Dear Fellow-Missionary,

Do you believe that good literature in the vernacular is of value to our Indian Christian women? If you do not, this letter will not interest you. If you do, however, I am sure that you will be grateful to me for calling your attention to "The Woman's Friend."

This 16-page monthly published in six vernaculars, contains a religious article, a good story, hints for mothers, health notes, a biographical sketch, a story for the little ones, and recent news about women all over the world. It sells at the low price of 10 annas a year.

Your field may have as its chief language a vernacular that is not listed above. But it is probable that every missionary is in contact with at least half a dozen persons who know one of these languages, and to whom "The Woman's Friend" would be a boon.

"But 10 annas is more than most of our women can afford at one time," you may say. Here is what a missionary in Madras does. She buys 70 copies a month, and through her Bible-women and zenana visitors sells them at one anna each. "That takes time," you will say. Yes, but is it not worth while? Surely the printed message has a permanence that the spoken word lacks, and can often be used to clinch what has been spoken.

The purpose of this letter is this: to ask you or some other representative of your Mission to be responsible for making known to all the women missionaries, at least, the existence of "The Woman's Friend," and get each woman missionary to promise to subscribe for at least ten copies a year, to be disposed of in monthly sales. Subscriptions may be sent either to the editors of the various vernacular editions, or to me. Someone has suggested that the various Missions should make weddings an occasion for getting Christian literature into the home by inducing the bridegroom to make a present to the bride of a year's subscription to "The Woman's Friend." In spreading the use of this magazine, you will be helping your Christian women to be better Christians, and will be helping the editors of "The Woman's Friend" to make it a better paper.

My dear Dr. Appasamy,



Thank you very much for your letter. I have now got a spare copy of my book Christianity as Bhakti Marga. This also I am sending you which kindly accept. This along with What is Moksa? will give you an Indian Interpretation of St. John's Gospel.

Dear Dr. Appasamy,

Thank you for your kind letter of the 12th. Also please accept my hearty thanks for your good gift of What is Moksas? This book with a dozen copies of "Church Union" reached me day before yesterday for which also accept my best thanks. These books will be very useful and helpful in our study of this vital question. These are being distributed to interested members of our Church.

I too have received letters from Mr. J. D. Asirvadam who says that Bishop Bexell will return to India in September next. I note that official visitors from the Lutheran churches in South India will be attending the next meeting of the Joint Committee on Church Union. It is good that you too are going there. I understand that these official visitors will bring forward their own suggestions before the Lutheran Federation in our next meeting which is to be held at Guntur 28-30 December.

You misunderstood me when I said that supposing one of our own ministers, say a President of our Church, is consecrated a Bishop by a Swedish Bishop and we thus introduce Episcopacy, the union of the two Protestant Churches in Chota Nagpur will be complete. This I said on the understanding that the Anglicans view Episcopacy as a main basis for union, uniformity and regularity, not to speak of spiritual unity which already exists. Much depends upon our definition and conception of what a true church is. Let me tell you here that our people, I mean the mass are not ready just now to understand the meaning of Episcopacy, and they can not see a Bishop with the same eye as an Anglican does. Any way let me study your book and see what you say on union and unity, whether you aim at national, territorial and ecumenical union etc.

At Ranchi we have so far made little progress. Our study group will now consist of 8 members, 4 from each church with a view to study and explore the subject of Union and know the mind of Christ. Last Sunday out of 4, 3 only could meet and we agreed to enlarge our group by coopting 4 additional members such who have an interest in the subject and through prayers, intercessions and deliberations will contribute to the cause of our study. I hope to be able to keep you informed of what we shall be doing in our study group from time to time.


I note you again think of visiting us during the Christmas holidays. It is very kind of you. You are welcome. Ranchi is ever ready to welcome distinguished visitors as guests. I am afraid we shall not be able to do much during your next visit as I shall be leaving Ranchi on the 26th of December and get back to Ranchi not before the 8th. January, 1933. This long absence is due to Lutheran Federation and N.C.C. meetings at Nagpur.

I have read only a few pages from your "What is Moksha?" It is a delightful study in a soul arresting subject of John the mystic.

Trusting to hear again from you when you get back from Madras.



Dear Mr. Hurad,

I have asked the C.L.S. to send you some copies of my little book on 'Church Union'. Could you kindly take one copy for yourself and distribute the other copies among Lutheran friends of Chota Nagpur who are interested in this question? You will be receiving a copy of my ~~little~~ book What is Moksha? Please accept this book yourself with my compliments as a gift to you.

As soon as I returned to Calcutta I wrote two letters to South India, one to Mr. J.D. Asirvatham and another to the Secretary of the Joint Committee. Mr. Asirvatham says that the Home Boards of the German and Swedish missions have agreed to nominate Dr. Froelich as a Bishop and that probably he will consent to be consecrated.

Bishop Bexell is expected to return to India next September; then he will probably consecrate Dr. Froelich. The Secretary of the Joint Committee informs me that six Lutheran visitors, two from the German Lutheran Church, two from the Swedish Lutheran ^{church} and two from the Danish Lutheran Church and probably two more visitors from the American Lutheran Church will be attending the next meeting of the Joint


Committee early in December. I am expecting to be present at this meeting myself.

You said when I was at Ranchi that the proposal has been brought forward that one of your men could be elected as a Bishop and consecrated by the Swedish Lutheran Bishop. This is an excellent idea. It will be a great step forward towards the Union with the Diocese ^{of} Chota Nagpur. I wish you ^{could} ~~will~~ ^{the} take necessary steps to bring forward this proposal before your Church Council. Could you kindly let me know what is the sort of procedure for a change of this nature in the constitution?

Our Christmas holidays begin on the night of the 22nd December. I could reach Ranchi on the 23rd Morning and stay on till the evening of January 2nd. If there is any help you want me to give in this matter I am quite willing to come over to Ranchi. You said you yourself may have to attend a meeting of the All-India ^{Lutheran} Federation about the end of the year. When (you will) be leaving Ranchi and when will you be getting back? I hope it will be possible ^{soon} to take the necessary steps ^{in this matter} ~~to elect one of your men and have him consecrated.~~

What about the little study circle we started? Is that going on? It will be well worthwhile your studying in detail the arrangements proposed in South India.

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



C I R C U L A R

To The Pastors and Pastorates of the T.E.L.C.

Gustavus Adolphus November 6th, 1932 is a memorable day for all Evangelical Churches as it reminds us of God's signal mercy to the cause of Protestantism, when it was very hard put to it to defend and preserve itself. With thanksgiving to God the Evangelical Churches of Germany and the Church of Sweden will celebrate on November 6th the 300th Anniversary of the Battle of Lutzen, where Gustavus II of Sweden, the great defender of the Evangelical faith met Wallenstein, the leader of the Catholic forces and won a signal victory though in that battle he himself was killed. Gustavus Adolphus was God's special gift to the Church in those dark days and his zeal for the evangelical faith, his Christian character and his unwavering trust in God and His cause, as well as his qualities as a first rate general were used of God to save the cause of the evangelical faith in Europe.

