Dear Brother Horo!

This is to let you know that our two young sisters Parakleta
K h e s s and Daisy H e m r o m are going in for their exam at
the Bible-School in Salzuflen at the end of March. We think they
should stay here for another month or two in order to visit the
friends and congregations who pray and work for the Gossner Church
in India. They must also have short holidays in order to recover
from the strenuous exams. They could then leave here in June or July
to take up work in the Gossner Church.

The decision as to what work they are to do on their return to India lies entirely with the Church Council. I would be glad if you would occasionally let me know what kind of church work you intend to assign to the young women.

The two teachers Bahalen B a g e and Seteng H a p a d g a r a have arrived in Mainz-Kastel as scheduled, and are staying there for a bit in order to be eqipped with the necessary clothing for the winter climate in Germany and to be introduced by Sister Auguste Fritz in-to the quite different circumstances of life. They are invited this week already to Pastor Dr. Hess, Westkilver/Westfalia, and are subsequently to stay in Espelkamp for a while to be together with Mr. and Mrs. Minz.

There will be no church courses in Germany starting before April 1st so that the two teachers will spend the first weeks of their stay in Germany in learning German. From April 1st onward they are either to go to the Bible School in Salzuflen, where P. Khess and D. Hemrom are, or to the large "Diakonissen" House in Kaiserswerth on/Rhine where they are to be acquainted with the working methods of the Kindergarten. In Kaiserswerth are also young women of the Batak Church pursuing their studies there, and we believe it would be profitable for our two teachers to study and work there in ecumenic community with these sisters from Indonesia. I shall let you know as soon as I myself know where our two teachers will be going on April 1st.

I have to give you very sad news which will affect you too. Our Pastor Heinrich G r o t h a u s died on January 20th, 1958. He was our best fellow worker in the mission work in our German congregations. And he was a real father for the small Indian family living in Germany. You knew him too, and will understand that it will be very hard for us to find someone to replace him.

Finally I want to thank you and especially President Tiga most heartily for continuing negotations with the brothers of the other group, thereby being willing to make sacrifices on your part. Brother Borutta has written to me about it. I pray God that He give His blessing to your further discussions.

The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission thanks you for the letter of the Church Council of December 27th, 1957 (No. 2584/57 - CC - 78) and affirms the resolution of the Church Council to invite Bishop Dr. Manikam as chairman of the Commission.

We pursue the goings-on within the Gossner Church which have become so scandoulous that even the police had to intervene with sorrow. You can imagine how much the Kuratorium and all missionfriends in Germany suffer under this disturbance in the Gossner Church. We pray to God daily that he show you all a way for the Church to return to peace and order.

We are also troubled by the news that India and also the district of the Gossner Church is threatened by famine. Should not this general distress lead us all to repent? In addition there is the loss of church money through the crash of the bank in Ranchi and the financial emergency of the Church Council.

We in the Kuratorium have turned over all these things in our hearts, and asked ourselves what we can do on our part to help you. We believe that the discussions in the Commission which are of a legal character are a far too narrow basis for restoring the church to unity and peace. The quarrel in the church seems to us only a symptom of a far deeper disorder of a spiritual nature and can only be overcome by prayer and the Word of God. We are, therefore, suggesting that the Gossner Church should this year - the year of the hundredth anniversary of the death of Gossner - arrange a wide-scale evangelisation campaign throughout the whole church. The Gossner Church is to be offered the Gospel once again. For this service in the evangelisation work all suitable men and women missionaries, Indian pastors and laymen are to be summoned irrespective of the group they belong to. This evangelisation is to be introduced by a preparation course for pastors of about 8 - 14 days and perhaps to be terminated in a kind of church rally (not synod, which would have a partly legal character) in one of the larger parishes. For this evangelistic service the Kuratorium is willing to send me to India. My wife will accompany me. If you agree I want to come immediately after the rains.

This evangelisation is not meant to replace the work of the Commission. This is to go on alongside and should begin as soon as possible. We have written to Bishop Dr. Manikam to this effect and asked him to come to Ranchiæ soon as possible.

The Kuratorium has yet another suggestion to make: From the sense of solidarity with you we want to send you a pastoral letter addressing all congregations and pastors of the Gossner Church to be read on Palm Sunday (the death-day of Gossner) in all services. We shall send you this letter as soon as possible and request you to distribute it

among all pastors and congregations irrespective of the group they belong to. This epistle also has no other purpose than to summon our brethren in the Gossner Church in prayer to obey the Word of God.

We would be very grateful if you would appreciate these proposals and put them into action. We are also willing to bear the costs of printing and dispatching this pastoral letter.

To conclude I have a very earnest and urgent request: hard as it may be for you, do not give up disscussing with the members of the other group, and hold fast to the unity of the Gossner Church. May God Almighty through His Holy Spirit give you patience, wisdom and strength to overcome all obstacles that lie on the way to peace and unity in the Church. 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church might be too isolated. In the same way as in former times it was in close communion with the Old Church it should now seek close communion with other Young Churches in India. And for this purpose it seems to us that a mere membership in the Federation is not sufficient. The close connection between the member churches and the Federation should find expression in one item of the Constitution.

We thought that this connection could best be integrated into the constitution in the part concerning the Board of Adjudication. The advantage would be that the chairman of this board could claim objectivity and neutrality from the beginning.

We are convinced that times will come in India when close union among the Lutheran churches will become necessary. We therefore beg you to reconsider this matter in the Committee. In Germany it is the custom in the synods to invite representatives of the neighbouring churches and of the united Board of administration of the Evangelical Church in Germany. They attend the synod as advisors, and we think this is the least that the G.E.L. Church in India should do.

For this reason we warmly welcome your suggestion under point 4 to invite advisors from other churches for your work in the present committee. It is been sail inspected and the present and t

So you see that on the whole we approve your letter of November 12th and only beg you to begin with the work of this committee soon. To conclude we want to treat a few practical matters which need urgent dealing with.

1. You will in the meantime have heard that Pastor Dr. Ple us ch of the "Kirchliche Außenamt" of the Evangelical Church in Germany has been sent to Rourkela as pastor for the protestant engineers and technicians. In the entry permit the Indian Government has expressly endorsed that Dr. Peusch is not allowed to work as missionary, but as paster for the protestant Germans in Rourkela. Nevertheless the church board in Germany under which Pastor Dr. Peusch serves has given him an "ecumenic commission". That means that Pastor Dr. Peusch has received from his Home Church not only the permission but also the order to take up connections with the Young Churches in India, especially with the Gossner Church. We commend him to your brotherly love and beg you to be proposed the pastor of the pastor of

We would suggest that you allow Pastor Hanukh Minz to use the last period of his stay in Germany to become acquainted with matters of church organisation and church administration in Germany. Bishop Dr. Meyer of Lübeck, formerly missionary in the Jeypur Church has consented to introduce Pastor H. Minz into this department of church work. That means, however, that we cannot wait till Pastor Minz has returned to India before we ask for a successor. Therefore, we would be grateful to you if you would already try to find an efficient

young Indian pastor who could continue Pastor Minz' work in Germany. We would be glad if his successor could come to Germany in 1959 so that he could be introduced into his work by Brother Minz.

5. Finally we hope very much that the two teachers of the Tabita School Bahalen B a g e and Seteng H a p a d g a r a for whom we are waiting for a long time can soon start on their journey to Germany. We beg the Church Council to take all necessary steps to overcome the technical obstacles that hinder their journey.

Last of all a brotherly exhortation. On March 30th, 1958 we are celebrating the 100th anniversary of the death of Father Gossner. We shall remember all over Germany the blessing that God gave to the work of Pastor Johannes Evangelista Gossner - in Germany as well as in India. When Brothers Joel Lakra and Jilo Tiga visited us in Berlin they placed a wreath at the tomb of Gossner, and in the face of his grave they thanked God in prayer and song for the Gospel that had been brought the Adivasis through His servant Johannes Evangelista Gossner. And we ask ourselves, should everything Gossner did for the Church in Chota Nagpur and Assam be destroyed through the quarrels in the Church which bears the name of Gossner? Are we all to be become the laughing-stock of the Roman Church and the Hindus? Or should we not all contribute to restoring peace and unity in our church in India in this year in which we are commemorating the 100th anniversary of Gossner's death? I beseech you, dear Brethren, for the love of Christ go to the bethren of the other party and unite with them and us in prayer to God that He guide us on the right path - the path of peace.

Dear Brother Lokies.

The second annual session of the full Church Council held here from IO th to I3 th. December '57 has endorsed our letter of I2 th. November '57, which the three Executive Officers had addressed to the Kuratorium. The Church Council has unanimously agreed to invite Bishop Manikam to be the chairman of the committee which is to work for the amendment of the Gossner church constitution. It, however, provided that in the event of any unforeseen circumstances making it impossible for the Bishop to accept the chairmanship of the said committee, Dr. Lokies should be invited to shoulder this responsibility. It is so because it is generally held here that Bishop Manikam and Dr. Lokies are the two christian leaders intimately known by the members of the Gossner Church, who in their turn know the mind of this church, and as such, they would be immendely helpful to this church at the present moment. The Kuratorium would be able to agree to this proposal we believe.

Speaking of the situation in the church, it might be said that it has not improved as was generally believed at the time of signing the "Agreement". It is a painful experience to know that the dissenting brethren have since indulged in the act of wilfully violating the solemn agreement. Inspite of repeated requests and appeals they have never sought the co-operation of the church council in having one united church service at Ranchi. They have, on the other hand, insisted on having their separate service continued. Thus they have closed the door for the two groups coming together. Constant propaganda work is being carried on thru speeches, actions and pamphlets with a view to extending their illegal activities. They have/directing their actions against the church council so much so that their recent criminal mactivities at Khutitoly and Ranchi have resulted in the Police drawing up proceedings against them and the church council. They have put obstructions in the working of the Lutheran Theological College at Ranchi of which Rev. J. Lakra is the Principal. This institution has been alloted a separate building as desired and recommended by the Serampore University. This building was so long on rent occupied by the Accountant General of Bihar, which they vacated last July. On September 25 th and November 4 this year when the college was bringing in its library and furniture to this new has building, the dissenting group put obstructions at the gate with the result that the Police had to intervene. This kind of incidents are happening after the agreement was signed.

Unfortunately Rev. J.Lakra, whom the church council appointed Principal of the Lutheran Theol Collge, is not acting according to the terms of his appointment. His actions and letters have clearly indicated that he helped the dissenters in putting obstructions before the collge on November 4. All official communications sent to him by the church council are passed on by him to the dissenters, who in their turn make resolutions on them. We have personally spoken to him about this, but he clearly says that he can't ignore them. He has been, moreover, neglecting his work in the college since he has now joined the CongressParty. He was recently elected to the State Legislative Rxx Council on a CongressParty tocket. It is widely rumoured that he will be taken in the State cabinet, and if that happens he will have to leave the college. If he is not taken in the cabinet, he may insist on remaining as the Principal. It has posed some vital questions: Whether

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Whether it is advisable for the Pastors to juin take active part in politics, and if they should do withere or not their doing so would endanger the life of the church.

The church council has so far watched these incidents with utmost patience and forebearance. But, at the same time it cannot afford to stand and stare. It has in its recent session, however, resolved to ask the leaders of the dissenting group and Rev. Lakra to give in writing by 3Ist January '58 that they abide by the present church constitution and respect the solemn "Agreement" signed on I7 th June '57, failing which, the church council under painful necessity will have to declare that they cease to be members of the Gossner church and forfeit all their rights and previleges of the Gossner church from that date. The church council would not want them to be lost in this way. It had to take this step under pressing circumstances and would want them to realise the deteriorating situation fragught with danger which might result in the breaking up of the church. We still hope that some - thing better will come out with the change of heart. We labour with this optimism.

Sisters Bahalen Bage and Seteng Hapadgara are scheduled to sail from Bombay on January 9,1958 by m.v. "Asia". It is expected that they will arrive in Germany towards the last week of January. We commend them to your care and request khak you to give them such training which will enable them to serve and help the Gossner church in her work in the women's department. We express our heartfelt gratitude towards the Kuratorium and the congregations in Germany who have made this possible - the task which the Gossner church would not have done by herself. We are conscious of the fact that the Kuratorium has been helping the church in training herpeople abroad, and we are highly indebted to you all.

Knowing it well that we do not deserve to ask you for more favours, the church council has in its recent session taken another important decision with the hope that the Kuratorium will renew its former proposalsent to us in its letter of 7.4.55 in selecting two students for technical studies in Germany. The church council has selected Mr. Horasenan HORO and Mr. Ruhma Joy LAKRA for studies in engineering. Both of them are science graduates of the Bihar University who have agreed to pay their journey expenses to Germany. They are prepared to be introduced to non-clerical church work. In the hope of the Kuratoriums inviting them we are asking them to secure their Passports. They will do their language work under the guidance of Bros. Bage and Surin. Since we have made this selection, we would like to hear from you how soon arrangements for their admission to a technical university could be made and whether or not they could begin their studies from the new session this coming year. The Kuratorium, we believe will be willing top bear the cost of their studies and stay in Germany. We would, therefore, highly appreciate if the Kuratorium would send us a financial guarantee in respect of these students. That would expedite the securing of their passports. For details of their studies, kindly send us some literature or prospectus that could be of some help to the students.

Brother Martin Tete has arrived in Xxixa church council has assigned him work in the Catechists' Training school as its head. He will take over charge of the school from June next year. Till them he will work as an assistant teacher in the same school. We thank you for all the financial and other help

extended to him during his stay in Germany.

The National Christian Council of India have written to President Tiga informing him that the India Government have agreed to permit Bro. Kloss and Mrs. Kloss to come out to India to serve the Lutheran Theol College at Ranchi. They have , however, rejected Erms Bro. Eckart's application for entry permit. Since this information was given to us we tried through our friends at New Delhi and at one stage We were assured that the revenuent will Delhi and at one stage we were assured that the government will sympathetically re-consider his case. Bro. Borutta who had been to New Delhi was also given this assurance. But, only a few days ago I was informed by a friend of mine that the govt. have now finally refused to give Bro. Eckart the necessary entry permit. We wonder if you would now think of sending him out here for a brief period for a visit.

Last year I had raised a question before the Kuratorium while presenting my report whether the Kuratorium could help could help the Gossner church in its economic uplift programme. The Kuratorium had then wanted a detail scheme. That is overdue as we could not give much time and energy to this subject. This question was raised in the recent council sitting. We wondered if the 'World Church Service' could be of any help in this respect. We do not have much information as to the nature and manner of their programme. Bro. Borutta has suggested that you could contact the WCS. May we, therefore, request you to contact them on our behalf and find out what assistance they could give us in this direction.

Bro. Peus and Mrs. Peus have arrived in India. They are now in Amgaon. We have yet to meet them. Bro. Borutta had proposed to station them at Raj Gangpur for the time being until a permanent quarter is available for them at Rourkela. On consideration we thought that the building at Raj Ganpur will require great deal of repair work and that that will not be immediately available as the dissenting group are occupying that building. Alternately we thought that it would be advisable if Bro. Tives at Chakradharpur in the old church bungalow. That needs some repair. As Rourkela and Chakradharpur are connected by rail, he will not find-it be able to look after his/at Rourkela. Form Chakradharpur

net-find-it be able to look after his/at Rourkela. From Charled Dur church land at Purnapani (Rourkela) has not yet been finally left over. That is due to certain trouble going on between some christian residents of the village and the steel company. The local residents are insisting to remain where they are. The moments it is settled, we believe our case will also be finalised. The DWM/LWF has asked us to present them with a scheme.

Wew will take up this matter soon.

We have noted that on next Palm Sunday that is the 30 th. March '58, falls the I90 years death anniversary of our dear Father Gossner. We would celebrate this memorable event thoughout the church. We thank you for the photo of Fr. Gossner which you have sent us. We shall preserve them in the church council office as a kind gift from Germany.

By the Grace of God we are all keeping well. Amidss drought conditions and constant troubles we have celebrated christmas. At the threshold of the NEW YEAR we are looking forward for better things to come.

Bringing you the very best of wishes for the NEW YEAR. Please convey our NEW YEAR'S greetings to the inmates of the two Gossner Houses, the congregations who pray for us and to Mrs. Lokies and other friends. YISHUSAHAY to your goodself and to the members of the Kuratorium.

Dear Brethren,

In the absence of the Full Church Council, the Executive Officers have given due thoughts to the suggestions and proposals offered by you in your letter of October 3, 1957. An answer to your letter could not be sent earlier due to several disturbances and emergencies that came in the way. President Tiga's eldest son who was ailing for the last 1½ years was passing through the critical stage, and passed away on the 17th October which was a deep concern for all of us. These and other things greatly disturbed us all.

