarantee that the 1971 budget will be provided for.

I would like to suggest that the division of the 1971 budget be as follows:

BWM/LCA grant	Rs. 72,300
GELC and Gossner Mission ...	39,200

and that the anticipated offerings be held separately in 1971 so that

so that at the end of the year there can be a budget balance for 1972 of whatever amount was collected in offerings. In this way we can guarantee that the 1971 budget will be met in full.


I would also like to indicate that the BWM/LCA, over the next three years will require a reduction of BWM/LCA subsidy and therefore I suggest the following schedule of reduction:

1972 - Rs. 50,000
1973 - Rs. 30,000
1974 - Rs. 15,000
1975 - nil

The second matter I was to underline is item No. 6 in your circular letter, namely "special consideration be made in respect of the development programmes in that field". I do feel strongly that some community development projects need to be studied and I would hope that your Church can, in 1971, make some suggestions as to possible projects which can be begun.

The resolution regarding corroborative votes on the proposed Constitution of the G.E.L. Church, passed in the Anchal samiti meeting dated Oct. 17-18, 1971 at Tinsukia G.E.L. Church is sent to you for information and the needful.

Anchal Samiti Assam in its meeting discussed and considered in every respect on the proposed constitution and resolved:- That the Anchal Samiti Assam is not in favour to give its corroborative vote to be enforced a new proposed constitution in the G.E.L. Church for the following reasons:-

1. Due to its geographical distance from the centre it appears practically impossible that the various congregation under the GEL Church scattered in the vast area of Assam shall be looked after from the centre under the proposed constitution.
2. Assam Anchal shall be divided into two Ilakas- Upper Assam Ilaka and Lower Assam Ilaka and as per provisions contained there in the Ilakas shall be under direct control, supervision and management of the Centre.
3. In view of the fast changing Socio-political picture of Assam State it is apprehended that the GEL Church Assam is in need of Regional approach to her problems which are peculiar in Assam, shall not be able to get due service from the centre.
4. It has been seen from the past seventy years history of the GEL Church of Assam that during all these years the GEL Church in Assam did not receive due share of various development programmes and projects that has been carried out in the whole church and as such there has not been done any note-worthy development of Assam.
5. The proposed constitution weakens the very spirit of Autonomy selfsupport etc. and it will encourage centralisation of power by the centre.
6. The proposed constitution is likely to disturb the communal harmony within the church.
7. Under the proposed constitution the administrative set-up appears to be topped heavy which is not conducive and it will heavy drain on the church finance.

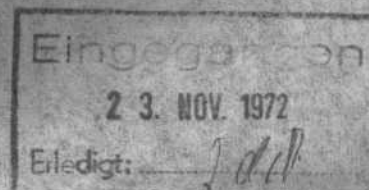

Re: Item No. 17 - Health Insurance of Pastors -
from the KSS Samiti Meeting, 1st-3rd March, 1972

We have discussed this item and have the following suggestions to offer the KSS for consideration when discussing this matter.

As such insurance for church workers is a new idea, it is best to begin with a few words regarding the purposes of such an insurance scheme. It can be seen that an insurance plan

- will make health care possible even when the cost of medication or treatment is prohibitively high for a person to pay by himself,
- creates mutual liability, and
- in general, should encourage members to seek medical advice and treatment.

Our suggestions: -

The Fund

1. The money already granted by the Church of Westfalen (DM 9.600,--) for health care should be placed in an account as working capital for a fund entitled "Health Insurance for Church Workers".
2. This fund is to be supplemented by means of annual payments in advance by members. The annual premium is to be 10% of the monthly income of the member.

Questions arising

- a. How is 10% of the monthly income to be determined?
- b. What about fixed rates based on an income scale?
- c. How are the payments to be collected?

...2

Eligibility

1. This Insurance Plan is open to all church workers* for voluntary membership. The payment of the annual premium entitles the member to the benefits of the plan listed below during that particular membership period.
- * Pastors, Pracharaks, Teachers, Officers, Secretaries, etc.
2. Each membership can insure up to and including six persons in the same immediate family, i.e. father, mother and four children.
3. Upon paying the annual premium, the member shall receive a membership card and a small booklet consisting of ten tear-off cards, each with a corresponding stub remaining in the booklet to serve as a record.