The T.E.L.C. has special reasons to remember these facts about Gustavus II of Sweden and the day in which religious and civil liberty were won for the Protestant countries of Northern Europe and you are therefore invited to celebrate this day, the 6th November worthily and to offer special prayers and thanksgiving. It is hoped that a booklet on Gustavus Adolphus prepared by Miss E. Wimmercrantz which would be sent to you as a presentation copy by the C.S.M. Council will provide information that would be of interest to the members of your pastorate. Those who desire extra copies of the booklet may get them from the Central Treasury, Trichinopoly. (price annas six).

Day of Prayer for Unity. The Federation has issued an appeal to observe November 6th as the Day of Prayer for Unity in the Christian Church, and the appeal is most warmly commended. A reference be made in the sermon to this appeal of the Federation and prayers be offered for a growing realization of the unity and solidarity of the Christian Church.

Sermon text for Sunday November 6th. As already intimated Hebrews 12, 1-3 will be the Sermon text for November 6th. This will be found suitable for the day in view of the Gustavus Adolphus's tercentenary celebration and the Federation call for Prayer for Unity.

N.M.S. Call for Prayer. The National Missionary Society of India has appealed that the succeeding Sunday viz. November 13th be observed as the Day of Prayer for the N.M.S. The appeal is warmly commended and the occasion may be taken advantage of to emphasize from the pulpit as well as in other ways the great need for the Church to be an evangelizing Church so that each member may take a vital interest in the evangelistic work of the pastorate and in the work done in the N.M.S. fields. The N.M.S. has passed through a difficult time, and in view of the steady development of the work special collections may be taken for the work with a view to afford relief to the Society during this year of its exceptional financial difficulties.


Dear Mr. Cock,


Dear Mr. McNEEL,

Your letter of the 6th. reached me duly. I have been consulting our records to find out the informations you require with regard to Gossner's missionaries in C.P. working amongst the Gonds. It is true that Gossner sent out 6 missionaries to India in 1841 and there is a record of it in the Gossner Mission history in German. But the one which I have with me does not contain the names of these. A reference has been made as to their work in an old number of the mission periodical called "BIENNE". I have written Director Stosch of the Gossner Mission Board in Berlin to supply us this information and I hope to be able to give you the names of the missionaries when I hear from Pastor Stosch. Thank you for your inquiry.

There is I hear a history of the Gossner Mission Society of the earlier days in German and it can be had from Berlin. If you need such a book I can procure the same for you. Gossner started his Society for Foreign Missions in 1836.



"THE WORK AMONG ABORIGINES."
(P. Hurad Secy. Gossner Church
Ranchi.)

Your Secretary has asked me to say a few words in connection with the missionary work amongst the aborigines. Nothing would give me greater pleasure than to write something on this subject which is so dear to me and I thank your Secretary and through him your Council for the opportunity given me in expressing my views before a distinguished gathering as yours, and specially so as I myself come from one of those aboriginal tribes who inhabit the plateau of Chota Nagpur.

The aborigines comprise a very large part of India's big population and of these only a very small section has come to the fold of Christianity. Any way, it must be said that the aborigines are by nature or instinct a people who always want to live by themselves and shun the company of aliens. Being the earliest or original settlers of India, they came to some extent under the influence of the Aryans who entered India some 5000 years B.C. There is not the least doubt that those of the Aborigines who had reached a higher stage of civilisation had mixed up with Aryans and also adopted Aryan religion. But a vast number has to this day been worshipping ghosts and spirits in nature and are called animists.

I will now give you my impressions of the aborigines of Chota Nagpur and those tribes who inhabit the province of Bihar and Orissa. The chief amongst these are the Mundas and Oraons the former includes the Santals, the "Hos" and the Kharias and other minor tribes, known in history by the term "Kolarians" which is contemptuously used against the simple aborigines and is resented by them very strongly. The aborigines are very simple in their hearts, in their ideas and behaviour and last but not least they are exceedingly hospitable. Being animists, they have no religion which can be called a highly developed system of philosophy as the Indo-Aryans or the Semitic - Hebrews had of whom ~~Paul~~ Paul also said - "they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, ~~and not submitting~~ have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God". (Rom: IX, 3).

The Mundas and Oraons have been worshipping originally from fear of ghosts who according to them dwell in mountains, forests, caves, rivers and wells; there is also race-god, the clan-god or spirit of each family. Now these aborigines always seek some way to escape from the destructive power of the demons and the ghosts and so they come much nearer to God and to Christ who has dominion and power over the demons (Math. VIII; 29).

It is because of this that the preaching of the Saving Truths of Christianity has much greater success amongst the aborigines than in other tribes and races. They are nearer to God!

It is a strikingly interesting fact for a student of history to note that God so ordained things that in the middle and latter part of the nineteenth century different missionary societies - continental, English and American all started their aggressive missionary work simultaneously amongst the aboriginal people who inhabit Central India. The bulk of the Munda and the Dravidian races as well as the Gonds occupy the greater part of Central India from the plains of Behar and the plateau of Chotanagpur down to the ranges of the Vindhya mountains bordering on the Nerbadda and the Tapti. In this vast tract of land Gossner's missionaries came to C.P. to work amongst the Gonds in 1841 with Sir Donald McLeod; Church of Scotland mission started work at Nagpur, 1845; the present Gossner mission in Chotanagpur was founded in 1845; C.M.S. at Jubbulpore in 1845. The Santhals mission of Northern Churches in 1867; Evangelical mission of Chhatisgarh 1867 by Rev. Oscar Lohr, formerly a Gossner Missionary to Chotanagpur. The Swedish N.M.S. of Stockholm at Chhindwara in 1877; S.P.G. in Chotanagpur 1869 and so forth. It appears as if the whole missionary forces of Europe, America and England aimed at exerting their concerted action in evangelising the whole of the aboriginal tracts.

Perhaps the largest aboriginal Church amongst these is that of the Gossner Mission in Chotanagpur. Gossner sent 4 missionaries to work amongst the Karens in Burma or to proceed to Kotgarh in Kashmir But God willed it otherwise. He had his plans already made. He

He wanted them to preach the Gospel not to the rich and the wise but to "the poor, and the maimed and the halt and blind", and not only that but to "compel them in". Luke 14:21 and 23. The missionaries Schatz, Batsch, Brandt and Janke met for the first time the people of Chotanagpur in Calcutta, working as coolies which attracted their attention. They came to Ranchi and with their associates who joined them later preached incessantly for 4 long years before any one could be converted.

Then at last the fire broke out; Four Uraons came forward to acknowledge Jesus as their saviour and were baptised in 1850 followed by 2 Mundas in 1851. Then came the whole people in what we in these days call "the mass movement". Soon after the conversion of the first aborigines preaching was done in the village homes, in the markets, on the streets and in the sickbed, not by missionaries alone but by the early converts themselves. As early as 1853 it could be said "they carry on the work almost more than the missionaries". Here began the great evangelical campaign by the people who said to themselves "freely ye have received, freely give". (Math. X.8) The Christians were themselves the evangelists. It is true that in the aboriginal areas where there is mass movement the people can do much more than others from outside.

The Gossner Church is a glaring example of what mass movement can do for the spreading of the Kingdom of God. In 5 years' time from the conversion of the first Christians, i.e. in 1856 April there were 466 baptised members and 800 inquirers, and in 1857 April just before the commencement of the Sepoy Mutiny there were 900 baptised members and 2000 inquirers. At the end of 1860 the number swelled to 1700 baptised.

