Let us remind ourselves about our annual programme on the above mentioned subject. Once in a year all the Lutheran churches in India observe "Rewa Mission Day" and thereby collect offerings or donations for joint effort of evangelistic enterprise in Rewa area. According to the annual call received from Rev. G. Thoms Abhyaksh, Secretary, Rewa Mission Work, the date for observation-use of this day falls on 1st or 2nd Sunday of October, 1967. As there is a short time for the wide circulation about the observance of this day on one of first two Sundays of October '67, I have decided to fix it on October 22, 1967. I hope by this time call for Rewa Mission Day prayer will reach you all and to all the congregations. Each of you is therefore requested to circulate the call of observing this "Rewa Mission Day on Oct. 22, '67 to all your congregations so that through out our Gossner Church we can observe the same day.

A report on the visit of five Synodical Presidents and Miss E. Hirams of Andhra Evangelical Lutheran Church to Shahdol Field of Rewa Mission from October 14-16, 1966.

By God's grace it was my happy privilege to address the five Synodical Conventions of the AELC twice during my deputation tour of the Church in last four years. On these occasions I had humbly but sincerely extended an invitation to the ladies to visit us on the field to gain first hand knowledge of the work being done. Ever since with my associates I have been praying for the same. Now through the kind efforts of the President of Rewa Mission, who is also the President of AELC, the Lord made it possible for the five Presidents of Synodical Conventions to visit us. The Lord indeed is faithful and has answered our prayers. We the Rewa Mission family at Shahdol, would like to thank the President AELC and Rewa Mission Executive Councils of AELC and Rewa Mission for arranging and making it possible for a women delegation of this kind to visit our field for the first time. We are also thankful to the Synodical Presidents who undertook this strenuous journey to Shahdol to bless us with their loving fellowship.

The delegation reached Shahdol at 3.10 P.M. on October 14th by the Bilaspur-Indore Express and were received at the station by Revs. C.B.Rao boarded the ladies' compartment, welcomed them to Shahdol and prayed with them thanking the Lord for journeying mercies. Their luggage was then unloaded and were then driven in cycle rickshaws to the hospital compound. At the hospital compound gate the delegation was received by Dr.(Mrs) Ramabai Rao and the medical staff, patients and their relatives. It was indeed a very happy occasion for us all to have these 'daughters of Zion' in our midst and more so for Mrs. K. Devasahayam and Dr.(Mrs) Ramabai Rao, for they are childhood classmates and good friends. After a long time they met each other. The staff and those present were then introduced to the Presidents and the visiter by the doctor. She then led us to the verandah of the hospital, the place of worship for the Shahdol congregation for thanksgiving service. With our hearts full of joy, we sang the bhajan of praise 'Jai Jai Yesu'

'Jai Jai Yesu' accompanied by kanjiras and talams, followed by Dr. (Mrs) Rao leading the assembly in prayer. Rev. Rao then read Psalm 103 and welcomed the Presidents and the visitor. He said that this is a mission field still in the pioneering stage. In these humble dwellings which God has provided through you we live and work. Facilities and conveniences of modern type are very limited. But dwellers in these huts are your children whom you have commissioned and sent and they cherish a warm and loving heart toward them and with such a loving heart we welcome you in our midst and in our humble dwellings in the name of Trium God. Replying the brief welcome address President Mrs.K.Devasahayam thanked the assembly for the kind reception and welcome to them. We stood up, said Lord's prayer and with benediction the assembly dispersed. Presidents and the visitor were then entertained at tea by the Raos.

Then we made out a programme for the celebration of Rewa Mission Day and the closing function of the jubilee year, we had designated 14th evening as a social evening for the congregation. Dr.(Mrs) Rao and her colleagues erected a pandal in front of the hospital building and beautifully decorated the same in side and out. Our joy knew no bounds when we learnt that the Presidents were also reaching the field the same evening. When they arrived we immediately extended them an invitation to join us in our celebrations and get together which they graciously accepted.

The Presidents were made to sit on chairs on a raised platform under the pandal with congregation seated on the ground in front of them. With invocation and singing of congregation bhajan "Ao Prabhu ghat aj hanare" our evening function commenced. Pastor Rao then offered prayer thanking God for fifty years ministry of Rewa Mission and all that HE accomplished through Rewa Mission in these years in Murwahi, Surguja and Rewa; for men of vision and dedication to the cause of spreading the gospel to unevangelised areas in our motherland, to serve as its Officers; for men and women who offered to go to these forbidden lands for the gospel at great sacrifice as missionaries and workers; for the present activities

of the mission. We also prayed beseeching God to expand and flourish the present ministry of the mission and to provide for the same. He also thanked God for the visiting Synodical Presidents. When the welcome song was being sung by the congregation, presidents and the visitor were garlanded by representatives of the Sunday School, Yuwati and Yuval Samaj, Manila Samaj and the staff of the Rewa Mission. Rev. Rao then read from Philipines 4:10-20 and with a brief comment welcomed the Presidents in the fellowship of Rewa Mission at Shahdol. We always had men officers and men visitors to our field but this is the first time an all women delegation of this kind has ever visited the field. Church women have played a great role in helping to achieve the purpose of Rewa Mission. This can never be underestimated. Their concern for Rewa Mission has been loving and motherly. This motherly love for us all further inspired by the love of Christ has brought these church members to us. We their spiritual children are not only happy to have you in our midst but consider it a great privilege to welcome you in our midst with hearts full of love and gratitude and to be waiting upon you to serve during your sojourn with us.

