

Minutes of the 3rd meeting of the Vikas Maitri Kalyan Sanstha Board (Executive Committee).

The Third meeting of the V.M.K.S. Board was held on the 10.10.71 in the Vikas Maitri Office (St. Joseph's Club), Purulia Road, Ranchi, at 3.00 p.m. and was attended by the following members:

Fr. T. Moens presided over the meeting.

- The matters transacted at the meeting were:
 1. The minutes of the 2nd meeting were confirmed.
- 2. The consensous of opinion was that several members were not taking interest in the working of the V.M.K.S. in as much as they had mot attended any of the meetings held so far. It was therefore decided that such members should be replaced by new members unless they had any reasons to show for not attending the meetings. The Secy was requested to make necessary enquiry and report in the next meeting of the Board.
- 3. In reply to our requests for financial aids from the foreign organisations the letters received up till the date of the meeting were -
 - (i) canada One
 - (ii) Swiss Catholic Lenten Fund (iii) Misereor

 - (iv) N.C.C. (v) Catholic Fund for Overseas Dev. (CAFOD)

These letters were read out by Fr. Bogaert and explained as to for what particular development works these Donor Agencies would extend their help and what were their denditions for help. This required chalking out plans and only thereafter our replies could be sent to them.

However a ceiling for aid up to Rs. 1,000/- could be fixed for each individual, and it would also be necessary to charge 5% of the grant (2% advisory charges and 3% for administrative charges) for projects which would be routed through the V.M.K.S. These needed further detailed examination.

- 4. It, was decided that the next meeting of the Board be held o'n 12.11.71 at 6.00 p.m. in the office of the VM, Ranchi.
- 5. "The meeting en led with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

The following matters were transacted at the meeting The minutes of the Second Meeting held on the 19th July 1971 were read out and were confirmed.

- Points arising out of the minutes of the Second Meeting were discussed-
 - (a) Draft By-Laws: Mr. Viswanathan explained that in order to be very specific the By-Laws will have to be based on the provisions of the Memorandum approved by the Registration Department. Final reply of the Registration Department would therefore, have to be awaited.
 - (b) Booklets on Banking: Fr. Bogaert informed that if individual members needed it they could have it on payment.
 - (c) Aid from Foreign Organisations: Fr. Bogaert informed that no replies had been received till 17.9.71 from any of the Foreign Organisations to whom letters had been sent.
- The reworked version of the Memorandum and Rules & Regulations in accordance with the advice of the Registration Department were read out by Fr. Bogaert and were discussed point by point. Some clarifications were asked for by some members on the provisions and the same was done by the Chairman and Wen. Archdeacon Cable.

- 4. Ven Archdeacon Cable suggested the following amendments:-
 - (a) The word 'inspection' at line 7 of the rule 14 (b) be changed to 'Inspecting'.
 - (b) The term ' committee' used at line 7 of the rule 16 be substituted by 'Board'.

These sugrestions appeared quite reasonable and were accepted.

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The Memorandum and the Rules & Regulations were unanimously approved. The requisite number of the copies of the documents were signed by the required number of member and the Secy. was requested to submit as soon as possible this Memorandum and the Fules & Regulations to the Inspector General of Registrations, Bihar with the request to register the V.M.K.S. under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 at an early date.

- Fr. T. Moens suggested that if any member had not attended any of the three meetings without giving any excuse his name should be removed from the list of members of the V.M.K.S. and in his place Dr. Nirmal Minj be co-opted. This was accepted by the members and the Secretary was asked to issue a notice accordingly.
- 6. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