I would not give credit to the Indian evangelists alone for this glorious victory of the gospel. It was the joint prayerful effort of the foreign missionaries as well as of the aboriginal preachers themselves. Little could have been achieved by the one without the spiritual cooperation of the other.

By the end of 1873 the result of this movement which spread from one end of the land to another was simply amazing. The mission had work in 5 revenue districts with 8 mission stations and a baptised Christian membership of 20,000 with 6000 communicants. Large sums of money from Germany were collected and stations were built up.

While Protestantism was making such rapid strides, the Roman Catholics entered the western field amongst the Uraons and had considerable success in some parts of the Ranchi district.

The Proclamation of those days was "Jesus our Saviour". This persuasive cry rung through the length and breadth of the country. In the district of Ranchi people were very much oppressed by the Aryan Hindu Zemindars and they hearing this message began to feel that nothing but the Christian religion can bring us help in all things even in our outward troubles with the landlords. In the earlier days of conversion the people were proclaiming Christ by their preaching in the fairs or melas, in non-Christian festivals, by their own Christian poets, also by the exercise of the gift of healing and by prayer meetings and young men and women's village associations. By the end of 1914 when War broke out there were 98883 Christians in 24 mission stations, with 442 Churches and chapels, 37 Indian pastors 377 catechists, 12 candidates for ministry and the contribution of the Church amounted to Rs 49,083.

The above is a very brief account of the Gossner mission in Chotanagpur. In the missionary regime (1845-1914) the evangelical faith was preached to the people in 5 revenue districts of Chota Nagpur and to the several Feudatory States of Orissa including one in the Central Provinces.

But we must not think that the preaching of the Gospel was done very smoothly without any hinderance. On the other hand I wish to impress upon you the fact that from the very beginning, the Hindu Zemindars or the landlords began to oppress the converts as they found them relatively more intelligent and freedom-loving. Thus the more the Christians grew in number the more violent grew the hatred of the land-lords and other influential non-Christian people. It is related that before the Sepoy Mutiny and after some individual missionaries while out for preaching in the district were severely beaten by the Hindus and were only left there thinking they would die

by singing new
songs from their
own tribal music

die after some hours.

During the Mutiny when all the white people, officials and missionaries had to leave the country, the Christians were brutally and shamelessly persecuted. Many had to flee for their lives to the dense forests and mountain caves and got ill and died. But in spite of all these persecutions and oppressions the Church grew steadily and even during the absence of the missionaries when the Lutheran Church declared Autonomy in 1919, it could celebrate the 75th. anniversary or Jubilee of the founding of the mission in Chotanagpur in 1920.

One of the main features of the Gossner Society has ever been the preaching of the message first. It does not think of opening any educational, medical or other institutional work in any missionary area. The only duty of the evangelists, first and foremost is to give the message and plant and found the Church and when it has been done the other things come by themselves. In this we follow the apostles who went about preaching the gospel and establishing churches at different centres, in cities and towns. We do not give schools and colleges or hospitals to the people on the hope of getting converts. Our aim has been "First the Kingdom of God" and when this Kingdom has been established we say "all these things will be added unto you."

There is one thing which is worth noticing here. That as the Gossner mission has become a self-administering Church and is governed mainly by the aboriginal leaders themselves, the people of the country now look upon this Lutheran Church as their national Church, though there is the Anglican Church (1869) and the Roman Catholic Church (1889) who claim 30000 and 268,300 respectively compared to our own strength of 125000. Our work is self-expanding. There is always a call from somewhere saying - "come over into Macedonia and help us".

Now I wish to divert your attention to another aspect of our mission work i.e. to the problem of self-support. Self-support has been the key-note of Father Gossner, the man of prayer with unparalleled missionary zeal. When he started his missionary Society in Berlin in 1836 he took for his pupils artisans who could and would support themselves wherever they went in the world. Such missionaries he also sent to Chotanagpur and though he made himself responsible for their support and mission work, he had no beneficence or bequest or accumulated fund to which the mission could turn in the days of misfortune. Father Gossner had little faith on human organisations. On the other hand he had supreme trust in a prayer-answering God. The sole dependence on God for direction and support, therefore, became the mark stamped upon the Gossner mission and now on the Gossner Church. The Gossner Church is a Faith Church.

It is therefore the aim always of its leaders to plant the Church and tell the people to support their pastors and other Church agents. The leaders know how difficult and hard it is to tell the new converts who at one time perhaps thought of being helped and taken care of by the mission or the Church. Temporal help and gain are sometimes the cause of conversion. But it is just during the days of instructions before the planting of the Church that we make it clearer that the salvation though freely given (as we shall never be able to purchase it) we should accept it with thankful hearts which should be expressed in our offerings. Real praise is in the heart before it is on the lips.

Quite recently a few months ago, there has been an urgent call from the Uraons in a landlord's big estate in Palamau, a district of Chotanagpur. There is besides our own another foreign mission working in that district close by but as these people look upon our Church as the national Church of the aborigines, they give preference to our pastors to come over and help them. The other mission says they have money enough to help these people and would give them every facility to educate their children by opening schools and so on. On the other hand we tell them we have no money and you shall have to support your pastor, and catechist or village teachers. Now you have to choose between the Mission and the Church. The people give preference to our Church. Now we can not refuse the request or the call. But our missionaries must be men prepared to make utmost sacrifice. Their chief aim must be "service" and who could say "having food and raiment let us be therewith content". (1 Tim:6;8.) We plant congregations and make them responsible for their support.

The system of centralisation of funds had a beginning back in

in the days of the missionaries. All the Indian pastors and other Church Agents had to come to the mission stations from around the country to have their monthly meetings, to hear their mutual reports whether good or bad and, to take counsel from the missionary in charge and other Church leaders. Here they also brought in all their collections of the month which were then distributed amongst the workers according to their scale of salaries. This system has been kept up and the mission stations are the centres which are church-district head-quarters where the district funds are centralised.

Now according to our Constitution there are different kinds of Church Organisations and are as follows :-

- (i) Pracharakpan Panches or the jurisdiction of a Catechist.
- (ii) The pastorate Panch in charge of a Pastor consisting of several pracharakpans.
- (iii) The Church-district or Circle Panch in which the pastor resident in the station becomes ex-officio Chairman of the Circle consisting of several Pastorates.
- (iv) The Church Council consisting of 13 members is the chief Executive body of the whole church under the General Conference the legislative body of the Church.

The Panches or organisations (i) and (ii) have no power to make any expenditure whatsoever but to bring in all their incomes every month to (iii) at the district Head-Quarters, which alone has the power to determine, sanction and make expenditures.

In the Gossner Church the Church revenue is classified under two heads. The first is called the Sirni or offering and the second is Chanda or Church-tax or subscription.

They are as follows :-

- I. Offerings - these are the gifts to the altar.
 1. Baptismal offerings.
 2. Communion offerings.
 3. Matrimonial "
 4. Thanks-giving"
 5. Harvest "
 6. New corn. "
 7. Pot -offering- This is women's offering. While cooking Women set apart a handful of rice every day and bring it to the altar every Sunday.
 8. Sunday service offerings.
- II. Church Subscription or Tax.
 1. Mandali Chanda -not less than -/4/-per family, a yearly tax.
 2. Prabhu Prit or Lord's love, for the support of any definite mission-field.
 3. Swapalan or Self-support.
 4. Reserve Fund for emergency.
 5. Bible Society-subscription.
 6. N.M.S. -subscription.
 7. Propagation of Gospel subscription.

