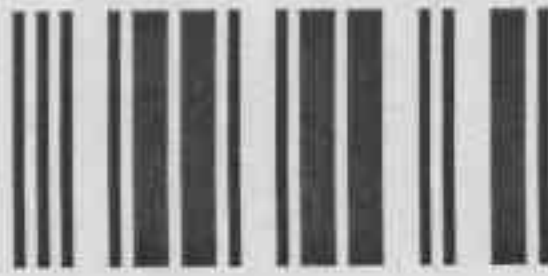

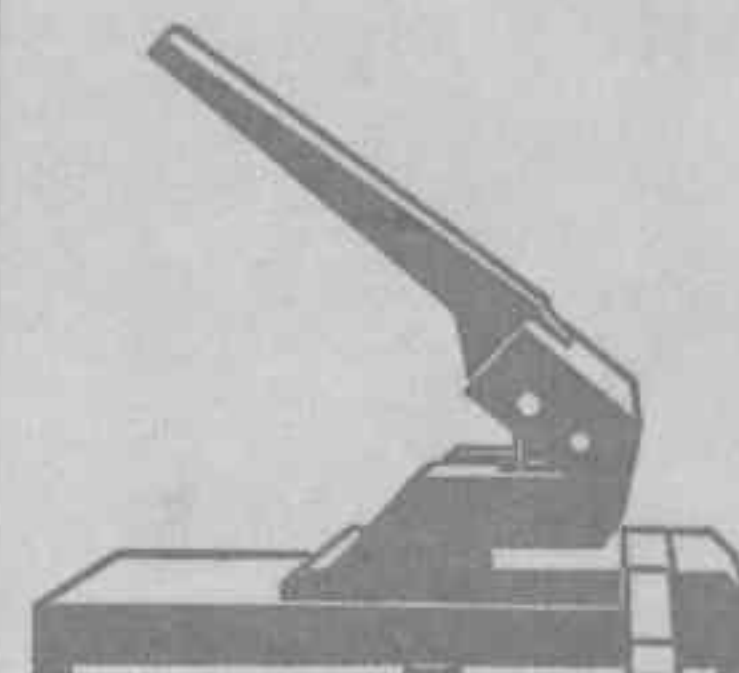
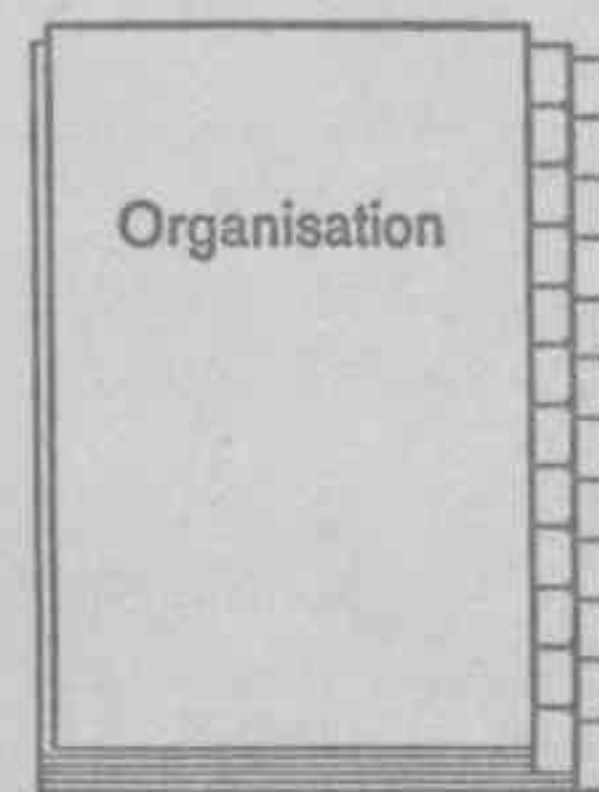

Dear Sir,

We the employee of F.T.T.C. would like to inform you the state of affair presently existing in the F.T.T. Fudi, church Institution.

Before this we would like to convey our Greetings and sincere wishes for Merry Christmas and Happy New-Year.

Since the formation of the F.T.T.C. Trust Society the Institution is not moving smoothly neither at Administrative front nor in the Accademic circle. The Present Principal along with the members of the Trustee form the Top hierarchy of F.T.T.C. Fudi management. Members of the Trustee are supposed to scrutinise the thorough accounts. In spite of all misappropriation of the Institution fund and malpractice is at rampant. We are affraid if such this continues for long, the Institution may be facing closure. Before such situation arises, we are sorry to draw your kind attention and request you to very kindly investigate into the matter and save our church Institute.

In the accademic front the criteria of admission and employment in the Institution is not "What a candidate knows" but "Whom a candidate Knows!"

In the changing enviroment participation of employee in the management has been suggested by the modern ~~thinkx~~ management thinkers but here the concept is not followed and the present Principal thinks that our participation will jeopardise his personal interest. The account is being manipulated and no depth is being done since new Principal and new Secretary have come. We surprise ~~how~~ how the present Secretary of F.T.T.C. Fudi, Mr. P. S. Topno who is not at all fit or suitable for the Institute either becomes a permanent Gossner Mission Nominee? No income and expenditure accounts are prepared for its production, Mess-accounts, Caution Momey, Stipend & other activities. It is petty that the basic neccessities of life not available in the Institute.

The Salary etc. paid to us have neaver been revised in the context of the price rise hence we find actute difficulties in meeting our both ~~handx~~ ends. However, we earnestly appealed to the management and all the Churches heads to redress our sorrows but all in vain. Whenever, we approach for such legitimate demand we are treaten for dire consequences and victimisation. Does this a Christian ethics? No essential other amenities such as Medical facilities, Children's education, Retirement pension and gratuity are provi- to us.

We hope you will kindly look into our genuine grievances through appropriate channel and take necessary steps to redress our miserable life in F.T.T.C. Fudi. We shall be eagerly awaiting for an early reply. Thanking you in anticipation.

We shall be eagerly waiting for an early reply. Thanking you in anticipation.

REPORT WITH HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF F.T.T.C. FUDI.

After independence of our country, India, new plans and thinkings in the country emerged with a view of rebuilding India as an Independent Country. The leaders of different Churches in India also had to redraw their own strategies in view of the India Government's NEW POLICIES WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO FINANCIAL aid from abroad and restrictions in the entry of foreign missionaries.

Like other churches, the G.E.L. Church had to face certain questions, mainly in the matter of self-support in men and money. With the launching of five-years development plans by the Union Govt., the GEL Church had also to redraw its own strategies so as to be able to participate in the development programmes of the Government.

The G.E.L. Church holding landed properties in different Parishes decided to utilise these properties for augmenting her income and also to prepare her members for the coming years when Industrialisation would overtake the mainly agricultural population in Chotanagpur and its neighbouring areas rich in minerals and forest wealth. These ideas were vaguely being mentioned within the G.E.L. Church, but no specific programme was before it to work upon. It was during the visit of Mr. W.E. Horc, the then Secretary of the G.E.L. Church to West Germany in 1956, these questions were discussed between him and the members of the Kuratorium of the Gossner Mission, more particularly with Dr. Hans Lokies, Director of the Gossner Mission and Rev. Simanowsky an important member of the Kuratorium.

The discussion resulted in the sending out of two new type of missionaries in the person of Mr. Thiel, an Engineer and Dr. Junghans an agricultural expert. Mr. Thiel was asked to establish a Technical Training Centre out of town but within easy reach from the town. Village Fudi in Khunti P.S. of the Ranchi District, was chosen for such a centre where villagers willingly made available 21.51 acres of land at nominal price. Dr. Junghans was asked to start an agricultural farm and an Agricultural Training Centre on Church lands at Khuntitoli near Simdega town. These two centres were thus established at Fudi and Khuntitoli.

What was the purpose of starting a Technical Training Centre at Fudi and an Agricultural Training Centre at Khuntitoli? one may ask when such institutions were already there in the district of the Chotanagpur region. The idea was to utilise the Church as an Agency for Development of the society and to bring about a qualitative change in the life of the people of this region. This was thought to be a solid contribution to the development programmes launched by the Government as a supplementary effort.

The then Secretary of the G.E.L. Church, Mr. W.E. Horc had impressed upon the Director, Hanslokies of the Gossner Mission the immediate need of training ordinary youth of the villages irrespective of caste and creed in Basic technical subjects like welding, fitter, building construction, carpentry and such other subjects which could strengthen the base of rural industries traditionally available. Such training it was suggested, would build a technical culture in the villages. Trainees passing through the TTC would not only get employment but would also be able to start their own industries, if they desired. Such trainees would also get easily adjusted in the event of Chotanagpur region becoming highly industrialised when agricultural lands would be repaidly acquired for growing and expanding industries.

The Gossner Mission once convinced of the Project went ahead with enlisting support from several Churches and Congregations in West Germany. "The Bread-for-the-World-Action" which is a German Inter Church Aid Programme got interested in the Project. Thus the T.T.C. was built with the financial help of the "Bread-for-the-World-Action". The Original plan was to run a Training Section and a Production Section.

Production Section's income would support the Training programme once the T.T.C. found its feet on solid grounds. It was the idea to Train up Trainees and also Personnels for managing work out of the membership of the G.E.L. Church. The Trainees would on completing their course be engaged in production work in the T.T.C. itself. They would also be given working sheds in nearby towns to start their own business as ancilliary units of the T.T.C. The T.T.C. would secure orders and supply raw materials and ask these Trainees to produce articles as per specification. In this way production work will be expanded out side the T.T.C. premises.

However, the T.T.C. could not work out these activities as originally planned. The cost of maintenance was comparatively high. So also was the cost of production. Training programme was also patterned on Traditional I.T.I. line. Right from the beginning no one from the G.E.L. Church was groomed for top management functions. Several people came and went who had no attachment or dedication to the Church programme. Thus the original idea of training managerial personnel was not taken up.

Latter, the T.T.C. became a losing concern. The production centre which had started producing steel furniture and other metal items and was earning some profit had to be closed down due to high percentage of cost involved; It could not compete with the neighbouring market.

The training section was continued and is still continuing with the help from abroad.

In 1971 it was decided to involve local Roman Catholic and Anglican Churches in forming a Trust Society for running the Training Centre. This was an ecumenical effort to pull common resources for running the Training Centre. This was possible due to the effort of the Financial Advisor of the Church Mr. R. Montag. A lease deed and an agreement was executed between the G.E.L. Church and the Trust Society on 20th. December 1971.

Today the T.T.C. is being run by the Trust Society through a Governing Body, members of which are the following:-

429 Fitters.
65 Welders.
40 Carpenters.

Trainees had been from all communities as admission is available to students irrespective of caste and creed. Our boys who have come out of the T.T.C. are engaged in several Industrial Concerns. The Training imparted at the T.T.C. is of high quality and the T.T.C. Trainees have high reputation of efficiency.

Staff:- At present there are 22 staff and workers and 96 students all residing in the T.T.C. Campus. The relationship among the staff and between staff and student is very cordial. They have maintained a high standard of discipline in the Centre.

Finance:- As mentioned earlier the F.T.T.C. has been established with the generous help of the Gossner Mission Berlin and funds for recurring expenses like salary of staff and maintenance cost are born by the Gossner Mission. Even after formation of the Trust Society the Gossner Mission continued and is still continuing to finance the running as well as non recurring expenditures. Now the Gossner Mission would like to see some visible attempt being made for becoming self supporting with the local funds. Keeping this in mind and to achieve the object of the Institution as originally planned, the management has restarted a production unit to make it (1) Self Reliant, (2) to help such of the Trainees who ~~like~~ would like to get themselves self employed, by giving them essential help in the shape of tools and advice.

The F.T.T.C. is a Charitable and Educational Institution. It is very unfortunate that due to certain lacuna in the memorandum of the Association the Income Tax Department has imposed a heavy amount of Income Tax for the past several years. Lacuna has since been removed by amendment, effort is being made to get it exempted from the Income Tax. This heavy tax burden has affected the programme of imparting Technical Training Education to the local youths.

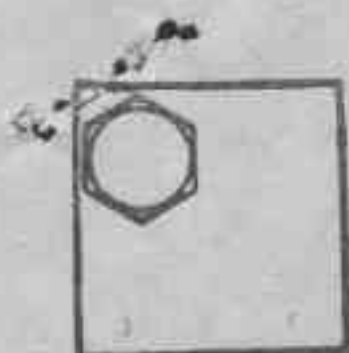
Im September 1981

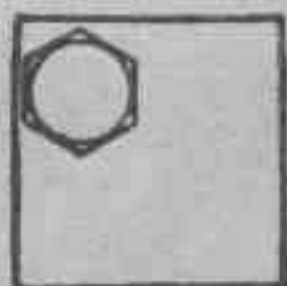

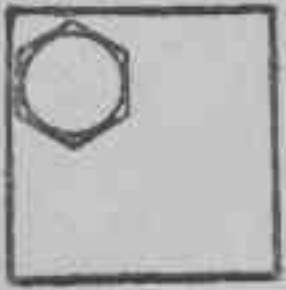

**Name of
Society**

1. The name of the Society is "FUDI TECHNICAL TRAINING CENTRE"

**Registered
office.**

2. The Registered Office of the Society will be situated at G. E. L. Church Office, G. E. L. Church Compound, Main Road, Ranchi in the State of Bihar.

Objects

3. The Society is established for the following objects and purposes :

- (a) To establish maintain or aid in the establishment or maintenance of technical training schools and/or centres with a view to imparting technical education in all its branches to persons regardless of caste creed or nationality.
- (b) To establish maintain or aid in the establishment or maintenance of schools or institutions for training in handicrafts, manual art, trade or occupation.
- (c) To establish maintain or aid in the establishment or maintenance of institutions for the diffusion of useful knowledge with a view to assisting in mechanical inventions, instruments and designs.
- (d) To pay the expense or part of the expense by way of stipends or scholarships to such trainees in all or any of such training schools and/or centres as aforesaid as the Society may think fit.
- (e) To hold in trust any property, moveable or immoveable, which may be demised or given to or vested

in the Society wholly or mainly for such charitable purposes or activities as do not conflict with the basic objects and purposes of the Society and to execute or administer the trust in accordance with the wishes or directions of the authors of the trust.

(f) To promote, subscribe to, assist and amalgamate with or carry on the activities of any other society, association, whether incorporated or not, having objects similar to the objects of the Society.

(g) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise any property (moveable or immoveable), concessions, grants, licenses, privileges, claims and any estate, right or interest in all or any of them and either to retain, hold, develop, work, cultivate and deal with the same for the purposes of the Society or to turn the same to account as may appear to be necessary or convenient for attaining the objects of the Society.

(h) To sell, let on hire, improve, manage, develop, build on, make alterations to or improvements in exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Society.

(i) To invest and deal with the moneys of the society not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined and to vary or dispose of any such investments.

(j) To borrow or raise money for the purposes and objects of the Society and to secure the payment thereof in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Society may think fit.

(k) To lend or advance money, either with or without security, and give credit to such persons and upon such terms and conditions as the Society may think fit.

- (l) To acquire (whether by way of underwriting or subscription or otherwise) hold, sell and otherwise deal in shares, stock, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, mortgages obligations and securities of any kind issued or guaranteed by any company, government, commissioners, trust, municipal local or other authority or body of whatever nature, whether in India or elsewhere.
- (m) To draw, make, accept, discount, endorse, negotiate, buy, sell, execute and issue bills of exchange, promissory notes, cheques, warrants, debentures and other negotiable or transferable instruments or securities.
- (n) To pay for any rights or property acquired by the Society and to remunerate any person, firm or body corporate rendering services to the Society and also to pay wages, salaries, pensions, gratuities, contributions towards provident fund or other sums to any person employed by the Society.
- (o) To procure the registration or recognition of the Society in or under the laws of any place outside India and to open branches of the Society at any place.
- (p) To adopt such means of making known the objects and purposes of the Society as may seem expedient and in particular by advertising in the press by circulars, by exhibitions of works of art or interest or by publication of books and periodicals and by granting prizes, rewards and donations out of the funds of the Society.
- (q) To collect funds and to receive and accept donations, grants of aid, subscriptions, endowments and gifts of money, land, buildings, stocks, shares securities and any other property.
- (r) To do all such other acts, deeds and things as are or may be deemed necessary incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects and purposes aforesaid.

Management 4. The management of the affairs of the Society shall be entrusted to a Board of Governors in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Society. The Board of Governors may from time to time delegate any of their powers to bodies constituted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations and may from time to time revoke such delegation.

Rules and Regulations

Of

Fudi Technical Training Centre

Interpretation.