Questions arising

- a. In case of death of the church worker, is the membership extended to his spouse?
- b. When should payments be taken? Our recommendation is to set one general date.

Benefits

1. Membership entitles the insured to any and all medication and treatment up to 100,--Rupees per membership year. This amount is, however, non-cumulative (the member cannot save unused benefits from the previous year in order to be insured up to 200,--Rupees). Medication and/or treatment must be given or prescribed by a doctor or dispensary from the following list * of approved medical establishments.

In extreme cases the insured may submit in writing an application to the Central Administration of the Insurance for consideration in granting extraordinary benefits.

2. Each card in the booklet is valid for treatment of one illness. In effect, the member and his family are insured for treatment of ten illnesses during each membership period.

Practice

1. When receiving treatment or a prescription for necessary drugs, the doctor or nurse must be given the booklet and complete the card and stub. The card will then be sent to the Central Administration of the Insurance Fund for Reimbursement.
2. When extending membership, unused cards and all stubs must be returned to the Central Administration.

It is hoped that these suggestions will help in the formulation of a health insurance plan for church workers. We also want to encourage the KSS to form a new advisory committee with members of neighbouring churches who are experienced in this area in order to obtain their comments. It is seen that the success of such a scheme would depend on the cooperation of the Anglicans and Catholics and their comments would be very valuable. Therefore, we would wait for the recommendations of this committee before progressing with the plan. It is also thought that this plan should be an ecumenical approach to the problem. The question of whether it would not be advisable to consider membership of church workers of neighbouring churches also arises.

Dear Brother,

On the above subject I have to let you know that last year we received from Gossner Mission a sum of Rs.2000/- to be equally distributed among them as Christmas gift from Germany. But due to non-availability of addresses of all the widows I ordered the head accountant to remit Rs 50/- only as first instalment to them whose address was available. Later on addresses of other widows were called for and money was paid to them at the same rate. Thus 25 widows were paid and still 3 widows are to be paid whose money is being remitted to day. Thus Rs.1250/- was remitted to 25 widows and Rs.150/- is being remitted to 3 widows; total Rs.1400/-

Now the balance of Rs.600/- will be equally distributed among 28 widows and the money will be remitted to them in December next as Xmas gift. Each will get at the rate of Rs.21.42 and the balance of 24 paise will remain which will be transferred to widows' fund account.

Last month another Pastor Rev. Johan Mundu of Tokad died, and thus the number of widows was increased by one, but this newly widowed wife is not entitled to get out of this special gift. However, if you advise us to give her equal share out of Rs.600/-, from our side we will have no objection.



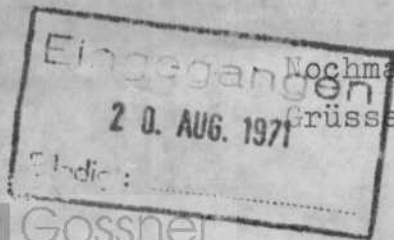

Subject: Widows of Pastors.

Ref: Your letter dt.Aug.3, 71.

Dear brother,

Thanks for your letter referred to above on the above mentioned subject. I am sorry to let you know that no such fund has been created by the Church to help the widows of the Pastors. As I see the past history, the Church leaders of the past spent their valuable time in Church politics, and except creation of Provident Fund, did nothing. Widows fund had been created, but discontinued since long. Similarly reserve fund had been created, but that is also discontinued since long. In both the funds, there are some thousands only. Today in both the funds, there should have been capitals of Lacs and out of interest of Widow fund, monthly help could have been given, but nothing to help them. I am really very sorry to see the condition of the Church.

Out of the interest of Widow fund, only once in a year it is distributed among the widows and they get about Rs.10/- or Rs.12/- each. Last year they received Rs.11/- each. The receipts are 20 in number, they are the following:-

As a procedure, order of Pension Officer Rev. J. Topno is being awaited. But for the widows, prior to creation of Pension Fund, there is nothing to help them. It would be highly appreciated if help is extended to them.