We do fully agree with you that the Kingdom of God stands first. The Church administration has always held the view that personal or communal differences should in no way come before us when we are serving the Lord in the Church. The administration will have due respect for the rights and lawful claims of every member of the church, and for any dissenting group. At the same time the church administration will have claim over every member or group of persons for their loyalty and support in maintaining and protecting the integrity of cur Gossner Church.

We have to proceed constitutionally and the Constitution of the Church in force will have to be the basis. This view was expressed by us from the very beginning. When we say "Constitutionally" we mean to observe it strictly as it is. We hold the view that any problem involving the legal rights and previleges of a person of persons must be solved within the framework of the Constitution in force viz., the one passed by the Mahasabha in 1949, and in doing so, the integrity of the Gossner Church must be positively upheld.

We strongly feel that the Constitution may and should be amended out of constitutional and administrative necessity. If the socalled "Minority Problem" seems to necessitate a change in the constitution, that has to be carefully and properly studied in right perspective after correctly evaluating the situation at hand. If, the Gossner Church administration is to be run on the fabric of communal interests then it will switch on to be an inter-communal organisation and if church administration is to be run by representatives of "Parties" then it will mean that the church is a political organisation. We do fully agree with Praeses Stosch's remarks on the "Preamble" of the scheme presented by the so-called North Zone.

Now, our remarks on the constructive suggestions offered by you are as follows:-

- 1. Besides the President of the Church, we agree, to have another officer who will preside over the Mahasabha and Share some administrative responsibilities. He would be elected by the Mahasabha, become an honorary officer of the Church and sit in the Church Council and its Executive as an ex-officio member. We would call him "The Chairman". He will be assisted by two Vice-Chairmen during his absence in the Mahasabha. The Chairman will indicate which of the Vice-Chairmen will officiate as Chairman during his temporary or long absence. The Vice-Chairmen will not be members of the Church Council and its executive. They will be members of the Mahasabha. We agree that the Chairman and the Vice-Chairmen he laymen. They should also be elected by the Mahasabha.
- 2. Board of Adjudication: The Church Constitution provides for a commission of Adjudication in (Article 13:2) of the constitution and Article 4/4 of its Byelaw. This commission is composed of 4 most experienced laymen and 4 most experienced Pastors of the Church and presided over by the President of the Church. It is biennially appointed. We feel strongly that this commission's members should be from within the Church and not from outside. We agree that the Chairman of the Mahasabhashould preside over this commission instead of the President of the Church. This Commission will have members who will serve for four years.
- 3. Finance: We would give due consideration to the financial aspect of the proposal. In this connexion we commend to the consideration of everybody the "Ranson's Report" which proposes contralisation of of Finances. Some modifications are necessary in keeping with the existing synodical system. Already the DWM/LWF has suggested legal guarantee against misappropriation of public money and the Church Council has taken steps in this direction. We feel that the Treasurer or the Financial Secretary, as he may be designated, shall have wider powers to deal with church finance. All these will have to be incorporated in the Constitution through amendments or introduction of new sections.
- 4. We feel that the provisions of the Constitution in the matter of procedure for amending the constitution be followed with no exception. The procedure envisages a long time and we feel that any amendment should not be rushed through. We have to wait till 1959.
  - (a) The Church Council Officers agree that the following 10 persons should form a committee to

draft amendments to the present Constitution :-

1. Rev. J.J.P.Tiga; 2. Mr. N.E. Horo; 3. Rev. Habil Topno; 4. Mr. Isahak Minz; 5. Rev. Samuel Bage; 6. Rev. J.A.Kujur; 7. Mr. P.D.Panna; 8. Mr. Naeman Toppo; 9. Mr. Sachindramohan Chowdhury; 10. Rev. C.B. Minz; 11. Mr. Nuas Kerketta and 12. Dr. N.Bage.

We hold the view that one or even two persons from outside the Gossner Church, who are conversant with Church constitution be co-opted as legal advisers to help the committee in its work. This committee will cooperate with the committee of yours. We are very grateful to the Kuratorium for the promise of financial help.

- (b) Chairman: We thought that Dr. Lokies is the best person to be The Chairman of the Commission. But, since you rightly pointed out to us the wisdom and feasibility of having an Indian to be the Chairman of the Commission, we appreciate your view and we are seriously considering the matter. We need some time to find out a suitable Indian Chairman Chairman leader for the purpose.
- (c) We approve that Missionary Borutta be requested to be present in the meetings of the committee as a guest.

For as much as it is impossible to convene the Full Church Council meeting for paucity of funds, we the Executive Officers of the Gossner Church unanimously agree to send the above as an official reply to yours of October 3, 1957.

We are deeply indebted to the Kuratorium and our friends in Germany for their help and prayers at this hour of trial. We send our heartfelt thanks to them all and beseech them through you to pray for us.

We have registered Mr. Eckart as 'social worker for the Christian congregations in the industrial area and manager for the Mission Hospital at Amgaon'. Further he is ment to replace our missionary Borutta, the last missionary we have who intends to return to Germany next year.

/ Endosed please find an invitation of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam to the lecturer Mr. Hermann Kloss who is willing with his wife to serve the Indian Church.

The GELC is autonomous since 1919, and is administrated by Indian Christians.

There are special "terms" which regulate the working conditions between the autonomous Indian Church and the German men and women called by the Indian Church to their service which have to be signed by every German fellow-worker. A copy of these "terms" signed by Mr. Kloss is enclosed.

At the time only very few German fellow-workers are employed in the GELC of Chotanagpur and Assam: one missionary (who is returning to Germany next year), two lady-teachers, one missionarydoctor and one missionary-nurse.

Mr. Kloss is asked by the Church in India to replace Professor Dr. Schultz who had worked at the Theological College in Ranchi and returned to Germany last year. Mr. Kloss is predominantly to be employed as teacher for languages at the Theological College in Ranchi, especially as teacher for German, where he is to teach such men- and women-students as are invited by the Gossner-Mission to university-study in Germany. At present the Gossner-Mission is giving scholarships to two Indian men- and four women-students. Besides, for the first time in the history of the German Mission, the Gossner-Mission has appointed an Indian Pastor to serve German congregations for 5 years in the same way as the German Mission does in the Christian congregations of India.

Thus practically our application means an exchange of Church workers and on this basis we beg you to approve the application for an entry permit for Mr. Kloss and his wife.

/ The forms necessary for the application have been filled in and signed by the applicant, and are enclosed.

We beg the Indian Consulate to consider favourably the application which the Indian Church and the German Mission Society have jointly filed in and give us their support for a permit.

The autonomous Gossner Bvangelical Lutheren Church in India has invited Missionsry Heinz E c k a r t and his family to serve in this church. You will find the invitation of the Gossner Church enclosed.

Mr. Heinz Eckart was in the first place trained for the profession of electrician. He was then teacher and at last studied Theology and won the title of Master of Theology.

In 1953 the Gossner-Mission in Berlin applied to the Indian Embassy in Bonn to allow Mr. Heinz Eckart who was then still a student to study at the Theological College in Ranchi. This application was at that time turned down.

At the moment the situation is completely different. Mr. Heinz Eckert has been trained in several directions and has finally finished his university studies. The Gossner Church in India as well as the Gossner-Mission in Berlin consider him very well suited for being a social worker and manager of the hospital at Amgson within the Indian Church. This work had hitherto been carried out by missionary Borutta at Chaibasa who is the last missionary at work in the Gossner Church of Chotanagpur and Assam and who intends to return to Germany in 1958. Mr. Meinz Eckert is meant to replace him.

May we remark that the Gossner-Mission is the first foreign mission society in India that aimed at absolute autonomy for the Indian Church. Thus the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church of Chotanagpur and Assam was already autonomous in 1919 and established its own Indian administration. The whole property of the Gorman mission was at that time given over to the Indian Church and an agreement settled between the autonomous Indian Church and the Mission Society in Germany according to which a limited number of German missionaries was to work under the direction of the Indian Church without being allowed leading posts. You will find such an agreement enclosed which is signed by Mr. Eckart proving that he is willing to work under Indian direction in India.

The Gossner Church has its parishes mainly in the province Bihar and Orissa. These are originally pure rural parishes which are now undergoing the process of industrialization. Under these conditions a man like Mr. Eckart has his special duties towards Christian workmen who are going into factory work. He himself has worked in a factory for some time and is therefore especially qualified to serve the Indian Church as expert. For this reason we beg you to grant him an entry permit to India.

Dear Brother Lokies,

You will be interested to know that the Church officers have agreed with the dissenters in a meeting with Bishop Manikam here on 17th June to appoint a Commission of 10 persons- 5 from each side-which will work out a Constitution for the work of one undivided Gossner Church. This Commission will be headed a neutral man abd your name has been proposed as Chairman from both sides. In the event of your inability to accept the invitation Dr. Birkely or Dr.Oberdorfer will be requested. A former invitation will come to you in due course. This Commission will be requested to submit its report within three months from the date of the commencement of its work. For the interim period a workable agreement has been agreed to which you will find in the enclosed "Agreement".

This "Agreement" will be placed before the full Church

Council session next month from 16-18, July 1957 when it will be asked to ratify the "Agreement". We are anxious to have you here and we believe it will be possible for you to find time in the midst of your preoccupation to come out to India to serve your dear Gosner Church.

Rev. Santosh Surin Director -designate of evangelistic wax work will be joining his new duties here on 1st July, 1957. I believe, you have my letter of 10th June in this respect, in which, a request is made by the C.C. for financial aid for two years in order to enable us to launch the evangelistic work anew. I am thinking of presenting a report to the Council mext month when it will be in session.

On the advise of two sisters the two Tabitha School teachers are asked to postpone their voyage to Germany till January 1958. This was due to nonavailability of a suitable teachers to replace the two teachers. It is expected that by January 1958 we shall have no difficulty in securing a suitable teachers.

In the absence of money we are thinking of advising President Tiga and Rev. Hemrom to cancel their passage to America. We do not know yet what last moment situation will bring about.

Dear Brother Lokies.

I am enclosing a copy of the translation of the resolutions passed by the GELC Mahasabha1957. which will be some interest to you. The Mahasabha, inspite of all the storm around it, has comparatively transacted its business well. A good deal of deliberation took place in regard to property, economic administration, evangelistic work, amedndment of the constitution and of course .

about the present agitation in the church.

I will discuss a few things here: the Mahasabha has directed the church council to appoint a full time Managere for the Property Board so that church property is properly managed, supervised and maximum bene fit out of it available. We will have this Manager from next year. Till then, the organisational aspect of the work will be gradually introduced. A new step has been taken in the field of evangelism by appointing Rev. Santosh Surin as Director of Evangelistic work in the church. He will be under the employ of the church council and will be directly under the Evangelistic Board for his programme of work. Rev. Surin is at present President of the Govindpur Synod and is Secretary of the Tabitha school. He is one of our leading Pastors. He will take up his new office from July 1, 1957, with his headquarters at Renchi.

This action is according to the directive given to the Council by the Mahasabha. The Church Council while making this appointment was faced with the question of finance. While we were still thinking and discussing possibilities, news from Bro. Borutta came to us that he had been in correspondence with you regarding this matter, and that you have expressed your willingness to finance this new project. The Executive has , therefore , decided to go ahead with this work and desires to make a request to the Kuratorium Afor financial help, at least for two years, for it is expected, according to our calculation that by that time work will be organised in such a manner that the whole project can be supported by the congr-

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congregations themselves. This project will cost Rs. 3000. a year i.e., Rs. 150. salary p.m. plus Rs. 50. travelling allowance p.m. and Rs. 600. cost of establishment and equipments a year. That means that the affigure running expenditure per month will be Rs. 200. and another sum of Rs. 600. will be spent on equipments according to necessity. May I, therefore, request you to kindly consider this request of financial aid, so that in the event of this help coming from you, we can positively ask Bro. Surin to start his work without any delay. I must thank you, on behalf of the Church Council, for your kind willingness to help the Gossner church in this direction.

The agitation in the church is not yet over. Nothing could be done inspite of the fact that outstanding people like Dr. Arne Sovik and Rev. J.D. Asirvadam visited us and tried to solve the problems facing us. Only last mid-May Rev. Asirvadam presented a statement for restoring peace in the church. The Executive of the CC heratily accepted it. This required Rev. Lakra to agree to give in writing by the end of May '57 that he will not hereafter act in contravention of the policy of the Ministerium or the authority of the President of the Gossner Church in res pect of ordination within or outside the GEL Church. The CC expressed its desire to immediately restore him to his former position as Principal of the Seminary. The opposing groups were also called upon to call off their activities and restore unity in the church by accepting position in the church as before 15 th. August 1956. To this Rev. Lakra did not agree. It sometimes appears that these people are not serious about any kind of settlement, but are bent upon creating trouble in the church. Their actions amply prove this. There are several instances where they have obstructed the church workers fax and are obstructing the church council in day to day administration. However, inspite of all these provocations, we think that new efforts should be made. We shall be shortly reviewing the whole situation and take suitable steps necessary.

Bros. Bage and Surin have informed us of their arrival here by the middle of July. B th of them have been assigned work in the Theological College at Ranchi. Bro. Bage has been appointed Principal of the College.

We are taking steps to select two science graduates for technical training in Germany, as suggested by the Kuratorium some time past. Selection of theological students is also proposed to be taken up soon. We shall fur -

ther correspond with you on these matters.

I thank you for informing through Bro. Hemrom's letter that Director Brennecke will speak for us in the CWM meeting in Staten Island. Our Budgest has been forwarded to the Bishop R.B. Manickam, President of the India Federation. It will come to the DWM through the India Federation as directed by the Commission last time. We shall take steps immediately to acquaint Bishop Manicjam with our financial situation. We are proposing to ask the DWM to give us some financial aid over and above the subsidy for our special evangelistic task. I hope that Director Brennecke and others will be kind enough to support our requests.

Contrary to our expectations, we could not do much regarding Rourkella. Our compound is still untouched, but the company authorities say that that portion of lands will finally be acquired. We have, however, applied for allotment of suitable sites at a place called Joldaa. I am afraid that nothing substantial could be done before the meeting at Staten Island. However, the company authorities are again being contacted. Rev. Christ Bijay Aind, President of the Orissa has been put in charge of the congregations in

Rourkella area.

Begore I close permit me to go back to the subject of evangelistic work. Rev. Borutta was here this morning and we officers had a long discussion with him re: this matter too. We agreed that we shill constantly keep the Kuratorium posted with the progress \*\*REMIX\*\* made by the Rev. Surin when he begins his work. In the beginning he will have to dvote some time in organising the work.

We are all keeping well. Hope this will find you all in cheers. Kindly convey our greetings to the Gossner house people and to the congregations praying for us. With much christian greetings to your good self and your

RESOLUTIONS OF THE G.E.L.CHURCH MAHASABHA MARCH 25 -29, 1957.

#### CHURCH PROPERTIES:

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- 1. Thereas the Honorary workers of the Board of Management are unable to look after proper management and supervision of church properties, it is RESOLVED that a qualified full time manager be appointed inorder that proper management and supervision of widely spread church properties is carried out and maximum benefit out of it is derived. This manager so appointed will not be an ex-officio member of the Board of Management. It is further resolved to direct the Church Council to draw a salary scale, arrange for bonding and finally appointing the new manager with effect from March 1958.
- 2. RESOLVED that the Treasurer of the G.E.L. Church in Chota-Nagpur want and Assam should also be appointed Treasurer of the Board of Management G.E.L. Church Properties with effect from March 28, 1957.

In view of the fact that the G.E.L.Church has some landed properties situated in far off places where there are no congregations of the Gossner church, with the result that such properties are not properly managed, supervised or protected and in fact are accruing more loss that gain; it is, therefore,

RESOLVED that such lands, which cannot be in future properly managed, supervised or protected even though they are situated in places close to our congregations, be sold out and the sale proceeds thus obtained be invested in purchasing new immovable properties where ever necessary, from which the church can derive benefits; further

RESOLVED to direct the Board of Management to prepare a schedule of such properties mentioned above and ask the Church

Council to take steps in this direction.