OF

VIKAS MAITRI KALYAN SANSTHA

- 1. THE NAME OF THE SOCIETY: The name of the Society is "Vikas Maitri Kalyan Sanstha."
- REGISTERED OFFICE: The registered office of the Society shall be: C/O St. Joseph's Club, Purulia Road, Ranchi -1, Bihar.
- 3. OBJECTS OF THE SOCIETY: The objects for which the Society is established are:-
 - (a) to work under, and in cooperation with, Vikas Maitri and to promote, the economic development of the people of Chotanagour, particularly through agriculture and industries, and to promote their social advance;
 - (b) to establish and maintain customs services to assist farmers in the more intensive cultivation of their lands;
 - (c) to encourage and to assist in the establishing of educational institutions, workshops, dispensaries, relief work etc; without charge for services rendered:
 - (d) to print, publish and to sell or distribute gratuitously, journals, periodicals, books and pamphlets;
 - (e) to purchase, hire, lease or in exchange, acquire movable or immovable property, which may be deemed necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Society and to improve, manage, sell, lease or dispose of, or turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any of its properties;
 - (f) to receive from any part of the world donations, bequests, subscriptions, gifts in cash or in kind from individuals, associations, trusts, Governments and any other institutions;
 - (g) to borrow money and to repay the same and to raise funds from time to time for the Society, with or without security, as the Society may think fit and proper;
 - (h) to spend and utilize the funds and properties of the society in furtherance of its aforesaid objects;
 - (i) to invest the monies and use the properties of the society not immediately required for its purposes, in such lawfull manner as may from time to time be determined by the society and/or the Board;
 - (j) to enlist the services of paid, part-time or honorary workers for the attainment of its purposes;
 - (k) to institute, prosecute and defend all such actions, suits and proceedings, civil or criminal as may be considered necessary or proper or expedient for promoting and attaining the objects and purposes of the Society;

- to assist any institution, society or association having objects wholly or in part similar to the objects of the society and to cooperate with any person or persons in such objects;
- (m) to do all or any of the above activities either as principals, agents, trustees, guarantors, or otherwise and by or through trustees agents, guarantors or otherwise as may be required from time to time;
- (n) to do all such lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any or all the above objects.
- 4. BO RD: The names, addresses and designations of the members of the Board to whom the management of the affairs of the Society is entrusted as required under the Societies Registration Act XXI 1860 are given below:

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RULES AND REGULATION

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VIKAS MAITRI KALYAN SANSTHA

INTERPREPATION: The Preliminary notes in these Rules and Regulations, hereto shall not effect the construction hereof and in these presents unless there is something in the subject or context inconsistant therewith:-

"The Society" means "Vikas Maitri Kalyan Sanstha."

"The Act" means the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 as applicable to the State of Bihar and includes where the context so admits any re-enactment or Statutory modification thereof for the time being in force.

"The Board" means the Governing Body for the tir) being of the Society.

> "Governor" means a mamber of the Board for the time being.

"Secretary" and "Treasurer" means the Secretary and Treasurer respectively for the time being of the Society and Board including any person temporarily appointed to perform the duties of the Secretary and/or the Treasurer respectively.

"The Inspector - General of Registration" means the Inspector-General of Registration, Bihar, appointed under the Act.

"Office" means the Registered Office of the Society.

2. MEMBERSHIP OF THE SOCIETY:

- (a) Membership of the Vikas Maitri Kalyan Sanstha shall be limited to thirty members;
- (b) Twenty members nominated by the Vikas Maitri from among its individual members as specified in clause 4 (c) (<u>Individual Membership</u>) of Rules and Regulations of Vikas Maitri (Registered under the Societies Act XXI of 1860 No. 51 dated February 1970: "Any individual Christian, living or working in the Southern District of Bihar or contiguous areas, may become a member of Vikas Maitri on payment of an entrance fee of Re. 1/- and an annual subscription of Rs. 3/-.
 - (c) Ten members nominated by the Vikas Maitri from the general public, who are interested in the objects and aims of the Society.

3. TERMS OF MEMBERSHIP:

- (a) The members of the Society shall be appointed for three years and shall be eligible for re-appointment. On admission they shall sign the roll of members of the Society.
- (b) In the first instance one third will retire after one year, then another third after two years, as decided by the Board, and thereafter in rotation after a three year appointment.