1. The marginal notes hereto shall not affect the construction hereof and in these presents unless there is something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith:-

"The Society" means "Fudi Technical Training Centre".

"The Act" means the Societies Registration Act, 1860 as applicable to the State of Bihar and includes where the context so admits any re-enactment or statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

"The Board" means the Governing Body for the time being of the Society.

"The Chairman" and "the Vice-Chairman" mean the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman respectively for the time being of the board of the Society.

"Governor" means a member for the time being of the Board.

"Secretary" and "Treasurer" means the Secretary and Treasurer respectively for the time being of the Society and include any person temporarily appointed to perform the duties of the Secretary and/or the Treasurer respectively.

"The Inspector-General of Registration" means the Inspector-General of Registration, Bihar appointed under the Act.

"Office" means the Registered Office of the Society

MEMBERSHIP

Membership. 2. The Society shall consist of not less than seven members. The following persons shall be members of the Society, namely :—

(a) The subscribers to the Memorandum of Association of the Society.

(b) All other persons named in the Memorandum of Association of the Society as the first Governors of the Board.

(c) Such other persons who have been or may be admitted with their consent in writing by the Board at any time and from time to time as members of the Society. PROVIDED ALWAYS that no person shall be a member who has not paid the subscription as may be fixed by the Board or signed the Register of Members of the Society pursuant to Section 15 of the Act.

Cessation. 3. (1) (a) Any member may resign his membership by giving one calendar month's notice in writing to the Board of his intention to do so and upon expiration of such notice he shall cease to be a member of the Society.

(b) The Board may at any time by notice in writing served on any member at his usual or last known address or place of abode require such member to withdraw from the Society and the person so required to withdraw shall at the expiration of one month from such notice being given cease to be a member of the Society.

(2) A member shall also be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the Society if—

(a) he is adjudged to be of unsound mind; or

(b) he is convicted of any offence involving moral turpitude; or

- (c) his membership is revoked by the votes of threefourths of the members of the Society present at a General Meeting.

Power to make bye-laws relating to members.

4. The Board shall have power to make, rescind and vary bye-laws not inconsistent with Rule 3 above relating to the admission of persons to membership of the Society, the circumstances under which any member shall cease to be a member and the rights and obligations of members of the Society.

GENERAL MEETINGS

When Annual General Meetings to be convened.

5. In addition to any other meetings General Meetings of the members of the Society shall be held once in every year within two months from the close of the preceding financial year as specified in Rule 53 hereof at such place and on such date and at such time as shall be determined by the Board. Each such General Meeting shall be called an "Annual General Meeting"; all other General Meetings shall be called "Extraordinary General Meetings".

Business of Annual General Meeting.

6. The business of an Annual General Meeting shall be :—

- (a) To receive, consider and pass the Accounts of the Society and the Reports of the Auditor and the Board which shall be submitted to the meeting.
- (b) To appoint Governors in the place of those retiring.
- (c) To appoint Auditor.
- (d) To discuss the general work and policy of the Society.
- (e) To transact any other business which any member of the Society may wish to place before the Meeting. No member of the Society shall be entitled to move any resolution under this Rule unless a copy of the proposed resolution shall have been sent to the Office seven days before the date of the Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings.

7. Extraordinary General Meetings of the Society may be convened at any time by the Board for the transaction of any business, either on its own motion or at the request of atleast five members of the Society.

Notice of Meetings.

8. Fourteen days' notice at least, specifying place and day and hour of meeting, and in the case of an Extraordinary General Meeting specifying also the nature of the business to be transacted, shall be sent by post to each member who has registered an address in India with the Society. Provided that accidental omission to send a notice or the non-receipt of such notice by any member shall not invalidate any resolution passed or proceedings held at such meeting.

Any meeting may be held on shorter notice than above specified if more than one-half of the members of the Society agree in writing.

Service of Notice.

9. Service of a notice shall be deemed to have been effected at the expiration of forty-eight hours after the same has been posted.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETING

Chairman of General Meeting.

10. The Chairman or in his absence the Vice-Chairman shall preside at and be the Chairman of every General Meeting of the Society. If neither the Chairman nor the Vice-Chairman shall be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, then the members present shall elect a person from among the Governors to preside at such meeting and if no Governor be present or be willing to preside then the members present shall choose one of their number, being a member entitled to vote, to preside at that meeting.

Power to adjourn General Meeting.

11. The Chairman of the meeting may with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present and shall, if so directed by the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the time from

which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given in the same manner as in the case of an original meeting, but otherwise it shall not be necessary to give any notice of adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.

Quorum

12. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. Until otherwise determined a quorum shall be three members of whom at least two shall be present in person. Provided that no person shall be entitled to vote or be counted as a member whose subscription at the time shall have been in arrear for a period exceeding three months.

When quorum not present Meeting to be adjourned.

13. If within half-an-hour from the time appointed for the holding of a General Meeting, a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day of the following week at the same time and place and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for holding the meeting, those members who are present and not being less than two shall constitute a quorum and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

How questions to be decided at meetings.

Casting vote.

14. Every question submitted to a General Meeting shall be decided, in the first instance by a show hands, and in the case of an equality of votes, both on a show of hands and on a poll, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a member.

What is to be evidence of the passing of a resolution where poll not demanded.

15. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by the Chairman or by at least three members present in person or by proxy a declaration by the Chairman of the meeting that a resolution has on a show of hands been carried unanimously or by a particular majority or lost and an entry made to that effect in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes cast in favour of or against such resolution.

Poll permitted.

16. (1) If at any General Meeting a poll is demanded as aforesaid it shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman of the meeting shall direct and either at once or after an interval or adjournment or otherwise and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be decision of the meeting on the resolution on which the poll was demanded. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn. In case of any dispute as to the admission or rejection of a vote the Chairman shall determine the same and such determination made in good faith shall be final and conclusive.

(2) The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

VOTES OF MEMBERS

Voting rights.

17. Save as otherwise provided in Section 15 of the Act at every General Meeting, on a show of hands every member present in person shall have one vote and upon a poll every member present in person or by proxy shall have one vote.

Proxies.

18. On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a member of the Society. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the Office not less than forty-eight hours before the time of holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote. Every instrument appointing a proxy shall, as nearly as circumstances will admit, be in the form or to the effect following :—

MANAGEMENT

Management to be vested in the Board. 19. The management of the Society and of its affairs shall be vested in the Board which shall be the Governing Body of the Society within the meaning of the Act. The Board shall exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised and done by the Society and are not hereby or by legislative enactment expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Society in General Meeting, but no regulation made by the Society in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if that regulation had not been made.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Number of Governors. 20. Until otherwise determined by the Society in General Meeting, the numbers of Governors shall not be less than three nor more than fifteen including the nominated Governors as provided hereinafter.

Appointment of Governors on the Board by nomination. 21. (1) The persons/institutions mentioned in column 1 of the table below shall each be entitled to appoint the number of Governors stated opposite their respective names :

<i>Name of the Nominator</i>	<i>Number of Governors to be nominated on the Board.</i>
1. Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church.	— Two.
2. Church of North, India.	— Two.
3. Roman Catholic Church, Ranchi, Bihar.	— Two.

(2) Each of the above nominators shall have the power to remove any Governor appointed by him/it and to appoint any other person in his place and also to fill any vacancy otherwise occurring in the office of the Governor appointed by him/it.

Power of Board to add to its number. 22. The Board shall have power, at any time and from time to time, to appoint any person (not being a Governor removed pursuant to Rule 29) as a Governor as an addition to the Board but so that the total number of Governors shall not at any time exceed the maximum number fixed by Rule 20. Any Governor so appointed shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting of the Society and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Certain persons not to be Governors. 23. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained no person shall be appointed or nominated as a Governor or as the Secretary or any other Office bearer of the Society if such person is an undischarged insolvent or has been convicted of any offence in connection with the formation, promotion, management or conduct of the affairs of a Society, or a body corporate, or of any offence involving moral turpitude.

The first Governors. 24. The persons hereinafter named shall become and be the first Governors.

6. Mr. Luther Kujur

Retirement of Governors 25. At every Annual General Meeting of the Society every Governor other than a Governor nominated on the Board under Rule 21 (1) shall retire from office but shall be eligible for re-election.

Meeting to fill up vacancies 26. The Society at the Annual General Meeting at which a Governor retires by rotation in accordance with Rule 25 may fill up the vacated office by appointing the retiring Governor or some other person thereto.

Eligibility for election to the Board. 27. No person not being a retiring Governor shall, unless recommended by the Board for election, be eligible for election as a Governor at any General Meeting, unless some member intending to propose him has, not less than seven days before the meeting, left at the office a notice in writing duly signed signifying the intention of such member to propose him as a candidate for the office.

Society in General Meeting can increase or reduce the number of Governors. 28. The Society in General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Governors within the limits fixed by Rule 20.

Society in General Meeting can remove Governors. 29. Subject to the provisions of these Rules the Society may, by the votes of three-fourths of the members present at a General Meeting, remove a Governor. If the Governor so removed was appointed in accordance with Rule 21 (1), the nominator (whose nominee such removed Governor was) may appoint a new Governor in the place of the removed Governor within one month from the date of the meeting at which such removal takes place.

Ipsso facto vacation of office by Governor. 30. The office of a Governor shall ipso facto become vacant if -

- (a) he is adjudged an insolvent; or
- (b) he has been convicted of any offence in connection with the formation, promotion or management or conduct of affairs of a society or of a body corporate or of any offence involving moral turpitude; or
- (c) he has resigned by giving one month's notice in writing to the Board; or
- (d) he has been removed (i) by the Society in General Meeting or (ii) in the manner laid down in Rule 21 (2); or

- (e) he absents himself from three consecutive meetings of the Board or from all meetings of the Board for a continuous period of three months whichever is longer without obtaining leave of absence from the Board; or
- (f) he is requested in writing by all other Governors to vacate his office.

Board may fill up casual vacancies.

31. If any Governor appointed by the Society in General Meeting vacates office as a Governor before his term of office will expire in the normal course the resulting casual vacancy may be filled up by the Board at a meeting of the Board, but any person so appointed shall retain his office so long as the vacating Governor would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred. Provided that the Board may not fill such vacancy by appointing thereto any person who has been removed from the office of Governor under Rule 29.

Board may act notwithstanding vacancy.

32. The continuing Governors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body; but so that if the number falls below the minimum above fixed the Board shall not, except for the purpose of filling vacancies or of summoning a General Meeting, act so long as the number is below the minimum.

Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

Chairman and vice-Chairman of the Board.

33. The Board shall appoint a Chairman and Vice-Chairman of its meetings and determine the periods upto which they shall hold such office. Until otherwise determined by the Board Mr. H. Samad shall be the first Chairman and Rev. Fr. A. Delbeke shall be the first Vice-Chairman of the Board.

Chairman of meetings of the Board.

34. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board. If the Chairman shall not be present at any meeting, the Vice-Chairman shall preside and if neither of them is present then the Governors present shall elect some one of their number to preside at the meeting.

Proceedings of the Board.

Meetings of Board and Quorum.

35. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings and proceedings as it may think fit and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, three members shall be a quorum.

Who may summon meeting.

36. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman may at any time and the Secretary, if any, upon the request of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, or in the absence of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, at the request of any two Governors shall convene a meeting of the Board. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of the Board to a Governor who is not for the time being resident in the place where such meetings are usually held.

How questions to be decided.

37. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

Powers of Meeting.

38. A meeting of the Board at which a quorum be present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers and discretions for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Board generally.

When resolution without meeting valid.

39. A resolution in writing which has been circulated to all the Governors for the time being in India (not being less than three) and assented to by a majority of such Governors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Board duly called and held.

Minutes, Appointment of Officer etc.

Minutes to be made.

40. The Board shall cause minutes to be kept by making within thirty days of the conclusion of every General Meeting and of every meeting of the Board or of every Committee of the Board, entries thereof in

separate minute books with their pages consecutively numbered. The last page of the record of proceedings of each meeting in such book shall be dated and signed by the Chairman of the respective meeting or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting. The minutes when recorded and signed as aforesaid shall be accepted as a true record of the business transacted at such meetings.

**Officers and
Office of the
Society.**

41. (1) The Board shall from time to time appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer and shall determine the duties and authorities of each such official.

(2) The Board may delegate to the Secretary and to the Treasurer such powers as may be necessary to enable each official to carry out his duties respectively.

(3) The Board may appoint other officers and allocate them such duties as may be determined, subject to these Rules.

(4) The Board shall from time to time nominate the situation of the Office.

Committees

**Power to
appoint
Committees.**

42. The Board may appoint Committee or Committees for special purposes consisting of such one or more persons (whether members of the Society or not) as it may think fit and may entrust such Committee or Committees with such powers and duties as it may think fit. Any Committee so appointed shall in exercise of the powers and duties so entrusted conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed upon it by the Board. The Board shall have power to dissolve such Committee or Committees.

**Proceedings
of the Com-
mittees.**

43. The meetings and proceedings of any such Committee shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Board so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by any regulation made by the Board. Each Committee shall fix its own quorum. The Chairman shall be an ex-officio member of each Committee so appointed.

Miscellaneous

Power to appoint Attorney.

44. The Board may appoint any person or corporation to be the constituted attorney of the Society for any purpose or purposes.

Power to sue.

45. The Society shall sue and be sued and all applications or legal proceedings on behalf of or against the Society shall be brought made and taken in the name of the Chairman.

Seal

Seal.

46. The Board shall provide for the safe custody of the seal of the Society and the Seal shall not be used except in pursuance of a resolution of the Board.

Signature on behalf of Society on document to which seal is affixed.

47. A document to which the seal of the Society is affixed shall be signed on behalf of the Society by two Governors and shall be counter-signed by the Secretary, if any.

Properties of the Society

Property of the Society to be vested in the Board.

48. (1) All properties of the Society whether moveable or immoveable shall be deemed to be vested in the Board who shall provide for the custody of the same and shall have power to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise deal with the same and also to purchase, take on lease, accept grants of or otherwise acquire moveable or immoveable property on behalf of the Society and to enter into all contracts and covenants on its behalf. The Board shall cause to be maintained proper books of account in respect of all properties of the Society.

Vesting of property in Trustees.

(2) The Board shall have power to vest all the properties of the Society whether moveable or immoveable in trustees to be appointed by the Board upon such terms and trusts as the Board shall think fit and shall have power to make with the Trustees such arrangements with regard to the day-to-day management of all the property of the Society as the Board shall in its absolute discretion think fit.

Funds, Bank Accounts etc.

Funds.

49. All Bank Accounts and deposits shall be opened kept and made in the name of the Society.

Power to invest, etc.

50. The Board shall have the management of the funds of the Society and shall have power to invest in the name of the Society or in the name of its nominees, lend or otherwise deal with the same and to vary investments from time to time and to incur such expenditure as it may think necessary and proper.

Power to Borrow.

51. The Board shall have power to borrow money for the Society upon such terms as to security and rate of interest or otherwise as the Board shall decide.

How the cheques, etc. to be drawn.

52. Unless otherwise determined by the Board, all cheques, bills of exchange, promissory notes including promissory notes of the Government of India and other similar documents shall be drawn, accepted or made on behalf of the Society by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and counter-signed by the Secretary or Treasurer (if any) or by such other person or persons as shall be nominated from time to time by the Board. Endorsement of the cheques for deposit into the Society's Bank Account may however be made by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary or Treasurer severally.

ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT THEREOF

Accounts.

53. The Board shall cause true accounts to be kept at the Office of all sums of money received and the sources thereof and sums of money expended by the Society and of the objects and purposes for which such receipts and expenditure take place and of the assets and liabilities of the Society. The first financial year of the Society shall be from the date of registration of the Society to 31st December 1971 and the succeeding financial years shall end on the last of December each year.

Accounts to be audited annually.

54. The Board shall cause the accounts of the Society to be audited once a year by a duly qualified Auditor and have the Balance Sheet and Receipts and Expenditure Accounts prepared by him.

**Appointment
of Auditors.**

55. (1) The First Auditor of the Society shall be appointed by the Board within one month after the date of registration of the Society and the Auditor so appointed shall hold office until the conclusion of the First Annual General Meeting of the Society.

(2) The Society shall at each Annual General Meeting appoint an Auditor to hold office from the conclusion of that meeting until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

**Certification
of Accounts.**

56. The Auditor of the Society shall submit a report showing the exact state of the financial affairs of the Society. Three copies of the Balance Sheet and Receipts and Expenditure Accounts and the Auditor's Report shall be certified by the Auditor.