Nach längerer reiflichen Überlegung drängt es uns, nun doch das Kuratorium der Gossner Mission von einer Not zu informieren, die uns all die langen Jahre, die wir in Indien gearbeitet haben, verborgen blieb und die uns jetzt auf unserer Reise nach Indien (privat) im Dez. 1970 bis Januar 1971, von Pastoren der Gossner Kirche offenbart wurde. Diese Not ist mit durch das moderne technische Zeitalter entstanden wodurch die Bande der Grossfamilien zum grössten Teil so gelockert worden sind, dass die Familienglieder, die früher einen starken Zusammenhalt hatten, jetzt oftmals den Schutz und die Geborgenheit der Grossfamilie entbehren müssen. Unter ihnen sind 1. die pensionierten Pastoren und 2. die Pastorenwitwen.

Erstens: Die pensionierten Pastoren bekommen wohl-wie man uns berichtete-finanzielle Hilfe durch eine grosszügige und wohldurchdachte Hilfsmassnahme der Gossner Mission. Man ist dafür sehr dankbar, denn die Pastoren bekommen nun wenigstens regelmässig eine kleine monatliche Pension. Wie man uns sagte, beträgt diese ungefähr 40.-Rupies, das wären in deutschem Geld 20.-DM. Da aber von dieser Summe oft noch Frau und event. Kinder ernährt werden wollen, so ist diese Hilfe zu wenig. Früher konnten die pensionierten Pastoren in den Schooss ihrer Familie zurückkehren und wurden dort bis zu ihrem Tode versorgt. Heute ist es nicht mehr so. Heute nimmt die Familie-meist sind es die Brüder, die den Erbhof bearbeiten - sie nicht mehr an. Man trägt sich nun mit dem Plan, ob man nicht von den kirchlichen Ländereien einen Teil abzweigt für pensionierte Pastoren, die dann gemeinsam das Feld bebauen und somit zusätzlich etwas verdienen zu ihrem nackten Lebensunterhalt. Sie würden sich dort in kleinen, selbstgebauten Hütten ansiedeln. Wie das praktisch durchführbar wäre, bleibt dahingestellt und muss die Kirchenleitung in Ranchi beschliessen. - Unser Vorschlag und unsere Bitte ist: Könnte die Evang. Kirche Deutschlands nicht dafür sorgen, dass die Pension der Pastoren um das Doppelte erhöht werden könnte, sodass sie sich nicht an ihrem Lebensabend - nach Jahren der Entbehrung und Not-auch noch mit Kummer und Sorge um's tägliche Brot quälen müssen?

Zweitens: Auch die Not der Pastorenwitwen hängt mit dem modernen ^{alter} Zeit zusammen, besonders derer, die noch zu der Zeit Witwen wurden, wo keinerlei oder völlig ungenügende Fürsorge für die Pastorenwitwen vor-

handen war. Ihre Not hat uns zutiefst erschüttert. Was man uns darüber von den Pastoren in Govindpur berichtete, wurde alles durch den "Anchal Adyaksch" Junul Topno-nächster President der Kirche -in Kadma bestätigt. Da gibt es heute noch eine Anzahl Witwen, darunter eine, die in jungen Jahren Witwe wurde, mit 5 Kindern, die im Jahr 12.-Rupies bekommen! Das sind in deutschem Geld umgerechnet ^{monatlich} 50 Pfennige! Diese 12.-Rs. bekommen sie vor Weihnachten. Wir brauchen wohl nichts mehr hinzufügen. Die Tatsache schreit zum Himmel und wir sind gewiss, dass Sie Mittel und Wege finden werden, dieser unbeschreiblichen und für eine Kirche untragbaren und unwürdigen Not ein Ende zu bereiten. Für die Witwe mit den 5 Kindern haben wir sofort Hilfe gegeben und schicken ihr jeden 2.-3. Monat etwas, bis eine Neuregelung einsetzt.

