





Enclosed herewith is the Survey Report submitted by Mr. Nathaniel after his visit to your hostel.

I request you to study this report carefully and take immediate steps to set things right.

The suggestions and recommendations of Mr. Nathaniel are given on pages 13 and 14.

I would like to stress again the following:-

1. Medical Check-up

The Home should arrange for a qualified Doctor to conduct a medical check-up for all the children every year since this has so far not been done. It is essential that steps be taken to see that a medical check-up is conducted at an immediate date.

2. Cultural Activities

As mentioned in the report it is necessary that cultural evenings be held at least once a week.

At these programmes the children should be encouraged to display their talents.

3. Accounts

The account books were not available at the time of the visit. You are requested to conduct an interim audit up-to the 31.5.77 and forward the Statement of Accounts to me without delay.

4. Full-time Warden

This is a must. A suitable person should be found who could take care of the numerous aspects of the work.

I request you to call a meeting of your Managing Committee to discuss the report.

You are also requested to let me know what steps are being taken to implement all the suggestions and recommendations.

/ I am forwarding herewith the Report submitted by Mr. Nathaniel after his visit to your hostel.

Kindly study this report very carefully taking note of the suggestions on pages 13 and 14.

I must admit that I am very disappointed with the management of the Home. So many aspects are neglected. What I cannot understand is the reason for there being no entries in your account books for 3 months. Further you had no proper record to show how much money was received and how much was spent.

The Special Gift and Joy Account was also not maintained.

You have also received our various requests for conducting an interim audit but so far there has been no response.

May I request you to note the seriousness of the matter and arrange for an interim audit to be conducted without any further delay.

Secondly it was noticed that the hostel sanitary block had not been cleaned for days. Kindly note that the sanitary block should be washed daily.

Food: Here again improvement is necessary. You are requested to take a keen interest in this regard and arrange for a proper menu to be prepared with a view to giving the children a balanced diet.

I look forward to your co-operation and request you to advise me as to the various steps you are taking to implement all the suggestions and recommendations.

Ref: To our circular LN/kjl dated February 25, 1977 . . .

The Self Evaluation Questionnaire was forwarded to your Home along with our above circular.

As stated previously the questionnaire is not a check on your hostel. Therefore, we would rather having a candid and authentic picture of your Home with valid findings rather than a rosy or a distorted one, which would defeat the very purpose of our Self Evaluation Programme.

Secondly we stress that this evaluation be done by a Committee of atleast 3 or 4 persons and should include those responsible for the management of the hostel i.e. the Manager/Superintendent, Correspondent, another member of the Managing Committee, Principal of the School or pastor or another competent person involved in the work. If at all possible, the Liaison Officer should be included, it may also be considered to nominate an outsider who has the relevant experience such as a medical practitioner or social worker.

At this point I wish to remind you with reference to page 4 of the questionnaire that you are requested to use numbers for rating the statements. Please do not therefore answer with yes or no.

May I point out that the last date for the submission of the questionnaire is 1.6.77 and you are therefore requested to forward the questionnaire on or before the required date without fail.

A follow-up team will be sent by us after receipt of the questionnaire either to all the hostels or to a random selection of hostels.





With reference to the subject mentioned above I, have to inform you that Mr. Nathaniel, K.N.M. officer Delhi visited Tezpur on 4th of April 1977 and asked me to clarify the situation of the church, specially of the Centre (Ranchi K.S.S.). Mr. Z.B. Lakra Secy. of the N.W. Anchal has circulated his letter No. 58/77/F-48 to the K.N.M. office Delhi and that letter has disturbed them very much. So they want to know the actual situation of the church and the legality of the K.S.S.

Here at Tezpur I, tried my best to clarify the questions put forward to me and I told him that trouble period of the church has already passed and as per direction of the Law Court, the then Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh Dr. C.K.P. Singh requested the anchals to complete the their election. Four anchals completed the ~~the~~ election but North West Anchal refused to complete the election, though repeatedly asked for.