FILING OF DOCUMENTS

**Annual list
of the -
Governors
to be filed.**

57. (1) Within fourteen days after the holding of every Annual General Meeting the Board shall cause to be filed with the Inspector General of Registration (i) a list of the names, addresses and occupations of the Governors (ii) a statement showing all the changes during the year in the personnel of the Board and (iii) a copy of the Rules of the Society corrected up-to-date certified to be true by at least three Governors.

**Filing of
reports
etc.**

(2) Within first quarter after the close of every financial year the Board shall furnish to the Inspector-General of Registration a Report of the activities of the Society during the previous year and the audited Receipts and Expenditure Accounts for the said financial year as passed and approved at the relative Annual General Meeting of the Society.

The Board shall also furnish to the Inspector-General of Registration quarterly statistics in the prescribed Form for quarters ending in March, June, September and December of each year by the 15th of the month following each quarter.

REGISTER OF MEMBERS

Register of Members.

58. The Board shall cause to be maintained at the office a Register of the Members of the Society and shall enter thereon the following particulars, namely .—

- a) the name and address of each member,
- b) the date on which such member was admitted, and
- c) the date on which a member ceased to be such.

Any admission of a member or cessation of membership shall be entered within fifteen days of such happening in the Register of Members to be maintained under this Rule.

BYE-LAWS

Power to make bye laws.

59. The Board shall have power to make bye-laws for the conduct and management of the Society and for the conduct of all committees, officers and agents of the Society or for any other purposes whatsoever provided that such bye-laws do not conflict with these Rules and any rules made under the Act.

INSPECTION

Inspection of Register of Members, Minute Book and Accounts of the Society

60. (1) The Register of Members and the Minute Book of General Meetings of the Society shall be kept at the Office and shall be open to inspection by members during the hours of 2 P. M. and 4 P. M. on every business day.

(2) The Board shall, from time to time, determine whether and to what extent and under what conditions the books and documents of the Society (other than those referred to in (1) above) or any of them shall be open to the inspection of the members not being a Governor and no member not being a Governor shall have any right of inspecting any books of account or book or document of the Society except as conferred by law or authorised by the Board or the Society in General Meeting.

AMENDMENTS

Amendments. 61. (1) These Rules may be amended by any General Meeting of the Society by the votes of at least three-fourths of the members either present in person or by proxy provided that the amendment shall have been proposed in writing and circulated to all members of the Society two weeks in advance of such General Meeting. Such amendments may be accepted by the General Meeting with or without modification.

(2) A copy of each amendment made to the Rules certified to be a true copy by not less than three of the Governors should be filed with the Inspector General of Registration within fifteen days after it is made.

Application Of Income Of Society.

Application of income of Society. 62. The income and property of the Society whensoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects and purposes of the Society as set forth in its Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonuses or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Society or otherwise PROVIDED THAT nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment of remuneration to any employee of the Society or other person in return for services actually rendered to this Society.

DISSOLUTION

Dissolution. 63. The Society in General Meeting may at any time by resolution passed by not less than three-fifths of its members resolve upon the dissolution of the Society to take effect as from such date as it may determine and the provisions of Section 13 of the Act shall apply.

Upon a dissolution no distribution to members. 64. If upon the dissolution of the Society there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Society or any of

them but shall be given or transferred to some other society to be determined by votes of not less than three-fifths of the members present personally or by proxy at the time of the dissolution or in default thereof by the principal Court of Original Civil Jurisdiction having jurisdiction over the Society in terms of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 as applicable to the State of Bihar.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE GOSSNER EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH IN
CHOTANAGPUR AND ASSAM.

(Effective from July 1, 1960)

Note :- Vide resolution of the Mahasabha of April 27-May 1, 1960

ARTICLE ONE

NAME AND REGISTRATION.

1. The Body organised under this Constitution shall be called "The Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam." The short name of this body in this Constitution shall be the "Gossner Church".

NOTE: It is understood that the term "Chotanagpur" does not mean the Chotanagpur Division only, but the whole of Bihar and all the adjacent States also in which members of the Gossner Church reside.

2. The Gossner Church was duly registered on July 30, 1921 in the Office of the Registrar, Joint Stock Companies, Patna under the Societies Registration Act, 21 of 1860. No. -J. ~~272~~ 273

ARTICLE TWO

DOCTRINAL BASIS.

1. The Gossner Church receives and holds the canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the inspired Word of God, and as the only infallible rule and standard of faith and practice according to which all doctrines and teachers are to be judged.
2. The Gossner Church accepts the three ecumenical creeds: namely Apostles, the Nicene and the Athanasian, as important testimonials drawn from the Holy Scriptures and rejects all errors which they condemn.
3. The Gossner Church receives and holds the Unaltered Augsburg Confession as a correct exhibition of the faith and the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, founded upon the word of God; and acknowledges all Churches that sincerely hold and faithfully confess the Doctrines of the Unaltered Augsburg Confession, to be entitled to the name of "Evangelical Lutheran".
4. The Gossner Church recognises the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Smalkald Articles, the Large and Small Catechisms of Martin Luther and the Formula of Concord, as being in harmony with the one and the same scriptural faith.

ARTICLE THREE

MEMBERSHIP

1. All persons baptized in the Gossner Church are members of that Church.
2. Baptized Christians belonging to another Christian denomination may be accepted into membership upon application to a Pastor of the Gossner Church. The Pastor will receive such persons into membership in a regular service, after they declare publicly

their acceptance of the faith of this Church, and if need be, after proper instruction in that faith.

3. Members of the Gossner Church who have been put under major excommunication lose their membership. They may be readmitted after a public confession of their repentance in a regular service.
4. Non-Lutheran congregations which accept the doctrinal basis and the Constitution of the Gossner Church may be received as congregations of the Gossner Church, after a public declaration of their faith. The members of such congregations thus become members of the Gossner Church.

ARTICLE FOUR BASIC PRINCIPLES AND ORGANISATION.

In accordance with the foregoing Doctrinal Basis, the Gossner Church sets forth and declares the following principles as fundamental for its organisation:

Part I: BASIC PRINCIPLES.

1. The full authority in the Church belongs primarily and exclusively to our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, the Head of the Church. This power is not delegated to any man or body of man.
2. All just power exercised by the Church has been committed to her as the servant of Jesus Christ for the furtherance of the Gospel through the Word and Sacrament. The Church, therefore, has no power to bind the conscience of any one except as she teaches what her Lord teaches and faithfully commands what He has charged her to command.
3. In obedience to her one Lord, the Church is bound to seek and preserve constantly the unity of the believers in faith and in witness, irrespective of whatever social or racial groups they may have come from (Gal. 3:28). In the same obedience, the Church must so organise herself that under her Constitution the different individuals and groups can live together in love and mutual respect for the God-given freedom of each individual and group (I Cor. 9:1-23).
4. The authorities and tasks given to the Church are authorities and tasks of the Whole Church. Therefore they are to be administered by all constituent parts of the Church, local congregations, regional units and central bodies acting together, severally or jointly, as set forth in this Constitution of the Church, local congregations, regional units and central bodies acting together, severally or jointly, as set forth in this Constitution and its Bye-laws. (Eqh. 2:1 Cor 10:15-17: 12:12-31).

Part II: ORGANISATION.

1. A Pracharakpan is the smallest organisational unit of the Church. It consists of all the Christians in one or several villages worshipping together at one centre. It is led by a Pracharak who is aided and advised in his work by a Pracharakpan Panch. Where there is no Pracharak in a Pracharakpan, the meetings of the Pracharakpan shall be presided over by a person appointed by the Ilaka Panch. That person shall act as the

substitute for the Pracharak.

2. A Padripan consists of one or several Pracharaks. The spiritual authority of the Padripan is vested in the Pastor. The administrative authority of the Padripan is the Padripan Panch. The pastor is the Chairman of the Padripan Panch by virtue of his office.
 3. An Ilaka consists of one or several Padripan. The spiritual authority of the Ilaka is vested in the Ilaka Padri. The administrative authority of an Ilaka is the Ilaka Panch. The Ilaka Padri is the Chairman of the Ilaka Panch by virtue of his office.
 4. A synod ordinarily consists of several Ilakas. The spiritual authority of the Synod is vested in the Synod Sanchalak. The administrative authorities of a Synod are the Synod Sabha and the Synod Samiti. The Synod Sanchalak is the Chairman of these bodies by virtue of his office.*
 - 5(a) An Anchal consists of several synods. An Anchal is a self-contained and in all internal affairs a self-governing organisational unit of the Church.
 - (b) The spiritual authority of an Anchal is vested in the Anchal Adhyaksh.
 - (c) The administrative responsibility of an Anchal is exercised by the Anchal Sabha and its Samiti and the Anchal Ministerium which consists of all pastors working in the Anchal. The Adhyaksh is the Chairman of these administrative bodies by virtue of his office.
 - (d) The one and indivisible Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church at present consists of four administrative units, known as Anchals, and they are, (1) The Assam Anchal (2) The North-Western Anchal. (3) The Orissa Anchal and (4) The South-Eastern Anchal.*
- These Anchals are self-contained, autonomous bodies only in so far as their internal administration is concerned. They are members of One Body, viz the Gossner Church. In and through the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, they express this unity of the Church in spite of its diversity. These Anchals are inseparable component parts of one and the same Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam.
- (e) The formation of the new Anchals or alteration of the existing limits of the present Anchals shall be decided by the Kendriya Salahkari Samiti in consultation with the Statutory Board for the Rights of Communities and the Standing Committee for Inter Anchal Relationships on the one hand, and with the Anchals concerned on the other.
- 6 (a) The Pracharakpans, Padripan, Ilaka Synods, Anchals and Central organisational units, all working together constitute the One Gossner Church.
- (b) The spiritual authority of the Gossner Church is vested in the Pramukh Adhyaksh.

- (c) In his spiritual functions the Pramukh Adhyaksh is advised and aided by the Ministerium of the Gossner Church.
- (d) The administrative authority of the Gossner Church is vested in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. The moveable and immoveable property of the Gossner Church shall be vested for the time being in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. The administrative authority of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha is however limited in the following ways :
- (i) The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha cannot interfere in the internal administration of the Anchals.
- (ii) All decisions affecting ~~the doctrine and the worship of the Church, the general status of the Church and of its workers, need an independent corroborative decision of the Anchals or the Ministerium of the Gossner Church, as the case may be, in order to become effective.~~ the doctrine and the worship of the Church, the general status of the Church and of its workers, need an independent corroborative decision of the Anchals or the Ministerium of the Gossner Church, as the case may be, in order to become effective.
- (e) The Pramukh Adhyaksh is the Chairman of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha by virtue of his office.
- (f) The Gossner Church will have four office bearers namely: the Pramukh Adhyaksh, the Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh, the Secretary and the Treasurer.
- (g) For all activities which are activities of the whole Church there shall be four Central Boards, namely: the Board of Evangelism and Literature, the Board of Property, the Board of Education, and the Board of Theological Education. The Central Boards shall be responsible to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and to the Anchal Sabha in all matters affecting the whole Church. If only one or more Anchals are concerned and not the whole Church, then the Central Boards shall be responsible to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Sabha or Sabhas of the Anchals concerned.

* Note :- For details see the Schedule appended to this Constitution which shows the composition of the Gossner Church. The Schedule is subject to revision.

ARTICLE FIVE DUTIES AND OBJECTS.

The objects of the Gossner Church are :

1. To preserve and extend the pure teaching of the Gospel and the right administration of the Sacraments (Eph. 4:5-6: The Augsburg Confession Art. 7.).
2. To conserve the Unity of the true faith (Eph. 4:3-16, I Cor. I:10). to guard against any departure therefrom (Rom. 16:17), and to strengthen the Church in its faith and confession.
3. To preserve and develop its autonomy.
4. To express outwardly the unity of the Church and all its organisational units, to foster cooperation among all Lutherans in the promotion of the general interests of the Church, to seek the unification of all Lutherans in one true faith, and thus

develop and unfold the specific Lutheran principles and practices and make them effective in the Church.

5. To bear witness to Jesus Christ, the Lord and Saviour, before all non-Christians inside and outside the area of the Gossner Church, and to win them for Jesus Christ.
6. To minister in the love of Jesus Christ to all those who are in physical distress.

ARTICLE SIX

DUTIES AND ACTIVITIES.

In order to fulfil the objects mentioned in Art. V the Gossner Church will initiate and carry out the following activities through one or all of her organisational units, acting jointly or severally as described in the Constitution.

1. To instruct pastors, pracharaks, pracharikas and teachers, and to establish, administer and maintain schools for their training. To maintain the Theological College, The Pracharaks' Training School. The Tabita Bible and Buniyadi Training School. The Gossner High School, The Bethesda Girls' High School, The Women's Training School and two Primary Schools at Ranchi etc.
2. To test the candidates and ordain them as at present.
3. To appoint Pastors and candidates in the Anchals and to transfer them from one Anchal to another with the consent of the Anchals.
4. To arrange refresher courses for the Pastors of the whole Church once in two years.
5. To extend the Kingdom of God by participating in evangelistic efforts of Christians and by preaching the Gospel to non-Christians inside and outside India.
6. To order the human outward rites of worship in such a manner that it's signs and practices be according to the teachings of the New Testament and the freedom of the Church, so that the Body of Christ may be built by them.
7. To gather the statistics of the Church through the Anchals.
8. To appoint Editors and Editorial Boards or Committees for newsmagazines and Sunday School Literature of the Church.
9. To prepare Literature for the spread of the knowledge of the doctrines, rites etc. of the Gossner Church,
10. To publish news-papers for the Church.
11. To maintain and administer the G.E.L. C. Press.
12. To prepare budgets of the Church year by year.
13. To encourage the practices of Christian Stewardship in all the congregations according to the teachings of the Holy scriptures.

14. To maintain and administer the properties of the Church with the co-operation of the Anchals, and to vest the movable and immovable properties of the Gossner Church, for the time being, in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.
15. To fix the scales of pay for Pastors and other employees of the Church.
16. To maintain the records of the Provident Fund accounts of workers.
17. To give financial assistance to the Anchals for the evangelistic work and other special projects.
18. To earmark money in the budget for helping the poor and deserving college students.
19. To fix rates of subscription and to collect and spend the collected funds for the objects stated in this Constitution.
- ✓ 20. To constitute Boards and Committees for the different activities of the Church.
21. To consider the problems of the entire Church and to prepare and publish necessary rules, regulations and plans. But normally such rules and regulations shall be entrusted to the Anchals for execution.
22. (i) To encourage the organisations of the Gossner Church and to foster a spirit of unity in the whole Church, the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha should send at least one of its members to the annual meetings of the Anchals, who should explain matters relating to central administration and practice.
(ii) To encourage Anchals to send at least one fraternal delegate to the annual meeting of the neighbouring Anchals.
23. To develop a living fellowship in the whole Church in faith and freedom, by all methods and to establish unity, not uniformity, in thought, belief, aim, work and witness.
24. To care, preserve and expand congregations, schools, and evangelistic work of every Anchal within its limits.
25. To foster and improve the work of the Anchals, to look after the interests of the Church, and to advise Anchals at the request of any Anchal on matters relating to doctrine, worship, and administration. Anchal on matter relating to doctrine, worship, and administration.
26. To keep contact with outside bodies.
27. To keep contact with other Churches in the unity of the faith and to send and receive official delegates.

ARTICLE SEVEN PRACHARAKPAN PANCH.

1. COMPOSITION.

The Pracharakpan Panch shall consist of elected members.

The Pracharak shall be a member and chairman by virtue of his office. The period of membership in the Pracharakpan Panch shall be for three years.

2. RIGHT OF VOTE.

In all elections to be held in accordance with the Constitution of the Gossner Church, only confirmed members, and of them only those who have paid their Church contributions and are not under Church discipline, shall have the right to vote.

3. ELECTION.

- (a) For every 50 confirmed members (And of the balance for more than half of 50) of each Village (Tola) one representative shall be elected by each Village (tola) as member of the Pracharakpan Panch.
- (b) At least one representative must be elected by each village which has more than ten confirmed members.
- (c) Where there is a minority community comprising more than ten percent of all the elected representatives must be a member of that community. In that case the Pastor shall determine, from time to time, before each election from which village (Tola) that member shall be elected.
- (d) The election and necessary by elections must be announced at least fourteen days in advance. The Pracharak shall be the Chairman of the electoral meeting.
- (e) The result of the election shall be communicated for scrutiny and confirmation to the Ilaka Statutory Board for the Rights of Communities.