These are the ones which have the sanction of the General Conference and every individual congregation has to collect these. Besides these there are local subscriptions to meet local needs. All these offerings and Church taxes are to be centralised in the Church district or station Head-Quarters and the district Councils have the power to determine all expenditure to be incurred in paying the salaries of all workers engaged in evangelistic and pastoral work, in maintaining church properties, such as the repairs of buildings and lands and so forth. In short, the district Councils are fully responsible for raising enough revenue to meet their own expenditures plus what they have to pay to the Church Council. In former years the Church Council managed to secure additional funds from Germany and America to supplement the deficits of the Budget but since last year owing to world economic depression, the Council is left to itself. It has to depend on its own resources. It can not and should not any longer count on the foreign resources. The burden of supporting and conserving all church activities rests on the congregations. All income for a fuller-self-support must come from the congregations. To give effect to this Policy the Church Council has made (i) drastic reductions in the salaried staffs (ii) Reduction of 25% to 60% in salaries of those who draw the same from the Central Fund of the Church Council (iii) total stoppage of Church Council

subsidies to the district Councils to supplement their deficits. (iv) laying the burden on the district Councils of meeting the deficits of educational institutions within their respective jurisdictions and (v) demand of 30% by the Church Council from the district Council on their total income for central organisations, for missionary enterprises, for higher educational institutions, medical work, Seminary and so forth i.e. for such work which needs the cooperation and joint efforts of all the congregations and district organisations to run the machinery of the whole Church.

It must not, however, be understood that all the Parishes and district Councils are in a position to raise enough money to pay their workers according to the standard scales sanctioned. Not that but they are given to understand that they will have to manage their own affairs as best as they can without expecting any substantial help from the Church Council.

X If any financial help or funds are received from foreign and outside sources, the Church Council shall make the best use of them but in no case it should have a place in the regular Budget of the Church.

In Chotanagpur and in the neighbouring Feudatory States the value of land produces have gone down terribly. Rice the chief food stuff is selling at 15-40 seers per rupees and money has become very scarce. Consequently the Church contributions have also declined more than 50% I think the conditions are not unsimilar in other Churches in other parts of India.

The hour of great trial has come for the Autonomous Church. The Church Council has been thinking of raising school and hostel fees and levying seat rents for all students in the hostels but we have always to keep in mind the foreign sister missions working with us and around us. We are very much handicapped by the existence of "missions" with whom we can not enter into active rivalry. The moment we raise such fees or attempt to levy some new kind of Church tax, our weaker brethren will be tempted to leave us and join other missions. We are not without such instances though so far their number is small. I say, there are also weaker brethren in our congregations who feel tired of heaving "Give and Give for the Church" and the problem of self-support sometimes looks very gloomy yea, disappointing. It will not be out of place if I mention that we have been receiving from southern areas of our field a part of C.P., repeated applications from a few men more vociferous than influential asking us to make over that area to some mission in C.P., as our Council is not in a position to give them material help and facility as a foreign mission could do. These people think that the business of the Church Council is to get funds from foreign countries and expend same in a rich manner. You can easily imagine what would be the fate of the Autonomous Church if each and every congregation of ours would make similar petitions and our sister missions and churches would make up their mind to take over our activities. If this be so, I find in my humble opinion that we shall be defeating our own purpose i.e. the establishment of indigenous self-governing and self-supporting churches.

Time has come, I should say, when all ~~the~~ missionary bodies and mission authorities should give their serious attention to the subject of indigenous churches and church financing. Our Chotanagpur Autonomous church with its bitter experience of the past 13 years through the most trying days in the history of the World's bad economic life, has come to the conclusion that we must sooner or later bring about a wholesale change in the system of our church financing, church organisations and administration consistent with our own environments.

It would be a great thing if our missionary friends would give their mission-churches a greater degree of responsibility in Church administration and church financing and thus lay the burden of maintenance or self-support on their own shoulders. In the beginning such a step would often seem impracticable but the problem, I think, is so urgent that the missions must be prepared to face this in some near future. There must also be some kind of perfect mutual understanding between all missions by which the dangers incidental to the development of indigenous Churches could be avoided without wounding any ~~saxxy~~ society's feelings or susceptibilities.

Our situation is different from the rest of our Indian brethren. We have, though poor and unworthy, passed that stage of church-devotion and have reached the stage of a full-grown self-administering and self-maintaining church. We have to conserve and extend and develop our work according to our own means independently. In this respect our Indian Christian brethren who live under the guidance and care of missions are better off and should rejoice as they have not been called upon to bear the great burden of care and anxiety. But we do rejoice in our own ways thanking God that He has suffered us to bear the cross so early in our church-life and has taught us to ~~be~~ be strong in faith and prayer and thus pave the way to the up-building of His church, a united Church of India.

Mr. Prehn our Treasurer requested me to send you certain informations by answering a few of your questions with regard to the acquisition of landed properties in India by Missionary Societies.

I endeavour to answer briefly your questions as given in the accompanying Statement, but would advise you to obtain legal expert opinion on such subjects as conditions vary in the different provinces. The Government of India Acts, however, apply to all the Provinces and all Religious Societies are to be governed by these Acts. Hope my answers will to a certain extent go to meet your needs.

ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY BY MISSIONS.

1. How to get corporative right. - The Gossner Church is a society registered under the "Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860" and as such the Church has got corporative power to acquire moveable and immoveable properties under section 5 of the said Act. Accordingly the Constitution of the Church lays down :-

2. The Church Council of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chota Nagpur and Assam, which shall also be its Committee of Trustees etc.

2. Under what Act ? Please see above.

3. What were the expenses ? Rs 50/- only for the registration fee under section 3 of the said Act plus pleaders fees etc.

4. Advantages and disadvantages for the Church. We do not think we are at a disadvantage. We on the other hand find we have ~~ex~~ acquired a LOCUS STANDI being a corporative body. No individual missionary or Church Officer or Agent or worker can lay claim on any property when such property has been acquired, legally ~~is~~ registered and vested in the governing body of the Church or Society.

5. Does it really pay to be registered etc ? Considering the situation of the world and for conditions obtaining in India it is highly desirable and advisable that Foreign Missions and Indigenous Churches should be registered either under the "Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860" or "The Religious Societies Act I of 1880" I prefer the latter Act. I would advise Missions to create or constitute "Churches" within "Missions" and vest the properties in the governing bodies of the Indian Churches in which both European and Indian element should find adequate place to safeguard the interest of the Society.

6. Duties derived from being registered etc. The above items will explain.

7. Place of Registration. In the office of the Inspector General of Registration or such other Officer of the Provincial Government who has been duly authorised to perform the duties of registration.


I am sending you herewith the sermons sent from Berlin in 1920 as a memento for the 75 years Jubilee Celebrations.