- ROLL OF MEMBERSHIP: The members of the Society shall sign the roll. The membership roll shall be maintained by the Secretary of the Society at its registered office, and it shall specify:
 - (a) The names designation and addresses of the members for the time being.
- (b) Any other information or particulars which the society may require. salfortfagua
 - (c) Any changes in membership taking place from time to time shall be recorded in the roll.

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- (a) The members of the Society shall meet at least once a year. This Annual General Meeting shall be held within three months from the close of the financial year.
 - (b) THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE SOCKETY, GATHERED IN THE ANNUAL GENER L MEETING shall be as follows:
 - (i) It shall have overall supervision of the Board and all activities of the Society.
 - (ii) It shall receive an Annual report on all activities and work undertaken by the Board.
 - (iii) It shall pass and accept an Annual budget recommended by the Board.
 - (iv) It shall appoint the auditors.
 - (v) It shall pass and accept the audited accounts and Balance Sheet of the Board.
 - (vi) It may give directions to the Board as to policy development and expenditure of the Society.
 - (vii) It shall elect the members of the Board.
- (c) Special General Meetings can be convened over the signatures of at least ten members of the Society for considering such agenda as they may deem fit. Such a requisition shall be submitted to the president for action within one month from the date of the deposition of the requisition. Failing action thereon in the stipulated time, the members can proceed to convene the meeting themselves.
 - (d) The quorum at general meetings shall at least be half of the total membership. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless the quorum requisite be present within fifteen minutes at the commencement of the business. No quorum will be required for an adjourned meeting.
 - (e) Specific notice of the meetings and the agenda shall be circulated to the members of the Society at least two weeks prior to the holding of the meetings.
 - 6. DISCIPLINARY ACTION: Any member of the Society shall be liable to be expelled from membership of the Society or Board on being declared insolvent or for misconduct involving moral turpitude or for having engaged in any activities detrinental to the interests of the Society. However before any discininary action is taken against

any member . The Governing Body of the Vikas Maitri, who shall alone be empowered to take such action, shall give such member a reasonable opportunity to be heard in the matter and their decision shall be final.

7. THE BOARD:

- (a) The Society shall elect a Board which shall consist of not less than five and not more than twelve member.
 - (b) The control and management of the affairs of the Society shall vest in the Board.
- 8. MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD: The first Board shall be nominated by the Governing Body of Vikas Maitri. The vacancies in the Board caused by yearly retirement of a third of the members in rotation shall be filled by election at the Annual General Meeting of the Society from a pannel recomended by the Board. Retiring members are eligible for re-election.

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- 9. MEETINGS OF THE BOARD: (a) The board shall normally meet at least once in three months. Such meetings shall normally be called by the Secretary in consultation with the President.
- (b) The quorum at such meetings shall be half of the total membership of the Board.
- (c) Special meetings of the Board may be called at the request of three or more members of the Board. Such requisition shall be addressed to the Secretary and if the Secretary does not ensure compliance within ten days from the day of deposit of such requisition, the requisitionists themselves can proceed to convene the meeting.
 - 10. OFFICERS OF THE SOCIETY AND BOARD: The Board shall, from among its members, elect a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer who shall also function as President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Society, and assign to them their duties. The Board shall have power to fill up casual vacancies and co-opt such members as may be considered necessary in the interest of the Society. The maximum of 12 members shall not be exceeded.
 - 11. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD: The duties of the Board shall be :-
 - (a) To prepare and propose the annual budget of the Society and the annual accounts and balance sheet for the approval of the Annual General Meeting.
 - (b) To handle all financial transactions and investments of the Society;
 - (c) To decide all questions of capital expenditure and loans;
 - (d) To make and give redeipts, releases and other discharges for money payable to the Society and for the claims and demands of the Society.
 - (e) To accept donations, subscription and endowments on such lawful terms and subjected to such conditions

as the Board from time to time think fit and proper for the purposes of the Society.