4 FUNCTIONS.

- (a) The Pracharakpan Panch will advise and assist the Pracharak in his duties which are :- (1) to preserve the unity of the congregation, (2) to strengthen the brethren in Christian love, (3), to nurture the members of the congregation in Christian faith, and (4) to proclaim the Gospel to non-Christians within his jurisdiction.
- (b) This Panch will act as the local representative of the Board of Property and work under its direction to find suitable sites for its Chapel, Pracharak's house, School, Cemetery etc., to construct houses required for those purposes, and to repair them and keep them in good condition.
- (c) This Panch will have a watch over all the members of the congregation in regard to their conduct and Christian character and try to save them from falling into sin. In case some allegations are brought against a member through the Pracharak, this Panch will assist him in determining the correctness of the allegations and then forward the matter to the Pastor for necessary action.
- (d) This Panch will collect all the Mandli Paisa and deposit it with the Pastor for transmission to the Anchal Sabha through the proper channel.

- (e) This Panch will meet once every month and shall maintain a minutes Book to record all the proceedings of the meetings of the Pracharakpan Panch and will be responsible to the pastor for all matter connected with the congregation it represents.
- (f) This Panch will collect all the offerings of the congregation and will see that all receipts are carefully entered in the cash book of the Treasurer and that the Treasurer deposits regularly the entire income monthly at a time appointed by the Padripan Panch either personally or through the Pracharak.
- (g) This Panch, will arrange for Sunday School, Youth Organisation and Women(s) Samiti and it will be responsible for maintaining proper relationship with such organisations throughout the Parish to which it belongs.
- (h) This Panch will be responsible to preserve and strengthen the integrity of the congregation by itself and in its relationship with the rest of the Gossner Church.
- (i) This Panch will assist the Pracharak in making arrangements for the preaching of the Word and the administration of the sacraments to the members of the congregation.
- (j) This Panch will advise the Pracharak when he is to recommend to the higher authorities applications for admission to the Theological College and other Church institutions as may be required by the institutions concerned and will also recommend all cases of baptism, confirmation, marriage etc.

5 MEETINGS AND QUORUM

The Pracharakpan Panch shall meet ordinarily every month. One third of its total membership shall form the quorum.

ARTICLE EIGHT. PADRIPAN PANCH:

1. COMPOSITION.

The Padripan Panch shall consist of members elected by the Pracharakpan Panches of that Padripan. The pastor and all Pracharaks who are in active service in the Padripan shall be members by virtue of their office. The Pastor shall be the Chairman by virtue of his office. The period of membership in the Padripan Panch shall be for three years.

2. RIGHT OF VOTE

Article VII Para 2 shall be observed.

3. ELECTION.

- (a) For every 100 (and of the balance for more than one half of one hundred) confirmed members of a Pracharakpan one representative shall be elected as member of the Padripan Panch.
- (b) The Pracharakpan Panches shall elect the representatives on this basis from amongst their members.
- (c) There shall be at least one elected representative from each Pracharakpan in the Padripan Panch.

- (d) Where there is a minority community comprising more than 10 % of the confirmed members in the Padripan, at least one of the elected representatives must be a member of that community. In that case the Pastor shall determine before each election from which constituency that member should be elected.
- (e) The result of the election shall be communicated (for scrutiny and confirmation) to the Ilaka Statutory Board for the right of communities.
- (f) Article VII 3(d) Shall be observed.

4. FUNCTIONS:

- (a) To see that the Pracharakpan Panches are properly organised that they function according to the rules of the Gossner Church.
- (b) To supervise, direct and help the Pracharakpan in the discharge of all the functions assigned to them.
- (c) To make recommendations to the Ilaka regarding appointment, discharge, transfer etc. of the Pracharaks and other workers of the Pracharakpans.
- (d) To assist the Padri in the discharge of his duties within the Padripan.
- (e) To receive reports from all the Pracharaks and the Padri working within its jurisdiction and to advise and help them.
- (f) To receive all the income from the Pracharakpans and other sources (e.g. the rents from houses on the compound, sale of fruits etc) produced in the area of the Padripan and assigned to it by the Board of Property.
- (g) To deposit all the money received promptly with the Treasurer of the Ilaka Panch, to submit monthly bills to the Ilaka for the needs of the Padripan and to disburse the money received from the Ilaka Panch.
- (h) To find suitable students for the Theological College, Tabita Bible and Buniyadi Training School, the Pracharaks' Training School etc. and to recommend them to the authorities concerned.
- (i) To hold monthly meetings and plan for instruction of Pracharaks and lay leaders and to see that the catechumens are properly prepared for active membership of the Church.
- (j) To survey fields for evangelistic work and to arrange for the same in consultation with the Ilaka Panch.
- (k) To maintain the Membership Register, Minutes Book, and Cash Book, Records of Registers of Marriages, Births and Deaths, Baptism Confirmation, Marriage, Holy communion, and Excommunication, Record of Church properties etc. in the Padripan.
- (l) To establish schools and other institutions in consultation with and under the direction of the Ilaka Panch and to maintain them.

- (m) To maintain the Statistics in the prescribed form and to submit the same as and when asked for.

5. MEETINGS AND QUORUM.

The Padripan Panch shall meet every month and 1/3 of its membership shall form the Quorum.

ARTICLE NINE THE ILAKA PANCH

1. COMPOSITION.

The Ilaka Panch shall consist of the members elected by the Padripan Panches. All the Pastors who are in active service in the Ilaka shall be members by virtue of their office. Lutheran headmasters and headmistresses of all educational institutions serving the whole Ilaka shall become members by virtue of their office. If the headmaster or headmistress of the school concerned is not a Lutheran then the Lutheran members of the staff of the school concerned shall elect one from among themselves to the Ilaka Panch. The Ilaka Padri appointed by the Synod Sabha shall be the Chairman by virtue of his office. The period of membership in the Ilaka Panch shall be 3 years.

2. RIGHT OF VOTE

Article VII Para 2 shall be observed.

3. ELECTION.

- (a) For every 500 (and of the balance for more than half of 500) confirmed members of a Padripan, one representative shall be elected as member of the Ilaka Panch.
- (b) The Padripan Panches shall elect the representatives on that basis from amongst their members.
- (c) There shall be at least one elected representative from each Padripan.
- (d) Where there is a minority community comprising at least 5% of the confirmed members of the Ilaka, there must be at least one elected representative from such community. In that case the Ilaka Padri shall determine from time to time before each election which Padripan shall elect that member.
- (e) The result of the election shall be communicated (for scrutiny and confirmation) to the Ilaka Statutory Board for the rights of communities.
- (f) Article VII 3(d) Shall be observed.

4. FUNCTIONS.

- (a) To see to it that the Padripan Panches are properly organised and that they function in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Gossner Church.

- (b) To see that the Word of God and the Sacraments are rightly preached and administered.
- (c) To survey fields for evangelism within its jurisdiction and to appoint Pracharaks for the fields where needed.
- (d) To hold meetings and conferences in the Ilaka for the employees of the Church and also for the laymen and to maintain the integrity of the whole Ilaka and to lead the whole membership in the unity of faith and witness.
- (e) To elect its Executive Committee (not exceeding seven members,) Not more than half of its membership shall be clergy.
- (f) To hold the quarterly meetings of the Ilaka Panch and the monthly meetings of its executive and to transact all business arising from reports, applications, appeals etc. from Padripan Panches, higher authorities, Pastors and the Ilaka Chairman.
- (g) To receive all incomes from all the Padripans and to enter the receipts and expenses carefully into the account books.
- (h) To prepare budgets for the whole Ilaka and to collect funds for the purposes approved by the Ilaka Panch in consultation with its immediate higher authority.
- (i) To spend the money received according to the budget.
- (j) To maintain all such Books and Registers which are prescribed by the Gossner Church.
- (k) To safeguard the interests of the communities within the Ilaka by constituting a Statutory Board for the rights of communities.
- (l) To establish and administer schools and other institutions and to abolish them with the previous approval of the immediate higher authority.
- (m) To appoint Pracharaks for the congregations, and teachers and workers for other institutions within its jurisdiction to transfer discharge or take other suitable actions against the defaulters. In the appointment etc. of teachers the rules as of the Education Department accepted by the Gossner Church shall be observed.
- (n) To preserve and protect the properties of the Church and to assist the Board of Property in the management of the same.
- (o) To co-operate with the higher authorities in all the schemes and projects approved and accepted by the authorities concerned and to comply with all the orders received from them.
- (p) To maintain the statistics in the prescribed form and to submit the same as and when asked for.

5. MEETINGS AND QUORUM.

The Ilaka Panch shall meet ordinarily once a quarter, and its Executive Committee once a month. One-third membership of each organisation shall form its quorum.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN.

THE MINISTERIUM OF THE ANCHAL.

1. All the ordained men of the Anchal shall from the Ministerium of the Anchal. The Anchal Adhyaksh shall be the chairman of the Ministerium by virtue of his office.
2. If there be any complaint of heresy against any pastor, it shall be considered by the Ministerium and reported to the Anchal Sabha.
3. The Ministerium shall bring constructive criticisms for the spiritual improvement of the Anchal.
4. The Ministerium shall have its meetings ordinarily at the time of the meetings of the Anchal Sabha. One third of its total membership shall form the quorum.
5. The ministerium shall send all its recommendations and decisions to the Anchal Sabha for approval.
6. The ordained members of the Anchal Samiti shall form the Executive Committee of the Anchal Ministerium. It shall meet ordinarily once a quarter at the time of the meetings of the Anchal Samiti. One third of its total membership shall form its quorum.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN.

THE ANCHAL SAMITI.

1. COMPOSITION: The Anchal Samiti shall consist of members elected by the Ilakas of the Anchal. It shall ordinarily meet once a quarter. One third of its total membership shall form its quorum.
2. ELECTION:
 - a) ^{Each} Ilaka Panch shall elect two members from amongst its representatives in the Anchal Sabha. One of them shall be a pastor and the other shall be a laymen. The Adhyaksh of the Anchal shall be a member and the Chairman by virtue of his office. The membership in the Anchal Samiti shall be for three years.
 - b) The office-bearers of the Anchal shall be members of the samiti by virtue of their office.
 - c) If there is a minority community comprising at least 10% of the total confirmed membership of the Anchal, not represented among the elected members of the Anchal Samiti, then the Anchal Samiti shall be bound to co-opt at least one member of that minority community.
 - d) The rule laid down in Article VII Para 3-(d) and (e) shall be followed.
3. FUNCTION: The functions of the Anchal Samiti shall be as follows :-

The Anchal Samiti shall be the Executive body of the Anchal

Sabha. Its actions shall be reported to the members of the Anchal Sabha for confirmation within a fortnight under ordinary circumstances. If a majority of the members of the Anchal Sabha object in writing to the proposed decision, it shall be dropped. But, if only one third of the members of the Anchal Sabha object in writing, then it shall be held over until the next meeting of the Anchal Samiti.

ARTICLE SIXTEEN.

THE OFFICERS OF THE ANCHAL.

1. Each Anchal shall have four officers namely, the Adhyaksh, the Up-Adhyaksh, the Secretary, and the Treasurer. The Adhyaksh shall be a paid officer. The Secretary and the Treasurer shall ordinarily be paid workers. The Up-Adhyaksh shall be an honorary officer. In the first instance the Kendfiya Salahkari Sabha shall determine the emoluments of the officers of the Anchals.
2. The office bearers of the Anchal shall be elected in the following manner :-

- a) A Nomination Committee shall be constituted by the Anchal Sabha as follows :-

The Nomination Committee shall consist of six or nine members. The Adhyaksh shall admonish the Anchal Sabha that the members proposed for the Nomination Committee should bear characteristics mentioned here-below :-

- i) That they are sound judges of character.
- ii) That they are impartial.
- iii) That they do have sufficient knowledge of the affairs and the structure of the Church.

I In Anchals where there are three or more communities each constituting at least 10% of total confirmed membership of the Anchal, then each of these communities shall propose three members to the Nomination Committee.

II-In Anchals where there are only two communities each constituting at least 10% of the total confirmed membership of the Anchal but one community constituting a very large percentage of the total confirmed membership of the Anchal and the other just about 10 % of the total confirmed membership, then the majority community shall propose six names and the other three names.

III- In Anchals where there is only one community which by itself constitutes a very large percentage of the total confirmed membership of the Anchal, and there is no other community which constitutes at least 10% of the total confirmed membership, then the majority Community shall propose six names and all the rest of the communities together shall propose three names, provided that they together constitute 10% of the total confirmed membership.*

³/₄ Note:-* 1. In the first election in 1960 as there will be no Adhyaksh as yet elected, the Convener will preside.

2. The Nomination Committees of the four Anchals will be constituted as follows in accordance with the rules mentioned above.

- a) The Assam Anchal -Mundas 6 + all the rest together 3=9
- b) The North-Western Anchal-Orans 6 + all the rest together 3=9
- c) The Orissa Anchal-Mundas 6 + Orans 3=9
- d) The South-Eastern Anchal-Mundas 6 + all the rest together 3=9

The names of the members of the Nomination Committee will be communicated to the Adhyaksh of the Anchal Sabha before the second session. The Adhyaksh will inform the Anchal Sabha of the names of the members of the Nomination Committee thus constituted. The Anchal Sabha shall accept these names. The Nomination Committee under the Chairmanship of its oldest member shall elect its Chairman by lot.

b) The office-bearers of the Anchals may be elected from the total membership of the whole Gossner Church including workers in the central Institution

c) Any Member of the Anchal Sabha (and in the case of the Adhyaksh and Up-Adhyaksh any member of the Ministerium also) shall have the right to propose names of eligible candidates. A separate list shall be prepared for each office-bearer. The list shall be voted on during the second session of Anchal Sabha. All names proposed by the members of the Anchal Sabha and the Ministerium shall be put to the vote by ballot. The names of those candidates who have secured more than 30% of the total number of votes must be included in the list of eligible candidates.

The lists of eligible candidates shall then be remitted to the Nomination Committee.

d) The Nomination Committee shall scrutinise the list of candidates for each office according to the following standards :

i) There shall be substantial evidence of successful service either on Parish, Ilaka, Ilaka, Synode or any other institutional level.

ii) The candidate has not been tried and found guilty either by the Ministerium or the Anchal Samiti for a fault of his own.

iii) He enjoys a reasonable amount of confidence amongst the people in his area of service and also the whole church.

iv) He has shown initiative in his own ministry.

v) He must have good educational or professional qualifications for the post for which he is to be considered.

vi) He thinks and works for the welfare of the whole

vii) He loves Christ, and not the community, first and foremost in all his considerations.

viii)

The members of the Nomination Committee shall by a majority or unanimous vote elect one candidate for each office to be proposed in the Anchal Sabha for election. In case

of a draw vote, the Chairman of the Nomination Committee shall have the deciding casting vote. If the Anchal Sabha rejects the candidate proposed by the Nomination Committee by at least two thirds of total number of votes by ballot then the Nomination Committee shall meet again and propose another candidate. If the Anchal Sabha rejects the second candidate by at least two thirds of the total number of votes of the Anchal Sabha, the same procedure shall be followed but the third new candidate proposed by the Nomination Committee shall be accepted as elected.

3. THE DURATION OF THE OFFICE.

The Officers of the Anchal shall hold office for three years after which they may be confirmed in their office for another period of three years, and if not, new officers shall be elected for a period of three years. Reconfirmation in the office may be repeated every three years until the officer has stayed in office for a continual period of twelve years.

4. THE ADHYAKSH.

- (a) The Adhyaksh shall be the spiritual head of the Anchal and as such he shall supervise all pastors and other workers, institutions, organisational units and auxiliary bodies.
- (b) He shall preside over all meetings of the Anchal Sabha, the Anchal Samiti and the Anchal Ministerium.
- (c) It shall be his duty to see that the Constitution of the Gossner Church, its bye-laws and rules and the instructions of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha are observed. He shall also see that all resolutions of the Anchal Sabha and its Samiti are implemented.
- (d) He shall instal newly elected Ilaka Chairman.
- (e) He shall on behalf of the Anchal, sign all official documents together with the Secretary. He shall countersign the signatures of the Treasurer.
- (f) He shall submit the annual report of the Anchal to the Anchal Sabha, the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Kalisiya Sangh of the Gossner Church.
- (g) He shall at the request of the Anchal Sabha or the Anchal Samiti appoint all special committees. He shall be a member of all such committees by virtue of his office.
- (h) He shall have the right to attend and participate in the meetings of every organisational unit under his supervision.
- (i) Over and above the aforesaid duties he shall assume all responsibilities which shall be entrusted to him by the Anchal Sabha and the Anchal Samiti.

5 THE UP-ADHYAKSH

The Up-Adhyaksh shall act for the Adhyaksh during the latter's absence or when requested by the Adhyaksh. If for any reason the post of the Adhyaksh is vacant, the Up-adhyaksh shall act as

Adhyaksh until the election of an Adhyaksh at the next meeting of the Anchal Sabha.