Finally to keep the legality and stability of the Church, Dr. C.K.P. Singh had no alternative ~~but~~ to ask the members of the four anchals to constitute the highest body (K.S.S.) and that is according to the existing constitution.

In support of the action of the then Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh Dr. C.K.P. Singh, there are two strong grounds :-

(1). Judgement of the Law court : " The def dt. No. 1 (Dr. Singh) however will remain and act as a caretaker as before as per direction issued in this case to administer the working of the church till constitutionally valid official of the K.S.S. according to the provisions of the constitution of the Gossner Church are elected constitutionally for the vacant posts caused by the resignation of the defendants Nos. 2,3,8 and 9."

Without K.S.S. no anchal can alter or amend the constitution therefore it is the foremost duty of the N.W. anchal to first join the K.S.S. and then put forward their grievances to the K.S.S. without doing that they may call or write showing that the church is unconstitutional or illegal but that has no meaning that will only disturb the people nothing more legally there is no danger. *But*

In the trouble period (1974 to Sept 1976) of the church Homes or Hostels which are under the jurisdiction of N.W. anchal, they received K.N.M. money (Grants) through the K.S.S. and even now they are receiving and in future also they will receive. So this internal dispute has not disturbed the outside grants. Church has received and has given to the concerned Homes.

Mr. Nathaniel asked me to submit some of the documents and I submitted him the following :-

1. Church Constitution (Hindi and English)
2. Order Sheet of the judgement of Title suit No. 232/85 of 1973/75.
3. Dr. Singh's letter to the N.W. anchal in which he has requested them to complete their election.
4. Rev. S. Barla's (Pramukh Adhyaksh) letter to N.W. anchal in reply to their circular.

Lastly as Mr. Nathaniel told me that you are going to attend the meeting of the K.N.M. at Delhi on 20th April I requested him to ask all questions to you because you were the Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh of the Church and under your direction K.S.S. has been formed. So you are the right person to clarify the situation and tell them the legality of the church (K.S.S.)


So may I request you to go to Delhi with all relevant documents, so that the officers of the K.N.M. be convinced, nothing remain in their mind and heart and Tezpur and Tinsukia Homes (Hostels) be recognised immediately because this is the time for admitting the students in the Hostels because in Assam, session of Schools begin in the month of April. In Assam there is no Single K. N.M. in our Church therefore I humbly request you to give your possible help for the recognition of these two Homes.



XVII SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMENDATIONS

1. Sanitary Facilities - The sanitary facilities were inadequate. It also lacked proper maintenance.

At the time of our visit we discovered that it had not been cleaned for days and the whole area was very smelly. Daily washing of the sanitary block is a must.

A new sanitary block is also necessary.
2. Food - The food needs improvement. A proper menu sheet can be prepared. Meat should be given at least 3 times a month.

The vessels should be cleaned thoroughly before any food is prepared.
3. Kitchen - The kitchen was dirty and also not cleaned. The Manager is requesting to look into these matters daily and see that there is improvement.
4. Extra tuition should be arranged for those children who are weak in their studies.
5. The home had cumulative records but with hardly anything written in it. It needs to be brought up-to-date.
6. Excursions should be a regular feature of the Home.

The Manager is requested to arrange for an excursion or picnic for the children at an early date.

7. Accounts - This was also a great disappointment. The books were not kept up-to-date. There were in fact no entries for 3 months.

The Manager had recently taken Rs. 15,000/- from the Treasurer of the G.E.L. Church but there were not account as to how the money had been used.

The Special Gift and Joy Account was also not maintained.

We were not able to know how much money was received and how much was spent.

There was just a rough book whensome entries were jotted down.

8. It is recommended that a follow-up study be conducted on all out-going children. If possible meeting of the old students could be held once a year.

9. An inventory for all furniture should be kept.

10. The home needs a well.

The plans and estimates have been sent to us. On our visit we discovered that the water for the girls hostel is also not sufficient. It is therefore suggested that the home dig 2 wells one in the Boys hostel and one in the Girls hostel instead of having a motor and distribution system for the Boys Hostel.