Besides that Cash Certificates of the face value of Rs. 1,662/8/- in the name of Mr. E. Purty kept in the custody of Mr. K. Frehn. Mr. Purty is no longer Manager it should be transferred in the name of Secretary

The following irregularities and defects noticed when money receipt checked with the entries in the Cash book.

1. Money receipt No. 549 to Sudarsan Lakra for Re. 1/8/- on 27-3-29 not entered in the cash book. It was noted in the receipt that it was money of G.E. account so paid to the Treasurer G.E. but no receipt for payment to the treasurer was obtained.
2. Money Receipt No. 569 D/ 4-4-29 Rs. 25/1/- corrected to Rs. 12/10/- was not entered in the cash book, entered in Written off account the receipt was not signed by the Manager.
3. Receipt No. 609 to S. N. Banerjee dated 10-4-29 Re. 1/- advance payment was not entered in the cash book.
4. Receipt No. 695 was not issued but the original receipt was not found in the book.
5. Receipt No. 696 D/ 24-4-29 to A.C. Dass & Bros original not given to him and the duplicate not written for Rs. 4/-.

6. Original of Receipt No. 717 d/30-4-29 for Rs.20/- issued in the name of R.K.Pattadar which was cancelled not found in the book.

7. Receipt No. 767 for Rs.13/8/6 to Saleman Tirkey on 10-5-29 not issued and duplicate not written.

8. Receipt No. 866 to Inspector of School C.N. Division for Rs.136/8/- issued on 31-5-29 but the amount entered in the Cash book on 30-5-29.

9. Receipt No. 814 bill No. 731 d/22-5-29 Rs.32/- from District Board but entered in Cash book on 5-9-29. The amount of Rs.32/- was also entered in receipt No. 1380 d/ 5-9-29.

13. Duplicate of Receipt No. 964 not written though original one written but not issued.

14. Original of Receipt No. 1008 not issued but in duplicate of the same receipt Rs.1/- was received from Mr. H. Cloete Esq.

15. Original of Receipt No. 1009 & 1017 said to be not issued but the duplicate is not in the book.

16. Original Receipt of No. 1018 not in the book and the duplicate said to be not issued.

17. Receipt No. 1019 cancelled but the duplicate was not found in the book.

18. As per written off a/c Rs.74/8/- was received on 24-5-29 vide receipt No. 814 but the amount was not found traced entered in the cash book.

The following defects were noted when the bill compared with the cash book entries and the receipt.

1. Bill No. 246 d/10-4-29 advance from Sub Inspector of Khunti Rs.1/- received on 10-4-29 not traced entered in Cash book as per note in the bill.

2. Bill No. 262 d/17-4-29 G. Heers Esqr. bill after correction made to Rs.14/7/- but when inner corrected figure was totaled it comes to Rs.14/- only. It was noted in the bill that Rs.5/- received in advance on 15-4-29 which has found entry in the Cash book on the same date but again without giving deduction of Rs.5/- advance the full amount of bill Rs.14/7/- realized on 19-4-29.

3. Bill No. 301 d/ 26-4-30 to Parammall Sarawgi as per correction of the bill Rs. 42/12/- but realized on 19-7-29 Rs. 46/8/- Less realized Rs. 5/4/-.

4. Bill No. 338 d/ 15-5-29 to A.D. Pall Bros. as per bill Rs. 15/14/-. It was noted in the bill that Rs. 10/- advance paid but date of advance paid was not given by reference to cash book it was found that Rs. 5/- paid in advance on 15-5-29 when the order was placed but another advance of Rupees 5/- was not traced entered in the Cash book from 15-5-29 date of order to the last payment of the bill Rs. 5/14/-. Thus Rs. 5/- is realizable from the Manager who received the amount and not entered in the cash book.

5. Bill No. 368 d/ 5-6-29 bill for 1/4/- Rs. 1/- said to be advance paid on 30-5-29 but not traced entered in the Cash book between the date of order 30-5-29 and the last payment on 5-6-29.

6. Bill No. 379 d/ 13-6-29 as per bill 7/15/- as per order book 6/5/-. The bill was not corrected as per correction in order book. Rs. 6/5/- realized on 15-6-29.

7. Bill No. 223 d/ 17-4-29 of Colekiste Beni Chandra Khalkho Rs. 2/12/- V.P. send on 6-5-29 recovered on 10-5-29 as noted but no entry of the amount found in the Cash book.

8. Payment by Mahendra Khessa as per receipt No. 2088 d/ 11-1-30 as per receipt -/2/- but entered in Cash book Rs. 2/-. The bill was also for -/2/-.

9. Bill No. 175 d/ 4-4-30 Rs. 1/7/- realized along with B.D. bill No. 306 d/ 13-6-30 as noted in the bill but entry of Rs. 1/7/- not found in the cash book. The bill was wrongly twice prepared. The amount realized in bill No. 306.

10. Bill No. 317 d/ 9-9-30 Benjamin Christo for 1/3/- but entered in cash book as bill on 319.

Assuittance Roll.

1. Signature of Elias Parry wanting for Rs. 58/4/- salary of March 1929 and also service stamp not affixed.

2. Signature of Barnabas Tigi and Mansukh Lakra wanting for salary of May 1929.

3. It was found that Babu Masih Charan Ekka was paid Rs. 95/- in July 1930 but deduction made only for Rs. 45/- deduction should have been made on Rs. 95/-.

The accounts of petty expenditure was maintained in a separate Cash book called Petty Cash book since July 1929. The following defects were noticed when checked with petty vouchers and the entries in the cash book.

1. Voucher No. 10 purchase of 1 tin Kerosine oil for Rs. 3/8/8 d/ 12-9-29, voucher of the firm wanting and in the same voucher -/2/6 paid to cooli but thumb impression not taken.

4.

2. Voucher of shop for purchase of Molasses for Rs. 2/2/- on 4-11-29 vide voucher No. 4 wanting.

3. Voucher No. 5 d/ 5-5-30 made as per voucher -/7/- but entered in cash book -/8/-.

4. Voucher of shop wanting for purchase of purple paper for -/14/- on 14-5-30 vide voucher No. 15.

5. Voucher No. 26 & 27 of May not found in the file.

6. Voucher No. 35 d/ 6-6-30 as per voucher price of matches -/2/3 but entered in petty cash book -/2/9.

7. Voucher No. 18 d/ 21-6-30 as per voucher postage Rs. 29/15/- as per entry in petty cash book 29/12/6.

8. Voucher No. 2 as per merchant receipt for oil 3/8/- but entered in Petty cash book 3/8/9.

9. Signature of book-seller being used to be taken on postage voucher since June 1930 but his signature wanting on the following vouchers.

Voucher No. 21 d/ 21-6-30 for -/2/6
" " 22 d/ 30-6-30 for 1/8/-.

I checked the total and expenditure of postages and found that balance of July 1929 annas -/1/- was not carried forward. This should be adjusted in the next end.

When daily sale book of books compared with the entries in the cash book :-

It was found that cash sale of 6-7-29 Rs. 1/2/- was not entered in the general cash book. This amount should be realized from the Manager who used to receive the cash.

I found that none of the payment vouchers bears pay order of the Secretary or any body authorized for the purpose. For the information of expenditures under different heads every voucher should in future be passed for payment by the Secretary. The following defects were noticed when the expenditure voucher checked with the entries in the Cash book.