Note :- This procedure of election shall be followed in all elections of office-bearers from the level of the Ilaka up-wards, and of the representatives of the Anchals to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

Foot note:-e.g.* If there are 100 persons in the electing body, the Chairman shall ask the body to vote 'Yes' or 'No' by ballot in reference to the name proposed by the Nomination Committee. For the name to be rejected 67 persons must vote 'No' against that name, otherwise the proposal of the nomination Committee shall be declared elected.

6. THE SECRETARY.

The Secretary shall write the minutes of the Anchal Sabha and Anchal Samiti and shall keep the record of the minutes. He shall prepare the list of members of the administrative bodies. He shall issue the notices regarding date and place of ensuing meetings a month in advance and in the case of extra-ordinary meetings at least 15 days ahead. He shall carry on the necessary correspondence within the Anchal and with the central authorities of the Gossner Church. Any other duty may be assigned to him by the Adhyaksh in consultation with the Anchal Samiti.

7. THE TREASURER.

- (a) The Treasurer shall collect all incomes and keep the account of income and expenditure.
- (b) He shall submit a financial report regularly at all meetings of the Anchal Sabha and Samiti. He shall prepare the annual budget of the Anchal and submit it to the Anchal Samiti.
- (c) He shall carry out the budgetary provisions; for any other payment he shall obtain the sanction and counter-signature of the Adhyaksh.
- (d) The Treasurer shall be either requested to deposit an amount of Rs. 3,000/- or be bonded for a larger amount.

ARTICLE-SEVENTEEN.

SAFEGUARDS FOR THE RIGHTS OF COMMUNITIES.

1. An Anchal Sabha should see to it that before an election takes place in any of its administrative organisations, the minimum number of seats are reserved for specified minority communities in the area concerned.
2. An Anchal, being a self-contained and, in all internal matters a self-governing organisational unit of the Church, will enjoy independence. Only when it gives its corroborative vote of acceptance of any legislation proposed by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, will such a proposal become effective in the Anchal. In this way the communities represented in the Anchal will be protected from any action of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha which might adversely affect their interest.

3. A Statutory Board for the rights of communities shall each be constituted by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, by every Anchal and every Ilaka respectively, and it shall be a standing board of that unit. The Pramukh Adhyaksh the Adhyaksh of the Anchal and the Ilaka Padri shall be responsible for convening respectively the Statutory Board concerned.

Such Board shall have two functions:

- (a) It will exercise careful supervision over all elections held within its jurisdiction. The results of the elections will be forwarded to the Statutory Board whose confirmation will be necessary before the results shall take effect. The Board, before confirming the results, shall satisfy itself that the election had been properly held, and that no community had been overlooked or discriminated against. When not satisfied, the Board shall call the attention of the organisational unit concerned and advise it to take steps to remedy the situation within a reasonable specified period of time. If the organisational unit fails to heed the advice, the Board will report the matter to the next higher authoritative organisational unit which shall set right the situation.
- (b) The Statutory Board shall also exercise careful watch over all general matters affecting the rights and welfare of the communities.
4. A nomination committee shall be set up by each Anchal before any election for office or appointment of persons takes place (Vide Art. XVI-2).

ARTICLE-EIGHTEEN THE PRAMUKH ADHYAKSH.

The spiritual authority of the Gossner Church shall be vested in the Pramukh Adhyaksh. He shall be advised and assisted in his administrative functions by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. Only for the election of the first Pramukh Adhyaksh in 1960, the following procedures shall be followed:

The President of the GEL Church shall convene a meeting of the four Adhyakshas. The oldest among them shall take the Chair. The four Adhyakshas will then meet by themselves.

The Pramukh Adhyaksh shall be elected by the unanimous decision of the four Adhyakshas who shall decide who amongst themselves is the person best suited for the post. But, if no unanimity is reached even after three meetings held on separate days, they shall after prayer determine the Pramukh Adhyaksh by casting the lot.

- 1- He shall be the visible symbol of the unity of the Gossner Church.
- 2- He shall be the spiritual guardian of the doctrines and Confessions of the Gossner Church, and shall be assisted by the Ministerium in this respect.
- 3- He shall be Pastor Pastirum of the Gossner Church and shall be the overseer of all the Adhyakshas the Anchals and all other workers of the Gossner Church. For this purpose he shall have the right of visitation to all the organisational units of the Gossner Church.

- 4- He shall ordain the candidates to the Ministry in the Gossner Church.
- 5- He shall be responsible for maintaining order and peace in the Gossner Church, and in this respect he shall be assisted by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Ministerium of the Gossner Church.
6. He shall represent the Gossner Church in all he external relationship, both in and outside India, and shall carry on correspondence with Churches and organisations inside and outside India,
- 7- He shall preside over the meetings of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, the Ministerium and the Board of Evangelism and Literature.
- 8- He shall be the pastor of the Ranchi Headquarters congregation and shall be the Chairman of the Mandli Panch. He may be assisted in this work by an assistant pator or pastors.
- 9- He shall serve for a period of three years. He shall be succeeded by the Up-Pramukh at the end of that period.

ARTICLE-NINETEEN.

THE OTHER OFFICE BEARERS OF THE GOSSNER CHURCH

There shall be an Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh, a Secretary and a Treasurer. In the first election of the Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh the following procedure shall be followed :

After the Pramukh Adhyash has been elected in the manner indicated in article XVIII, the Pramukh Adhyaksh and the remaining three Adhyakshas shall elect the first Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh at the same meeting from amongst the remaining three Adhyakas. This first elected Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh shall continue to be the Adhyaksh of his own Anchal in addition to his being the Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh. At the end of the first three years when the Pramukh Adhyaksh leaves his office, the Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh shall succeed him. This Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh who has now become the Pramukh Adhyaksh shall along with the Adhyakshas of the remaining three Anchals Adhyakshas by an unanimous vote. If unanimity is not reached even after three meetings, then Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh shall be chosen from among the remaining three Adhyakshas by casting the lot.

The procedure shall be followed for the subsequent elections of Up-Pramukh Adhyakshs.

The Secretary and the Treasurer shall be appointed by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. They may be chosen from the remaining Adhyakshas or from the office bearers of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. These three office bearers shall be honorary. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha must make these appointments in its first meeting.

(1) The Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh.

He shall act for the Pramukh Adhyaksh during the latter's absence from the Gossner Church area. He shall assume such powers and duties as may be assigned to him by the Pramukh Adhyaksh in consultation with the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

(2) The Secretary.

He shall be responsible for maintaining an office at Ranchi with a full time paid head clerk though he may not reside at Ranchi. The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence within the area of the Gossner Church, and shall act as Secretary of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. Any other duty may be assigned to him by the Pramukh Adhyaksh in consultation with the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

(3) The Treasurer.

He shall be responsible for the maintenance of the central accounts at Ranchi, though he may not reside at Ranchi. He shall be assisted in his work by a full time Head accountant. The head-accountant shall not make any payment without obtaining the sanction of the Treasurer, and the countersignature of the Pramukh Adhyaksh. The head accountant shall be bonded for an amount of Rs. 3000/00 or more.

(b) He shall submit a financial report regularly at all meetings of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and shall prepare the budget to the Gossner Church and submit it to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha for approval.

(c) He shall carry out the budgetary provisions.

ARTICLE- TWENTY

THE MINISTERIUM OF THE GOSSNER CHURCH.

(1) The Ministerium will consist of all the pastors of the Gossner Church.

(2) The Ministerium shall meet once in two years. One-third of its membership shall form its quorum. It shall elect its Secretary from amongst its members, frame rules for conducting its business and shall present the full report of its work to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha for approval.

(3) a. It shall assist the Pramukh Adhyaksh in examining the candidates who have passed their theological examination and declaring them candidates for the ministry. The subjects of examination shall be Scriptural knowledge, Dogmatics, Pastoral Theology and other useful subjects.

b. It shall upon recommendation from the Anchal in the case of candidates who have been supported by the Anchal, propose them to the Pramukh Adhyaksh for ordination and assignment to the Anchal in consultation with the Anchal concerned or others if necessary. In the case of candidates who have not been supported by any one Anchal, the Ministerium shall, upon recommendation from the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha propose them to the Pramukh Adhyaksh for ordination. The assignment will be decided upon by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal concerned.

c. It shall, if necessary, send recommendations to the Pramukh Adhyaksh and the Anchals concerned for disciplinary action against its members.

(4) The Executive Committee of the Ministerium.

The ordained members of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall shall form the Executive Committee of the Ministerium of the Gossner Church. They shall meet ordinarily at the time of meeting of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

ARTICLE-TWENTYONE.

THE KENDRIYA SALAHKARI SABHA.

1. COMPOSITION:

(a) The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall consist of members elected by the Anchal Sabhas. Each Anchal Sabha shall elect three members from amongst the members of the Anchal Samiti. One of them shall be a pastor and two shall be laymen. The Pramukh Adhyaksh and the Adhyakshas of the Anchals shall be members by virtue of their office.

(b) The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall have the right of coopting up to two members for a period of three years, if (i) any, community or (ii) any special interests are not represented amongst the elected and the ex-officio members.

(c) If the Secretaries of the Central Boards are not elected members of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, they shall have the right to attend the meetings of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha but not to vote.

(d) The terms of membership in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall be for three years.

(e) Kendriya Salahkari Sabha Samiti (Executive)

Composition:- The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall constitute an Executive Committee (Samiti) which shall be formed in the following manner :-

1. The Pramukh Adhyaksh shall be a member of this Samiti and its Chairman by virtue of his office.

2. The Secretary and the Treasurer of the Gossner Church shall be members of this Samiti by virtue of their office.

four 3. There shall be four ordained representatives, one from each Anchal. The four Adhyakshas being ordained persons shall be the ordained representatives of the Anchals on the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha Samiti.

4. There shall be four lay representatives, one from each of the Anchals. If the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Gossner Church are laymen, they shall be considered the lay representatives of their Anchals on this Samiti. The Anchals not thus represented shall elect their lay representatives to this Samiti from amongst their lay representatives in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

Thus in all, the Samiti will consist of nine members only including the Pramukh Adhyaksh.

5. The members of this Samiti shall serve for a period of three years

(f) Working Committee- The four officers of the KSS shall constitute a working committee and shall meet as often as necessary.

II. FUNCTIONS:-

It is clearly understood that the duties and functions of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha are both advisory and administrative.

The following shall be its duties and functions:-

(a) To receive and revise the reports from.

- (i) The officers of the Gossner Church
- (ii) The Adhyakshas
- (iii) The Secretaries of the Central Boards.
- (iv) The Ministerium.

The recommendation of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha will go to the bodies concerned for necessary attention and action, it being understood that the approval of the Anchals will be necessary in all matters affecting the whole Church before the recommendations of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha become effective. If unanimous agreement is not reached, the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall convene a meeting of the Anchal or Anchals concerned and discuss the matter at issue in order to arrive at unanimous final decision. If such a decision is other than the first proposal, either in part or in whole, the amended proposal shall be again circulated amongst the Anchals for unanimous vote.

(Above para is deleted)

(b)(i) To prepare its annual budget based on the budgets of the central institutions and of the Anchals and to determine the quota of contribution to the centre from the Anchals and the Central Boards, to fix the amount to be paid to Anchals as financial aid, and to forward its request for financial subsidy to the Department of world Mission of the Lutheran World Federation and the Kuratorium etc.

(ii) If any Anchal defaults in payment of ^{not meet} the yearly quota allotted to it and payable in 12 monthly instalments consequently for a period of four months, in spite of three reminders, it shall be superseded until the quota is paid and the Pramukh Adhyaksh shall take over the administration of the Anchal assisted by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha until the quota is paid.

(iii) To appoint auditors for the accounts of the Anchal Sabhas, and the Central Boards, and for the Central accounts every year and to receive and review the reports of the auditors.

(c) To appoint a Superintendent of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha office. He shall be full time paid official of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. He shall be directly responsible to the Pramukh Adhyaksh and shall work in co-operation with the other officers of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

(d) To select candidates for the exchange of personnel and training abroad and outside the Gossner Church area, based on proposals from the Anchals and the Central Boards.

(e) To advise the Pramukh Adhyaksh of the Gossner Church on all matters referred to it by him.

(f) To recommend through the Ministerium of the Gossner Church to the Pramukh Adhyaksh the candidates to be ordained to the Ministry.

(g) To initiate legislative proposals including amendments to the constitution.

- (h) To produce and publish Christian Literature in consultation with the Board of Evangelism and Literature.
- (i) To serve as the Kalishya Sangh continuation committee during the interval between the meetings of the Kalisiya Sangh.
- (j) To convene the Kalishya Sangh of the Gossner Church.
- (k) To assist the Pramukh Adhyaksh in keeping and preserving the doctrines and Confessions of the Church.
- (l) To keep, preserve and develop the autonomy of the Church.
- (m) To set up a Standing Committee on inter-Anchal relationships.
- (n) To set up a Central Statutory Board for the rights of communities.
- (o) To set up a Standing Committee for work among youth and women for the whole church.
- (p) To have the moveable and immovable properties of the Gossner Church vested in the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, to exercise all proprietary rights and to implement, Article VI 14.
- (q) To appoint on the recommendations of the Managing Committees or Councils, the Principals, Headmasters or Headmistresses of all the Central Institutions and in the case of the Theological college, the full time staff and the Secretaries of the said institutions.
- (r) To sanction the annual budget for all the Central Boards.
- (s) To exercise, on behalf of the Gossner Church the residuary powers not covered by this Constitution.

4. MEETINGS AND QUORUM

The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall meet ordinarily once in six months. One third of its membership shall constitute the quorum. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha Samiti shall meet ordinarily once in three months; five members shall constitute the quorum.

ARTICLE TWENTY TWO THE CENTRAL BOARDS.

1. Composition:-

- (1) The Central Boards shall consist of two members each elected by each Anchal Samiti. The Chairman of each Board excepting the Board of Evangelism and Literature shall be appointed by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha with the approval of the Anchal Samitis.)(Togo)

The Pramukh Adhyaksh shall be the Chairman of the Board of Evangelism and Literature.

- (2) Matters of common concern and interest shall remain under the care of the Central Boards. To start with there shall be 4 Central Boards:-

- 1- The Board of Evangelism and Literature
- 2- The Board of Property.
- 3- The Board of Education
- 4- The Board of Theological Education.

The members of these Boards serve for three years. Each Board shall appoint a Secretary or Manager or Director who shall be the Executive officer of the Board, and he shall be responsible to the Chairman of the Board. The Boards may constitute their own executive committees, if and when necessary.

3) Functions :-

Each Board shall be responsible for the internal administration of the institutions and spheres of work that come under its purview, and shall enjoy a great deal of autonomy. However, it will report periodically on its work to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samities. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall have the power of reviewing its work and making recommendations. However the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall not interfere in the internal administration of the Boards and their work. The review and recommendations of Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall go both to the Boards concerned and to the Anchal Samities, and both of them shall report to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha on the action taken by them. In case of difficulty or a deadlock, the Board concerned shall meet with the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the actions of such a joint conference shall be final. The Pramukh Adhyaksh of the Gossner Church shall have the power to act in an emergency, and his action shall be reported to the Board concerned for confirmation.

4) The Boards.

(a) The Board of Evangelism and Literature.

The Board shall have under its purview the work of the "Joint Mission Board", the "surguja Board", and the Gossner Church Missionary Society", the "Evangelistic committee of the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church", and similar auxilliary Evangelistic Boards. There shall be a paid Director of the Board and the Pramukh Adhyaksh of the Church shall be the Chairman of the Board. The Board shall submit annually its budget to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and administer the sanctioned budget.

The Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church Press at Ranchi shall come under this Board. A detailed Constitution for the management of the Press and the Anchal Samitis. The accounts of the Press shall be audited half-yearly, and the auditor's report shall go also to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samitis.

The Board shall meet at least once in six months, and five members shall constitute the quorum.

(b) The Board of Property.

The Board shall have a paid Manager or Managers to administer the property. The Manager shall hold in safe keeping at documents, registers etc. relating to properties. He shall also maintain the accounts of the Board, into which all income from all properties of the Gossner Church be entered. In each Anchal, there shall be appointed a sub-committee on properties within the area of the Anchal. The Central Board will act in co-operation and consultation with the Anchal Committees.