Noch ein drittes Anliegen möchten wir Ihnen vortragen mit der dringenden Bitte, auch hier Abhilfe zu schaffen. Es handelt sich um die drei kirchlichen Institute der Gossnerkirche in Chota Nagpur. Dass die Gossner Mission ihre finanzielle Hilfe für die Gossner Kirche in Kurzem ganz abbauen will, damit hat man sich draussen abgefunden, und sucht Mittel und Wege sich selbst zu helfen. Was ihnen aber Sorge und Not macht, das sind die drei Institute, die die Grundpfeiler des kirchlichen Lebens sind: 1. Das Theologische College, in Ranchi, für die Ausbildung der Pastoren 2. Das Katechisten Seminar, in Govindpur, das Katechisten für die Gemeinden und Missionsarbeiter für die Missionsgebiete ausbildet. 3. Die Tabita Schule, die Gemeindegemeinderinnen und Missionsarbeiterinnen unter Frauen und Kindern, auch für das Missionsfeld, ausbildet. Erwartet man von der Gossner Kirche nicht Unmögliches, wenn man erwartet, dass sie für diese drei Institute auch noch geldlich aufkommen soll? Bei dem Katechisten Seminar und der Tabita Schule würde es sich nur um Stipendien handeln. Für die Gehälter der Lehrerschaft dieser beiden Institute - so berichtete man uns - hat sich die Lutheran World Federation bereit erklärt. Wir erfuhren, dass die Tabita Schule mindestens 40 (man zeigte uns die Anmeldungen) und die Katechisten Schule 45 Neuanmeldungen für das Jahr 1971 hatte, dass aber die Kirche nur je 10 Studenten bewilligte, "aus Mangel an Geld". Auf Befragen und in wiederholten Sitzungen mit den verantwortlichen Pastoren beider Institute, kamen wir zu folgendem Vorschlag und Plan: Für das Jahr 1972: Jedes Institut mindestens 30, wenn möglich 40 Studenten. Für jeden Studenten sind 40.-Rs. monatlich nötig, das wären 20.-DM. pro Student. Das wären wiederum für jedes Institut monatlich ~~im~~ ^{im} Ganzen bei 30 Studenten 600.-DM. - bei 40 Studenten 800.-DM.

Über event. geldliche Unterstützung des Theol. Colleges haben wir keinen Einblick gesucht oder erbeten, da wir erfuhren, dass Amerika schon hilft und der Leiter des Theol. Colleges, Rev. Nirmal Minj, persönlich mit Deutschland und Amerika in Verbindung steht. - Über den Inhalt dieses Briefes sprachen wir persönlich mit Altdirektor Lokies. Er meinte, wir sollten ihn "unbedingt" dem Kuratorium vorlegen, was wir nun hiermit tun.

In der Korrespondenz über dieses Thema war ich seinerzeit mit dem Pramukh Adhyaksh nicht weitergekommen. Jetzt hatte ich während einer KSS-Sitzung Gelegenheit, diese Frage zu erörtern. Es ist ein Ausschuss gebildet worden, der die Statuten für eine solche kirchliche Krankenkasse erarbeiten soll. Eigentlich hätte diese Arbeit bis zu meiner Verabschiedung schon fertig sein sollen, aber zwei Mitglieder des Ausschusses waren für eine Reihe von Tagen von der Bildfläche verschwunden. Ich werde die Sache aber weiter verfolgen und hoffe, Ihnen bald Genaueres schreiben zu können. Dear Sirs,

I am very sorry to enclose the copies of letters addressed to and by me regarding the letter of the Secretary Press M/C. containing the resolution of that M/C. for your information and record. I have to give my following re-action and actions.

The letters are to some extent self explanatory, however I have to give some points connecting these letters in connection with our discussions and resolution draft in the BEL-Executive on 30-9-72.

1. Contents of the letters are against the spirit of the prevailing atmosphere in the above said meeting. I feel myself unable to work as Associate Editor, Gharbandhu, because I shall not be able to comply with "strong advice" and request made by the said M/C.

2. I am very much disappointed that the resolution of the M/C. was made secret inspite of my enquiry from the chairman, BEL, who is also the chairman of the Press M/C. I have my own way, if the M/C. has taken such actions, - I have given my explanations, but the chairman has kept it secret from the BEL Executive on last meeting deceitfully and led the committee to make me surrender to it, and with good hope and for the good of the Gharbandhu and the church (as the draft says) I bowed down but the chairman playing the double role allowed the raised dagger struck on my back, which he could have stopped if so wanted.