- 4. RESOLVED to give this direction that the work of managing and protecting church properties lying within the juris diction of individual Synods be carried out with the active co-cperation between the Synods and the Board of Management, G. R.L. Church Properties, and for which purpose the Church Council be asked to frame suitable rules.
- PRESCRIPTION that the G.E.L. Church Mahasabha nominates two persons in lieu of two representatives of the National Christian Council and the Pedgration of Evangelical Lutheran Churches in India who will serve on the Board of Management, G.E.L. Church Properties provisionally tills such time when the N.C.C. and the F.E.L.C(I) do not elect and send their representatives to the Board of Management, The N.C.C. and the F.E.L.C(I) be requested to send their representatives to serve on the Board of Management, G.E.L. Church Properties.
- ound at Ranchi is continues to be occupied by the Army although Var emergency period has terminated several years ago. This continuous occupation of the compound has considerably affected the spiritual and material progress of the church at large, it is, therefor RESOLVED that a memorandum be sent to the Union Sovernment requesting them to withdraw the Army personnel from the C. M. L. Church Compound at Ranchi as early as possible.

Church Properties be 8. directed to prepare afresh an up-to-date schedule of church properties old and new and supply copies of the same to all stations of the church. All documents of immovable properties should also be sedured and preserved in the office of the Board of Management G. E. L. Church Properties.
- The Church Council and the Board of Management, G. E. L. 9. Church Properties be directed to see that Board accounts are audited annually and the submitted to the Church Council resularly. It is further resolved that budget of the Property Board should also be submitted to the Department of World Missions along with that of the Church Council.

Dear Bretheren,

in gratitude to God the Kuratorium of the Gossner-Mission is glad to inform you that our two young brothers Marsallan BAGE and Saban SURIN have reached the aim of their 5½-year-studies in Germany. Saban SURIN acquired the degree of "Master of Theology" and Marsallan BAGE that of "Doctor of Philosophy" at a German University. That is more than we had planned or hoped for.

Unfortunately the departure of both the brothers has to be postponed from the 7th to the 30th of June. That wasn't our fault. The Italian line where we had boked the two brother's passages, does, for the first time after the Suez-conflict, not travel round Africa any longer but again through the Suez-Canal. That was the reason why the departure of the ship, all of a sudden came to be 10 days before the propper time. This, however, was to carly for the two brothers, as the verbal examination of Brother Bage which had been to take place in the middle of May was postponed to the end of May respectively to early in June. We at once booked for the next boat which will leave Genua on June 30.

We are very sorry this has happened fearing it could disturb your plans. But there is nothing to be done.

Besides I am unhappy to have to tell you that, for reasons of health, this time I cannot take part neither in the conference of World Missions nor in the Assembly of the Lutheran World Federation in America. So unfortunately I cannot personally support the delegate of the Gossner Church nor the "Requests" of the Gossner Church. Therefore I exactly informed Kirchenrat Dr. BERG as a member of our Kuratorium and Missionsdirector BRENNECKE of the Berlin Mission about the suffering situation and the financial necessities of the Gossner Church. Missionsdirector Brennecke will willingly side with Pastor HEMROM in any way. Pastor BERG also promised me to see to come into contact with Pastor Hemrom.

Moreover it would be of greatest importance if at the Assembly as well as in the Commission of World Missions the requests of the Gossner Church could be supported by Bishop Dr. MANIKAM. I therefore think it badly necessary that the Church Comncil invites Bishop Dr. Manikam before he goes to America. His visit should have double a purpose:

- 11) a thorough consideration of the financial situation of the Gossner Church,
- 2.) a last attempt to regain peace and unity for the Gossner Church.

To reach this aim the Church Council and the opposition led by Pastor LAKRA should meet. It would be desirable that both the CC and Pastor Lakra and his friends should agree to inviting Bishop Dr.Manikam, speaking frankly to him and following his brotherly advice.

This way the Gossner Church would most clearly prove the Lutheran World Federation its loyalty and confidence thus getting the basis for a brotherly financial help too. The Kuratorium of the Gossner-Mission gives the Church Council the urgent advice to invite the Lutheran Federation of Churches in India and its Chairman to Ranchi.

As to the constitution of the Church, I think, we all are of the same opinion, i.e.: the old constitution is not sufficient but must be altered. This, however, must not cause a splitting of the Church. In all the churches of the world a new constitution, if necessary, will be worked out thoroughly in a team whose members hage most different conceptions, even opposite ones. Such a work takes years and must at least be presented to the Church Council and the Mahasabha for enactment. This is the normal way.

The Kuratorium of the Gossner-Mission would like joining in the work of a new constitution. Furthermore the Lutheran World Federation published general directions, just for young, independent churches, which may form the basis of a church constitution. We would advise to appoint a commission with members of both groups to do preparatoy work for a new constitution of the church and are willing to support such work financially too(costs for conferences and travels a.s.o.)

thank you very much for your letter of February 16th (No.291/57 C.C.78). - We are very much obliged to you for your willingness to undertake everything possible to obtain entry-permission for Brothers ECKART and KLOSS from the Indian authorities.

As to the journey of the Indian Sisters Seteng HAPADGARA and Bahalen BAGE President TIGA now has all the documents in hand. I hope that the 3000 Rs. from Geneva to the account of Brother BORUTTA have in the meantime arrived. The travelling costs and board-money that exceed this sum will be advanced by Brother Borutta and later arranged with him. I have informed him accordingly.

I am expecting your further information concerning the sending of a lady missionary for womens' work (Tabita-School). Concerning this matter I am also in correspondence with sisters Anni DILLER and Hedwig SCHMIDT but am undertaking nothing before I receive news from the Church Council.

Thank you for giving me the exact dates of the meetings of the Church Council and the Mahasabha. We are willing to send the Mahasabha a message of fellowship. I have heard that the congregations in Ostfriesland, Westphalia and Berlin are/sending greetings to the Mahasabha.

I am sorry that Brothers Marsalan BAGE and Saban SURIN will not be able to attend the Mahasabha. The reason is that Brother Bage needs some more time to finish his exam. We have booked passages for the two brothers for the beginning of June.

In your letter of February 16th you suggested that the two brothers should return to India together with Miss BODRA. But we have been told that Miss Bodra will not have finished her studies in England before the beginning of July, and then she intends to stay in Germany for a month, and our two brothers thought they could not wait so lang for personal and for objective reasons. Two We understand their reasons very well, and therefore booked their passages for June. In any case Miss Bodra will visit us in Germany, and we are looking forward to her visit. After all she is the head-mistress of the Bethesda-School and will ramain so as long as the Gossner Church has no qualified teacher. Thus we ourselves are eager that she should learn something about Church work in Germany. Incidently I want so say that we are very keen that the Gossner Church should one day produce her own head-mistress. Should you know of any qualified student or teacher who could be trained for this post we would willingly contribute to her studies.

I am sorry, as I say, that owing to the earlier departure of Bage and Surin Miss Bodra will have to return to India alone, but I am sure that she will be able to travel back to India just as independently as she travelled to England.

We shall take all possible steps here for the entry

In connection with the return of Sister Anne earlier

and our invitation for a lady missionary for women's work, I think I should get a clear statement from the Church Council; which will be communicated to you in time.

Now, the final dates of our Church Council and Mahasabha are 21st-23rd March and 25th -28th March 1957 respectively. We shall be expecting a message of fellowship from the Kuratorium as usual. Thanks fax you for informing me of Bro Saban's succeess in his second examination, we are expecting similar results from Bro Bage. Now we already know that they will come possibly before the next academic session.

A word or two about Miss S.M. Bodra. She will complete her studies this summer and will return back to India. The Church Council thought that if the Kuratorium could extend her ever helping hands Miss Bodra could visit Germany for a month or so. The LWF is paying her return fare from England to India. expenses of her visit to Germany not included. I have asked her to contact you in this respect. If you can invite her to Germany she can book her passage to Mainz-Kastel by train. Next she can board ber boat to India in Genoa - if it can be arranged from Berlin or Mainz-Kastel, She can accompany Bros Bage and Surin. I shall talk over this matter with Dr. Sovik next week when he is visiting us and shall katax let you know.

Dear Brother Horo.

As I was on a mission-tour in Bavaria through the whole of January I am afraid my correspondence has suffered delay. For the same reason there was also no meeting of the Kuratorium during this period in which I could have submitted your letters. So I must ask you to forgive me that I have not yet answered your various questions. I am now at home and will deal with the items of your letter one after the other.

- / First of all the most important thing: here is a statement for the two teachers of the Tabita-School Hapadgara SETENG and Bahalen BAGE that we are prepared to bear the costs of their journey to Germany and back and also the expenses of their stay in Germany.
- / As to brothers KLOSS and ECKART here are the requested personal details. I believe we should attack the matter of their entry in India from both ends. I shall consequently very soon file in an application with the Indian Embassy in Bonn.

It is a different affair with Ursula v. LINGEN whom we have sent to England first for a year's training. It will take a year before we can send her to India.

I am glad to hear from you that Sisters Anni Diller and Hedwig Schmidt have decided to stay till Sisters Hapadgara Seteng and Bahalen Bage have returned from Germany. Does that mean that we are not to look for any other German teacher for the Tabita-School? You wrote in your letter of December 1956 that "another lady for the Tabita-School" was to come. Sisters Anni Diller and Hedwig Schmidt had also written that Anni Diller intended to return to Germany earlier than Hedwig Schmidt, and that for that reason we should send another Sister in the place of Anni Diller, so that Hedwig Schmidt could introduce her into the work. It seems that there is some change in this point, and I would be very grateful to you for giving me further information about it.

To sum up: The question of the sending out of Brothers Kloß and Eckart and the coming here of Sisters Hapadgara Seteng and Bahalen Bage has priority; all other matters can be dealt with later.

Thank you for telling me the date of the next plenary session of the Church Council. As soon as possible I will assemble the Kuratorium so that we can draft a message of fellowship but also including a word concerning our mutual responsibility before God for the Church of Chota Nagpur.

And now, above all, many thanks for your last letter in which you tell us about your cousin Notrott KERKETTA. Both Brother Symanowski and I are willing to help him wherever we can. It would, however, be important for us to learn from him whether he has already made a plan for his studies in Germany. We shall then assist him by advice and deed with great pleasure.

I have again to excuse my long silence. All questions between us which have not yet been dealt with, I shall answer very soon. There is only one thing I want to let you know officially: Brother Saban Surin has passed the second part of his exam too on 21st January. He qualified in Philosophy and Ethics. The summary mark for the whole exam was "good". Besides he received the certificate that by this exam he was exhibited the same knowledge required for the degree "Master of Theology". Brother Bage is now also going in for his exam and working hard at his paper and his oral exam. It is much harder for him than for Saban Surin and we therefore beg you to understand, that they both cannot come to the Mahasabha. But we have booked passages for them for June from Genoa. I have also written to Mrs. Bage and begged her to understand this last delay. I beg you and the Church Council to consent to this delay and to understand it.

It was further pointed out that it should be ascertained from the two girls whether they offer themselves for life for service in the Church. It was also expressed that avenues for such training be found out, if possible, in India.

RESOLVED: that Church Council officers be authorised to find out avenues in or outside India for training Miss Seteng Hapadgara and Miss Bahalen Bage, at present teachers in the Tabitha School, in subjects determined by the Church Council pertaining to Women's Work.

Dear Brother Lokies,

Many thanks for your kind letter of December 14,1956 and the good wishes you sent to me and to my family. It is God's providence that Dr. Bischoff & family could sail out from Germany well in time. The freighter "Lindfels", I gather from papers, is arriving at Calcutta on 25 th. January. We shall be happy to have him here. I believe that they were and are safe throughout the

long tedious journey.

The trouble in our church has not eased. You must have received some informations from Bro. Borutta about the recent situation. On 9 th. December, on the day of harvest festival here, there was an apprehension of the breach of peace and we had but to take help of the police. Now the matter is pending before the local magistrate. The next date is 12 th. inst. It is not a case as is usually supposed From our side we never wanted to go to the court but situation was made such that we were forced to seek help of the government officers.

You probably know that we made a last attempt to settle up by inviting them for discussions on 7 th. Dec '56. I am again suggesting and we officers have agreed to invite them again for a discussion on one of these days. In the meantime they are creating much trouble in the congregations outside. We have to devote much time on this matter and most of our office works are suffering. However, we are confident that a solution will be found out now or to-morrow. The dissenters pretty well know that they are mistaken and they cannot go the second mile but, it has become very hard and humiliating for them to return back. They are at the crossroad. They are taking time to see their game over.

We are convening the next Mahasabha to meet from March 25 th. to 28 th., 1957. The full Church Council session will be from March 21 st. to 23 rd. 1957. These will be after the General Elections in India are over. We are expecting Dr. Sovik and Prof Freytag to visit us in February or March April. We want them to attend the Mahasabha, if they can.

We shall try to show them our work in the congregations.

We are very pleased to know that Bro. Surin has done excellently well in his exams. Our heartfelt thanks goes to him and to the Gossner Mission Society and all those who in various ways have contributed towards his success. We hope similar things for Bro. Bage too.

Kindly send a letter saying that the cost of their education and stay in Germany will be borne by the Gossner Missio Thanks. Sisters Diller and Schmidt informed us that they are willing to stay here until these two ladies return from Germany. We shall be writing you shortly regarding other matters.

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE.

1. The relationship between the G.E.L.C and the Euratorium of the Gossner Mission Society shall be that of Daughter and Mother.

- 2. The Euratorium of the Cossner Mission Society will send missionarie to work in the G.E.L.C.on the request of the G.E.L.C.
- 3. The Missionaries on the field will work as friends and helpers in the development of the G.E.L.C. for specific periodsby personally accepting the terms of reference offered by the G.E.L.C. to the individual missioneries through the Kuratorium.
- 4. The Euratorium of the Gossner Mission Society in Christian love and charity shall undertake to support their missionaries on the Gossner field. The policy is to receive such help through the G. E.

L.C. Tressury.

5. All missionsries shall be invited to attend the meeting of the Mahasabhe. The men missionaries will be invited to attend the meetings of the Church Council, one by one, in rotation according to their alphabetical order. The missioneries will also be invited to attend the meetings of their respective synods. They shall be free to visit the congregations in any part of the Church and to attend the church meetings as they find it possible with information of the synod President.

6. All missionaries working in the G.E.L.C. shall be regular members

of the Gossner@hurch.

7. All ordained missionaries shall be members of the Gosener Church Ministerium.

8. Mach missionarys will be given a specific work in the Church such as Evangelistic work among non-Christians, Teaching in the Theological Seminary, Production of Christian Lietrature, Helprunning of charitable institutions etc.

9. The G. E. L. C. provide suitable accommodation for the missionaries

working in the field.

10. These terms of Reference can be amended by the mutual consent of thebodies concerned.

11. All former proposals or drafts of "Terms of Reference" are super-

seded by these Terms of Reference.
12. The Joint Mission Field' will be administered by a 'Joint Mission Board' incorporated in the G. E. L. Church, in accordance with the regulations adopted jointly by the Mahasabha and the Kuratorium (vide Mahasabha minutes 1953 p.p.49-52).

An extract from the minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee of the G.E.L.Church, Ranchi, dated the 5th December, 1956.

Matters from the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society :-

Secretary Mr. Horo placed his written report before the house which he had read before the Kuratorium in October 19, 1956 (see appendix). He also gave a verbal explanation of the talks he had with Dr. Kekies, Dr. Lokies' letter dt. was also placed for consideration.
(a) A Missionary to replace Rev.H.F.Borutta.

Noted that missionary Rev. H.F. Borutta is returning back to Germany early in 1958. A missionary in his place is requested to

take up the work in the joint mission Board.
Resolved that Rev. Eckert of the Gossner mission Society, Berlin be invited to replace missionary Rev.H.F.Borutta in the joint Mission Board's work of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam (India) who returns back to Germany in 1958 for good, and that Missionary Eckert should make it a point to arrive in India early in 1957. It is further resolved to request the Gossner Mission Society, Berlin to make all necessary arrangements for the sending out of missionary Eckert into India.

(b) Theological Professor for the Lutheran Theological College,

Ranchi in place of Dr.G.Schultz:
Noted that Dr.G.Schultz a missionary Professor of the Lutheran Theological College Ranchi has returned back to Germany in April 1956 for good. A German Lutheran Theological is needed in his place who will also teach language like greek, Hebrew, Latin and German which is essential for the teaching of general Lutheran Theology and research work.

Resolved that we invite Rev.P.Kloss through the Gossmer Mission Society, Berlin to replace Dr. Schultz in the Lutheran Theological College Ranchi in order to teach among other things foreign languages like Greek, Hebrew, Latin and German.

(c) Need of a German Schevester in the mission Hospital Amgaon.

It was pointed out that a German Schevester is needed to help the present staff in the Mission Hospital at Amgaon(Orissa)

Resolved to invite Schevester Ursula vonlingen of the Gossner Mission Society, Berlin, to join the staff of the mission Hospital at Amgaon in Orissa. The Gossner Mission Society be requested to arrange for her sending out to India.