There shall be a half-yearly audit of the account books of the Board. The Adhyaksh of the Anchals shall report to the Central Board from time to time on the financial aspects of the administration of the properties within their areas. The Manager shall submit

a report at every meeting of the Board on the properties under the Board and their financial situation. The Board at every meeting shall pay adequate attention to the financial aspects of the reports of the Manager and Adhyakshas, and express its opinion on the reports writing, and the action of the Board in this respect shall be immediately reported to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samitis. Detailed rules for the acquisition, purchase, use, lease and sale of properties shall be immediately reported to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samiti. Detailed rules for the acquisition, purchase, use, lease and sale of properties shall be worked out by the Board and reported to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samiti. An annual report on property transaction shall be submitted by the Board to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchals. In the management of properties of the Gossner Church the Board of Properties shall be directly responsible to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and work under its control, directions and approval. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall give a general power of attorney to the Secretary of this Board, and a special power of attorney to the Manager, the Treasurer and manager of the Board shall be bonded for an amount to be determined by this Board.

The Board shall meet as often as necessary but at least once in months and four members shall constitute the quorum.

(c) Board of Education.

The following institutions and all other institutions which may be established by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall come under the pervue of the Boards.

- 1) Gossner High School for boys at Ranchi
- 2) Bethesda High School for girls at Ranchi
- 3) Women's Training School at Ranchi

These institutions shall be governed as hitherto by their own Managing Committees. However in the case of appointments of the Principals, or Head of the institutions and the Secretaries of the Managing Committees, the Kendriya Salahkari shall appoint them on the recommendations of the Managing Committees concerned.

The Board will appoint an Educational Officer as soon as possible (paid or honorary) who will advise the Pramukh Adhyaksh of the Gossner Church and the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha on all educational matters. The Board through its officer will represent the Gossner Church before the Government and its Educational Department. While the other educational institutions in the Gossner Church will come directly under the Anchals, the Board will review their work periodically and report to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha and the Anchal Samitis.

The Board shall meet ordinarily once a year, and four members shall constitute the quorum.

(d) The Board of Theological Education :-

Theological institutions such as the Theological College at Ranchi, the Tabitha Bible and Buniyadi Training School and Pracharaks' Training School shall come under the Board.

The Board shall appoint a College Council for the Theological College as required by Serampore University. The Board's report shall go to the Ministerium of the Anchals and the Ministerium of Gossner Church, in addition to the KSS & Anchal Samitis.

These institutions will have their own Managing Committees or Councils as the case may be, and shall be governed by their rules and regulations. However in the case of appointment of the Principals and full time staff members of these institutions, the said committees or Council shall make recommendations to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha for approval. They shall submit also their annual budgets to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha for approval and disbursement by the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha.

The Board of Theological Education shall meet ordinarily once a year, preferably at the close of academic year. Four shall constitute the quorum.

ARTICLE TWENTYTHREE

Kalisiya Sangh (Mahasabha)

1) The Kalisiya Sangh of the Gossner Church shall consist of members elected by the Anchal Sabhas and the Anchal Ministerium respectively. The Anchal Sabha shall elect the following member of lay members.

Assam	20

South-East Anchal	30

The Ministerium of the Anchals shall elect the following number of pastors to be members of the Kalisiya Sangh.

Assam	10

Khutitoli	3
	<u>55</u>

2) The members of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha, the officers in charge of institutions under the Central Boards and the Secretaries or Directors of the Central Boards shall be members by virtue of their office. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha shall determine the number of members to represent youth and women.

3) If there is a majority community in any Anchal comprising more than five percent of the total christian population, there must be at least three elected representatives from that community. The Adhyaksh shall determine from time to time before each election, how many the Anchal Sabha should elect, and how many the Ministerium of that Anchal should.

4) The Kalisiya Sangh under the Chairmanship of the Pramukh Adhyaksh shall elect a layman from amongst its members to be the Chairman of the Kalisiya Sangh.

5) The Kalisiya Sangh shall meet once in three years. It shall be convened by the Pramukh Adhyaksh.

6) Reports from all the Central Boards, the Pramukh Adhyaksh and other officers of the Gossner Church, and the Adhyaksh of the Anchals shall be submitted to the Kalisiya Sangh for information and clarification only. The Kalisiya Sangh shall formulate general plans, and programmes for the life and growth of the church.

ARTICLE TWENTYFOUR
FOREIGN MISSIONARIES

1) The autonomy of the Gossner Church shall remain inviolate under the Constitution.

2) The relationship between the Gossner Kuratorium in Berlin and the Gossner Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chotanagpur and Assam shall be that of a mother and daughter.

3) Foreign missionaries belonging to any Missionary Society may be called by the Church for a special task in the Church for a definitely fixed period. They shall serve according to the terms and rules of the Gossner Church. The Church shall frame terms and conditions of service from time to time in consultation with the sending Missionary Societies. A foreign missionary serving the Gossner Church shall be governed by such regulations effective during the term of his service.

ARTICLE TWENTYFIVE

BYE-LAWS AND AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

1) Bye-laws to this constitution may be proposed by any Anchal or the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. Such proposals shall be circulated by the Secretary of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha amongst the Anchals for their consideration, setting a time limit of three months and for information only to the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha members. The Anchals meeting separately shall discuss them and forward their opinion to the Secretary of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha then shall meet and take a decision by a majority vote.

2) Amendments and alterations to the Articles of the Constitution (With the exception of Article I and II) may be proposed by the Anchals and the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. Such proposals shall be circulated by the Secretary of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha for information. The Anchals meeting separately shall discuss them and forward their opinion to the Secretary of the Kendriya Salahkari Sabha. The Kendriya Salahkari Sabha then shall meet and take a decision by a majority vote.

- (d) South Eastern Anchal :- The Synods of Govindpur, Burju, Takarma, Koronjo, Singhbhum and the Ilakas of Calcutta and the Andamans.

I thankfully acknowledge your kind letter of July 7, 1986 on the subject of additional grant for repairs of building and machineries of the Fudi-Technical Training Centre.

I am herewith furnishing particulars asked for as under

Fitter Trade Training for two years others are for one year only.

Average number of applications received during last four years is about 500 (five hundred).

Fitter Trade is the most popular Trade. According to Govt. regulations we are permitted to admit only 16 in each section in fitter i.e. for two section we admit 32. We are also permitted to admit up to maximum of 40, hence it is that during last three years we had more than 32.

Carpenter Trade proved unpopular so we abolished it temporarily.

- (c) Mode of Selections - Entrance examination is held and after weeding out those failing to secure qualifying marks a certain number of students is selected for personal interview.

When the selection committee after considering various criteria makes final selections. 75% of seats are reserved for scheduled Tribes and Castes. Balance of 25% of seats is filled up with non-tribal-non-Christian applicants.

Care is taken to see that parity is maintained in the admission from different Trustee Churches.

Applicants it may be noted come from all sections of the Society majority being from non-Tribals.

- (d) Rs 20 per month is charged as fee and their food expenses come to about Rs 110 per month per student. Tribal boys get scholarship of Rs 55 per month from the Welfare Dept. Govt. of Bihar. Students manage their Mess. They also do manual labour for maintenance of the compound in free time.

- (e) As students do not write back about employment follow-up records have not been possible. But this much can be said that the centre has good name and our results are very good.

The trainees generally get jobs in ancillary industries in and around Ranchi Rly. Department and in other places.

- (f) Production - Since wood work from private parties and fabrication job and wood work from private parties and from some Govt. Departments. We earned net income of

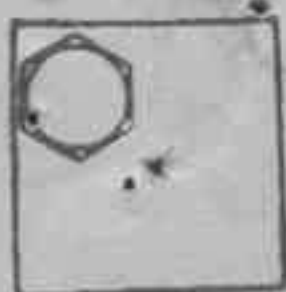

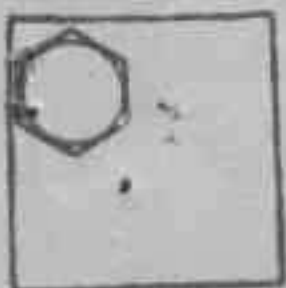

This year the Production unit hopes to atleast double the earnings.


Lal Bungalow money has been collected and we have started the repair and renovation work.

Revered Chairman and respected Governors,

I am privileged to extend hearty welcome to you all to this 12th Annual General Meeting of the FTTC. Trust.

- 1) I submit the annual report for the year 1984 which will give you the idea of the functioning of the centre during the year under review.
- 2) There were eight meetings including one extraordinary General meeting held during the year.
- 3) In the 11th annual general meeting held last year, the earlier recommendation of the governing body for abolition of the post of the Director, was approved and the Secretary was made responsible for the supervision of the campus through the staff of the centre. This arrangement has worked satisfactorily.
- 4) Maintenance of the centre :- As stated above the maintenance of the centre was done through the staff, who under the guidance of the principal have done a good job of maintaining in properly. There is however much to be done. On so many visits and stay in the centre, following things were ~~mention~~ noticed to need early attention to improve the maintenance of the centre.

The annexure A to report shows the extent of certain major repairs works to be taken up at an early date. Total estimated expenditure on such repairs total - Rs. 1,34,400.

- 5) Training - Extension of Trades :- Respected Governors are aware that the centre has at present three trades viz-Fitter, Welder and Carpentry, Fitter trade has presently four units, Welder trade - 1 units and Carpentry - 1 unit. The Governors will be pleased to know that the centre has got permanent affiliation about which we got the information in Jan'85 for

Fitter Trade and Welder Trade for 4 and 1 unit respectively. It is proposed that in Fitter and Welder Trades, 2 and 1 units respectively be started. If this proposal is accepted correspondence with concerned authorities will be taken up. Similarly another proposal for extension of trades is made. It is accordingly proposed that Wiremen and Motor mechanic trades of 1 unit each be started. To implement the above proposal, the capital (Non recurring) outlay will be as under :-

A. (a) - (i) Fitter Trade - Staff - 2

Salary @ of Rs. 550/- = 15,000

(b) - Welder Trade - @ Rs. 550/- = 7,500

(c) - Wiremen - allowance @ Rs. 50/- = 600

(d) - Motor Mechanic allowance @ 50/- = 600

Total Rs. 23,700 or in round figures Rs. 24,000

B. Tools and Equipments :-

(i) Fitter Trade

(ii) Drill Machine - Rs. 63,000

Total =

C. Welder Trade - Tools & Equipments Rs. 70,000

Raw Materials Rs. 6,000

D. Motor Mechanic - an old vehicle and tools Rs. 75,000

E. Wiremen Trade (Tools and Equipments) Rs. 50,000

It may be noted that class rooms (for Fitter 2 unit, Welder - unit Wiremen 1 unit, Motor Mechanic 1 unit) are not required. The existing room made for store room in the production unit can be converted into rooms for above purposes .

6. The Principal will be submitting a separate report about the training centre. I may in passing inform that our results

continue to be very satisfactory. The results for 1984 show that out of 30 appearing in Fitter Trade all passed (100%) with one in 1st division. Similarly in Welder Trade out 12, 1 failed and 1 stood first and in Carpentry Trade all the 6 passed. During the last 19 years we have had the best results, better than any other industrial training Institute. The Principal, the staff and the trainees deserve our congratulation.

7. Admission - In the session beginning July 1984, out of 300 ~~application~~ applicants, we admitted 34 in Fitter Trade, 13 in Welder and 7 in Carpentry.
8. Activities - Regular activities in centre including excursion to Calcutta in April last year, Picnic in 84 at their own expenses to Netarhat, Sports and Games ^{very} maintained.
9. Production Unit - Attempts to lease out the production unit were made without success. The Governor will be glad to know that we started the production in mill wood-work and in fabrication department in very limited scale. We executed orders for about Rs. 23,000 earning Rs. 13,000. The centres share of 40% as decided earlier comes to Rs. 5,200. With this it is proposed to restart the production unit on commercial scale for which investments required is as under :-

Materials	-	30,000 (for 1 year only)	
Saw Mill	-	Staff 2 - @ of 400 each	= Rs. 800
Wood Section	-	Staff 4 @ Rs. 600 each	= Rs. 2400

Total Rs. 6,800 x 12 = Rs. 81,600

Total Rs. 1,61,000

With the above investment it is estimated that Production unit will give the centre annually a net income of Rs. 50,000 and will make the centre partly self-reliant.

10. Some of the other high lights of the management of the affairs of the centre are as follows :-

The mandate given ^{by} the last annual General Meeting was carried out by the extraordinary General Meeting of the Trust by deleting some of the offending clauses which stood ⁱⁿ the way of the Trust existing solely for educational purpose. The Registrar General of Societies Registration Department of Bihar Govt. was duly informed of the amendments.

11. Staff :- During the year under review 1 new namely shree.D.P. Karnakar was appointed. The appointment has since been regularized.

12. Dudget - The Budget proposals vide Annexure B envisages-on the Expenditure side a sum of Rs. 3,50,000 as against an estimated receipt of Rs. 2,67,800 including the expected receipt of Rs. 2,25,000 from the Gossner Mission. Under the Development head total cutlay estimated in non recuting Rs. 2,28,000 plus Rs. 1,61,000 in production unit total Rs. 3,89,000 and recurring expenditure (for one year only) Rs. 39,000 or Rs. 4,28,000. It is estimated that with the expected net income of over Rs. 50,000 from production unit salary and materials will substantially be net. It is hoped that proposal will find favour with the Gossner Mission. This needs through discussion with the Director, Gossner Mission when he visits the GEL Church in March next.

13. Lastly I thank all the honourable Governors for their advice, guidance, support reveived in the conduct of the affairs of the centre.

14. Thanks are also due to the principal, the staff for their co-operation and to the student for maintaining a high degree of discipline in the centre and result in the examination. Our most sincere thanks are due to the Gossner Mission for their continued help and guidance in the affairs of the centre.

This is to inform you, that we received a request from Director Rev. C.B. Aind, to send some spare parts for a submercible pump at Fudi TTC. It is not possible, to send the plastic coated wire for re-winding, because the rolls are too heavy for a tourist to carry them in his or her luggage.

We have, however, bought the other requested parts and send them with a group of friends.

The cost was about DM 1.000,- , which is equivalent to Rs 4,000.00. We have to deduct this amount from an old fund here which is meant for replacements in Fudi TTC and which holds an amount of about DM 28.000,- now.

I inform you about the prices we have to pay here, so that you may decide whether it is cheaper to purchase spare parts in India or in Germany, and act accordingly in future. We always can send only small parts which can easily be carried in our air luggage.

The carpentry shop which is given to some party on rental basis, is not profiting satisfactorily, has also drawn our attention and the authority has been advised to take ^{measures} ~~measures~~. Among other issues, the continuance of the Director, Rev. Aind was also discussed and we hope the new Superintendent will be able to manage the affairs independently.

I have also proposed to introduce some of the short term Rural Trade to benefit boys who want to earn their livelihood at their native place.

The members appreciated the idea and asked to

Work out viability for discussion.

It is really a big way to have any additional activities in the present set up, but I hope, I, will be able to thrash it out.

I hope you will continue to bear with us for some more time and remember us in your prayers also.

Once again kindly convey our greetings and yeshusabei to our well wishers and hope to see you here soon as you promised when you visited us last.

Dear members of FTTC Trust, Fudi,

Our Secretary Mr. H. Samad was wise enough to allow me in the centre premises on 13.10.82 and has given his valuable time along with the Superintendent and the Director to make me acquainted with the working of the Centre.

As you are aware that the Centre is financially sick and is dependent more or less subsidy received from the Gossner Mission Berlin, it is high time to take appropriate measures to make it self supported because, the subsidy may either be curtailed or stopped any time.

It is a challenge before us and I am very much hopeful, we will succeed in the mission set before us.

I want your guidance and co-operation. In my view there is sufficient scope for improvement and expansion, with of course not much of funds requirements which I will explore in due course.

I am not very much conversant with the affairs of the Centre, still, I want to give first aid with the following actions in the first phase immediately.

- 1) Outstanding dues of the leased out section which is around Rupees seventy thousand (Rs 70,000) be realised forthwith, xx failing which appropriate be taken to withdraw the lease deed and adopt means to realise the dues, otherwise,

In case the Section gets vacated, we can use it as production Centre which will be worked out separately.

- 2) Unwarranted expenditure be curtailed or stopped without delay; this also can be discussed separately itemwise item.
- 3) The vacant land in the premises be utilised to the extent it is possible and benefit the boys and staff engaged in that.

Further it was informed that the short term training in the field of Carpentry, wireman etc have been imposed by the Govt. for the Koel-Karo project, ~~this~~ we can take up some more trades independently where the investment is not much. I am to suggest this to facilitate people to earn their livelihood of their own in their areas.

In the first stage I do not want to overplan the activities which may be unmanageable but request all of you to share your valuable suggestions to achieve the goal.

I am open for chalking out action/programme for TTC if you permit.




I have to thank you for your letters no. 585 and 1002 of 28.5. and 29.7.81.

This time I can inform you that on 3.9.81 we transferred the last instalment for 1981 to Fudi TTC's account: DM 20.000,- You should have the money by now.