Therefore I feel that my "determination for taking all possible steps to guarantee that the policy referred will be upheld" is not possible or it is not true and sincere. I feel and irresponsibility- find irresponsibility that there is already a breach of trust deliberately.

I am therefore compelled to stand to my previous decision of resignation from the work of the Associate Editorship, Gharbandhu. I express my deep sense of regret for going back to my former decision. I hope and do pray that the Almighty God will be gracious to us all to fulfill His service faithfully and honestly.

Therefore with this letter I am giving the charge of Gharbandhu totally to the Editor, Gharbandhu, by handing him over the subscribers Registers I & II, the Government Document File, A Receipt Books and the Stamp "Editor, G.E.L. Church Gharbandhu". The other necessary Registers, Files, Papers etc. will be handed over at any agreed time. Rev. K.D. Soy, Assistant to the Director, BEL shall make necessary arrangement and procedure for the handing over of the said charges immediately on this date the 6th October 1972.

Thank you very much for your kind letter dt. 5th Oct. '72 Ref.No. nil. giving an extract from the minutes of the G.E.L. Church Press Managing Committee on 15-9-1972 with regard to Dr. C.K. Paul Singh letter No.BEL/85/72 dated 11.1972 in reply of the Superintendent's letter No.GELP/Man/3/695 dated 9-9-1972 with the copy of the letter.

I hope and pray the honourable members of M/C will permit me to give my following remarks and explanations for kind and favourable considerations, actions records etc.

First of all I regret that your letter with the extract came to me too late to be put in the BEL. Executive held on 30-9-72 for needful action! was it preplanned? Could the honourable Secretary not furnish the minute or typists of the Press Staff were not available? or was the minute so far not confirmed? 1) Thanks to the committee for its "faithful" approval of the action of the Press Superintendent in his favour and as per "by-law! But I do not understand why the M/C did not refer to the resolution of the KSS dt. 18-22 Nov. '71 as quoted by the Press Superintendent, this same is, I understand, an addition to the Bye-Laws and is perhaps against the irregularities in M/C and of Superintendent. Please also see the prevailing constitution of the G.E.L.C. M.C. may please consider for the future !

2) Part of Dr. C.K. P. Singh :

Article - Para - Improvement of Gharbandhu etc. : M/C. has ^{not} gone through my letter point by points, and thus has taken such words and terms fitted to make Dr. Singh "the Scape goat".

(a) I am very very sorry for my foolishness that I did not bring the matter to M/C or Editorial Board of Gharbandhu directly for the improvement of the Gharbandhu. It was my foolishness that I brought these matters many times only to the chairman of Press M/C and the Editor & the Chairman of the Editorial Board. He did take action to please some one but without any fruit? Sorry! Please refer to my letter word by word, I hope in future the Editor himself shall do it better and the "Press M/C" and "Editorial Board" shall improve Gharbandhu and everything by prompt actions. I request for your pardon.

- (b) Sorry, I do not attend the M/C meetings of the Press and C.C.P.H. "regularly" even as ex-officio member ! But how "regular" are these committees in their words and actions, also regular in giving me notices of these regular meetings ?

Sorry, I shall not be able to attend these meetings even after strong advice of the M/C because I do not understand the big things and matters spoken and done in these "regular" meetings (!) I am very sorry for my ignorance of all kinds of things you have mentioned.

I was thinking that I have rightly pointed out the things which are necessary to be known by the members and Gharbandhu readers of our church to explain why the reputed and well furnished GELC Press is going to ~~gag~~ dogs inspite of prompt actions of the Press M/C. and Superintendent. I am sorry for this thinking. I hope in future to guide correct and necessary informations to all (concerned) people for the good future of the Press which has served to serve the church for His glory only.

- 3) My letter was addressed to the Pramukh Adhyaksh who forwarded the copy of the same letter to the Press Superintendent for reply, but he did not reply, just waiting for an "administrative framwrk" ?