- (f) To accept grants from the Government and other agencies on such lawful terms and conditions as may be nutually agreed upon.
- (g) To determine the manner in which notes, redeipts, acceptances, endorsements, cheques, releases, contracts, and documents shall be signed or executed by or on behalf of the Society.
 - (h) To make, vary and repeal from time to time regulations for the transactions of the business of the Society and for its officers and employees.
- (i) To appoint committees or sub-committees as hereinafter provided for, with such functions and powers as the Board may think fit.
 - (j) To delegate any of its powers to duly constituted sub-committees as it may think fit.
 - (k) To authorize the Secretary to represent the Society in and for all kinds of legal business.
- (1) To frame bye-laws concerning the working of the Board which are not repugnant to these regulations.
- (m) To do such lawful things as it may consider necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying our the objects of the Society.
 - (n) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, abandon or withdraw any legal proceedings by or against the Society and its officers and otherwise concerning the Society.
- (o) To refer any claims and demands by or against the Society to arbitration.
- (p) To provide from time to time for the management of the affairs of the Society, in such manner as it may think fit and, in particular, to appoint any persons to be the attorney and agents of the Society with authority to further delegate such powers and upon such terms as may be thought fit.
 - (q) To appoint bankers of the Society.
 - (r) To control the rolicy, development and expenditure of the Society.
 - 12. PROPERTY: The property, movable and immovable, belonging to the Society shall be vested for the time being in the Board, and in all proceedings civil and criminal shall be described as the property of the Board by their proper title.

13. ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT THEREOF:

(a) The Board shall cause true accounts to be kept at the office of all sums of money received and the sources thereof and sums of money expanded by the Society and of the objects and purposes for which such receipts and expenditure take place and of the assets and liabilities of the Society. The first financial year of the Society shall be form the date

of registration of the Society to 31st December 1971 and the succeeding financial years shall end on the last of December each year.

- (b) The Board shall cause the accounts of the Society to be audited once a year by a duly qualified Auditor and have the Balance sheet and Receipts and Expenditure Accounts prepared by him.
 - (c) The first Auditor of the Society shall be appointed by the Board within one month after the date of registration of the Society and the Auditor so appointed shall hold office until the conculusion of the First Annual General Meeting of the Society.

The Society shall at each Annual General Meeting appoint an Auditor to hold office from the conclusion of that meeting until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

(d) The Auditor of the Society shall submit a report showing the exact state of the financial affairs of the Society. Three copies of the Balance Sheet and Receipts and Expenditure Accounts and the Auditor's Report shall be certified by the Auditor.

14. INSPECTION:

- (a) The registers of members and the minute book of the General Meetings of the Society and accounts registers shall be kept at the office and shall be open to inspections by members during the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on every business day.
- (b) The Board shall, from time to time, determine whether and to what extent and under what conditions the books of accounts and books and cocuments of the Society (other than those referred to above) or any of them shall be open to inspection of the members not being a Governor and no member not being a Governor shall have any right of inspection any books of accounts or book or document of the Society except as conferred by law or authorized by the Board or by the Society.
- MINUTES: The Board shall cause minutes to be kept by making within thirty days of the conclusion of every General Meeting and of every meeting of the Board or of every Committee of the Board, entries thereof in separate minutes book with their pages consecutively numbered. The last page of the record of proceedings of each meeting in such book shall be dated and signed by the Chairman of the respective meeting or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting. The minutes when recorded and signed as aforesaid shall be accepted as a ture record of the business transacted at such meeting.
 - 16. AUTHENTICATION OF DOCUMENTS: All documents creating a charge or obligation on the Society or relating to acquisition, alternation or transfer of immovable properties shall be executed for and on behalf of the Society by two members of the Society. One member shall be the Secretary and the other a person appointed for the purpose through a resolution passed by the Committee. All such documents shall bear the common seal of the Society which will be in the custody of the Secretary and kept in the office of the Society.