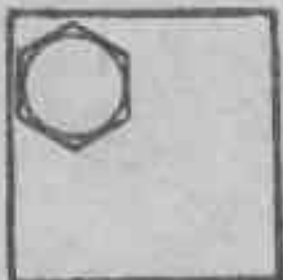

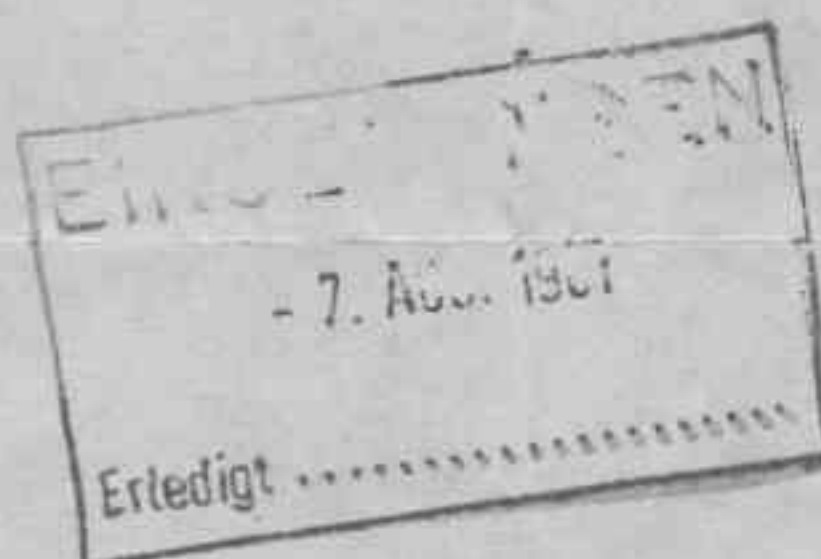

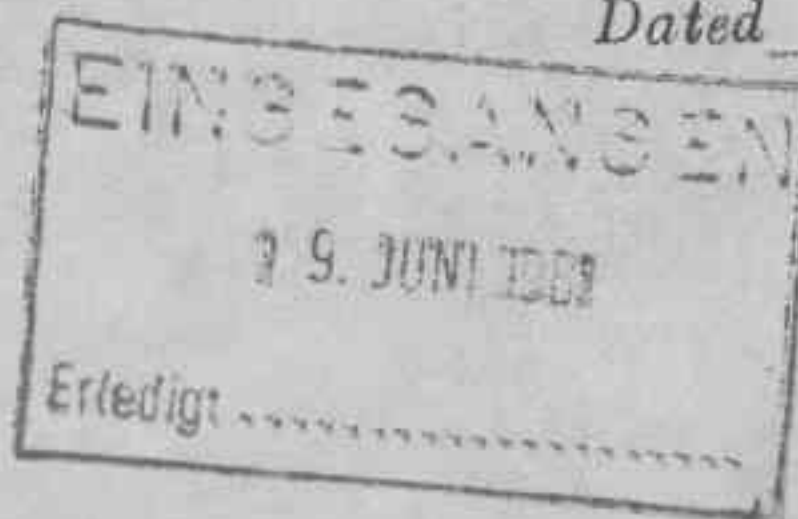

Sir,

We beg to bring the following for your kind action:-

1. That to train students of Chotanagpur German Friends of Germany generously donated Technical Training Centre at Fudi, P.S. Khunti, Dist. Ranchi, Bihar.
2. That German Friends also donated Motor Cycle for the use of the Training Centre. The Director, Rev. C.B. Aind sold the Motor Cycle to his own son for the purpose of Jharkhand politics.
3. That German Friends also donated Motor car, New Motor Cycle and other vehicles. The Director Rev. C.B. Aind uses all these vehicles for Jharkhand Party.
4. That the Production Section of T.T.C. was sold or leased out to Tools Mecho, Private Ltd. Calcutta. The valuable Precision Instruments were also sold to Tools Mecho Pvt.Ltd. Calcutta. Proper enquiry will reveal as to how much rent the T.T.C. receives and out of valuable materials how much money received and spent for Jharkhand Party.
5. That a sum of Rs. 200,000/- was given to Mr. Mishra for building construction without the knowledge of the concerned.
6. That the Director Rev. C.B. Aind runs a T.T.C. Fair Price Shop. The outsiders are shareholders of this shop. Sugar and other commodities of the hostel are secretly sold through this shop.
7. That the T.T.C. boys get some Government Scholarship also. A few special boys did signed the scholarship register but the Director did not give scholarship to the boys. That from SKIP BOOR BOYS FUND only Director's relatives, Siryakus Aind, Alfred Aind and Silas Bhengra were helped. It is partiality.

8. That Rice for the trainees was purchased for two years. But the Director drew Rs. 70,000/- from State Bank of India on December 14-15/1980. He explained to the Government that the money was spent in Rice. Mr. Tirkey and Mr. Mishra are false loan holders of Rs. 50,000/- and Rs. 20,000/-. Roland and Mr. P.Surin are witnesses for these amount.
9. That in purchasing materials (Sports, electrical goods etc) the director is not honest.
10. That in 1976 T.T.C W/S goods were stolen. The thieves and goods were caught. Goods have been kept in the Kotwali. The director has not brought the things till date.
11. That T.T.C director has no inventory. Therefore all goods (Tape Recorder, Washing Machine, Steel Utensils, Freeze, Type writer etc) have been transfered to Ranchi. Mr. Hak and Director have shared these goods among themselves.
12. That for the Installation of Telephone a sum of Rs. 5000/- was spent. But till today no telephone has come.
13. That T.T.C has also land for cultivation. But so far the director has not shown any income and expenditures. The income is for him and not for T.T.C . That out of Foreign Contribution the director has purchased 47 acres of land in Fudi, and proper enquiry also will reveal that he has also purchased land in Ranchi.
14. That the director drinks XXX with T.M. along his associates out of foreign contribution.
15. That as per T.T.C rules he should retire by now. But he through court he has made his age minus to continue as director. This is against Christian law of Baptism. Because he made Usman, Mr. Tiru to retire when they reached the age of 62.

16. That Mr. Heran Samad one of the associates of the Director Rev. Aind built a house at Khunti out of Foreign contribution. Cement and other materials were supplied from T.T.C for the building. Proper enquiry reveal regarding amount of money spent from foreign contribution.
17. That the T.T.C Trust admit only those students who pay heavy bribe or who are related to Director or to T.T.C Trust members.
18. Motor Cycle, Motor Car, Fore Wagon etc. are used for Jharkhand Party. A proper investigation will reveal regarding Rev. C.B.Aind either he is director of T.T.C or Church politician or Jharkhand politician.

Herewith, I write to you in continuation of my letter dt. 25th July, '78. This is to give you same information about T.T.C. Fudi.

① Result :- out of the 32 students (25 regular and 7 Ex-students), who appeared for the final Examination in Fitter Trade in July, '78, 28 students were declared pass (24 regular and 6 Ex-students). Two students failed, one regular and one ex-student.

4 students in Carpentry Trade, who appeared for the final examination, all come out successfully.

Amongst the 1st year (Preliminary) in Fitter Trade 28 students appeared and only 14 were declared pass. Out of 14 failure students 11 have rejoined the class.

② In my previous letter, it was reported that Mr. Peter Ekka, Engineer was appointed as Superintendent. From Jan. '79 his services were terminated. Another one, in his place, is to be selected for appointment, to-morrow the 10th March, '79.

③ Leasing out of Production Section :- Now it has been finalised to lease out the Production Section to ToolsMeco, the party of Calcutta. On 26th March, '79 the lease deed will be registered in favour of ToolsMeco.

Annual Report of the Director (January '79 to Dec. '79.).

Reverend Chairman and honourable members, let us thank God who has kept us safe and enabled us to complete our 9th year of service to Fudi Technical Training Centre. At this occasion, I feel a pleasure to submit my brief report about the life and activities of our Institution.

Taking into consideration our financial position, December, '79 was hard days for us. Upto that period, we received from Gossner Mission only two quarters of grant. The last two quarters grant was released only in the last week of December, '79. Money is still on the way. Whatever money we had in the Bank about Rs. 48,500/- was also attached by the Income Tax Department on demand of Income Tax from us for which we have appealed to the Commissioner I.T. through our advocate. Due to the above circumstances a loan of Rs. 71,000/- (Rupees seventy one thousand) only has been taken from ~~Depreciation~~ Depreciation and Special Fund for advancing of rice purchase and payment etc. Now also Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand) only has been taken loan from the K.S.B., G.E.B. Church for the payment of December, '79 in January, '80.

Gossner Mission expects that the Institution be run by the help of local resources or by the contribution of the three constituent churches. The Director has informed me that he would discuss this point with the members of the Governing Body when he will be here in the month of March, '80.

In the beginning of January, '79, the total number of workers was 20 - 4 Instructors, 3 Office staff, and 13 other workers. In the month of December, '78 Shri Peter Ekka left the Institution. The post was vacant till June, '79 when Mr. Vincent Marki (an Electrical Engineer) joined us as Superintendent. Also from August, '79 Mr. Acharjee, who was in Das Nagar, Howrah for C.T.I. Training, after his successful training, joined the Institution.

The strength of students in January, '79 was as follows :-

From 23rd Jan. to 18th March, '79 the students were on strike in support of the All Bihar I.T.I. trainees. As a result of the strike all failure students of 1st year were allowed to continue their studies in 2nd year unconditionally. All India Trade Test due to take place in July, '79 was postponed and was held in October, '79 in Bihar.

The two ex-students appeared in one subject only, and as per the mark sheet, they have passed but by mistake they are declared fail. Request has been made to the department to declare them pass. Result is awaited. This year because of the strike of the boys, the Annual Excursion was stopped. May be outside excursion programme could be arranged during first half of March, '80.

Session of I.T.I. schools begins from August. Hence new students were admitted. Also Welding Trade was started from August, '79. Accordingly trade and yearwise following was the strength of the students :-

From October, '79 Mr. Phillimon Tirkey I.T.I. has been appointed as Welder instructor. Also as per requirement pointed out by the Department, one allied Trade instructor Mr. Joseph Soy I.T.I. has been appointed from the month of Nov. '79. Thus total number of staff has increased from 4 to 7.

For recreation we have arrangements for out door and in door games. The Institution has a play ground where the boys play hockey and football seasonally. For Volley Ball we have separate arrangement. Students were allowed to join outside tournaments.

Time to time items for recreation like cultural show, and film show were organised.

15th December is the Foundation Day of our Institution. Like former years, we commemorated its importance with Thanks Giving Service and ended by Annual Sports. Mr. Thekur, the Principal, I.T.I. Hehal was the Chief Guest for Annual Sports. Children, men and women from Fudi Village were present during this function and some of them took part in some of the items of sports. In the end prizes were given to the winners by the Chief Guest. With the distribution of tea and murhi the function was closed.

A day before the Institution was closed for Christmas and New Year's day, T.T.C. X.mas day was observed. To celebrate this function all people of the compound and headmen of Fudi Village were present. Rev. Dr. M. Bage, Up-Pramukh Adhyaksh, G.T.L. Church was invited as a Chief Guest. As usual aftersongs and bhajans and Christmas messages by the Chief Guest Tea and Cakes were served to all. This day was ended with Bara Khana to all student instructors and special invitees.

Revered Chairman,

And honourable members of Fudi Technical Trust Society, warm welcome is accorded to you all for attending the 9th Annual General meeting. Let us thank God and sing to Him songs of praises for He has blessed us in the past year too. He has enabled us to maintain the status quo of the institute. Not only that but also He has crowned us with success in our endeavours although they are few and far between. Before we pass on to review and evaluate our actions let us say adieu to seventies and welcome to eighties. During seventies frets and fens were there but we could overcome them successfully thereby setting an atmosphere of proper discipline, sincere and honest discharge of duty in the institute. Monetarily we were not much handicapped in those years as the patrons of the institute honoured their pledge in due time. The Gossner Mission Society of West Germany deserves special commendation and thanks in this respect. Let us hope for a similar situation in ~~sixth~~ eighties too.

Last year proved to be a lean one so far number of our meetings is concerned. As a rule we have to hold twelve meetings a year. But we missed six of them. Moreover attendance was palpably thin in whatever meetings were held. Same is the case with our last few Annual General meetings. This unhappy record has been registered only last year. Obviously it shows our downward trend of interest in the affairs of the institute. Perhaps some insight and imagination-catching programmes are needed for the revival or revitalization of our interest. Our meetings are taking place in a stereotyped manner. We meet to discuss and solve our problems. This far this is all. We never think of coming together to enjoy a few moments by witnessing a drama or watching some cultural activities or the like. Shakespeare the greatest dramatist has said, "Moments of happiness are like interludes in the general drama of pain." In the process of solving problems, I think we as a body are lacking such moments in relation to our institute.

Coming to the body of my report I have to acquaint you with some achievements. First of all, we succeeded in leasing out our production section to a party called Toolsmeco of Cacutta. The lease-deed was executed and registered at Ranchi on 6th April '79. By leasing out the production section we have to get a rent of ~~Rs 500/-~~ Rs 500/- p.m. for first six months. Later on it has to go up to Rs. 1000/- p.m. Secondly, we had a success in finding and appointing a well qualified and experienced Superintendent. He is Sri Vincent Marki, B.Sc., Engineering (Electrical). Since 1st June '79. Even since his taking charge of the assignment troubles coming from the side of trainees have disappeared. We hope our institute will prosper and gain name and fame during his tenure of service.

Thirdly, service rule for employees has been framed. Accordingly an employee has to retire after 60th years of age. This is applicable to all. In the case of our Director we have relaxed the rule in practice ~~because~~ because we want that he be allowed to join a post honourably in the GEL Church after getting an appointment there. The GEL Church is delaying in appointing him. Hence his service is lingering even after the expiry of the said age-limit. It is hoped that it will do so shortly to save the FTTC from an embarrassing situation.

Fourthly, meeting after meeting we have been receiving applications from our employees for grant of loans of their P.F. A/Cs. We have been liberal enough to meet their requests although they are done so strictly according to P.F. rules.

Fifthly, we have started welding trade in right earnest and an instructor for the same has been appointed. We have fulfilled all conditions for the affiliation of the trade but still it is awaited. We do not know how long we shall have to wait for it.

FTTC is a charitable institution. As such it should have been made free from assessment of the income-tax. Now we are facing difficulty in this respect. The income-tax officer has assessed income-tax of Rs. 29000/- and Rs. 42,000/- for last two consecutive years. Moreover, he has made an attachment of Rs. 48,000/- in our bank. So the amount is not helping us. Consequently we had to make a decision to draw a loan from the Fixed Deposit of Depreciation Fund and some other funds for purchase of rice.

It is not a happy signal for the growth and maintenance of the institution. However, recently some attempt has been made to make the institute income-tax free. We shall have to wait for a favourable outcome.

In order to obtain affiliation for welding trade we had to appoint an allied trade instructor besides a welding trade instructor as per suggestion made by a commission. By appointing these two instructors our expenditure in the establishment has positively increased. But this augmentation of expenditure will not aid us if our aim is ~~not~~ achieved.

Recently our teaching staff has ^{been} ~~been~~ an initiative with plans and programmes to impart training in pump operating. This training will be of short duration. But ~~they~~ ^{it} will prove to be very helpful to our trainees in getting employment in ^{the concerned} ~~respective~~ fields. May this endeavour meet with success.

Lastly, let our institute be bestowed upon hands of our Lord God ~~who~~ who may Himself take proper care of it and render assistance, guidance and wisdom to the Governing Body in tackling problems.