(d) Industrial expert for the Gossner church:
Noted that Mr.N.E. Horo proposed to the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society for the sending out to India in the Gossner Church of an Industrial expert.

The Kuratorium suggested submission of a detailed plan in respect of the Economic Development plan of the Church and assured to find out a suitable man in this connexion.

(e) Noted that the Kuratorium /Gossner Mission Society, would like to invite an Indian Pastor in place of Rev. Hanuk Minz, and two Theological Students after Messrs Bage and Surin return

from Germany.

(f) President Tiga informed the House that Director Dr.M.Porkson of the Schleswig-Holstein Mission Society, introduced Pastor John Gaus, an American who wants to come out to India as a missionary. Resolved that correspondence be made with Director Dr. M. Porkson suggesting to him that if Pastor John Gaus wants to come out to India he should do so through the Gossner Mission Society.

Dear Bro Sovik,

I have received your letter of Nov: 6, 1956 but could not send you a reply earlier firstly because of several engagements and secondly because things here in our church was moving so rapidly that I thought it im was improper for me to comment on the situation at that stage.

By the time this letter reaches, you will have received an official communication from the G.E.L.C. Executive officers on the present situation. You will find some strong words in our resolution but that is not a view to condemning any outside body - but a frank expression of the mind of the Executive.

Personally I had had a long discussion with Rev. J. Lakra

for two days for hours together and offered him alternatives for solving the present trouble but he never came back with his reply though he repeatedly promised me to do so. Even after that we called him and his groups 18 of them on 7th December 1956 to the Executive. They came and the Executive pleaded with them to put forth their grievances or anything they wanted to say towards solution. Indeed of doing so they wanted recognition outright and they said that there is a prack parallel organisation in the Church and that their's is a mass movement and they have every right to declare themselves into a Zone. They refused to give their grievances and then unceremoniously walked They refused to give their grievances and then unceremoniously walked out including Lakra. We have tried to hear them several times and that is what the FELC(I) wanted. We took the initiative and invited them, they came but refused to avail themselves of the opportunity.

They have now adopted a method of violence. On 5th December they prevented the Professors from taking classes in the Theological Seminary. Lakra's men stood on the doors of the classes with sticks in their hands. On 9th instant there was an apprehension of the breach of peace just after the service. The police had to intervene and now the matter has gone to the Court. They are threatening our workers in the rural congregations with dire consequences. The trouble started with J. Lakra on his personal grievance and it has now taken a

turn on communal lines. That is how the matter stands.
We have tentatively fixed 25th-28th March 1957 for our next Mahasabha. The Church Council will meet from 21st-23rd March'57. I think that you will be able to be here with us during those days. I extend you an invitation on behalf of the Gossner Church to visit our church field and the Mahasabha.

years situation in India in general has undergone a great change and is still changing. The Gosaner Church has found herself surrounded by various problems and responsibilities. It necessitates, therefore, that we recognize this fact in our relationships with each other and seek one, that which is in conformity with God's will. Under the present circumstances it should be our look out that we understand each other properly, with sympathy and patience. We are pretty, well aware of the confusions reports from India but that should not disturb us. Let us face problems with confidence and with christian patience.

I would like to discuss certain important matters of mutual concern and would try to give my opinion and plans about them keepings in view the situation in the Gossner Church and in due respect to the mind of the Church Council. My remarks in this session of the Kuratorium, and may be, som points of agreements and understanding reached upon between us here in this house will be subject to the ratification and approval of the Gossner Caurch Council.

## Missionaries

I thank the Kuratorium, on behalf of the Gossner Church, for securing the good services of Brother Bischoff and his family, who are sailing to India, next month. We welcome them to India and to our Church and assure Bro. Bischoff all cooperation and wish him all success in his missionary task. I wish him and his family a bon-voyage to India. Bro. Borutta is doing a fine job in the Joint Mission Field and in the Church, so also the three sisters Diller, Schmidt and Ilse Martin are doing good works in their respective fields. I also thank the Kuratorium for the good services of Bro. Schultz in the Theological College. We had mi wished that he stayed there for some time more. It was very unfortunate that he found himself uncomfortable for some time due to unwelcome incidents in the Church. I wish that personal disappointments do not mar the relationship between us.

It is a bit surprising to me that the older missionaries like Bro. Borutta and sisters willer and schmidt are all planning to return back home in 1958. We wish that they could stay until such time when proper arrangements could be made in respect of their works. If, however, they cannot stay any longer, then I would suggest to the Church Council to invite a male missionary to take up Bro. Borutta's work and one lady missionary to help us in the Tabita School. It seems to me that the two Indian ladies now receiving training in this country would not be able to return back to India earlier and take up Tabita school work before sisters Diller and Schmidt leave India. The Church Council would make suitable arranagements for the Tabita school even when the two ladies leave India. It was the intention that trained indian ladies take up the responsibility of this school, and it would be advisable that the lady missionary who comes to india assists and cooper ates in the efficient running of this young institution. As far as I remember, the Church Council has invited a theologian to assist us in the Theological College. If one can get the permit and come to join this college, we would be much thankful. Considering the difficulties in securing entry-permit for a foreign missionary I would suggest to the Kuratorium and to the Church Council that the missionary for the college be invited as a language teacher i.e. who could teach Hebrew,

Greek, Latin and German. Perhaps we could convince the Indian Government that the college needs a language expert, which is a necessity too for general theological study and researchwork.

#### Joint Mission Board.

Much work has to bee done in the Joint Mission Field. The hospital at Amgaon is an important item of work. Considering the important role this institute will have to play in future in the boarder districts of Orissa and Bihar, and taking in to consideration the necessity of the social and medical work in the areas covered by the church, I would suggest the following: that this hospital be developed gradually into a training centre for future social and medical workers. There is already an opinion in the Church to open health centres and maternity homes in different parishes of the Church. This will be in keeping with the national extension service of the Indian Government now being done during the 2nd Five Year Plan. It would be advisable that, as far as practicable, Indian medical men and women be encouraged to cooperate in this social and medical task of the Church. The church would, therefore, very much like to send medical men and women for further training in foreign countries. Economic development plan.

Finance is one of the main problems of the church. The church is thinking as how best to improve the economic condition of the church and the people by utilising the landed properties of the church and by training the people in agricultural and small scale industrial methods. A committee already appointed by the Church Council is making efforts to this direction with the help of the National Christian Council of India. I would suggest to the Church that she invites, if possible, an expert from the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society, who could help and advise us in this direction.

#### Foreign Education.

I would thank the Kuratorium on behalf of the Gossner Church for arranging for the training of Bros. Bage and Surin and sisters P.Khess and D.Hemrom.

I have appreciated the manner in which all these persons are being trained here in this country. I would ask the Church Council.if the Kuratorium agrees, to

to consider whether more students in future could be sent to this country to study theology, engineering, medicine and other subjects according to the need of the Church in India.

## Deputation work of Pastor Minz

The Gosaner Church is grateful to the Euratorium for inviting Pastor Minz and his wife for deputation work in Germany. If the Euratorium feels that such deputation work by Indians in this country would be of much benefit to the Gosaner Mission Society, then I would be able to place this subject for the consideration of the Church Council so that proper men could be found out and prepared for this task before they come there.

## Recent disturbances in the Gossner Church.

The recent disturbances within the Church at Ranchi are foremost in our minds. Many letters to our friends in this country have come from several individuals in India a nd they sometimes give confusing picture of the situation. I would try to give yo the correct assessment of this situation. A certain aggrieved persons have proposed to rearrange the edministrative set-up of the Church by dividing it into two zones, each with a Church Council. i.e. North Zone and South Zone. They went wax so far as to ansounce the North Hone with a church coulcil on 15th August 1956. The step taken by these people is not in conformity with the constitution of the constitutional matters affecting the whole church are to be decided by the Mahasabha. The Church Council as the executive committee of the Mahasabha is the proper body to which such matters are to be referred first. All these procedures have not been undergone in this case. These people have tried to take the law into their cwn hands and are trying to force their point of view by argumentum ad bacculum. A couple of people cannot decide a matter affecting the whole church. The Church Council has taken up steps to bring peace and accord within the church. It has appointed a commission to hear the xxx grievances of the aggrieved people.

A question may be asked : What is the reason behind this disturbances ?

I would say that petty personal matters are behind this. It is very easy for an aggrieved man to collect a few equally aggrieved people and create disturbances within/ the Church by giving it a communal colour. It is equally easy to believe a trouble-creater who speaks in a communal language. In this case, personal prejudices and quarrels are at the bottom and the action taken by the promoters of Morth Tone is not an honest one. The basis of regional arrangement in this case is communal. It would be disastrous and unchristian like if we devide ourselves into communal compartments.

The dissenters in this case have been trying to obtain recognition by the Federation of Lutheran Churches in India, the Lutheran world Federation and other bodies, they are sending out letters and momoranda. A good many leaders outside the Cossner Church are already thinking whether to intervene or advise in this situation. A similar situation was created last year when the Church council had to say that the trouble ought to be decided within the church by the people themselves. The Church Council then abided by it and it had settled the dispute within the Church though it was widely said that the INLC (India) hat sent a commission which settle.d the dispute. I would, therefore, advise that no society should enter into any discussion with the Church Council or the dissenters in this case too, unless the Church Council asks for it. The legal authority of the Church Council should be respected and that would help the Church in settling this disturbance. Prayer is the best arbitrator of all differences, the best promoter of true friendships, the best cure for envy and jealousy and I would plead with any body for it.

This much I have to say, Mr. Chairman, by way of my report.

It would not be only place to mention here that since past several years situation in India in general has undergone a great change and is still changing. The Gossner Church has found herself surrounded by various probelems and responsibilities. It necessitates, therefore, that we recognize this fact in our relationships with each other and seek only that which is in conformity with God's will. Under the present circumstances it should be our look out that we understand each other properly, with sympathy and patience. We are pretty, well aware of the confusing reports from India but that should not disturb us. Let us face problems with confidence and with christian patience.

I would like to discuss certain important matters of mutual concern and would try to give my opinion and plans about them keeping in view the situation of the Gossner Church and in due respect to the mind of the Church Council. My remarks in this session of the Kuratorium, and may be, some points of agreements and understanding reached upon between us here in this house will be subject to the ratification and approval of the Gossner Church Council.

#### Missionaries

I thank the Kuratorium, on behalf of the Gossner Church, for securing the good services of Brother Bischoff and his family, who are sailing to India next month. We welcome them to India and to our Church and assure Bro. Bischoff all cooperation and wish him all success in his missionary task. I wish him and his family a bon-voyage to India. Bro. Borutta is doing a fine job in the Joint Mission Field and in the church, so also the three sisters Diller, Schmidt and Ilse Martin are doing good works in their respective fields. I also thank the Kuratorium for the good services of Bro. Schultz in the Theological College. We had wished that he stayed there for some time more. It was very unfortunate that he found himself uncomfortable for some time due to unwelcome incidents in the church. I wish that personal disappointments do not mar the relationship between us.

It is a bit surprising to me that the older missionaries like Bro. Borutta and sisters Diller and Schmidt are all planning to return back home in 1958. We wish that they could stay until such time when proper arrangements could be made in respect of their works. If, however, they cannot stay any longer, then I would suggest to the Church Council to invite a male missionary to take up Bro. Borutta's work and one lady missionary to help us in the Tabita school. It seems to me that the two Indian ladies now receiving training in this country would not be able to return back to India earlier and take up Tabita school work before sisters Diller and Schmidt leave India. The Church Council would make suitable arragements for the Tabita school even when the two ladies leave India. It was the intention that trained Indian ladies take up the responsibility of this school, and it would be advisable that the lady missionary who comes to India assists and cooperates in the efficient running of this young institution. As far as I remember, the Church Council has invited a theologian to assist us in the Theological College. If one can get the permit and come to join this college, we would be much thankful. Considering the difficulties in securing entry-permit for a foreign missionary I would suggest to the Kuratorium and to the Church Council that the missionary for the college be invited as a language teacher i.e. who could teach Hebrew, Greek, Latin and German. Perhaps we could convince the Indian government that the college needs a language expert, which is a necessity too for general theological study and researchwork.

### Joint Mission Board

Much work has to be done in the Joint Mission Field. The hospital at Amgaon is an important item of work. Considering the important role this institute will have to play in future in the boarder districts of Orissa and Bihar, and taking in to consideration the necessity of the social and medical work in the areas covered by the church, I would suggest the following: that this hospital be developed gradually into a training centre for future social and medical workers. There is already an opinion in the church to open health centres and maternity homes in different parishes of the church. This will be in keeping with the national extension service of the Indian Government now heing done during the 2nd Five Years Plan. It would be advisable that, as far as practicable, Indian medical men and women be encouraged to cooperate in this social and medical task of the church. The church would, therefore, very much Alike to send medical men and women for further training in foreign countries.

## Economic development plan

Finance is one of the main problems of the church. The church is thinking as how best to improve the economic condition of the church and the people by utilising the landed properties of the church and by training the people in agricultural and small scale industrial methods. A committee already appointed by the Church Council is making efforts to this direction with the help of the National Christian Council of India. I would suggest to the Church that she invites, if possible, an expert from the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society, who could help and advise us in this direction.

#### Foreign Education

I would thank the Kuratorium on behalf of the Gossner Church for arranging for the training of Bros. Bage and Surin and sisters P. Khess and D. Hemrom. I have appreciated the manner in which all these persons are being trained here in this country. I would ask the Church Council, if the Kuratorium agrees, to consider whether more students in future could be sent to this country to study theology, engineering, medicine and other subjects according to the need of the Church in India.

## Deputation work of Pastor Minz

The Gossner Church is grateful to the Kuratorium for inviting Pastor Minz and his wife for deputation work in Germany. If the Kuratorium feels that such deputation work by Indians in this country would be of much benefit to the Gossner MissionSociety, then I would be able to place this subject for the consideration of the Church Council so that proper men could be found out and prepared for \*\*x\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* this task before they come here.

#### Recent disturbances in the Gossner Church

The recent disturbances within the Church at Ranchi are foremost in our minds. Many letters to our friends in this country have come from several individuals in India and they sometimes give confusing ficture of the situation. I would try to give you the correct assessment of this situation. A certain aggrieved persons have proposed to rearrange the administrative set-up of the church by dividing it into two zones, each with a Church Council, i.e. NorthernZone and South Zone. They went so far as to announce the North Zone with a church council on 15th August 1956. The step taken by these people is not in conformity with the constitution of the church and is in direct opposition to the Church Council. All constitutional matters affecting the whole church are to be decided by the Mahasabha. The Church Council as the executive committee of the Mahasabha is the prper body to which such matters are to be referred first. All these procedures have not been undergone in this case. These people have tried to take the law into their own hands and are trying to force their point of view by argumentum ad bacculum. A couple of people cannot decide a matter affecting the whole church. The Church Council has taken up steps to bring peace and accord within the church. It has appointed a commission to hear the grievances of the aggrieved people.

A question may be asked: What is the reason behind this disturbance? I would say that petty personal matters are behind this. It is very easy for an aggrieved man to collect a few equally aggrieved people and create disturbances within the Church by giving it a communal colour. It is equally easy to believe a trouble-creater who speaks in a communal language. In this case, presonal prejudices and quarrels are at the bottom and the action taken by the promoters

of North Zone is not an honest one. The basis of regional arragement in this case is communal. It would be disastrous and unchristian like if we devide ourselves into comunal compartments.

The dissenters in this case have been trying to obtain recognition by the Federation of Lutheran Churches in India, the Lutheran World Federation and other bodies, they are sending out letters and memoranda. A good many leaders outside the Gossner Church are already thinking whether to intervene or advise in this situation. A similar situation was created last year when the Church Council had to say that the trouble ought to be decided within the church by the people themselves. The Church Council then abided by it and it had settled the dispute within the church though it was widely said that the IELC (India) hat sent a commission which settled the dispute. I would, therefore, advise that no society should enter into any discussion with the Church Council or the dissenters in this case too, unless the Church Council asks for it. The legal authority fof the Church Council should be respected and that would help the Church in settling this disturbance. Prayer is the best arbitrator of all differences, the best promoter of true friendships, the best cure for EXE envy and jealousy and I would plead with anybody for it.

This much I have to say, Mr. Chairman, by way of my report. Thank you very much.