The Manager is requested to advise the CNI-CCC as to whether the sum of Rs. 20,000/- is sufficient for the purpose of digging 2 wells without pump shed motor etc.

It is necessary that the management committee meet immediately to set right the above matters.

XVII SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMENDATIONS

This Home needs improvement both in facilities and administration. There is not enough care & concern for the children.

I give below my findings and recommendations:-

1. Medical check-up is not a regular feature. It is only done when the children are sick.
I would like to emphasize that an annual medical check-up is a must.
2. The Home should keep a first aid box fully stocked with essential medicines.
3. Sanitary facilities The maintenance of the sanitary block is totally inadequate.
It needs to be cleaned regularly.
4. The kitchen facilities also need to be improved.
5. Extra tuition for those children who are weak in studies should be arranged.
6. Cultural Activities - Here again nothing concrete is being done. The hostel needs to have regular cultural evenings at least once a week. This would give the children an opportunity to display their talents in singing dramas etc.

7. A few magazines and newspapers are also essential. This would help the children to learn and think. It would also mean that their leisure time is spent usefully.
8. The Manager is requested to encourage the children to participate in the annual CNI-CCC painting competition.
9. A lot of the land is just not being used. It is recommended that the Manager discuss this matter with his committee members and make an effort to cultivate the land.
10. Accounts - The books of accounts were not available for my scrutiny. The manager mentioned that he had given it for audit.

We have so far not received any audited statement of accounts. Since I F was not able to see the account books, it is very essential that the audited accounts from this home be forwarded to the CNI-CCC office without delay.

11. Separate files should be maintained for each child.
12. A follow-up study on out going children should be conducted. The manager should try and keep in touch with such children.
B. A full-time warden is a must.
The authorities are requested to see that immediate action is taken to improve all the aspects of child care in this home.

The meeting commenced at 10.30 a.m. with Bishop Mitchell leading in prayer.

The Secretary reported that Mr. J.F. Daniels, the Accounts Officer, after requesting 4 days leave on 30.11.76 for urgent personal business had not returned. All efforts of contacting him were in vain. No response came to letters and telegrams sent. His whereabouts are not known. It is presumed that he has found another job.

The Secretary informed members that she has sent him a letter on 11.1.1977 terminating his services with immediate effect. Efforts to replace him are being made.

CNI-CCC 3/77

Resolved : i) to approve of the action taken by the Secretary;
ii) to put on record the Council's strong disapproval of the irresponsible actions of a man chosen for an important post on the strength of the highest recommendations by Church leaders;
iii) to request the Secretary to continue efforts to find a suitable person to replace Mr. Daniels.

5.00 New Business

5.01 Discussion of Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj, General Secretary, CNI, with the Executive and Board members of Kindernothilfe, Duisburg (Appendix I)

a) Endowment Funds

The discussions on this issue (Appendix 1,2.0) were read.

The Committee appreciated the concern and sense of urgency felt in Duisburg over this matter.

Whilst the first step towards obtaining exemption from Income-tax by the CNI were being undertaken, the problems and doubts connected

with investment in buildings still remained.

- (i) Obtaining a blanket exemption could be much more complicated in the case of CNI than the CSI since there were still numerous independent Trusts not yet under the CNITA;
- (ii) The erection and later the efficient management of commercial buildings coming under different Trusts have foreseeable complications and pitfalls;
- (iii) Such investment being contrary to existing Government policies, the principle of pursuing this avenue is also to be questioned.

Bishop Lipp suggested that if exemption for investment in property was granted to the CNI, it would be worthwhile to consider investment of the funds in one or two major projects by the Synod. The returns from these would be allocated to each hostel according to the proportion of the Capital invested on its behalf. This arrangement could to some extent ensure a good management.

Members felt the need to gather specific facts regarding both forms of investment, i.e. in commercial buildings and in nationalized banks. The names of various knowledgeable persons who could be consulted were proposed. Also it was considered worthwhile to write to other Churches and Societies to give information on their experiences with the various forms of investment.