I have given reasons - honourable member may please refer the letter, I have written to the Pramukh Adhyaksh other letters too. I am wondering why he did not forward the copy of the same ? Let the M/C. discuss all these letters item my item and reply to me or take action as done in regards with the above mentioned letter.

- (a) Sorry that due to my letter and its spirit members were made to regret the press M/C. may please refer to my letter No. BEL/78/70 dt. 26-7-70 addressed the chairman BEL with Copies to the Secretary Press M/C and the Press Superintendent about those things.

- (b) Sorry, that due to the facts, which are based to the best of my knowledge, "misunderstanding inside and outside of the church" has been made. I hope and say that I shall make correspondence more accurately to answer the questions of the people in the church and outside the church the M/C will kindly give the facts of the Press and its related works as the people in and out side the church want (?) I am sorry for my inexperience of keeping correspondence with the "administrative framework" ?

I beg your pardon !

I am very sorry that I have done against the expectation of the M/C. of GELC Press and I ahve created the "unhealthy "atmosphere" all over the church". Shall I write an open letter addressed to the GELC people about the GELC Press etc. to create the healthy atmosphere all over the church, as many honourable members of our church have in done to seek verdict of the people for certain matters or shall the Pramukh write or chairman write "Patri"? Press M/C may kindly advice. Sorry, that I have become such foolish man in the G.E.L. Church, M/C. and its honourable members are doing very good service to the church, but I am blaming them with my writings for Gharbandhu !! What about the article in Gharbandhu (Oct.72) by Martin Tete - by the way this article did not go through the proper channel and Superintendent printed it leaving other articles because it was of Martin Tete ? But what shall I say when during my tour, people of GELC are asking; have you brought Durangputhi, Along, ~~Satish~~, Bhajna-wali, Panjika, etc. ? Shall I say, no, because Press M/C is doing very good ? I can have many points for defence, but I surrender to honourable Press M/C. members to answer me, if so desire, to me as an individual of the G.E.L. Church.

I am very sorry to give my above reactions and request to bear with me for my ignorance etc. I do appeal to the honourable Press M/C authorities and well wishers of the Press and the church consider the matters sincerely

Dear Sir,

Thank you very much for your kind letter No.758/72/KSS-21 dated 15th Sept.'72. I am ver sorry to note that you are very sorry to read only the end of my letter about my resignation from the post of Associate Editorship. This is a great disappointment for me. What about my other points (1-5) in that letter No.BEL/85/72 dt.11-9-72 ?

You may not accept my resignation as Pramukh Adhyaksh, but you could have explained the other points on which circumstances I have resigned. If not you as Chief Editor, Gharbandhu must take action as Superintendent GELC Press requests you. As I have written earlier letters and reported to you verbally I am unable to work with the present Superintendent Mr. B. Khess GELC Press. He is printing arbitrarily the MANUSCRIPT submitted by me as Associate Editor. He has even censored the M/S. You can verify this even in the previous issues and specially in October(72) issue. Can he do so- like this ? That means he ignores my work and labour. This has been reported to you more than once. Therefore for me it has become well known secret that nothing will change the situation under the present Superintendent Mr. B. Khess. Therefore if there is any provision for you please accept my resignation as Pramukh Adhyaksh or as Chairman BEL.

Under the above circumstances mentioned earlier my resignation from the post of Associate Editorship of Gharbandhu stands unchanged and I have stopped my work as Associate Editor. As I have mentioned in my earlier letter reffered by you, I repeat again "The Chief Editor of the Magazine Rev. C.B. Minz, the Pramukh Adhyaksh and the Superintendent Mr. B. Khess GELC Press, Ranchi shall be made fully responsible for any consequence or bad effect on the G.E.L. Church.

The Chief Editor, Gharbandhu is requested to make arrangement for Gharbandhu work without delay".

Rev. K.D. Soy, Assistant to the Director BEL automatically ceases to be the co-worker for Gharbandhu due to my resignation. If he continues to work for Gharbandhu personally and in own interest, I have no objection to it unless the office work of BEL affected.