#### JOINT MISSION FIELD.

- 1. The areas for Joint Mission Field shall, for the present consist of Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar and the adjoining territories with Chaibassa as their outpost, though Singbhum lies within the jurisdiction of the G.E.L.C.
- 2. There shall be a joint board of control consisting of four members two elected by the G.E.L.C. and two by the Gossner Home Board, and the Joint Board shall have the right to elect its own President, Secretary and Treasurer for two years, alternating the first two positions between the G.E.L.C. members and the Gossner Home Board members. The Treasurer is responsible for the intake and expenditure of all subscription to this work.
- 3. The Joint Board shall be the final body for all matters concerning the field and its work.
- 4. The Board shall not be a registered body, but shall be incorporated in the G.E.L.Church.
- 5. The G.E.L. Church and the Gossner Home Board shall have the right to replace either of their members any time they like.
- 6. All workers, foreign and Indian in the Joint Mission Field shall be appointed, discharged, dismissed and transferred by the Joint Board.
- 7. Workers, for the Joint Mission field shall be called by the Joint Board both from Germany and the G.E.L.Church. They shall be responsible to supply workers to the Joint Board.
- 8. The Joint Board shall submit an annual budget estimate to the Church as well as to the Home Board. After this estimate has been approved from both sides the Church Council and the Home Board must agree as to the repartition of the costs.
- 9. The scale of the G.E.L.Church shall apply to all workers supplied by the G.E.L.Church.
- 10. The scale and furlough rules of the Gossner Home Board shall apply to the workers supplied by the Home Board.
- 11. All the new converts shall form congregation affiliated with the G.E.L.Church Pracharakpans, Parishes, Illakas and Synods and care shall be taken that they become self-supporting from the very beginning. Any help to such congregations shall be given by the joint Board through the G.E.L.C..
- 12. Any new assets that may be acquired shall be vested in the name of the G.E.L.C. If a piece of property acquired by the Joint Board is to be sold the proceeds shall be made over to the Joint Board by the G.E.L.C. Treasury to enable the Joint Board to acquire other property for the Mission work.
- 13. For inter-relationship between the Board and the G.E.L.Church the existing rules of membership in the G.E.L.Church shall be applied also to the foreign wprkers of the Joint Mission Field (Tentatively adopted subject, clarification in course of time.)
- 14. This agreement has been reached between the Gossner Home Board and the Church Council in Ranchi. If a third party is to enter this can only be done with the consent of the two parties of the contract.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL MISSIONARIES ( Passed by the G.E. L.C. mahasabha 25-26 th march 1954 and signed by representatives I the Gonner church and

the Gosse mission society, Berlin)

The Mahasabha of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran church in Chotangapur and Assam received with gratitude the declaration of the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society, dated 3.11.50 and the statement kkek dated 3.11.50 which read as follows:-

"The Gossner Kuratorium is happy that the G.E.L.C. has become autonomous, that there is therefore, no need for the missionaries to assume administrative responsibility, and that they will instruct their missionaries accordingly the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society is convinced that in the present situation of the Autonomous Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church, it is no longer necessary or desimable to take charge missionaries with responsible administrative posts, and to give them a vote."

The Mahasabha of the G.E.L.Church offers the following terms of reference to the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society:-

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE.

- (1) The relationship between the G.E.L.C. and the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society shall be that of Mother and Paughte daughter and
- The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society will send Missionaries to work in the G.E.L.C. on the request of the G.E.IC
- (3) The Missionaries on the field will work as friends and helpers in the development of the G.E.L.C. for specific periods by personally accepting the terms of reference offered by the G.E.L.C. to the individual missionaries through the Kuratorium.
- (4) The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society in Maria Christian love and charity shall undertake to support the missionaries on the Gossner field. The policy is to receive such help through the G.E.L.C. Treasury.
- All Missionaries shall be invited to attend the meetings of the Mahasabha. The men missionaries will be invited to attend the meetings of the Church Council, one by one, in rotation according to their alphabetical order. The missionaries will also be invited to attend the meetings of their respective synods. They shall be free to visit the congregations in any part of the Church and to attend the church meetings as they find it possible with information of the synod President with information of the synod President.
- (6) All missionaries working in the G.E.L.C. shall be regular members of the Gossner Church.
- (7) All ordained missionaries shall be members of the Gossner Church Ministerium,
- (8) Each missionary will be given a specific work in the Church such as evangelistic work among non-Christians, teaching in the Theological Seminary, production of Christian literature, help running of charitable institutions etc:
- The G.E.L.C. provides suitable accommodation for the missionaries working in the field.
- (10) These Terms of Reference can be amended by the mutual consent of the bodies concerned.

Resolved that in view of the above mentioned offer of these Terms of Reference, any other Terms of Reference which may have been given to the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society are thus superseded by these terms.

Dear Brethren,

at our meeting held in Berlin-Friedenau on October 18th, 1956, the Secretary of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church Council, Mr. N.E.HORO was present. We thank the Church Council for sending him, he represented Gossner's Church very well whereever he went. The Rev. Hanukh MINZ was also invited to Berlin for this meeting. He is successful in his Deputation Work, we highly appreciate his service. Mr. Horo suggested that the Rev. Hanukh Minz should be replaced by another Indian Pastor before his service in Germany comes to its end. Mr. Horo urged that he gave his private opinion in this matter as well as in his following suggestions, but he hoped the C.C. would endorse them.

As to the Successor of the Rev.G.SCHULTZ Mr.Horo moved that we should send a Language Expert, in other words a Theologian well trained in the ancient languages, in Latin, Greek, Hebrew as well as in German. We shall endeavour to find such a man, if officially asked bythe Church Council.

Further Mr. Horo inquired, if the Kuratorium would send a Missionary to replace the Rev. H. BORUTTA in the Joint Mission Board and a sister for TABITA-School, when the Rev. Borutta and Sisters A. DILLER and H. SCHMIDT return to Germany for good. Mr. Horo also raised the question whether it would be possible to send a trained economist from Germany to advise the Church. We are awaiting the opinion of the Church Council on these questions.

You have probably learnt that the Rev, Dr. Arnd BISCHOFF with Mrs. Bischoff and their youngest child are on their way to India. Dr. Bischoff urged that for the development of medical work in the Amgaon aerea, a nurse trained in midwifery would be needed. The Kuratorium resolved to send a sister to England for this purpose. We trust the Church Council will consent.

As to report on the present situation in Chota Nagpur Mr. Horo gave us, we cannot help expressing our deep concern with the split menacing our Gossner Church. It is hard to understand that in the occumenical era when the Churches tend towards Union, just our Gossner Church shuld be divided. We trust the Church Council will remain firm in disallowing any disintegration of our Lutheran Gossner Church.

Saying this we do not give our personal opinion but refer you to the Holy Scriptures as to the Judge in all matters of Christian doctrine and life. S.PAUL writes to the Corinthians in his first Epistle Chapter 1 vers 10: "I appeal to you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree that there be no dissensions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. Each one of you say's: 'I belong to Paul' or 'I belong to Apellos' or 'I belong to Cephas' or 'I belong to Christ'. Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? And to the Ephesians Ch.4, v.3: "Be eager to maintain the unity of the

spirit in the bond of peace (Compare the version of our Hindi Bible, please.)

May God's Spirit guide you ! Let us pray for the Peace of the Church. -

#### Life Story

I, Johanna Elisabeth Walther, was born on the 12th April, 1929, the daughter of Landsurveyor Ottomar Walther, a civil servant, who at that time was a Secretary for Land Surveys, and his wife Erika Walther, née Jaensch, at Halle / Saale. In the year 1935 I entered a state elementary school in Halle. After having finished the normal four years at the elementary school I entered the Helene Lange Girls' High School in Halle, which in the senior classes specialised in domestic science. Therefore after four years I changed and in 1943 went to the August Hermann Franke Girls' High School, a school specialising in modern languages, as I wished to make these my subjects at the University. I remained at this school until I passed my 'Abitur' in the beginning of 1947. I missed one year at this school because I was forced to work in the 'Kriegshilfsdienst' and - after the end of the war - in a 'Landarbeits-lager' (Army maintenance and landwork).

My applications to Universities in the Russian Zone of Germany were unsuccessful. Therefore I attended a 'Katechetischen Vierteljahreskursus' (Quarter Year Course for Religious Teaching) in Halle and then I taught at elementary schools in my native town. But I had only the opportunity of teaching for a few hours each day due to lack of accommodation and this was not sufficient to keep me occupied. So I worked for the rest of my time in an organisation which assisted soldiers and refugees (Bahnhofsmission Halle).

In the beginning of 1948 I immatriculated at the 'Kirchlichen Hochschule' in the Western Sector of Berlin. At that time it was not difficult to move from East Germany to West Berlin, although now it is not possible for me to return to the East. While in this school I did less Theology than Philosophy and Literature, therefore it was no decisive change, when in autumn 1948 I continued my studies in Philology with German as a main subject and English and Philosophy as minor subjects at the newly-established Freie Universität Berlin'. I remained there until I passed my 'Promotion' and 'Staatsexamen' (State Teachers' Examination) at the end of 1954.

Since January 1955 I have been teaching at the 'Evangelischen Gymnasium' in Berlin-Grunewald. While here I have been admitted to the 'Referendar-ausbildung', a Teachers' Training College, and attend it for two days every week, as is customary in our country.

( Naming my University subjects does not tell you enough about the true significance of my studies. I shall try to explain this: I was always struck by the wonders of spiritual manifestations and their variety all over the world. This it was that gave to my studies inner direction. At first I tried to find this wonder in religious and philosophical pursuits. Even in my literary studies I was not satisfied by restricting myself to the writings of England and Germany, but tried to see these in a wider relationship. The same search led me to investigate Geography and Ethnography early on in my course. My concentration upon the essence and distribution of the Indian religions brought me for the first time into close contact with this country and it interested me deeply. I learnt Sanskrit in order to be able to assess India's spiritual conditions from its own ancient literature, though the demands of my main subjects did not permit me sufficient time to pursue these studies to an extent that could satisfy me. But thanks to my attempts I gained a new insight into my major studies: from Sanskrit I learnt to regard linguistic phenomena as very important in the recognition of the spiritual development of mankind. With new impetus I undertook exact philological studies in my main subject, the Germanic languages, including Dutch and the ancient Scandinavian ones. Therefore the recognition of similar powers to be found in various languages and the studying of their manifestations in conjunction with the spiritual peculiarities of certain nations became the subject of the dissertation for my Doctorate.

I need not stress the fact that the limitations imposed by the writing of my dissertation did not quench my enthusiasm for the subject in its widest sense. Now I am anxious to return from my long concentration upon the spiritual issues of Germanic peoples to their source, which I believe is to

be found in Indian ideology. I feel this could not be better done than in direct contact with Indian people and their ways of life.

The privileged position of lecturer would afford me unique opportunities of making social contacts with students, something I should greatly value, because I have found during my experience while teaching senior classes in the 'Evangelischen Gymnasium' that this close contact with my pupils is my happiest method for instructing young persons. This should continue the social experiments made with people of my own age while in residence at a students' hostel, where I resided throughout the whole period of my studies. In these surroundings my interests in music and drama matured. I also lived in a students' hostel in Holland, the 'Zendings Hoge School Oegstgeest' near Leiden, for three months and enjoyed my social contacts there in the same way.

I am particularly anxious to be appointed to the University of Calcutta, since I possess friends, both German and Indian, who are living in that city and would help me to settle down and to solve any difficulties that might arise in a new country.)

- 1. Whether the Missionaries have to be paid through the Church. On this point I would say 'Yes', for they have agreed to work under the constitution and rules of the Church. And certainly even now, if any Missionary is unwilling to remain under the rules of the Church, he at his will can leave the field. I have shown you the rule and all Missionaries working here are aware of the rule.
- 2. Whether the Federation has agreed. To this also I would say 'Yes', for the Federation has pledged itself to respect protect and develop the Eutonomy of the Church by setting up an Advisory Board for seven years from the inception of Autonomy July 10, 1949. Rev. Rupley being the first representative of the Federation.

Further Mr. Z. Horo pointed out the rule at the Federation meeting of 1946, just when the German Missionaries had returned from the camp and the Federation observed the rule till recently when some German Missionary wrote to the Federation Treasurer.

Which will expedite the payment, rather than going into the rules and breaking them which the Church has adopted. Such things create unpleasantness in the Church and it tells upon the good relationship between the Church and Missionaries which we desire to keep intact.

Dear Brother Tiga,

Today I am going to answer your letter of March 19th, 1956 and reply to the Church Council decisions of the 29th of February 1956 communicated to us by Mr.N.E. Horo, Secretary to the Gossner Church. The Kurstorium of the Gossner Church in its meeting of the first of May, considered both writings in following way:-

- Mr.N.B.Hero to come to Germany in order to get to know Church Life hers and first of all to see the Mission groups and parishes that have prayed and worked for the Gossner Church in India for more than a hundred years. We would appreciate of Mr. Horo could let us know which boat he will take and when he will arive here. We asked Rev.Borutta to hand in the money necessary for the voyage.
- (2) The Euratorium welcomes Dr. Bischoff being elected into the Joint Mission Board (instead of Dr. Schultz) and thanks the Church Goul for the confidence shown through this election.
- (3) As to the question of ROURKELA the Kuratorium has not got a report from Rev. HURBNER-Hannover, representative of the Lutheran Church in Germany, with the following proposals:-

The Church Council is asked to take all measures necessary with the competent authorities so that the Gossner Church may remain the owner of the Purnapani Church Compound.

The Church Council is recommended to most quickly send the best paster to Purnapani so as to bring there into being a centre of gathering all the Christians from among the Indian working people, technicians and engineers.

An Evengelical Church with parsonage and schoolhouse is provided to be built in the supramodern industry town growing up in the very Vicinity of Purnapani. Rev. Hubmer suggests to have the Evangelical Church in Germany send there a German parson who should look after the Europeann Christians and work together with the Indian pastor in Purnapani. We are at present training through the German

Government to have the Indian Embassy in Bonn care for a travelling visa for Rourkela to the chosen German pastor. The Gossner Mission has proposed our missionary Dr. PWSCH to be the German pastor for Rourkela. We therefore ask the Church Council to wait whether the steps the German Evangelical Church has taken with the Indian Covernment to get a travelling visa for Dr. Peusch will be successful. If not, we shall come back to the Church Council decision of February 29th 1956 and ask the Gossner Church to send an invitation to Dr. Peusch. As long as the negociations between the Eveng. Church in Germany and the Indian Government are going on we ask the Church Council not to take any measures in this matter. With your letter of March 19th 1956 you. dear Brother Tiga, asked to propose a successor for Dr. Schultz who. meanwhile, has returned to Germany. Please be so kind as to wait in this matter for the next Kurstorium meeting that will take place on the 12th of June. It also seems advisable that the desire of having a suitable missionary sent to the College of Ranchi should be uttered not only by you personally but also seconded officially by the Church Council.

I suppose the Kuratorium will suggest as the teacher for the College Rev.KLOSS who at present prepares Brother Bage and Brother Surin for their final examinations and who has special qualifications as a theological teacher. But in this question, too, I ask you to have still some more patience, as I need an official decision of the Kuraorium to make a final proposal.

representatives of the Churches of Ostfriesland and WEstphalia to visit the Gossner Church in India. We think such visits from Churche to Church are very important and thank the Church Council for the sacrifices the Gossner Church is ready to offer during the stay of the German guests. We shall hand these invitations over to the two German Churches in which there are many friends of the Gossner-Mission and the Gossner Church, hoping that this good idea will make the relationships between

the Church in Germany and the Gossner Church in India deeper and deeper. We shall continue reporting to the Church Council about the further development in this affair.

(5) The Kuratorium has noted that the Church Council intends to employ Brother Bago and Brother Surin first as teachers at the Theological College in Ranchi.

We heard from you that Bretheren Bage and Surin produced a motion to the Church Council saying that after finishing their studies for the service in India they would like to be ordained in Germany. We think it a sign of the two bretheren's personal gratitude to the German motherchurch, but consider the decision of the Church Council to achieve the ordination of the two brothers in the proper church as absolutely right.

Mr. Kandulna will have to be much travelling about so as to take for his family a real advantage of the few months here. Should it however be a really strong desire of his we ask him to write once more to me personally.

(7) Following the suggestion of the Church Council the Kuratorium decided to invite seteng HapadGara and Bahalen Bage, the two teachers of Tabita-School, to come to Germany to get to know church work with girls and women. We give both the teachers the advice to start learning the German language as soon as possible.

Finally I want to tell the Church Council that owing to Paster Symanowski's work in Mainz-Kastell in 17 ecumenical work-camps a new Gossnerhouse has been built on the Rhine. We ask all brothers and sisters of the Gossner Church coming to Germany to consider both the Berlin Mission House and the New mission compound in Mainz-Kastell as their home. In both the houses we pray for the Church Council and for the whole Gossner Church and its parishes, but first of all for the Mission work that 1st done in the Gossner Church.