1. After voucher No. 121 voucher No. 124 begins there is no existence of voucher No. 122 & 123.

2. Voucher No. 8 d/ 18-11-29 advance for repair to the Secretary C.E.L.N. Press not supported by receipt.

3. Voucher No. 127 for refund of Rs. 7/- to Hino Depot not found in the file.

I regret to note that the general cash book in the period when Mr. E. Parry was Manager it was full of cutting and corrections. It should be written neatly and balances daily struck. The entries of receipts on 9-5-29 on pages 28 to 31 are without receipts and hence it could not be checked. For every item received receipt must be issued and every payment must always be supported by vouchers.

Further it was found that on 15-7-29 when the Cash was verified Rs.1,866/- was found short and Mr. E. Parry late Manager of the Press was held responsible for the amount. During the period under audit Rs.66/- was realized from him on 17-7-29 and adjustment of Rs. 233/17/- was made on 5-5-30 from P. Dand a/c. There is still due a balance of Rs.1566/4/- from him. The amount should be realized from him with interest as the Press is great sufferer for long remaining its capital locked outside the business. In this connection for safe guard the interest of the press I would like to suggest that all money receipt should be deposited in the local Bank and payment excepting small amount may be made by cheques. Heavy cash balance should not be allowed to remain with the Manager. According to requirement for petty charges say Rs.50/- or 100/- be allowed to remain with the Manager after the days transaction.

During the period under audit large number of temporary advances were made to the employee from the petty cash but they were never entered in the cash book save an except of item Muz of Rs.15/- in July and Rs. 53/- in August 1930. The amount of such advances were recouped by deduction from the Salaries of the employee as per acquittance roll but these deduction not passed through the Cash book. The advances were made as private affairs from the petty cash and recouped every month on Salary distribution day. Thus the cash balance of the petty cash shown was never agreeing with the actual Cash. It was always short. The practice is highly objectionable and at the same time dangerous. It should be put to stop. Any advances made should be shown in the Cash book on the expenditure side and when recouped on the receipt side and a ledger should also be maintained to know the outstanding balance at any time in case if they are not promptly realized every month.

From the list of unpaid list upto 31-12-30 attached herewith it will appear that some of the bills even of 1922 still unpaid. The bills which are unpaid for more than three years cannot be realized by recourse to law as they are time barred. The bill should not be allowed to remain unpaid so long in future. If the payment are not made within specified time action should always be taken otherwise the press will be great loser.

The abstract of receipt and expenditure attached herewith for the year 1929 and 1930 will give a clear idea of the amounts of receipts and expenditure under head miscellaneous for the year 1929 seems to me heavy and as such in future it should be curtailed by possible means.

Dear Sir,

The Quadrennial Meeting of this Board will be held about this time next year. In case your mission should wish to send delegates, I am issuing this preliminary notice, since mission committees usually meet during the cold weather, and delegates can then be chosen without special arrangements having to be made.

The rule about representation reads as follows:—

“To constitute the Managing Committee each Society adopting the scheme, and having more than ten foreign missionaries in this language area, may appoint one delegate, more than 30, two, more than sixty, three, and so on. Any Society with ten or fewer missionaries in this language area may unite in the scheme, but will not be entitled to representation on the Managing Committee.

“N.B.—A married couple to count as one missionary.”

In this rule, the words “language area” denote the whole of the area where Urdu and Hindi are used. It may be more clearly shown by the oral centres, which range from Lahore in the north to Dhamtari (for Hindi) and Poona (for Urdu) in the south, and from Darjeeling in the east to Indore and Ajmer in the west. It may, however, be understood that missionaries in the area, not working in Urdu or Hindi, are excluded.

It will be possible for some financial assistance from savings on the Board's working to be given to delegates. If all who may come do so, this will probably amount to two thirds of their expenses, but on the last two occasions the whole was paid, since many missions were not fully represented.

Although the representation is reckoned on “foreign missionaries”, yet the sending of Indian delegates is allowable, provided these are of a status comparable with that of missionaries, and, at the last meeting of the Board, most valuable work was done by such representatives.

Suggestions for the improvement of the rules or syllabus should reach me early in the New Year, so that they may be fully discussed by the Executive Committee. If alternative books are suggested, copies should accompany the suggestions.

Would you please let me know when your mission committee will meet, and, in due course, the names of the representative or representatives chosen?


Received your last letter of the 15th.

Holy Indian Church, Adra
The 30th June 1931.

Dear Sir,

I am directed to submit a brief Report of the Holy Indian Church, Adra. I could have sent this Report earlier than this but due to my sickness I could not do so.

This church was established in 1922 by Mr. Sarada Prasad Dass, then there were only a few members on the Roll and accordingly a small Church Building was also built on the land of Mr. Dass. But now this Church Building is not sufficient to accommodate the members now on the Roll, and sometimes, the services are held in the open place in the North side of the building. The necessity, therefore, for a more spacious Church Building, is absolutely necessary.

I. The Statistics of the Church: The total number of members is 60; and the total number of Children is 55, the total numerical strength of the Congregation is 115 including 27 Communicants on the Roll.

Most of the members are Railway workers and are getting poor pay.

II. The services of the Church: Two services are held regularly on Sundays only; One Sunday School Service in the morning and the other General Prayer Meeting held at noon. The Sunday School Service is conducted by me and my wife and the General Prayer Meeting, by Mr. Dass. The Sunday School children are also taught religious hymns during this period.

Upto 1929 we attempted to hold evening prayer meetings on Tuesdays and Thursdays in different houses but I am sorry to note here that no encouragement was found amongst the members to join these Prayer Meetings; so they are discontinued now.

III. The Finance of the Church: The financial

condition of the Church is very poor as I have said before that most of the members are poor; so according to their means they have to pay monthly subscription towards the worthy object of the Church and I am glad to report that this Church is selfsupported and selfgoverned and we thank God for His Blessings over such a small Contribution.

With this small fund we have to meet the expenses in connection with the Church and to help the poor in time of their need. Nothing is paid either to Mr. Dass or to me; we do the work of God free of any wages but willingly.

This Church sends Rs. 5/- yearly to the Church Council of the United Church of Northern India, Calcutta, as Council fees which we propose to discontinue for some reason.

IV. The need of a Licensed Pastor: There is no Licensed Pastor here. Mr. Dass takes up the Congregational services as I have mentioned above and he is quite fit for such responsible appointment and the Congregation hopes that he should be Conformed as a Licensed Pastor for this Church. We shall take up this matter when you kindly visit this place at the end of July next as you have promised.

We are all well by the blessing of our Almighty Father trusting you all the same.



I have planned to write you for at least two weeks but have allowed other responsibilities to control my time. You may remember that while I was with you in the Maha Sabha I suggested to you that the Church in Chota Nagpur might be greatly aided if Dr. Sam Higginbottom and his associates in the Allahabad Agricultural Institute could be persuaded to establish some²where in the Ranchi District a branch school of agriculture. You thought the idea sufficiently promising to deserve consideration. The German Missionaries also spoke very favourably. I have accordingly talked to Dr. Higginbottom about the matter and find that he is interested and would like to discuss the possibility of such a programme with you and other representatives of the church and the mission, and also with the representatives of the Anglican Church in the district. Dr. Higginbottom hopes to attend the Mass Movement Conference in Ranchi next month and will try to arrange for conversations with a number of you either privately or in a group.