Please excuse me that I am addressing this letter to you. As you have stopped me to make any further correspondence with the Superintendent Mr.B.Khess GELC Press Ranchi I am compelled to do this. I have to give the following explanations and strong reaction for which you and the Superintendent Mr.B.Khess shall be fully responsible for any consequence to come.

1. The Half yearly Report was presented in the BEL Executive Meeting and the question arising were explained by the Director BEL. The same has been translated into Hindi for Gharbandhu.
2. The Press and the Publishing House have to give their reports even without asked by the BEL (vide constitution, the Byelows and resolution of the KSS one is referred by the Superintendent Mr.B.Khess himself).
3. The Superintendent Mr.Khess should read the report carefully. I can show many instances that the Superintendent Mr. Khess has done arbitrarily in printing the Gharbandhu, only due to the patience and untiresome work of the Associate Editor and Rev.K.D.Soy Assistant to the Director BEL the Gharbandhu could be published regularly.
4. The Superintendent's quotation of the KSS minute dt.Nov.18-22,'72 goes mostly against the Superintendent Mr.Khess GELC Press please see there :-
 - (i) The training of Students:- Has the Superintendent arranged well ?
 - (ii) The report of the Press :- Has he submitted, through whom ?
 - (iii) The meeting of M/C ? Is it so ?
 - (iv) Half Yearly Audit Report:- Where is it ?
 - (v) Audit by Chartered Accountant :- How often ? What is M/C doing on the last report ?
 - (vi) Rules and Regulations by the BEL: totally failed, but do the M/C and the Superintendent really go according to the rules and regulations already existing and decided time to time ?
 - (vii) Arrangement be made for training of Superintendent :- For Mr.B. Khess ? but the Superintendent did not go, perhaps looking for training in foreign country ?

5. Relation of the Press and the Publishing House:- Stated fact in the Half Yearly report can be confirmed by the decision of the KSS Officers' Meeting dt.2-9-72 Item 3 and many letters of the Pramukh Adhyaksh to the Secretary of the concerned M/C. Why no objection to such letters ? Due to the unsatisfactory relation between the GELC Press and the Publishing House Punjika(1973), Durang Puthi, Along, Sakshi-Bani etc. are not in a position to be printed by the Press under Mr.B.Khess. Is it not so ?

The Director BEL to whom the above mentioned letter has been addressed is at the same time the Associate Editor Gharbandhu, on the ground of above circumstances and as already mentioned in his previous letter No.BEL/84/72 dt.11-9-72 Item 5 resigns with immediate effect this day 11th Sept.1972 ex-parte from the work of an Associate Editor, Gharbandhu.

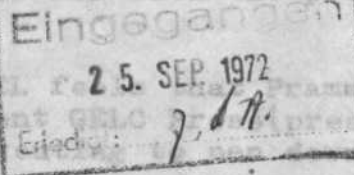

Thank you very much for your kind letter, a copy of letter No. 740/72/KSS-32 dated 8-9-72. As the letter has references to some previous correspondence it need some clarifications before any action from our part is expected. First of all it is expressed with regret that it is highly objectionable to request Dr. Singh to make payment of the two bills attached (duplicate ?) as if they are his personal Bills. As it has been already told verbally that the printings were not personal. If one claims so, he has no idea of anything even of printing, or he says so blindly. If such printing as letter head (this very letter head on which this letter is written) of an office is treated by a press Superintendent as of personal nature. It is sheer ignorance. The Superintendent GEL Church Press has shown his inability of discerning simple things, even the letter head of a board of the GELC or is it his blindness to get the money on bills ? If he plays such objectionable games with his own people can be not blunders with other customers and thus lead the press to suicidal death ?