- APPLICATION OF INCOME OF SOCIETY: The income and property of the Society whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects and purposes of the Society as set forth in the Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonuses or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Society or otherwise, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment of renumeration to any employee of the Society or other person in return for services actually rendered to this Society for services actually rendered to this Society.
 - 18. MISCELLANEOUS AMEMDMENTS: No amendments shall be made to the Memorandum of Association or to the Rules and Regulations of the Society which are for the time being in force, unless the amendment; The second second
 - (i) has been included in the agenda submitted to the members of the General'Meeting.
 - (ii) has been agreed to by the votes of three fifths of the members delivered in person or proxy, and con-firmed by the vote of three fifths of the members present in a second special meeting conducted by the Board at an interval of one month after the former meeting: and
 - (iii) has the approval of the Governing Body of Vikas Maitri.

19. DISSOLUTION:

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Wit with

- (a) The Society shall not be dissolved unless threefifths of the members shall have expressed a with for such dissolution by their votes delivered in person or by proxy at a General Meeting conducted for the purpose, and the Governing Body of Vikas Maitri approves of such dissolution.
- (b) If upon dissolution or winding up of the Society there remains, after satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, any funds, movable and immovable property whatsoever, the same shall not be distributed amongst the members of the Society but shall be handed over to Vikas Maitri or to such organistions and agencies that have aided the Society or be transferred to such associations having objects similar to the objects of the Society. This shall be determined by the General Meeting at or before the time of dissolution, or in default thereof, by the Court of Judidature as may have or acquire jurisdiction in the matter.

 If the above is not feasible the property, movable and immovable, shall be handed over to Government.

All the provisions of the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 will apply to the Society.

Fr. T. Moens was requested to chair the meeting.

The following matters were transacted at the meeting:

(1) Welcome and introduction of members: Fr. T. Moens briefly explained how the idea of launching a Development Board, as a satelite body of Vikas Maitri, had grown over the last two years. He welcomed the members and requested each to introduce himself.

(2) <u>Discussion on the Memorandum of Association and Rules and Regulations:</u> Fr. M.V.d. Bogaert introduced the subject by relating how the drafters of the Memorandum had taken inspiration from the Seva Kendras organized by the Ramakrishna Mission, and other sources.

While the Board would be closely related to Vikas Maitri and follow its policies, it would at the same time have enough independence to pursue its objective: to function as a go-between linking the small man of Chotanagpur with the Nationalised Fanks and donor agencies. Responsibility for financial and technical matters would be entirely with the VMKS.

Fr. Moens added that two committees would have to be set up:
(i) An advisory committee consisting of experts and specialists in accounting agriculture, engineering, law etc, and
(ii) a Control Committee, consisting mainly of economists and financiers.

Ven. J. Cable, who had played a very prominent role in drafting the Memorandum, raised the basic question whether it would not be better to register the VMKS as a Company rather than a Registered Society. In Maharashtra, the Government was heavily taxing all registered societies, as a result of which some had already decided to shift their offices to other states. Other States in India might eventually immitate Maharashtra's example.

Mr. S. Viswanathan admitted that it was possible to register the VMKS as a "Section 25 Company", but the processwould be very cumbersome and expensive, in the form of registration fees, for filing documents etc. and heavy Government control.

The Members present, agreed that for the time being we could take the benefits of the Bihar Registration of Societies Act 1860 and register VMKS as a registered society under that Act. Registration is absolutely necessary. It gives VMKS a legal entity and donnor agencies require registration as a condition for funelling funds.

Fr. Bogaert then read out the Braft Memorandum:

U/S 3 b, <u>Customs services</u> means the provision of machinery, fertilizers, maintenance services etc.