In the meantime Dr. Higginbottom is prepared to extend help to at least 8 young men from Chota Nagpur in his Institute. He will give free tuition so that all the expenses of the students will be their food and incidental expenses plus Re.1/- room rent per month. 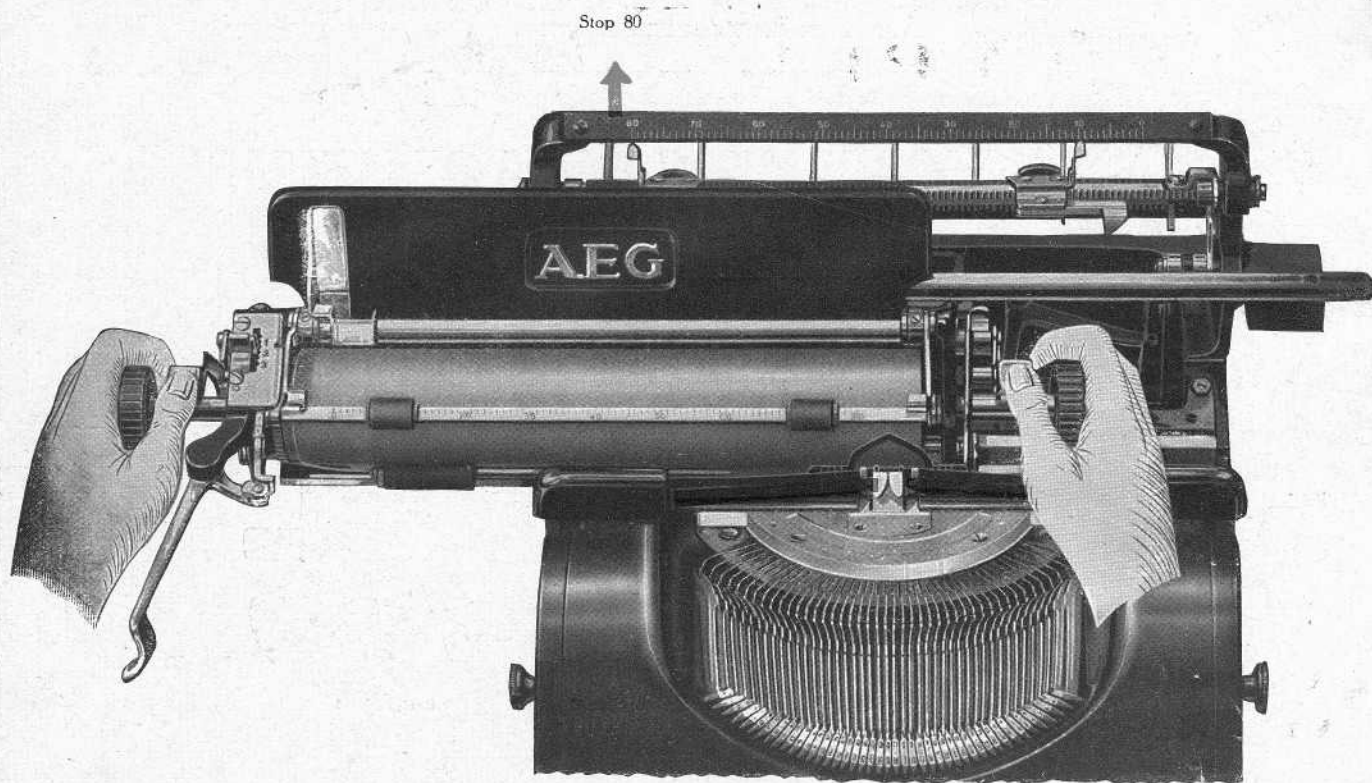

NOTICE.

During the present settlement operation an attempt is being made to save some of the jungles in the Ranchi district from destruction. The greater part of the district is now denuded of forest, and there is nothing left even for fuel. The hills which used to bear forest are now bare and stony, for after the jungle on the hills is cut down, the soil is in a few years washed off, and the hills are useless for cultivation and even for grazing.

2. In most of the forests in this district both the landlords and the tenants have rights. In a few villages the landlords and tenants have come to an agreement whereby blocks of forests are preserved. But in most villages the jungles have been cut down in a most -- destructive manner either by landlords letting them out for cutting to contractors, or by the tenants wastefully cutting down trees. It has become in some cases a race between landlords and tenants for the destruction of the jungles. Sometimes a tenant cuts down hundreds of young sal saplings for making fences. Sometimes good jungle on a hill side is cleared to make a tanr field which in a few years will lose its soil and become useless. Unless some action is taken now, there will in a few years be no forest left in the Simdega and Gumla Subdivisions, and the people will have to burn cowdung for fuel, as many raiyats have to do now in other parts of the district.

3. It is the duty of every landlord and raiyat to do his best to preserve some forest for the use of his children and his children's children.

4. There are two ways in which the forest can be preserved. Where the area of forest in a village is small, the landlord and tenants should agree to an amicable partition. It is generally fair to divide the forest into 3 parts. One part will be landlord's rakhat, in which no one but the landlord will have rights. Another part will be the tenant's rakhat, in which no one but the tenants will have rights. The third part, will remain as it was before, ordinarily village jungle.

5. The other way where the area of forest is large, and spreads into several villages, is to have a portion of the forest reserved

under the Forest Act on the application of the landlords, in the interest of both landlords and tenants. The Forest Officer will divide the forest into a number of coupes. Each year one coupe will be thrown open for the villagers to cut their requirements. The other parts then have a chance to recover, and so the jungle is preserved for posterity. Arrangements are made at the same time for the landlord to get a fair share of the produce of the forests.

6. When forests are reserved in this manner care will be taken that forests is left outside the reserves.

7. Forest guards will usually be appointed from among the villagers themselves.

8. Villagers will be able to graze their cattle in the reserves without fee or permit, except in those parts where young trees are growing up.

9. It must be remembered that these reserves will not belong to the Government. Nor will Government try to make any profit from them. The forests will be managed by the Government on behalf of the people.

10. A large number of tenants have realised the necessity for saving part of the jungles, and have agreed to the partition of jungles with the landlords. Each party must give up some part of its claims. The landlord must give up his claim that the jungles belong exclusively to him. And the tenants must give up their claims that the jungles belong exclusively to them.

11. When the small jungles are divided between landlord and tenants, the tenants must take care of their own rakhat. They must not allow anyone to cultivate in their rakhat. They must see that the forest is not damaged by excessive cutting. Generally it will be better to appoint a panchayat, with the headman, Mahato, and other village officials, to manage the tenants rakhat. A forest officer will come round once a year to advise the panchayat how to manage their forest and regulate cutting. Both the landlord's --

rakhat and the tenant's rakhat must be kept clearly demarcated on the ground. The tenants must not interfere with the landlord's rakhat, or the landlord with the tenant's rakhat, ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~

12. The tenants should remember that all these steps are being taken in their interest and in the interest of their children.