I finish up my letter with hearty praying thoughts.

We are just before Whitsuntide. May God give you and us His

Holy Spirit, so that we are happy to preach His word and remain

His obedient servents.

In the time from April 28th till May 1st a big Gossner meeting took place in Mainz-Kastell to inaugurate the new house. One this occasion the Kuratorium welcomed Dr. Schultz after his return from India thanking him for his true at Ranchi Theological College. Unfortunately Dr. Schultz will remain no longer with the Gossner Mission but take an important office within the German Evengelical Church.

Many thanks for your kind note of April 23,1956. Iam really thankful to you, to the Kuratorium and other German brethren for enabling me to plan for a journey to Europe. I have not yet been able to secure a Passport. It has naturally put me in to inconvenience for securing a passage. I have asked the Thomas Cook & Son to arrange a passage for me from Bombay to Genea in the m.v. "Asia". They have registered my name with the steamship company. If all preliminaries are gone through I expect to sail by the above mentioned ship from Bombay on July 8 reaching Genea on July 22. I do not know how many days it will take me to reach Mainz-Kastel. This is my tentative programme. As suggested by you, I shall contact Bro. Borutta for the travel expenses. As a matter of fact he has suggested to me to ask him for payments.

It would not be out of place to mention here that consequent upon a discussion here between Dr.Birkeli and Dr. Baetz on the one hand and the GEL church officers and synod Presidents on the other hand in January last the Lutheran World Federation/CWM sent me an application form to apply for a scholarship for training abroad. I have on the advice of the President and applied for such a scholarship. In the meantime the church council members were asked by the President to give their opinion, on which the majority of the members have voted in favour of this proposal i.e., my applying for a LWF scholarship. There was only one objection and that is from Rev.J. Lakra. Similar is the case with Miss S.M. Bodra, Lady Principal of our Bethesda Girls' High School who is also an applicant. It is guessed that some kind of objections might have reached Berlin in this regard, and I am sure this will not upset my programme of visiting you. I am not very much sure about this scholarship, but would like to avail myself of it, if it is forthcoming. This will engage me for one year or so abroad.

As for my travels within Germany and in the neighbouring countries I entirely depend upon you. Since I am looking forward to learning much through this travel, I would like to have some guide literature, if, there are any, viz., literature regarding the kirchentag and the Ecumenical institute at Bossey.







John Minister Thank you very much for your letter of 7.6.55. In the meanwhile Bishop Sandegren wrote to me about his visit to Ranchi and informed me of the results of his talks with you and other brethren. I am very glad to hear that all brethren are willing to do everything they can in the coming extraordinary Synod for the maintenance of unity and the reestablishment of peace within the Gossner-Church. I have informed all members of the Kuratorium of the letter of bishop Sandegren and begged them to remember you and the Gossner-Church in their prayers. We have purposely not interfered with these affairs; but we have never stopped praying, and beg God daily, that he may give you all the spirit of Truth and Love. I have special question to you personally. I know that Dr. Sovik intended to visit Rourkela in order to discuss with the Lutheran World Federation, whether it would be worth while to build a church, a school and a hospital in this new industrial district. I would be grateful to know whether Dr. Sovik has been in Rourkela, or whether he has talked to you about it. Please write to let me know. On July 16<sup>th</sup> I am going to Finland, where the Department of Missions of the Lutheran World Federation is this year having its meeting. I hope I shall see Dr. Manikam there. As you know the Gossner-Church has applied for a grant of 60.000 Rs. I am willing to support this application strongly, but to be able to do it wholeheartedly I would have preferred the Mahasabha to have been held earlier, the Gossner-Church to have had a legal church-leadership, and the financial matters clear. The President Tiga and myself are now back from our tour in Surguja, Raigarh and the Western part of Ranchi district. We went out immediately within few hours of the rising of the Council meeting on 29th February. I can now inform you of the Council's deci-

sion which concern you too.

1. The Church Council is thankful to the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society in inviting the Secretary of the Gossner Church to visit Germany in order to acquaint himself with church life in Germany and to attend certain important church meetings in the continent.

2. The Church Council has resolved that Dr. Arndt Bischoff, the new missionary Doctor for Amgaon be elected as G.E.L. Church representative in the Toint Mission Board (wise Dr. G. Schultz) Until Dr. Bischoff. in the Joint Mission Board (vice Dr. G. Schultz). Until Dr. Bischoff arrives in India and takes up the work, the rest of the members should

carry on the work.

3. The Council has decided to take up pioneering mission work at Raurkella. The President Tiga and Mr.P. Kandulna have been authorised to further deal with the Hindusthan Steel Ltd, and the Ministry of Iron and Steel, Government of India in the matter of obtaining the permission to retain our Church Compound at village Purnapani which lies in Project's Town area. Further it has been RESOLVED to request the Gossner Mission Society to send a German Pastor (Minister of Religion) to take care of the German Engineers and their families at Raurkella. It is further resolved that a suitably trained Indian Pastor be appointed

to help the German Pastor at Raurkella.

4. Further the Council has "RESOLVED to invite representatives of the Churches of Ausfritzland and Westfalen (Germany) to visit the Gossner Church in India in order to be acquainted with the different works of the Gossner Church and to strengthen the relationship with that of the

Churches of Ausfritzland and Westfalen."

5. Messrs. Bage and Surin have requested the C.C. for the permission to be ordained in Germany under the auspices of the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society. In this regard, the C.C. has unfortunately to disappoint them since according to practice an opportunity will have to be given to the Gossner Ministerium to give its opinion in the matter of declaring them as candidates and their ordination. The C.C. is deeply indebted to the Gossner Mission Society for giving Bros. Bage and Surin intensive training in Germany.

The Council has further decided to appoint Bros. Bage and Surin to be Professors in the Lutheran Theological College at Ranchi for

the present. In the recent Church Council meeting the question of Mr.P.D.Kandulna's deputation to Germany again came up. Mr. Kandulna, who was present in the meeting expressed his readiness to go abroad. In case, he said, arrangements could be made to take his family too, some time would be taken to prepare himself for the journey. If it is he alone, things would be easier both sides. Not knowing all the circumstances in Germany we wait to hear further from the Kuratorium.

7. In conjunction with the two Govindpur Sisters the C.C. has recommended two young ladies-Miss Seteng Hapadgara and Miss Bahalen Bage

for training abroad preferably in Germany. They had their training in the Tabitha School and at present they are on the staff. It would be profitable if they are acquainted with the nature and manner of work being done for women in Germany.

We had a profitable time here in February. Three Directors of the LWB, Dr. Birkeli, Dr. Vaetz and Dr. Vajta visited us within last two months. The Pastoral Conference was a successful one and our Pastors have gone back to their Congregations with newer knowledge and vision.

Jaki Teen As you know I attended the meeting of the Mission Committee of the Lutheran World Federation in Helsinki end of July. Following that I was on holidays with my wife in Denmark for the whole August. Soon after my return to Germany I had to go to West-Germany and carry through an evangelisation week in Detmold. This week I am off to Bavaria in order to attend a meeting of all German Mission societies together with Brother Symanowski. So I beg you to understand my long silence. Today I want to affirm what I have already told you and the Church Council by telegram. The Lutheran World Federation has approved the application of the Gossner Church for a grant and granted a sum of approximately 12.000 \$ for 1956. It will not be quite the whole sum, because the principle of the Lutheran World Federation is that their grants should be slowly reduced from year to year. However the difference between the sum applied for and the sum granted is very small, and we should be very grateful for this result. I was rather sad that you had assumed I had not intended to support your application with the Lutheran World Federation. I do not understand how you or anybody else could conceive such an idea. The letters I wrote you, only contain my request to send me material which would be useful to support your application. But even without this material I should have backed the application of the Gossner Church with all the arguments at my disposal. That goes without saying, and I beg you and the Church Council with all my heart to trust the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission and me in future, that we only have the best for the Gossner Church in mind. It makes no difference who is President of the Gossner Church or whether there is none at all for the time being. These personal affairs are the sole concern of the Church Council and the autonomous church itself. We can only pray God that he give the Gossner Church the right President. And we also pray God that he lead the discussions of the coming synod to a good end. Then we inform you that the Lutheran World Federation has also granted a sum of 2.500 Rs. for building and repairs for the Tabita-School. I have already written Sisters Anni Diller and Hedwig Schmidt about it. Only the sum will not be accessible till the beginning of next year. We have great difficulties concerning the missionary doctor we want to send you according to your desire. As you know we had

definitely fixed on 2 doctors, and now both of them have had to withdraw their concent for good reasons. So we have had to look out for a new efficient doctor. At present we are in negotiation with 5 doctors. They are all well recommended by the Tropics-Institute in Tübingen. So now we hope at last to find a doctor whom we can definitely send to you for service in the Hospital of Amgaon.

On October 10th we are having our next Kuratorium meeting. I would be grateful if you could write me something about the situation of the Gossner Church by then, so that we can bring all your problems and worries before God in our prayers. It was a great joy to me to hear that President Topno has accepted the commission of Acting-President. Please give my greetings to him, the treasurer and the members of the Church Council.

To you yourself go the thanks of all of us for the efforts and the work you have taken on yourself for the best of the Gossner-Church between the two synods.

TERMS OF REFERENCE PASSED BY THE MAHASABHA DATED THE25th & 26th March, 1954. PREAMBLE. President ke adesh par samucha Terms of Reference and Preamble parha gaya jo yon hai:-The Mahasabha of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam receives with gratitude the declaration of the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society dated 3.11.50, and the Statement dated 3.11.50, which read as follows:-"The Gossner Kuratorium is happy that the G.E.L.Church has become Autonomous, that there is therefore no need for the missionaries to assume administrative responsibility, and that they will instruct their missionaries accordingly." and "the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society is convinced that in the present situation of the Autonomous Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church, it is no longer necessary or desirable to charge missionaries with responsible administrative posts, and to give them a vote." The Mahasabha of the G.E.L. Church offers the following terms of Reference to the Kuratorium of Gossner Mission Society. TERMS OF REFERENCE. The relationship between the G.E.L.C. and the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society shall be that of Daughter and Mother. 2. The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society will send missionaries to work in the G.E.L.C. on the request of the G.E.L.C. The missionaries on the field will work as friends and helpers in the development of the G.E.L.C. for specific periods by personally accepting the terms of reference offered by the G.E.L.C. to the individual missionaries through the Kuratorium. 4. The Kuratorium of the Gossner Missiona Society in Christian love and charity shall undertake to support their missionaries on the Gossner field. The policy is to receive such help through the G.E.L.C. Treasury. All Missionaries shall be invited to attend the meeting of the Mahasabha. The men missionaries will be invited to attend the meetings of the Church Council, one by one in rotation according to their alphabetical order. The missionaries will also be invited to attend the meetings of their respective synods. They shall be free to visit the congregations in any part of the Church and to attend the Church meetings as they find it possible with the information of the Synod President. All missionaries working in the G.E.L.C. shall be regular members of the Gossner Church. All ordained missionaries shall be members of the Gossner Church Ministerium. 8. Each missionary will be given a specific work in the Church as evangelistic work among non-Christians, Teaching in the Theological Seminary, Production of Christian literature, help running of charitable institutions etc. The G.E.L.C.provide suitable accommodation for the missionaries working in the field. These Terms of Reference can be amended by the mutual consent of the bodies concerned. see next page.

12. The 'Joint Mission Field' will be administered by a 'Joint # Mission Board' incorporated in the G.E.L. Church, in accordance with theregulations adopted jointly by the Mahasabha and the Kuratorium (vide Mahasabha minutes 1953 p.p. 49-52).

I thank you for the Kuratorium's kind message for our Special Mahasabha, which you have sent me. Before it reached me here I wrote you a letter on 16th June, 55 in which I informed you of the cancellation of the Special Mahasabha. Now I can tell you with much confidence that a Special Mahasabha will meet here on 19th October, with a view to electing C.C.Officers afresh. This arrangement has now been agreed to and is widely supported.

Some friends of the Lutheran Federation (India) including Bishop Sandegren came to Ranchi on 28th June who claimed themselves as assiforming a Federation Commission. A Federation Commission was never asked for, and we three officers (Rev.J.J.P.Tiga,myself and Mr.C.M.Horo,new Treasurer) were always propesting against this attitude of the Federation. We told these friends that we intended to settle our own affairs within the Church. We decided to take a bold step. Rev.Tiga the President myself and the Treasurer, all of us, decided to tender our resignations to the C.C.Executive and in the night of 30th June we went to meet Rev.Lakra and told him that we intended to resign in order to pave the way for holding a Special Mahasabha on 19th October. After a night long consultation with his men Rev.Lakra in the morning of 1st July brought to us this good news that all proposals that we gave him were acceptable to him. Immediately we went to Bishop Sandegren and thanked the Lord together.

I had already sent out notices for an Executive meeting of the C.C. on 5 and 6th July, 55. In this session of the Executive, Rev.J.J.P. Tiga and Rev.J. Lakra's resignations were accepted with immediate effect and immediately an Acting President (Rev. Habil Topno of Burju) was elected. The Treasurer' P.T.O.

In that letter I have written to say that now peace and concord has been achieved. The Church Council appointed by the Mahasabha of 22nd April 55 is accepted by all sections. This of course, excludes Rev. J. J. P. Tiga and Rev. J. Lakra. A new Acting President (Rev. Habil Topno) has been elected who has joined his office on 5th inst. New elections of office bearers will take place in the Special Mahasabha of 19th October, which has been convened by the Executive of the Church Council. As such, there should be now, no doubt from any body. Informations to this effect has already been sent to the F.E.L.C., Bishop Bandegren and others.

The question of Rs.20,000/- is clear from the beginning I do not think we have officially written you about that. Out of this money only Rs.3975/2/- was taken by the former treasurer from the General Account. To-day it has come down to Rs.2937/12/-. Rest of the money belongs to the Provident Fund account. This account is still under audit and all records and books are with the F.E.L.C.Auditor. All these accounts are standing in the name of the former treasurer Mr.Z.Horo and he has accepted them as such. I do not see how this will affect our application for financial aid. This amount of Rs.20,000/- (now it is less than that) which is not of the General account (except Rs.2937/12/-) should not be likked with the question of financial aid. We have not heard anything regarding this Rs.20,000/- from the Department of Missions L.W.F. and they have not said that

Dear brother,

This is in continuation of our letter of June 2. It is regretted that in that letter an important decision of the church council in connexion with Miss Paracleta Khess' training in Germany could not find mention, hence this letter. It may be remembered that the two girls Misses Khess and Hemrom were to reach Germany sometime in January last, which, of course, did not come of due to non-availability of passports and vizas. There were certain other things which came off in the C.C. meeting held from 11 to 13 th January 55. It was in this meeting of the CC that some members raised an objection against Miss Khess' going to Germany. It was said that a marriage negotiation was going on for her and members thought that under such circumstances it did not look nice to send her for a deaconess' training. This line of church work required ag good deal of personal sacrifice and devotion. A married life is equally important. The girls were asked to give an undertaking in writing that they will serve the church for first five years after their training, unmarried. Besides, there was a strong public feeling against this particular girls going to Germany under such circumstances. Miss Khess was asked to confirm her previous undertaking, which she did. Even then the Council did not find herself agreeable to her going. On 13 th. January, decision about her deputation was postponed for further consideration. This matter was to come up in the CC meeting scheduled to meet from 13 th. April '55. But, before the CC could meet, the two girls left India for Germany. Rev. J. Lakra was arranging everything about their passage. He reserved first class seats for them and they sailed. They left Ranchi in early April. Rev. Lakra told me about all these before their departure, and I reminded him about the CC resolution whereby CC had postponed consideration Re: Miss Khess. I also reminded him about the Council's intention to keep these girls for a year or so in the Tabitha school. To this I wrote you in my letter dated March 22. The intention of the CC was to send them, if possible, with Schultz. I also pointed out to him your letter of March 7 in which you have informed us of the Kuratoriums suggestions to give these girls more opportunity here in order to pick up German language and acquire a good knowledge of the Bible. But, inspite of all these good suggestions Lakra took everything upon him to send them. When the CC met on 13 th April, it demanded explanation. THE CC disowned everything in respect of Miss Khess. Subsequently the CC on 25 May decided to inform the Kuratorium ".. that the Church Council has not sent Miss Paracleta Khess to Germany for higher training." This was passed by a majority of votes. There is nothing against Miss Hemrom.