CNI-CCC 4/77

Resolved :

- a) to authorise the Secretary to form a sub-Committee which is to include various experts besides Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj and herself;
- b) that the purpose of calling a sub-committee is to collect specific information and make a comparative study of the advisability and feasibility of the two alternative investment methods.

b) Office Building

(Refer Appendix I,1.0) The Secretary reported that the DDTA had turned down the request of the CNI-CCC for land in St. Paul's Hostel compound. No reason was given.

Mr. Dharmaraj informed the meeting of a further possibility of the CNI-CCC building a complex in 'Wesley Lodge' site or in Free Church, Parliament Street Compound. The latter proposal has arisen on account of a foreseeable possibility of the Baptist Missionary Society (BMS) transferring the land to the CNI. The rough project plan would be needed to be submitted as early as possible.

Bishop Lipp made again the suggestion of an interim solution by constructing a second storey on the present building. This was favourably received.

CNI-CCC 5/77

Resolved : a) to request permission of the D.D.T.A. to build on top of the present structure (Jennings Block) to meet the immediate need for more office space;
b) to also pursue the possibility of constructing the CNI-CCC complex at 'Wesley Lodge' or Parliament Street.
c) Self Evaluation Programme: (Appendix I,5.0)

The Secretary reported that the Self Evaluation Questionnaire has been sent to all the hostels. They were asked to submit the completed Questionnaire by 1.6.77.

5.06 Letter from Mr. Luers L/hb dated 12.1.77 regarding a fund for giving special assistance to staff

Rev. Rudolf Heyken, a retired pastor has contributed a sum of DM 2,000,-- to be used for staff welfare, especially for those who suffer from mental disturbances and depressions.

The money needed can be requested on submission of a brief description of the particular case or could fall under the personal discretion of the Director.

CNI-CCC 12/77

Resolved : i) to convey our thanks and appreciation to Rev. Heyken;
ii) to authorise the Director to use her discretion in the use of the money;

5.07 Quarters for Home Officers

The Secretary brought up the problem of accommodation for Home Officers, since, with the appointment of new Home Officers, more accommodation would be needed.

The principle of the CNI-CCC renting accommodation and making it available to the Home Officers was approved in view of the special terms of service which takes the Home Officer out of station regularly for long periods at a stretch.

CNI-CCC 13/77

Resolved : a) to approve the principle of providing accommodation for Home Officers;
b) that preferably one large building should be rented in which several married Home Officers may stay.

5.08 Telegraphic Address

CNI-CCC 14/77

Resolved : a) to approve of the CNI-CCC applying for a telegraphic address;
b) that "Child Care" along with one or two more alternatives (left to the Secretary to propose) should be proposed to the Post and Telegraph Department.

5.09 Pay and conditions of service of retired staff

CNI-CCC 15/77

Resolved : i) that retired staff be given consolidated pay;
ii) that the pension which they draw should be considered in the fixing of the pay;
iii) that the age of retirement in the CNI-CCC shall be 65, after which the question of continuation of service shall be referred to the Council.

5.10 Allowance for use of car

CNI-CCC 16/77

Resolved : i) that the Director be given an allowance of 500 kms. per month with retrospective effect;
ii) that with the present cost of petrol paise 0.75 per k.m. be charged in the event of excess mileage.

5.11 Appointment of staff

A) Home Officers: The Secretary reported that of the number of applicants who had been interviewed, only one, Mr. Jiwan Crawford was found suitable.

In his case there was the slight doubt whether he would stay on since his specialization was in teaching deaf and dumb children.

CNI-CCC 17/77

Resolved : that Mr. Jiwan Crawford should be asked to consent to serve for a minimum of 3 years.

B) Other Staff: It was reported that a Mrs. Cooper, Director's Stenotypist in the CSI-CCC, on account of family problems was seeking transfer to Delhi and a job with the CNI-CCC, if accepted.

She has a brother in Delhi who would provide her with accommodation. Mr. Bhasme very strongly recommended her for appointment. The Secretary was in favour of her appointment since there is need of a good steno-typist.