१. इस सेंट्रल मेरठ में राजी जिले के कुछ जंगलों को बरबाद हो जाने से बचाये जाने की कोशिश का जा रही है। इस जिले के अधिकाँस हिस्से में जंगल एकदम खत्म हो गया है, और जब जलावन तक के लिये भी कुछ न रह गया है, वे पहाड़ियाँ जिन पर जंगल थे अब उजाड़ और पत्थर के टुकड़ों से भरे भरे पड़े हैं, क्योंकि पहाड़ियों से जंगल को काट डालने पर मिट्टी कुछ ही वर्षों में बह जाती है, और वे पहाड़ियाँ बरबाद करने और मवेशी चराने लायक भी नहीं रह जाती हैं।

२. इस जिले के अधिकाँस जंगलों में जमीन्दार और प्रजा दोनों का हक है। कुछ गाँवों में जमीन्दार और प्रजा ने ऐसा राजीनामा कर लिया है जिससे जंगलों के टुकड़े रखवात रखे गये हैं। लेकिन बहुत से गाँवों में जंगल सत्यानाशी तरीके से काटे गये हैं। धातों काटने के लिये जमीन्दारों के ठीका देने से या पेड़ों को प्रजा लोगों के काट डाल कर बरबाद करने से। कहीं कहीं तो जंगलों को बरबाद करने के लिये जमीन्दार और प्रजा दोनों ने परस्पर एक दूसरे की स्पर्धा की है। कभी कभी तो एक प्रजा मैकड़ों सरबुर के नये पेड़ों को घेरना बसाने के लिये काट डालता है। कभी कभी पहाड़ी के किनारे पर के लकड़ें लकड़े जंगल ऐसी एक टांड खेत बनाने के लिये काटे जाते हैं जो कुछ ही वर्षों में मिट्टी के बह जाने से बेकार हो जायगी। जब तक के जमीन कोई करवाई नहीं की जायगी कुछ ही वर्षों में सीमडेगा और गुमला सबडिवीजन में कुछ भी जंगल न रह जायगा, और लोगों को जलावन के लिये जोड़वा व्यवहार करना पड़ेगा जैसा कि जमीन इस जिले के और और हिस्से में बहुत सी रैयतों को करना पड़ता है।

३. हर एक जमीन्दार और प्रजा का यह कर्तव्य है कि वह कुछ जंगल अपने बाल बच्चे और उनके भी बच्चों के लिये बनावे।

४. जंगल बचाने के लिये ये उपाय हैं। जिस गाँव में जंगल का रक्ता कम है वहाँ जमीन्दार और प्रजा को आपसी बटवारा में राजी होना चाहिये। साधारणतः यह मुनासिब है कि जंगल ३ टुकड़ों में बाँटा जाय। एक टुकड़ा जमीन्दार का रखवात होगा जिस में जमीन्दार के सिवाय और किसी का कोई हक स्वेका नहीं होगा। तीसरा टुकड़ा सम्पूर्ण प्रजा लोगों का रखवात होगा जिस में प्रजा के सिवाय और किसी का कोई हक नहीं होगा। तीसरा टुकड़ा

- साबिक मुतानीक मामुली मिलेज जंगल याने गाँव वालों का जंगल रहेगा
- ५ जंगल बचाने के लिये दूसरा उपाय यह है कि जहाँ जंगल का रक्कबा बड़ा है और जंगल कई मौजों तक लगातार मिला हुआ है वहाँ जमीन्दार अपनी और प्रजा की भलाई के लिये फोरेस्ट एक्ट के मुतानीक दरवास देकर जंगल का एक टुकड़ा रीजर्व याने रखांत करवाले। ऐसे रखांत जंगल को फोरेस्ट ऑफिसर कई एक टुकड़ों (कूप) में बाँटेजे। हर साल एक एक टुकड़ा (कूप) गाँव वालों की जरूरतों के लिये खोला जायगा। रखांत जंगल के बाकी हिस्से को तब बचने का मौका मिलेगा और इस तरह से हमेशा के लिये जंगल बचाया जा सकता है। इसके साथ साथ ऐसा प्रबन्ध किया जायगा जिस से जंगल का पैदावार का मुनासीब हिस्सा जमीन्दार को मिले।
 - ६ जिस समय में इस तरह से जंगल रीजर्व किये जायेंगे उस समय में ऐसा उपाय किया जायगा ताकि रीजर्व के बाहर भी कुछ जंगल रह जाय।
 - ७ साधारणतः गाँव वालों ही में से फोरेस्ट गार्ड बहाल किये जायेंगे।
 - ८ गाँव के लोग रीजर्व जंगल में बिना नाम और बिना हुकुम मवेशी चरा सकेंगे सिवाय जंगल के उन हिस्सों के जिन में छोटे छोटे पेड़ निकल रहे हैं।
 - ९ यह जरूर थाय रहे कि ये रीजर्व जंगल सर्कार के न होंगे और न सरकार उनसे (गवर्नमेन्ट) कोई नाफा करने की कोशिश करेगी। उन रीजर्व जंगलों का केवल प्रबन्ध ही जंगल के तरफ से सर्कार करेगी।
 १०. बहुत सी प्रजातों ने अब यह समझ लिया है कि जंगलों का कुछ हिस्सा बचाना जरूरी है और जमीन्दारों के साथ जंगल बाँट लेने को मंजूर कर लिया है। हर एक पक्ष को अपनी दायित्वों का कुछ हिस्सा जरूर उठा लेना चाहिये। जमीन्दार को यह दानी जरूर उठा लेना चाहिये कि कुल जंगल अकेला हीका है और प्रजा लोगों की भी यह दानी उठा लेना चाहिये कि कुल जंगल अकेले उन्हीं लोगों का है।







Postponement of the All India Swadeshi Exhibition.

The 'All India Swadeshi Exhibition' which was to be held in November/December 1930 has been postponed to February/March 1931 due to the tense and disturbed political conditions in Bombay, as also to enable to complete the erection work more satisfactorily. The Committee has taken this step after mature consideration-in the best interest of the Exhibitors themselves.

You will appreciate the motive underlying this decision as we feel the political conditions in Bombay are bound to get worse, making it impossible to satisfactorily carry out the objects of the Exhibition.

However, it must be clearly understood that the work in other directions will go on such as preparation of directory of the Exhibition and the stalls will be registered from now on from all over India, Burma and Ceylon. The average charges will be from annas 12 to Rs. 1/4 per square foot, according to the exact location of the place required. All the exhibits will be allotted stalls according to our classification.

Although there is enough time, manufacturers and merchants of 'Genuine Swadeshi Articles' requiring stalls should immediately write to the undersigned stating the area required and giving details of their manufactures together with a remittance of Rs. 50/- for each stall as deposit for which an official receipt will be sent signed by either of the Treasurers Raja Narayanlal Bansilal or Seth Surji Vallabhdas.

The construction work will be taken in hand from the 15th of January 1931. Those requiring special stalls and also small cottage industries will be given special concession. All the necessary facilities and help for demonstration purposes will be given.

The average size of the stall is 12 feet frontage and 15 feet depth but arrangements can be made to have stalls of either smaller or bigger area with less frontage, the depth remaining same according to the individual requirements provided the requirements are known earlier.

The Exhibition office is now shifted to the Great Western Hotel Building, Old Customs House Road, Fort, Bombay, where all communications should please be addressed in future.