We have been thinking seriously how best to improve the Tabitha school, for which, the two Govindpur sisters have advised us from time to time. This year we have opened a Pracharaks' Training School at Govindpur from this month. We are anxious to build these two central institutions as strong and living as possible. In course of our talk with the two sisters, we wondered whither the Kuratorium could further help the CC in some way. We were thinking and thinking and finally the CC in its executive meeting on May 16 decided to make a definite request before the Kuratorium. It resolved to request the Kuratorium for a sum of Resees 40,000 (forty thousand) to be spent the in the following manner: Tabitha school - Rs. 2500(for repairs and extension Rs.

(for thousand)

and extension Rs. 1300 and for stipends to 5 teacher students Rs. 1200. @ Rs20/- p.m.). Pracharaks' Training school for providing teaching appliances, furniture, Libraray etc.

This resolution is being sent to you for the consideration of the Kuratorium. In making this request the CC is conscious of the tremendous work the Kuratorium has at hand, however, we trust that friends in Deutscheland will pray for our efforts that we are making in our own humble way. We also know that unless the LORD HIMSELF buideth our efforts would be in vain, still we trust that the LORD will certainly make us HIS instruments in the lesser human beings like us.

Dear brother, I have now reveived your letter of June 9. We rejoice in the knowledge that our friend in kke Germany are fervently praying for us here. WE have certainly found ourselves in troubles. We are, however, trying to resolve everything & seek the guidance of the Holy Ghost so that we can see eurthe WAY. Our efforts are but feeble and we do not think we ourselves can restore peace. We can be the instruments through which HE works.

You will be more sorry to hear that the intended special Mahasabha can now sit on 30 June. Two thirds requests from the Synod Presidents have not come and in the absence of this constitutional necessity, we cannot call this mahasabha. However, we are tring to find out a solution. Rains have now set in and it becomes very difficult for our delegates to come for such meetings. In the meantime we are carrying on our work. We are having difficulties, no doubt, but we must work. It is immterial-whiteimmaterial whether I become the Secretary or Tiga becomes the President. He can also serve well who stands by.

We pray that may God give us understanding. May He show

us the way.

May we thank you and the Kuratorium for the words of encouragement and prayer that you are having for us here. We also thank you all friends and workers in the Gossner Mission in Germany for the blessings.

Dear Brother.

Hereby I acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 5 and 7, 1955 and also of the message the Kuratorium sent us for the Mahasabha.

There has been an inordinate delay in replying you, mostly due to unsteady circumstances in which we found ourselves after the Mahasabha. The Mahasabha this time was not smooth. Due to certain unavoidable circumstances the Mahasabha took drastic action and deposed Rev. J. Lakra and Mr. Z. Horo from the offices of President and Treasurer respectively, disolved the Church Council, elected new office bearers and an Ad interium Church Council for next three months. And, there followed troubles. Rev. Lakra was up against the present - C.C. He created a party on communal lines and appealed to the Federation (India) for intervention. The Federation wanted to send a Commission. The C.C. flatly refused that but welcomed some representatives of the F.E.L.C for studying the situation. Rev. E.Raman the Vice-President of Federation along with Dr. Sovik of the L.W.F. visited Ranchi on 26th May, '55 and left here only yesterday. They took three days to study the situation and we have now agreed, according to their advice, to convene an Extra-ordinary session of the Mahasabha on June 30,1955. The present office bearers and Rev. J.Lakra (He still claim himself to be the President) will resign in this Mahasabha and a fresh election will take place under the Chairmanship of a bha and a fresh election will take place under the Chairmanship of a pro-tem Chairman. There all happened during the last six weeks. We are thankful to God who has shown us the way and we are now looking forward to meeting on the 30th June, to elect new office bearers. I am Secretary of the Church for next thirty days and so I thought it my urgent duty to communicate to you the decisions of the Church Council on the point the Kuratorium very kindly sent us for our delibration and decision. They are the following.

delibration and decision. They are the following:

1. The C.C. agrees to the proposals regarding Brother Surin's further training in Germany and so it "resolves to accept the proposals of the Kuratorium in retaining Mr. Saban Surin for further theological training in Germany, and request her to make necessary arrangements according to her plan". It further resolved to select a qualified theological student for availing that Scholarship which was formerly offered to Mr. Saban Surin that Scholarship which was formerly offered to Mr. Saban Surin

for study in America. 2. " We heartily accept the offer of the Kuratorium to train up two technical students in Germany. Further we undertake to select two such students who will receive their training in Germany and spare time will be introduced to non-clerical work so that infuture they prove useful to the Church at large".

3. Mr. P.D. Kandulna was informed of the invitation which he

has from the kuratorium. He has expressed his readiness to accept this invitation. Now, it depends upon him when he can find himself going. The C.C. has yet to make arrangements for him. We shall write definitely when every thing is finalised.

4. As to the further staying of Brother Bage and Surin in Germany, the C.C. has resolved to agree to the Kuratorium's propo-

sals". " The Church Council is thankful to the Kuratorium for the very encouraging words she expresses in our effort for bringing about a union of the Gossner and Ebenezer Churches." We consider Rev. Khondpan's visit to Germany a Significent one. We believe, he will be persuaded to visit us here too, that we can all come closer to each other in the ecumenical relationship. (Many thanks for the 2 photos which have been passed round ).
6. The C.C. regrets to note that the Klimkeits' cannot come out out to India again due to Mrs Klimkeit's protracted illness. However, we believe Pastor Klimkeit and his family will immensely be utilised by the Lord, in their own country, for Mis glory. As to Dr. G. Schultz - the C.C. desires that he and his family should come back to India after spending their fundament in Dautachland This is a large spending their furlough in Deutschland. This is a unanimous decision of the C.C. We know, how valueable he has been for our church here. The C.C. pleads with the Kuratorium to send him back amidst us again.

Dr. Bartsch is welcome here. The C.C. has " resolved to invite Dr. Bartsch for the Amgaon Hospital". We hope, the Kuratorium for his letter and wishes that the bond of Christian love and relationship should be strengthened between us

The C.C. has now come to know about the nature of Correspond-cences that has passed between Rev. J.Lakra and Rev. J.Klimkeit The C.C. makes a note of it and takes this matter as closed.

Dear Brethren,

As we have learnt the Church Council will meet on April 13<sup>th</sup> 1955 to prepare this years's Mahasabha. We beg you to be sure we shall remember you in our prayers. May God bless your deliberations and your decisions. May He guide your hearts and give wisdom, love and the strength of His Spirit in carrying through the two meetings:

For the meeting of the Church Council the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission presents you the following points for discussion and decision:

- 1.) We learn from the last letter of the Church Council of March 22<sup>nd</sup> that we may expect the arrive of Pastor Hanuk Minz and his wife in the course of this year. In spring 1956 the two young girls elected for studying in Germany will arrive here, accompanied by Dr. Schultz and his family. We should like to express our joy at this and we thank the Church Council for all the pains taken in this matter.
- We once more beg the Church Council to leave in Germany not only Mr. Marsallan Bage but also Mr. Saban Suri n so that he may finish his studies here. We have learnt but lately that you have decided Mr. Saban Surin to continue his studies in America. We should consider this as highly regrettable, as in that case Brother Surin would not be able to finish and complete the studies on which he has spent so much time and work. We once more offer the Church Council to let Mr. Surin have here all the degrees he could get in America. We hope and shall try to let him pass his examination as a B.D. next autumn and as a S.Th.M. at the end of next year.

Would it not be more profitable to the Church to give the scholarship offered for America to another qualified student of theology? So another theologian, trained in a foreign country, would be at disposition for future Church work. Mr. Surin is, of course, quite ready to submit obediently to any decision of the Church Council and we put the whole question into the hands of the Church Council. But we beg the Church Council to consider the question once more and to tell

us what has been decided.

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4.) Besides we have to make another proposition which outpasses all the brotherly help we have been giving until now to the Gossner-Church. We should be glad if Indian students not only of theology could come for their studies to Germany. Therefore the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission has resolved to give help. We offer the Church Council to grant two scholarships for two really qualified students at a German Technical-University or Mining-University. We beg you to pay for the passage here only. All the other costs arising here in Germany and for the passage back after the studies are finished, will be paid by the Gossner Mission. We have but one condition: That the two students during their vocations should be ready to let themselves be introduced to non-clerical church work so as to enable them to help in the Gossner Church in India in spare hours.

This proposition would in no way stop the efforts of the Church Council to help Indian students to study 'n Germany by the agency of the Indian-Steel-Company. On the contrary: We should like to encourage the Church Council in that direction.

5.) Finally we should like to express our joy that the relations between the Gossner Church and the Santal Church seem to grow closer and closer. We guessed as much from what we read in the last letter from the Church Council.

We had, in the mean time, the visit of Rev. Khondpan, the President of the Jeypur Church, and received him as a dear brother in our house and in the parishes of Berlin connected to us by friendship. We enclose two photos taken at occasion of his visit at the new Gossner House.

We take this visit as a hopeful sign of the growing closeness of ecumenical relations between the neighbouring churches and the churches of the whole world.

6.) As to sending out new missionaries we have made definitive proposals in our letter to the Church Council of April 5th 1955. We should like to add a few words about sending out we were misses a medical doctor. For months we have been in negotiations with Dr. Bartsch, son of the former Gossner missionary Paul Bartsch, et last of Darbhanga. He is willing to go as a phisician to Amgao, as soon as the Joint Mission Board calls him. He himself, his wife, and his eleven years old son have been tested for fitness for a tropical climate and have been declared fit. So the Kuratorium has determined to propose him for being sent out to India. The final decision has not yet been taken, but it will be so towards the end of the month. Only then the Kuratorium will be able to make the Church Council a definite proposition.

As a last item we have to acquaint the Church Council of a correspondence that has caused us great care and pains. Private letters have arrived written by the brethren Dr. Schultz and Rev. /private Tiga addressed to members of our Kuratorium. They refer to a/letter written by our missionary Br. Klimkeit to Br. President Joel Lakra. The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission does not think it correct to go into the details of this correspondence and to write about it officially to the Church Council before the brethren Rv. Tiga and Dr. Schultz have told the Church Council themselves of the whole matter. We make use of the contents of Br. Klimkeit's letter to President Lakra only so far as it concerns the relations of the Church of Westphalia. Br. Klimkeit in his letter to President Lakra makes certain private propositions which ought not to have been made without knowledge of the Church Direction in Westphalia and the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission. We regret that the missionary Br. Klimkeit wrote such a letter without the knowledge of the Kuratorium and we shall ask him to account for it as soon as the Church Council has given its opinion of the whole matter.

> As to the relation of the Church of Westpahlia to the Gossner Mission in Germany and the Gossner Church in India, President of the Westphalian Church, Rev. Wilm, has already sent the Church Council his reply which we entirely approve of.

Many thanks for your letter of 22.3. I am very glad for your telling me that the next Church Council will only take place on 13.4. and the Mahasabha from 18. - 20.4. That means that our Home Board has time to make certain suggestions early enough and can send the Mahasabha greetings and a message.

I shall therefore convene a meeting of the Home Board as soon as possible and let you know of its resolutions in an official letter. On this meeting we shall discuss the items of your letter of 22.3..

Today I want to let you know the following: Our Home Board has decided to suggestin the place of Missionaries Dr. Schultz and Klimkeit a German theologian named Pastor Hermann K 1 oss who for the beginning is to help and cooperate with the Gossner Church.

There is also another clergyman, Pastor Eberhard Peusch and his wife who haveapplied. He too as Pastor Kloss has passed his two theological exams, but he wants to take his degree as doctor of theology so that he would not be ready to go to India before the beginning of next year. As soon as that will be possible, we shall make suggestions to the Church Council in this matter.

Today however the only matter is that of the unmarried Pastor Kloss, born in Danzig 21.6.1925, and now in the service of the Church of Hessen in Frankfurt as ordained minister. Pastor Kloss had at first studied oriental languages and ethnology, but then he decided to study theology. So at first he studied in the theological seminary in Neuendettelsau within the Bavarian Church, and then at the University of Erlangen, which trains theologians for the Bavarian Church. In 1951 he passed his first theology exam there. And from this time on he has been/close connection with the Gossner Mission, because he had the wish - if God so willed - to go to India and serve the Gossner Church there. In 1954 he passed his second theology exam, and from that time on he has been ready to be sent to India. The Home Board has now summoned him to Berlin, where he is to help in the home work of the Gossner Mission and to prepare himself outwardly and inwardly for the work in India. Pastor Kloss is Lutheran.

As there will be a great gap in the staff of the Theology College in Ranchi when Dr. Schultz returns to Germany and Mr. Klimkeit will be missiong, we suggest that for the beginning you call Pastor Kloss to

Berlin-Friedenau, 5.4.1955 Ranchi as teacher of Theology. We believe him to be a conscientious worker, fitted for the post of theology teacher, and we are sure that he will perform his duties in the Gossner Church faithfully. in other sections of the Gossner Church as well. He could be sent at any time.

The Home Board assumes the responsibility as hitherto for the costs of the journey there and back as well as the salary. Brother Kloss is willing to accept the terms of reference. We can do no more than recommend him in this letter. Should the Gossner Church want his services and invite him as teacher for the Theology College, the Home Board would be willing to furnish further details, especially for the applications for an entry permit.

Believe us, we beg you, that we have only this offer to your Church after we had won certainity in our prayers. We know that we human beings can err, and that Christ alone as the Head of His Church can call the right workers for the Mission and equip them with the gifts of His Holy Spirit. Therefore we have laid the whole matter into His hands. But we beg the Church Council to bring the whole matter before God together with us, so that the right decision can be made.

Dear Brother Lokies,

Thank you for your letter of March 5,1955, which will be a placed before the next session of the Church Council scheduled to meet from April,13,'55. In the meantime, I am acknowledging receipt of your letter and let you know that we are extremely grateful to you for accepting our few suggestions with regards to the ferms of Reference. We have been trying to improve conditions with Tabitha School with the very valuable suggestions from the two sisters at the spot. It was very kind of miss Schmidt woo could make time to attend the opening session of the Church Council. I believe, She has been able to see for herself the Church Council at work.

It is very unfortunate that an able man like Dr. Schultz should leave for nome so early, but we do not intend to comment on the decision of the Home Board. It is Dr. Schultz's own desire, you write, which is taking him back to Germany. Well, we have only another one year to work with him. We shall be really missing his very important work in the Indian Church. You do not inform whether you are thinking to send any other missionary in future, but we guess you are most certainly on the look out for one. You tell another disappointing news about the inability of the Klimkeit to return back to India. That is really missing one of the most experienced missionaries in our field.

Due to non-availability of the passport in time, Mr.&Mrs. Minz could not sail for Germany in good season. This delay is regretted as that has put you to many an inconvenience, and further delay means more inconvenience. I do not know when they shall be able to get the berths. When your suggest a warmer season. When they should arrive in Germany, that means they should have to leave India towards the end of this year. I do not know what you propose them to do here.

India along with Schultz & family sometime next year. This arrangement will provide mere opportunities for them to learn German Language and the field work. Both of them are in the Tabitha School studying under the guidance of the two sisters. As regards their special training - specific branch of work for which they are to be sent to Germany, We shall be able to give you a more confirmed and final information after the two Govindpur sisters of the Church Council has been fully consulted. The special aptitude and ability of the two girls and the need of the Church are to be taken into consideration.

As far as the cases of Bage and Surin go, we entirely depend upon your advices. While we thought Bage will come back after two years we intended that Surin should go to America for further training. For this purpose, he had already approached us and an application to the Director, Department of Theology LWF had already been addressed. We had informed Surin about it and at the same time we had requested you to recommend him for this undertaking. We do not quite know what happened to his application. Now, you inform us of your intention to retain him in Germany and say that German equivalent

equivalent degree can be available for him. He is already in Germany 4 years now and we do not quite know what more time will be necessary for him to undergo this new training. We shall however be araiting your detailed information in this connexion.

Dear Brothers,

thank you very much for sending us back the Terms of Reference as they were resolved in the plenary session of the Church Concil. Your letter was submitted to the Home Board in its meeting of 9.2.55 and was unanimously approved by it. The Home Board also received a report from Sisters Anni DILLER and Hedwig SCHMIDT on the resolutions of the CC concerning the TABITA-SCHOOL. The Home Board is very joyful over the active help of the Church Council for the progress of the Tabita School and thanks the responsible brothers for all the aid they have given the Tabita School. That the CC has decided to have extra 5 teachers a year trained at the Tabita School for religious instruction. trained at the Tabita School for religious instruction we consider most important and promising. The Home Board on its part is willing to contribute a scholarship-help of 100 Rs monthly.

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Further the Home Board lets the Church Council know that Professor Lic. SCHULTZ according to his own desire and according to an arrangement with the Home Board agreed on before his departure to India intends to leave the service of the Gossner Church in 1956. At his request we are already preparing to secure berths for him and his family in time. Most probably he will return to Germany next year February.