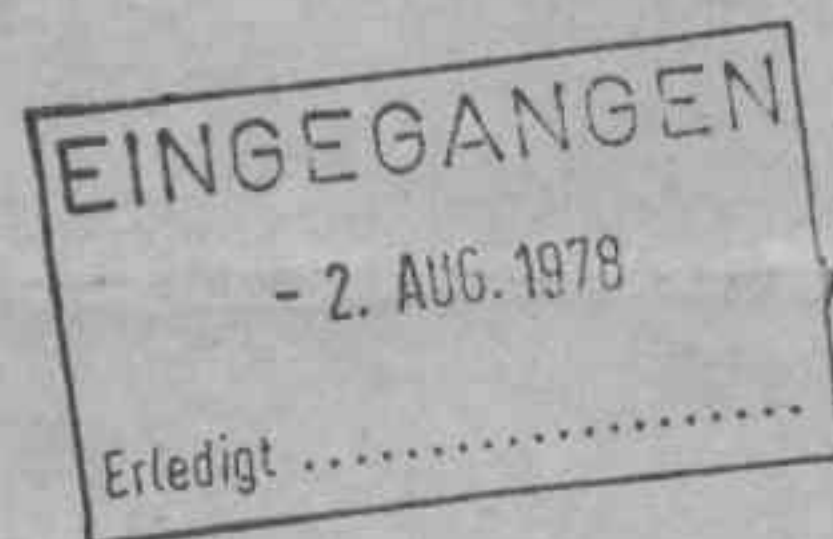

Since you have taken the office of Gossner Mission as Director, this is my first letter to you in which I like to communicate to you the following information -

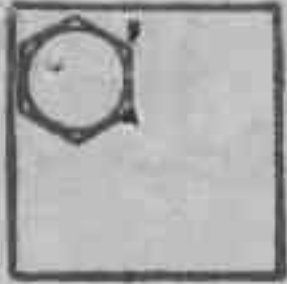

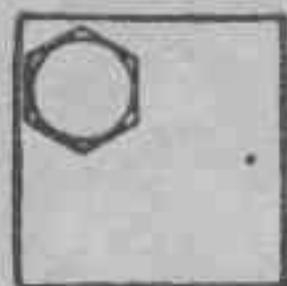

The submitted list with the materials wanted for the TTC was a tough task. I asked Mr.Schwerk to identify the spare parts on your description but he failed even after having asked some experts.

Just after having accompanied Mrs. and Dr.Singh to the air port your letter of June 8th arrived. I regret very much that the old case concerning the VW car ist still unsolved. The German course of law is quite different and a "magistrate of the court" does not exist, quite even at all concerning a case pending in a foreign country. 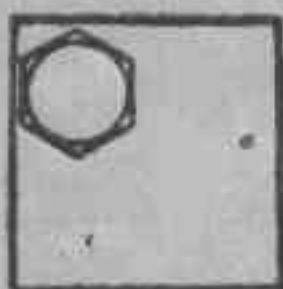

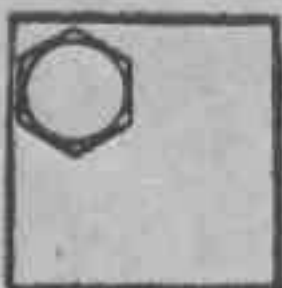

Dear brother Seeberg,

After long long silence I want to write some lines as information about TTC. I could have written earlier, but I was waiting for the decision of Governing Body in certain matters.

1. Life of TTC :- Up till now inspite of some differences in certain matters amongst us, Training is running smoothly. At present there are altogether 68 students. In between four students left their training.
2. Final Examination 1976 :- It may be held some time in July next. Date has not yet been announced to us. Thirty six (36) boys will appear this time. Out of them 6 boys are carpenters and rests are fitters.
3. New admission :- 202 boys will appear for interview on June 29th & 30th 1976 out of them are only two (2) boys for carpentry and rests are for fitter trade. The selected students will start their training with effect from 1.8.76.
4. Passed out trainees :- Almost all have joined their apprenticeship training in Hatia, Bokaro and other concerns. Many of the boys joined the Railway services and are placed in different places and stations.
5. Welding Trade :- This is a long outstanding subject for us. Up till now no recognition from the Government has been received and it seems there is very little chance of being recognition of this trade. However Governing Body has decided to start this trade privately as this is demand in the market from such welders. With this view interview of instructor for this trade is to take place on 26.6.76. If suitable candidate is found, Governing Body may start this trade from this year.
6. Leasing out of Production Section :- This is a long outstanding subject. About three years have passed but no final decision has been taken. We had advertised in the papers. Few applicants came up with their offer. One offer was even up to 6,000/- (Rupees six thousand as lease rent P.M.) next ~~lessor~~ one was of Rs. 3,100/-. After some negotiation the first one dropped out from the picture. Now negotiation is going on with the second man. We are waiting for the result.

7. Annual Statement for 1975 :- Annual Statement of A/c. for 1975 along with the copy of the audit report of Chartered Accountant is being sent for your information. Still before the Governing Body some question are pending to be concluded like loss in Special (Rice) A/c. It was all due to the loss in rice purchase of 1973, consumed in 1974 about which I have already intimated to you in some of my previous letters.

8. Volkswagen Car belonging to Dr. Dell :- Still the matter is pending. In course of time we had requested the authority concerned to allow us to retain the car which was not accepted. We are asked again to sell the car to State Trading Corporation of India Limited, Calcutta, but the problem is to take the car to Calcutta, as the car is out of order since long long ago. We are waiting for the final order.

9. Submersible Pumps :- Three pumps are out of order. Two pumps were sent to Patna before you had sent some materials for repair. They are returned back as they are, rather some of the main parts are taken out. Anyway through our electrician we want to get it repaired at least one pump. To help him if you could send some map or diagram or papers of rewinding the Submersible Pump it will be great help.

After so many years of service other motor pumps are also becoming unworkable. In these days we are facing lots of trouble in water supply.

10. General :- Since a long time we have no rain. When it seemed that the monsoon has started, people started showing their paddy and other things now they are getting dry. If no rain fall is there within a week, there will be the considerable damage to the cultivation.

We all are O.K. Thanks for the letter of thanks about the death of your daughter. With best regards and complements.

Dear brother Seeberg,

Since I received your last letter dated February, 20, 1975, this is my first letter about FTTC. I hope, you have returned back from Zambia safely, having gathered lots of new experiences.

Inspite of local dissatisfaction of staffs about day to day living which has become a problem for every body here due to increase of the cost of food commodities, every thing is going on well. Officers in the Governing Body has been changed - Fr. Delbeke is the Chairman, Mr. Samad is the Secretary and Mr. J.I.P. Singh (CNI) is the Treasurer. Last year due to the grace of Gossner Mission, there was no financial trouble though Christmas Gift could not be given, this may be materialized in 1975.

In next June/July '75 final boys will be appearing in the All India Trade Test and new batch of students (42 in numbers, 32 in fitter trade and 10 in Carpentry Trade) will be admitted from next August, 1975.

Still the mess is being run by the students. For the whole year we advance for rice to be realized monthly as they consume. We had some trouble with last year rice supply. Still the person concerned had not finalized the settlement of rice supply and because of that my special fund A/c. is still unaudited. I feel I shall run short of some money due to this hotchpotch business of the rice supplies.

1974 A/cs. are audited besides the A/c. of special fund where rice advance money is involved. One copy of the audited note is being sent to you for your information. If there will be any question in connection with the 1974 statements of Income & Expenditure, I shall try to explain.

Still the production section is lying vacant. There are few interested persons, who want to take it on lease, but the Governing Body is still not clear what to do. May be in next meeting scheduled to be on 10th May, it may arrive on some decision.

Greetings to you, to your family and to your staff.
Spring season has passed and we are in the middle of summer season.

I like to write this letter not as Director of FTTC, but as one of the officers of South East Anchal and as one of the Well Wishers of the Gossner Church. I am extremely interested about agriculture business of the church. Sarnatoli Farm is the branch of A.T.C. Khuntitoli. About ~~the~~ years ago, as I observed, the condition of the Sarnatoli Farm was very satisfactory. It has refunded all the loans from A.T.C. and was running successfully on its own resources. Seeing it progressive two more workers other than Mr. Mundu, were appointed who started non co-operation and the Adhyaksh Rev. Junul Topno, inspite of cooling down the non co-operation between the staff, left it as it ~~was~~. The result was that the farm went on loss. Also there were natural reasons of its loss. There were none to help under such circumstances.

Since few months, I also came in as a member of the managing Committee. Finally we retrenched the staff members. We kept only Mr. Mundu in the staff. Now I think to help this Farm again from any source (This is my personal view). Hence I thought to approach to you for help for once only, which will be on temporary loan basis. Hence please do consider freely whether you can help by giving one time loan of Rs. 8,000/- (Rupees eight thousand) only. Farm needs the money immediately so that it can start its cultivation works. Please let me know your reaction. If you will be in favour of helping this Farm, you may send the money either through KSS or through FTTC.

I shall be anxiously waiting for the reply.

Since you left India, I have always been thinking to form some sort of duty chart, as we had talked about. It is not so easy at the same time very difficult to make a pucca separation line between the duties of the Director and Superintendent. What I feel necessary, is the co-operation, good mutual understandings and a good team work spirit.

Any way following are for your information and considerations:-

- Director is overall in-charge of the Institution but if he is absent, Supdt. is to act.
- Supdt. is not only to supervise the Instructors but also to maintain people if he feels necessary.
- Things which are to be decided, Director has all the power to decide, but if he is not capable of taking decision, Supdt. should be consulted.
- All the training related things should be in a proper way and must be channelised through the Supdt.
- Director - administrative head. Supdt. - technical head.
- For purchasing of tools and equipments etc. Supdt. should be made responsible. It is not necessary for the Director to go every day to Ranchi for purchasing, his presence in the campus is much more necessary.
- If the Director goes out of the station, Supdt. must be informed.
- The spare key of the Institution car and motor cycle should be with the Supdt.
- In case of emergency when the Director is not in the campus, Supdt. should be allowed to use the Vehicles.
- For sanctioning of the leave of the trainees Supdt. is responsible, in special cases it should be forwarded to the Director.
- Time to time Supdt. should be allowed to go for making personal contacts with the Industrialists, and other important people in connection with boys employment - this sort of trip should be well planned.

Several times I have noticed Supdt., being responsible for all Trg. matters, being neglected. If the Director together with some of the Instructors can decide the training matters, then what is the use of having a Supdt. in the training section.

After your departure, once we were going to Ranchi and I asked him to allow me to drive the car but he refused. One day during discussion in his office I pointed out your views regarding car driving that I should get opportunity to exercise driving, he said that this was Pastor Seeberg's idea, it is not necessary that the Director will follow the same. Any way I have very little hope that the situation will be better.

I am really sorry to write all these things and in such a way, please forgive me if I am very straight.

One thing as I had requested you during our talk in Ranchi that my family is also staying in Fudi, I should get the opportunity to use the car specially at the week-ends. But whether I will get , or entitled to get, that is up to you to decide.

Well dear Director, don't think that I claim for the same facility which has been given to Rev. Aind being the Director FTTC, but being Supdt. I must have atleast some of the facilities available.

Please extend my good wishes and regards to your family, to Mr. Schwerkand his family, and to all Gossner People .

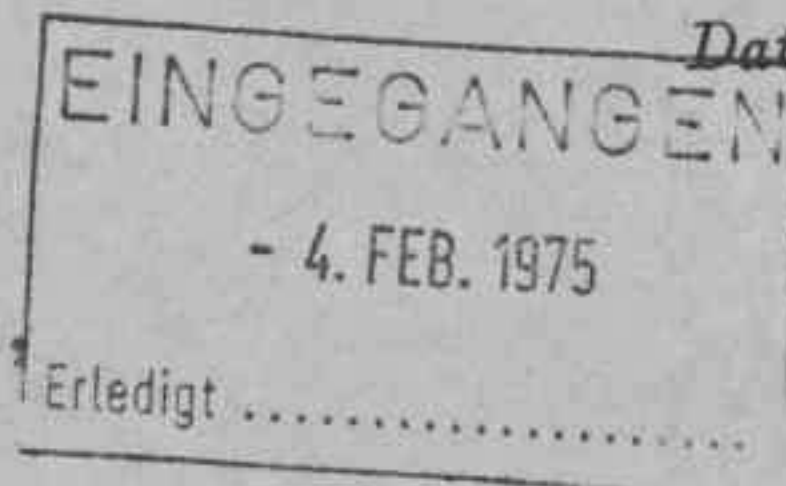

Dear brother Seeberg,

After a long break I am writing these few lines. Your letters dated December, 12, 1974 and January, 14, 1975 were received. I am grateful to you for these letters. In the first letter as mentioned above, you had informed me to continue the Christmas Gifts. This information reached me after the close of training for Christmas holidays and therefore Christmas present could not be given. Through the second letter I came to know that D.M. 5,000 has been sent to T.T.C. A/c. for 1975.

Regarding last year receipt in connection with subsidy I like to inform you that after the amount of Rs. 30,000/- (Rupees Thirty thousand) which was credited to our A/c. in the State Bank of India, Khunti Branch in Nov. '74, I was informed by the Bank that another amount of Rs. 31,591.64 (Rupees thirty one thousand five hundred ninety one and paise sixty four only) has been credited to our A/c. in this month (January, 1975) sent direct from Duetsche Bank, Hamburg. For this amount I have received information neither from you nor from Duetsche Bank Hamburg. Please see and let me know about it.

Now let me acquaint you with the difficulties that we have in pulling^m the mess. Rice is very dear. We have purchased rice @ Rs. 227.44 P per quintal. The boys contribute only @ Rs. 40/- per head per month. The monthly consumption of rice is nearly 10 quintals (Rs. 227.46). The total monthly contribution of the boys is Rs. 2,720/-. So there is a deficit of nearly Rs. 1,000/- p.m. The Governing Body has decided to subsidise some part out of last year's profit from training production profit which will be nearly Rs. 3,000/-. As we have not announced earlier, increment in mess charge is not possible. From next session, I think that mess charge will be raised.

Next I like to mention that Dr. Hess and the other German Guests were here on 23-1-75. We enjoyed to meet them.

Handwerkliche Ausbildungszentren der Frauenarbeit der Gossner-Kirche in Indien

Die Frauenarbeit in der Gossner-Kirche

Wie in den meisten Kirchen gibt es in Chotanagpur bereits seit Jahrzehnten eine Frauenorganisation in der Gossner-Kirche, die Mahila Sangh. Sie ist von den Ortsgemeinden über die Kirchenkreise bis hin zu einer gesamtkirchlichen Vertretung aufgebaut. Ihre Hauptaufgaben sehen die Frauen in einer Unterstützung der Gemeindearbeit durch Treffen nach den Gottesdiensten am Sonntag zur Vertiefung der Predigt, gemeinsamem Gebet und einer Verteilung der Aufgabe der Betreuung von kranken oder sonst notleidenden Gemeindeglieder. Dies wird noch ergänzt durch Hausandachten für Nachbarschaftsbereiche am Samstag. Seit Jahrzehnten bereits hat sich die Frauenarbeit auch immer für die Finanzen der Kirche verantwortlich gefühlt, indem sie bei ihren Mitgliedern für eine sorgsame Beachtung der regelmäßigen Reisopfer (eine Handvoll Reis wird beim Kochen jeder Mahlzeit für die Gemeinde beiseite getan) eingetreten ist. Daneben haben sie mit besonderen Basaren Mittel für die Missionsarbeit der Kirche und die Bibelgesellschaft gesammelt.

Seit einigen Jahren sind die Frauen auch kirchenpolitisch mehr in Erscheinung getreten. Dabei macht sich bemerkbar, daß sie eine ganze Reihe sehr fähiger Führungspersönlichkeiten hat. Die Frauen haben sich in bestimmten Fällen zusammen mit der Laienvereinigung und der Jugendorganisation der Kirche mit Erfolg dafür eingesetzt, daß bestimmte Entscheidungen der Kirchenleitung, die von der Basis der Gemeindeglieder nicht akzeptiert wurden, zurückgenommen werden mußten (z.B. eine Grundstücksverpachtung zu einem zu geringen Mietpreis). Sie haben auch durchgesetzt, daß eine Frauenvertreterin in die Kirchenleitung berufen wurde und haben die Frage der Frauenordination auf die Tagesordnung der Pfarrervertretung (Ministerium) gesetzt.

Das Handwerksprogramm

Seit zwei Jahren hat die Gesamtfrauenarbeit ein wirtschaftliches Selbsthilfeprojekt für nicht berufstätige Frauen geplant. Man möchte bewußt bescheiden anfangen. Die Kirche hat nach langem Hinausschieben endlich ein Gebäude als Werkstatt zur Verfügung gestellt, das aber noch renoviert werden muß. Dort soll ein Ausbildungsprogramm in Schneiderei, im Sticken und Stricken gestartet werden. Es sind Frauen da, die die Ausbildung übernehmen können. Gebraucht werden - neben der Renovierung des Gebäudes - lediglich einige Nähmaschinen, Material und sonstige Geräte zur Ausrüstung der Werkstatt. Während und nach der Ausbildung will das Zentrum auch bei der Vermarktung der Produkte behilflich sein. Es ist vor allem ein ziemlich großer Bedarf an Schuluniformen auch für die Kirchenschulen vorhanden. - In Govindpur wurde bereits in den Räumen der Tabitha-Schule, der Ausbildungsstätte für Katechetinnen mit einem gleichen Programm sowohl für die Studentinnen der Tabitha-Schule als auch für Dorffrauen begonnen. Das Interesse ist sehr groß an diesem Programm.

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