U/S 3 c, Ven. Cable indicated that the VMKS would not establish educ. instit. but encourage and assist others to do so.

the question was raised as to whether Members of the VMKS could be also its beneficiaries. The members agreed that this would be possible, but that when drafting further By-Laws, the impression be not created that members of the VMKS draw undue advantage of their position.

U/S 6 The words " or to the Rules and Regulations of the Association which are for the time being in force" were removed, so as not to have a contradiction with Section 9 of the Rules and Regulations.

The approval of the Governing Body of VM would be necessary

to change the Memorandum, not for changes in the Rules and Regulations.

The Rules and Regulations were then taken up for consideration.

- U/S 4 It was explained that this section dealing with membership, saw to it that a balance was kept between the need for expertise and the desirability of having a considerable part of local (tribal) and Xtian representitives on the VMKS. It would at the same time ensure the openness of the VMKS, and avoid creating the impression that it is a "sectarian" body.
- U/S 5,i, It was suggested that in the by-laws, reasons for removing a member from the executive committee should be made explicit.
- U/S 7, c, After some discussion it was decided to keep one half as the required quorum, but to change the clause so as to read:

"No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless the quorum requisite be present within half an hour of the commencement of the meeting.

U/S 8 The clause on Voting would cover general meetings as well as Executive Committee meetings.

(3) Passing of the Memorandum and Rules and Regulations:

After this discussion the Chairman asked whether the members present approved of the Memorandum. There was unanimous consent. The Memorandum andRules and Regulations were passed and adopted, and seven members, commencing with the meeting's chairman, signed four copies of the Memorandum, and attested the Rules and Regulations. Two members functioned as witnesses.

Since the first Executive Committee would have to be constituted with the approval of the Governing Body of Vikas Maitri the names of the office-bearers would be noted in the Memorandum of a later date.

(4) Policies & Practices:

The Chairman indicated the needs which the VMKS would have to meet, by giving illustration of the ASMA Project along the Khunti-Simdega which could not be started because of the absence of a guarantor agency.

The plan to have a "poor man hospital fund scheme" had not been started for the same reason.

Ven.Cable read out a letter from the Bihar Christian Council, indicating that a donor agency in UK is precisely looking for an intermediary body like VMKS to help with funds.

Besides functioning as a <u>guarantor</u> on the basis of a fund invested in a fixed deposit (on which a 10 fold loan from Government could be obtained), the VMKS should also function as <u>starter</u>, especially especially for small men, who have very little resources of their own but have the potentialities to grow into entrepreneurs.

Mr.C.Kerketta raised the question whether VMKS would have a definite programme of development of its own. The re-ly to this was:

- (i) at a later period, such a programme could be attempted in cooperation and understanding with Govt.(vg. the Govt sp nsored Chotanagpur Development Board). This was actually one of the suggestions made at the Mandar Seminar in 1967, (as a result of which Wi was launched).
- (ii) in the initial stages help would be given on an ad hoc basis to both individuals, institutions and especially small cooperatives (thereby encouraging people to cooperate with one another), working for the welfare of local people of Chotanagpur, irrespective of religion.
- (iii) initially the VMKS would receive the help of the Executive Officer of VM, for field investigation. Eventually a qualified team of experts might be necessary to undertake the work.

Financing Operations of the VMKS: Banks allow a ½% service charge for bodies such as VMKS. Donor agencies in their turn, permit 2% for advisory charges and 3% for administration charges, for projects which would be routed through the VMKS.

Besides Funds from abroad, it would be necessary to generate funds in India also.

The United Bank of India seems at present best equipped for helping the work of the VMKS. It was therefore agreed that funds could be invested with that bank, and Mr.S.N.Sen, could be requested to be a member of the VMKS.

(5) Executive Committee

As per Rules and Regulations, the first executive committee will have to be appointed by the Governing Body of VM. The following names were proposed. They will be sent up for approval to the B.B. of Vikas Maitri.