The Director BEL has no right to withheld the bills on the job done correctly by any firm or institution on personal grounds. But it was understood to help the Pramukh Adhyaksh/the KSS realising the loan from an institution like GELC Press which has just bluffed the KSS by giving a "dishonourable Cheque", but if the Pramukh Adhyaksh does not like the way lest the party be displeased, the Director, BEL is ready to clear up the bill at any suitable time. But the requests for the right to place following remarks and recommendations to the KSS and the G.M. for record and necessary considerations :

1. As Director BEL and the present KSS member I shall not like to hear anything from the Pramukh Adhyaksh about loan to or from any one.
2. That the amount of the BEL shall be kept intact in a separate account under the KSS. This is to keep the BEL money safe, lest it be given in loan and never refunded and thus the BEL workers have to suffer. Such ideas have been already expressed by some officers and responsible persons of the KSS.
3. If due to loan etc. the workers of the BEL-Centre and Fields shall have to suffer at any day or time the Pramukh Adhyaksh shall be made fully responsible by the BEL and the Gossner Mission. Such expression had been already made in KSS meeting by Director BEL based on his Terms of Reference.
4. Henceforth Director BEL shall find out possible place and press where the publication of the BEL are well done and shall be recognised as official not putting the Director BEL in any awkward position.

- The Director BEL is ready to disassociate from any job or task which offends the Superintendent GELC Press or which leads direct dealings of the Director BEL with the present Superintendent of the GELC Press.

At the end the Director BEL feels that Pramukh Adhyaksh on one side and the Press Superintendent GELC Press (present Superintendent) are fully responsible for preventing to pen down to contents of this letter.

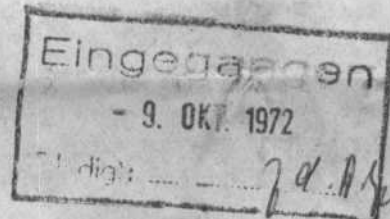

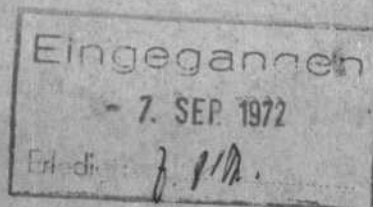

We have forwarded the request of the Printing Press to the Stipend's Department of the Diakonisches Werk in Stuttgart together with our recommendations.

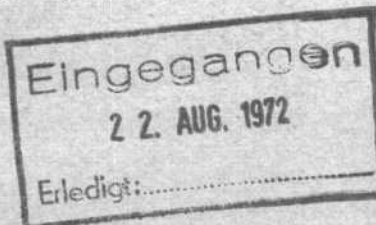

It was with regret that we had to read that the financial situation of the school is not good as a deficit of Rps. 19,199.13 for 1973 is foreseen. We remember very well that after the Gossner Mission involvement, our friends in Stuttgart supported Khutitoli High School for two more years with the hope that, in the meantime, the school could overcome the difficulties. Unfortunately this was not the case. We feel that the problem of Khutitoli High School is not a single entity, but, on the contrary, has to be seen in the context of the entire educational programme of the G.E.L. Church. We are looking forward to receiving the report and recommendations of Prof. Grothaus after he has studied this area. In the meantime, we do not want to initiate any action or anything at all.

From the letter written by you with regard to Womens' College Hostel at Khunti, to Rev. B. Minz dated 3 May '71 you have asked for clarification of certain points. You are not in a position to consider the matter until reply to these points raised by you is not given with regard to Womens' hostel at Khunti.

Through your letter of 3 May it is seen that you want also to know whether there was consultation with the Gossner Church Development Committee with regard to Womens' hostel at Khunti. In reply to that I would like to say that no consultation was made with the above committee as the Dev. Committee of Gossner church has been formed recently and it has not yet started its work properly. Prior to the formation of this committee there were several correspondences with you regarding Khunti hostel and hence it deserves your consideration. The points raised by the Regional Commission for Partnership Relationship to the Indian Lutheran Church I enclose herewith minutes of the Board of Education of the GEL Church, duly approved by the KSS (Church Council) along with the resolution of the KSS, by which the question raised by the Commission and all the conditions are fulfilled.

So far the question of Womens' College hostel at Khunti is concerned the situation there is such that neither the Government nor the other churches have opened any college hostel. The girls make their own arrangements for accommodation by residing in different messes run by them. The girls frequently approach Rev. J. Topno, Adhyaksh and urgently request him to construct a college hostel for them. In such a need it is justified to get help from abroad. Therefore I earnestly appeal to you that Womens' College hostel at Khunti may please be considered and given first priority, and the project be sanctioned.

For this act of your kindness I remain ever thankful.