The Home Board regrets that the departure of Pastor MINZ and his wife has been delayed. It is the same with the two Indian young women who have been selected for study in Germany by the Church Council. On the otherhand this delay may have its positive sides. For Mr. and Mrs. MINZ it is sure to be better for their health if they arrive in Germany in the warmer season. As to the young women who are to come to Germany, their coming later need not be a disadvantage if 1.) they are further taught German in the Tabita School and 2.) acquire a good knowledge of the Bible. In fact the Home Board suggests a further postponement of their journey so that they could travel to Germany with Brother SCHULTZ and his family. The Home Board would also be grateful to the CC if it would let us know clearly for what section of work the young women are to be trained, e.g. whether they are to be prepared for teaching at the Tabita School or to take over the management later on. The Home Board intends this only as a piece of advice or a suggestion for the CC. The decision and of course the selection of the girls for study in Germany is wholly in your hands.

We are very sad to have to give you the very disappointing news that Missionary KLIMKEIT cannot return to India. While the undersigned was in India he was asked on several sides to send

KLIMKEIT to India again. We regret to say that is impossible, as it has turned out that Mrs. Klimkeit is no longer fit for the tropics. She will need a number of years before she becomes quite well again, and even then it must be feared that she will not regain her fitness for the tropics. For this reason Missionary Klimkeit has decided either to take service in the home work of the Gossner Mission or to take over a German parish. We hope that he will remain as fellow-worker in the propaganda work of the Gossner Mission, even if he does have a small parish. However he can no longer work for the Gossner Church in India.

In our Home Board meeting we also discussed the future of Brothers Marsalan Bage and Saban Surin. As you know it had first been arranged between the CC and the Home Board that the 2 young men were to stay in Germany for two years, and now they have be en here for nearly 4 years and have not yet even finished studying. We would quite understand if the families of both Brothers not only, but also the Church Council became impatient and asked wen at least the studies would be over and with which result. We beg the Church Council to be patient and to allow the two brothers to stay here till they have completed their studies. As you know Marsalan BAGE is working at a philosophical dissertation at the Freie Universität Berlin. And we hope that he will be able to return to India with a German University degree. Besides that he is continuing his theological studies, which are also terminated by an exam. In this way Brother Bage will be qualified to serve the Gossner Church in important sections.

With Saban SURIN things are a little different. Both Brothers have passed their Greek exam well after having made their exam in Hebrew. We take the opportunity to tell the Church Council that we very much appreciate the diligence of the young brothers and are happy every time they have passed one of their exams. We beg the CC to allow us to keep Suban SURIN here still he has completed his studies in Germany. The Home Board promises the CC that he too will return with practically the same degree he would have acquired in America. We would consider it as disastrous if Saban Surin would break off his studies in Germany now and go to America, however tempting that may be. The Evangelical Church in Germany will arrange that the degrees he acquires in Germany will be in no wise less valuable than those he would make in America. We shall give the CC details as soon as we have discussed the matter with Bishop DIBELIUS.

We thank your office very much for sending us the adresses we had asked for of all the synod presidents. Would you please also b t us know when your Mahasabha is taking place this year.

We send the Church Council our warmest greetings and pray God to bless your work in this year, and we remember and in our prayers the whole of the Gossner Church in Chota Nagpur and Assam, her pastors and all who serve the Church in its congregations and bid you Yishu Sahay!

## DIRECTOR LOKIES VISITS INDIA

Director Lokies was born in India while his father Missionary Lokies lived at Anutitoly. His golden age of childhood was spent at Anutitoly. At the age of ten or eleven he left India for Germany.

After about 50 years he returns to the land of his birth. In this connection the following facts are recorded:-

- 1. Director lokies visited the five large Provinces of North East India viz, Assam, Bengal, Bihar, Orissa and Madnya Pradesh in Which area the Gossner Church has spread out at present. This area includes the Autonomous Church Field, the New Joint Mission Field and the Surguja Lutheran Mission Field.
- 2. Besides the above area of the Gossner Church Director Lokies visited madras which is in the Krip Leipzig mission area, Rajanmundry which lies within the Andhra Lutheran Church, the Breklum Field and the Santal Ebenezer Church. At Rajanmundry he attended the meeting of the Federation of the Lutheran Churches in India. While in Bengal he attended the convocation of the Serampur University which is the only institution in India which confers theological degrees. He attended the Gossner Church Manasabha (General Conference) on March 25th. and 26th., 1954.
- 3. These visits of Director Lokies were made within a # little more than four months. He left Ranchi on the 9th may, 1954, having landed in Bombay on the 26th.of December 1953. The programme was 50 crowded and neavy that the critics said the Gossner Church authorities were going to kill Director Lokies. There was no vacant time and no leisure for Director Lokies.
- 4. Everywhere in the Gossner Field, the Director was met and welcomed by nundreds and thousands of our brothers and sisters and children by Such signs of love as hand-washing. All were very eager to meet him and hear him. People came on foot walking ten to twenty miles. The Director met not only the congregations, but Pastors, Catechists, Teachers, Young people, Women Children and Committee and Council members, separately, discussing matters of respectiveix interests. Director tokies could intelligently discussed the problems of different groups and interests and his suggestions were very helpful. He could grasp and understand the problems and tried his best to convince the people. To the congregations he always spoke on a text from the Bible. He never touched politics in his speech.
- 5. His love for India and the Indian Church is a unique. His missionary ideals are far above the ordinary level.xxxxxxxxxx He undauntedly upholds the independence of the Indian Church. He ardently believes in the co-operation and collaboration of the daughter and the mother churches. He is a zealous for the example Evangelization of the unbelieven, but he never goes to offend any group if non-Christians. During his whole itinararyDirector tokes wonderfully respected and kept the Indian Church authority.
- 6. Director lokes has given a new life to the relationship between the daughter and the mother churches. The Terms of Reference which he defended in the Mahasabha, are unique in the history of Missions. The Terms of They open a new way of cooperation and collaboration between the youngmen and the older churches. They release a new spiritual force for the work of the Evangelization of the world. These terms of reference are worthwhile to be adopted by the other churches and missions.
- 7. It is worthwhile to record here the resolution of the Gossner church Mahasabha (General Conference) on the visit of Director Lokies which reads as follows:
  Resolved that the Mahasabha of the G.E.L.

Church expresseand records its grateful thanks to the Home-Board, Berlin, Gossner Evangelical Missionary Council, the Lutheran World World Federation and to Director Hans lokies, for the more most fruitful visit of the Dr. lokies to the G.E.L.Church including Joint Mission Field, and Surguja Mission Field. It further records that the visit of Director tokies to these areas and the manasabha in session, have brought innumerable blessings and incouragement to the G.E.L. Church. This visit will ever be remembered by the coming generations in the Church.

Dear brother Lokies,

I thank you and the Kuratorium of The Gossner Mission Society for inviting me to visit Europe to be able to acquaint myself with church life in Germany. I specially thank the Gossner Mission Society for very kindly volunteering to meet my travelling costs.

I have placed these before the Executive Officers meeting. These will also be put up before the full Church Council which is meeting from 28-30th September, where certain decisions will be taken re: Rourkela and many others. Brother Hanukh Minz has not yet come to Ranchi. He is held back due to serious flood occuring in the Brahmaputra. I learn from Pastor S. Horo (Tezpur) that Minz will be staying with them until floods have receded and rail links are repaired. The Council has decided to send him to Germany. This decision was taken in full C.C. meeting on 29/3/54. Minz has been relieved from his duties at Tinsukia (Assam). Only Gospel according to St. John has been published so far. Translation of Old Testament and New Testament is nearing completion and I hope, by next year, the whole Bible will see publication. I shall send Bage one copy of St. John's in Kharia. The Statistics which you wanted has, I find, been sent to your Berlin address on 16.6.54. In case that has not reached you, I am enclosing one. I am realy sorry it is not in your hands as yet. We are applying to the Hindustan Steel Ltd. for some lands to enable us build Church buildings, hospital and School buildings and parsonage. If the firm Krupp-Demag give money for building purposes that will be very nice indeed. List of technical hands are being sent to them. We are glad to know that the Kirchliche Aussenamt has accepted brother Symanowsky's proposal and so let us hope that Krupp-Demag will agree to provide money for the project. agree to provide money for the project. We shall consider in our next C. C. meeting to provide an Indian Pastor for Spiritual welfare of the German Engineers. Co-operation from the National Lutherak Coulcil will be possible, it appears, from correspondences passing between you and Dr. Schiotz. I think, it will be possible to give an estimate of the total costs involved in this project before the meeting of L. W. F./C. W. M. at Hockelum. This information is being required by the C. W. M. at their Geneva Office. I shall let you know of our Council decision in respect of Co-operating with the World Mission Prayer League. Personally, I feel, there should be no hesitation in securing the co-operation of the League. More in my next letter. Cordial greetings to you and Prases Stosch.

We are in receipt of "The Vote of Thanks" passed by the MAHASABHA on March 31st, 1954 relating to Director Lokies' visit. Thanks be to our Lord for blessing Director Lokies' work. We are also grateful to you for the cordial reception you gave him, for all the expenses incurred and chiefly for the fine spirit which prompted all your meetings with him.

The "Terms of Reference" passed by the Mahasabha in March are at hand. We accept them, suggesting a few slight changes in their wording only, viz:

- § 1 should read "Daugther and Mother" in accordance with the logical sequence of the sentence.
- § 4 Instead of "The Kuratorium ... shall undertake to support the Missionaries on the Gossner field " we should say "The Kuratorium ... will undertake to support their Missionaries in the Gossner field ".
- § 5 It seems to us preferable saying "alternately" instead of "in rotation according to their alphabetic order", leaving the decision to the C.C. which Missionaries presence or counsel would be desirable at the particular case.

The "Resolutions" annexed to "Terms of Reference" should be transformed into paragraphs 11 and 12, as shown in our revised draft of these "Terms of Reference."

Two Copies of them duly signed by the Kuratorium are enclosed. If the slight alterations propsed by us are agreeable to the C.C., we suggest that both copies should be signed by the C.C. authorities and one of them returned to us.

Translation of the Terms of Reference for foreign Coworkers of the Gosanor Church. pr.ch. Derg Director Drafted by the Kuratorium for the G.E.L. Church, May'64. 1. Having the member of the Lutheran World Federation and participating in the fellowship of the World Council of Churches the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church of Chhotanagour and Assam has the desire that the members of the other brother Churches should cooperate in mastering the task imposed upon the Gossner Church. This desire is based on the Holy Spirit and ought to be the desire of every Christian Church in this age. 2. In ecumenical candour and freedom the Gosaner Church claims the right through its constitutional authority to invite such Fraternal workers who do not dictate the terms of its faith but cooperate for its own happiness (II Corel, 24) because the Cossner Church is not a MissionField any more in the sense that without its agreement foreign Church workers could be sent to it. 3. The Gossner Church emphasises this right so much the mote also before the Government of the Indian Republic because (a) on the basis of its short history it is conscious of the possibility to receive valuable help and spiritual envicement from such coworkers of friendly brother Churches in the variety of works and services imposed upon the Gossner Church (b) The Gossner Church knows that its autonomy is inviolable and respected by the non-Indian coworkers in full loyality. 4. The Gogener Church is conscious of its relationship to the Church of Re-

formation in Germany with special gratitude and love, because it owes its life and origin to the work of Father Gossner's emissaries. Therefore the Gossner Church will be specially glad to receive (male & female) coworkers from the German mother Church and has a special confidence in the Gossner Mission of Berlin nominating fit workers.

5. During the period of work being stipulated or not stipulated these fra ternal workers are responsible not only to the organisations of their home Churches which have sent them, but also to the Gossner Church and its organised bodies.

6. The task of the coworker is to be expressed as precisely as possible and an indenture is to be drawn up in order to avoid possible misunderstandings and disappointments and to make rights and duties clear. The authorities of the Gosher Church still reserve to themselves the right to put up general terms of reference for such indentures.

7. The Gossner Church has aims to grant dwelling and appropriate salary to the invited coworker. As long as the Church is not yet in the position to do that, it is grateful when help is given for this from the side of the sending organisation (Gossner Mission Ecumenical bodies, brother Churches.)

8. In principle all fields of Church work (Theological teaching, mission work, diacomia and aducation, women and youth work etc.) are open for such co workers. The KSS of the Gossner Church will let the brother Churches and ecumenical institutions know for which work the cooperation of experienced foreign brothers and sisters is specially desired.

9. They are requested to cooperate in these central badies boards of the Gosmer Church which are related to their service being as a rule advisors"
The governing bodies of the Church will from time to time receive them in
their midst for report and discussion about their work.

10. The Gosmer Church welcomes also the invitation of its own servants and coworkers as fratemal workers to other brother Churches whether for deepening their education and training or for their cooperation, only in such a mutualityand such an exchange the Gosaner Church sees the unity and practically proved community of Christ's body on earth manifested.

"The Gossner Kuratrium is happy that the G.E.L. Church has become Autonomous, that there is therefore no need for the missionaries to assume administrative responsibility, and that they will instruct their missionaries accordingly" and "the Kuratorium of the Gossner mission Society is convinced that in the present situation of the Autonomous Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church, it is no longer necessary or desirable to charge missionaries with responsible administrative posts, and to give them a vote".

The Mahasabha of the G.E.L. Church offers the following terms of reference to the Kurstorium of Gossner Mission Society.

#### Terms of Reference.

- 1/ The relationship between the G.E.L.C and the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society shall be that of Daugther and Mother.
- 2/ The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society will send missionaries to work in the G.E.L.C. on the request of the G.E.L.C.
- 3/ The missionaries on the field will work as friends and helpers in the development of the G.E.L.C. for specific periods by personally accepting the terms of reference offered by the G.E.I.C. to the individual missionaries through the Kuratorium.
- 4/ The Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission Society in Christian Lowe and charity shall undertake to support their missionaries on the Gossner field. The policy is to receive such help through the G.E.L.C. Treasury.
- 5/ All Missionaries shall be invited to attend the meeting of the Mahasabha. The men missionaries will be invited to attend the meetings of the Church Council, one by one; alternately. The missionaries will also be invited to attend the meetings of their respective synods. They shall be free to visit the congregations in any part of the Church and to attend the Church meetings as they find it possible with the information of the Synod president.
- 6/ All missionaries working in the G.E.L.C. shall be regular members of the Gossner Church.
- 7/ All ordained missionaries shall be members of the Gossner Church Ministerium.
- 8/ Each Missionary will be given a specific work in the Church such as: evangelistic work among non-Christian, teaching in the Theological Seminary, production of Christian literature, help running of charitable institutions etc.
- 9/ The G.E.L.C. provide suitable accommodation for the missionaries working in the field.
- 10/ These terms of Reference can be amended by the mutual consent of the bodies concerned.
- 11/ All former proposals or drafts of "Terms of Reference" are superseded by these Terms of Reference.

12/ The Joint Mission Field will be administered by a Joint Mission Board incorporated in the G.K.L.Church, in accordance with the regulations adopted jointly by the Mahsabha and the Kuratorium (vide Mahasabha minutes 1953 p.p. 49-52).

Dear Brother Sirka,

I am sorry to hear that in the meanwhile the meeting has already taken place (27.10.). That is very unfortunate, but I am afraid I cannot help it.

I hasten to send you an extract of the minutes of the Home Board meeting which President Joel Lakra also attended, and with it the text of the statutes of the Joint Mission Board which the Home Board formulated on the basis of the meeting of July 16th.

We had certainly sent President Joel Lakra the wording of these statutes personally, but you are right: officially we should have sent the statutes to the Church Council through you. Please forgive me this lapse. I should be very sorry if for this reason the Church Council should have been prevented from taking a definite decision on the Joint Mission Board. It is wholly my fault, and I beg you to express my regrets to the Church Council.

You write that the meeting of the Church Council was to take place immediately after the Centenary Jubilee of the Mundas. I hope our greetings and good wishes arrived in time for the great day. We were ourselves very unhappy that none of us could come; but we can't always act as our heart inclines us to. I myself am very tied by heavy responsibilities and my work in Church and Mission, and cannot do what I should like. You may be sure that in spirit we were with the Centenary Jubilee with all our hearts and partook in the joy of all.

We were very pleased at the arrival of Brothers Bage and Surin. No-body was exactly informed concerning their arrival and so they both arrived surprisingly in Mainz. But now they are there, and we are glad to see how keen the two are to adapt themselves to conditions in Germany, to learn the language, so as to begin study soon. You will sure to have heard further details through my fellow-worker, Brother Symanowski.