CNI-CCC 18/77

Resolved : to create an additional post of steno-typist.

5.12 Closure of Basanti Devi - 1421

The Secretary reported that the above Creche was closed down on account of the government's resettlement programme in Calcutta, in the course of which the occupants of this basti were shifted.

The Creche could not be continued in the new settlement because the people wanted to run it themselves without any help or supervision by the Cathedral Relief Service.

CNI-CCC 19/77

Resolved : to withdraw affiliation in view of the above situation.

5.13 Report regarding Self-Evaluation Programme of Hostels

Already dealt with under 5.01 c)

5.14 Problems regarding the Court Committed children of Home 1741, Poona (letter dated 7.2.77 from Mr. A.D. Gaikwad)

The Secretary reported that there were in the above home 17 Court Committed children who were also receiving CNI-CCC support. Despite several attempts by the Superintendent, the authorities of the Social Welfare Department have not been able to find a way to have them

released into the full custody of the hostel.

The authorities, however, seem to have no objection to these children receiving help from other sources since they recognise that the Rs. 37.50 per child, per month is inadequate.

There was some discussion as to whether the CNI-CCC should stop support of these children or whether the children should continue to get the double support.

CNI-CCC 20/77

Resolved : i) that the children who are at present committed by the Court may continue on the double support, seeing that the amount received from the Government is nowhere sufficient to support a child;

ii) that in future court committed children should only be taken if there is a vacancy in the hostel, i.e. after the quota of fosterships is filled.

5.15 Liaison Officer for Sambalpur

The Secretary reported that Miss Whitmee was appointed as Liaison Officer for Sambalpur Diocese.

CNI-CCC 21/77

Resolved : to approve the appointment.

5.16 Letter from Rev. Carey to Mr. Dharmaraj 3.2.77 Reply of Mr. Luers letter dated 2.3.77

The United Church of Canada was interested in the Child Care Programme of the CNI-CCC and was prepared to arrange for the support of children. The great difficulties of working with 2 separate parent organisations were expressed.

Firstly the CNI-CCC was still struggling under given limitations of accommodation and staffing. The implications for accounting separately for monies coming from Canada were also stressed. It would mean preparation of separate requests for payments etc. and this has now become very complex and involved.

CNI-CCC 22/77

Resolved : a) to express the Council's appreciation of the interest shown by the United Church of Canada in associating itself with the fostership programme of the CNI-CCC;

b) to request KNH, Duisburg to convey to Rev. Carey the regrets of the CNI-CCC that at the present

juncture it is not feasible for the CNI-CCC to be directly associated with a sponsorships scheme other than the Kinder-nothilfe, Duisburg, as this would necessitate enormous administrative modifications and adjustments which the office is not yet able to make and

- c) hence to request KNH Duisburg to consider and negotiate for a basis of linking a similar endeavour by the United Church of Canada to their organisation;
- d) that at a later stage, if necessary, the modus operandi can be reviewed.

6.00 The Committee expressed its joy and thanks to Bishop Richard Lipp for attending the meeting. They requested him to convey the greetings of all the members of the Committee and staff of the CNI-CCC to KNH, Duisburg.

7.00 Closing Prayer

The meeting came to a close with a prayer offered by Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj.

APPENDIX I

Re: Discussions with Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj, General Secretary of the CNI from February 15th to 18th, 1977

Points of discussion

1. Office building of CNI-CCC in Delhi
- 2.0 Endowment Fund
- 3.0 Personnel
- 4.0 Training Centre for Wardens
- 5.0 Study paper Bread for the World
- 6.0 Creche Programme

1.0 Office Building

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj informed KNH that three originally proposed sites for constructing the CNI-CCC Office at Rajpur Road (St. Stephen Home), Jangpura and Free Church, Parliament Road did not materialise for various reasons. Mr. Dharmaraj informed KNH further that the Delhi Diocese Trust Association (DDTA) declined to construct an office on the present compound of St. Paul's Hostel but offered a place at St. John's at Mehrauli. On inquiry it was found out that Mehrauli is located far outside of Delhi.

The representatives of KNH expressed their great disappointment that even after more than one year the CNI did not offer a suitable site. The Mehrauli compound was ruled out by KNH for being far away. The members of KNH told Mr. Dharmaraj that the proposed expansion may have to be cut down or completely put to a halt if there will not be found a solution soon.

Mr. Dharmaraj suggested three solutions:

- a) to purchase a ready office
- b) to construct an office at Wesley Lodge; but it would take a year before the construction could be started.
- c) to rent an office as an interim arrangement.

Regarding a) KNH did not agree to this solution. Solution b) is acceptable. Similarly c) provided the CNI-CCC can pay the rent from its normal budget.

It was agreed to:

- 1) that the CNI-CCC should make an appeal not only to the DDTA but to the CNI as this matter is not only an affair of the Delhi Diocese but also important for the total Church;
- 2) that if the CNI declines to offer a suitable land in the near future the CNI-CCC should feel free to negotiate with other participating Churches to offer a suitable land.

2.0 Endowment Fund

The reasons for and against investment of EF in property development like Unity buildings in Bangalore were discussed at length. In view of the Government legislation which prohibits the investment of funds for generating income in properties Mr. Dharmaraj was suggesting to permit the CNI-CCC to invest the accumulated funds in nationalized banks. Bishop Newbigin was also in favour of this solution, stating:

- 1) that this solution would be in the national interest of India;
- 2) the Churches should not try to seek their own interests but should promote national interest;
- 3) in the long run the security of the Churches and the work of the Churches will be taken care best if the national policies are adhered.

It was agreed:

that KNH writes a letter to the CNI-CCC explaining the aims and objectives of the EF and requesting a thorough discussion of the whole matter. The CNI-CCC is requested to advise KNH:

- 1) how best the accumulated funds should be utilized resp. invested;
- 2) Whether the EF should be continued and if so how;
- 3) alternative ways for using the funds.

3.0 Personnel

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj gave the firm assurance that immediately after the next Synod of the CNI scheduled for October 1977 decisions would be taken to select a suitable person for being trained to succeed Mrs. Lipp-Nathaniel. Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj informed KNH that the Moderator has already 3 or 4 persons in mind who

would be qualified to take up this work.

Similarly the CNI-CCC would take action already now to find a suitable person for replacing Mr. Daniels.

4.0 Training Centre for wardens

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj expressed the opinion that in view of the expansion of the Child Care ministry in North India it would be proper to start planning to set up an own Training Centre for Wardens in course of the next 2 to 3 years. He suggested as one possibility: Batala.

5.0 Study Paper of Bread for the World

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj informed KNH that the CNI-CCC has sent out a self-evaluation paper to all Bishops, Managers/Correspondents/ Wardens as a first step for evaluating the work going on in the hostels. A detailed survey would be conducted by Mrs. Lipp-Nathaniel and her staff in a few selected homes in course of the next few months.

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj stated that the CNI and the CNI-CCC by its resolutions are committed to participate in the proposed workshop. Mr. Dharmaraj felt that the NCCI had failed to organise the workshop so far.

6.0 Creche Programme

Mr. A.C. Dharmaraj stated that the CNI-CCC had to go slow with the introduction of the Creche Programme having too many problems to tackle with at one time. Once the CNI-CCC staff position is more settled and more Home Officers are recruited the CNI-CCC would definitely pioneer also in this new field of Child ministry which particularly opens a new dimension for the work, i.e. to care not only for the children but to work with the total community to which the children belong.

I request that you arrange for an enquiry into this:


Some of the clarifications which I request are given below:

4. The child was sent home with his parents. Was there any guarantee that he would be given the necessary treatment? It looks very much as though the hostel was concerned to pass on the responsibility.
5. He died on 10.12.76. Why were we only now informed of his death?
6. What was the cause of his death? We require a medical report and a copy of the death certificate on this.