What you see before you is just the beginning of the fruit of your labour with us. There are more than 500,000 Adivasis that inhabit the jungles of this valley of the Vindhya still unreached with the gospel. In addition to the above we have a large mixed population living in towns and cities. We are the only missionary agency working here. In comparison to the huge task before us we are an insignificant force. We need a similar force of workers as we have in Surguja. Our need for workers and support for these workers is great.

This small country hospital has been the spearhead of Rewa Mission work in this area. We are thankful to God for the wisdom and vision. He gave to our Officers to take the gospel to this area through this humble medical ministry when it was not possible to take the gospel directly. God has blessed the ministry of this hospital and opened many homes and hearts to receive the gospel of

of Jesus and be saved. It has opened doors to many villages where we could now go freely with message of salvation. The ministry and witness of this hospital has won many friends from the ranks of those people who were opposed to us. This pioneering testimony with the Lord raised has been also the place where we have witnessed many wonder works of our Saviour which has further established us in our faith and calling. It continues to be the chief centres of evangelistic work. But as you would see for yourselves that facilities that we should have to do work professionally efficiently is lacking. We are indeed thankful to you for having provided for one of the most pressing needs of this hospital and that is the shadowless lamp. How hard it had been to do without it is hard to describe. In the rainy season the ~~roof~~ leaks badly. We have to move patients and sometimes survival cases from one place to another. Once even the operation table had to be shifted in the midst of gastro-jugunostomy operation. The well which provides us with drinking water - we call it 'Jacob's well' is used by patients and their relatives freely. The well is sometimes used as a public bathroom. As such asbestos cement roof and water system facilities are pressing and essential. In Amlai, Keswahi, Khanaudi and a few other places people have asked to run road side dispensaries once or twice a week but we have no transportation facilities. Beloved mothers essentially we have invited you here to welcome you, greet you and to have your blessed fellowship but as your spiritual children we also take this opportunity to cry out to you our needs and difficulties. Your motherly hearts would understand these needs of ours better than others. Lastly may we add that a chapel for this growing congregation is a must. The hospital verandah which is at all spacious to accommodate the worshippers is also not a fit place for worship, specially from the point of view of presenting a witness to the people. Three years ago this small congregation took an initiative and collected nearly Rs.1600/- with which we sunk foundation for a chapel 57' x 20' with a vestry 8' x 10' and raised the foundation to plinth level of 3' above the ground level. In last three weeks we have collected cash and pledged to the amount of Rs.3100.

By God's grace we have purchased 63000 bricks which will be our requirement for the above chapel. We still need Rs.7000. We would continue these local efforts, but we also commit this urgent need to your prayers and support. We have also brought this to the notice of the Executive Committee of our mission. We request your prayers for all these and through you appeal to the Church as a whole to contribute liberally to meet these needs of ours. We also thank you for all that you have done for us and also for all that you would be doing for us hereafter.

Replying to the welcome address Presidents gave a brief message by turn. They spoke in Telugu, translated in English by Dr. (Mrs) Rao and then further translated from English to Hindi by Rev. Rao. Almost all of them reminded us of the love of God on the Cross of Calvary and it was this love in them which brought them to the field. It was the same love which has made this fellowship possible. They thanked the congregation the way they were received and welcomed and that they are filled with joy and thanksgiving to the Lord. They said that they were overwhelmed to see the excellent work being done by their children and specially by the children from their own Church. They had only heard of it and read of it in papers but today the Lord has given them opportunity to see it for themselves. Their labour was not in vain at all. We praise and thank God for the same they said. One of the Presidents and my notes tell me it was Mrs. K. Devasahayam who secured us that something was being done to praise the support of Missionary Miss A. S. Gopal's salary. Whether it is full or partial support it will ease a tremendous financial burden on the hospital. They further assured us that they have taken notes on our needs and would pray with us to the Lord to meet each one of them.

Miss K. Hiram also thanked the congregation for the honour given to her with other Presidents. She said she was not a President and was not worthy to receive the same. She was just a visitor and her father has underwritten all her expenses for this visit and said this was indeed a rich experience to her as a young person. On hearing this our congregation acted to make her President Emeritus

(monoris Cause) for the tour.

After hearing these Church Mothers special members were presented by the yuvak,yuvati and Streela Samaj of our congregation. A Telugu number was given by the staff of the hospital and the Presidents. After Lord's prayer and benediction sweets and mixture was served to the gathering followed by the hot tea. With prayer the function came to an end.

Saturday the 15th Presidents joined the staff at their family sevotion at the family alter of the Raos. Once again we were reminded from the Word of God about the love 1 Cor. 13. We were much encouraged by the fact ' Love never faileth'. Indeed it was this unfailing love of God toward man that brought Jesus to earth to be a propitiation for our sins. Miss A. S. Gopal then led us in prayer and with Lord's prayer and benediction we rose for breakfast. This is how we begin our day daily.

After the breakfast Presidents then joined us in our hospital devotional service at 8.30 A.M. conducted by the hospital chaplain Rev. Rao. We all together read 1 Cor.13. Rev. Rao gave a gospel message and then prayed to God that non-Christians gathered there would accept the Lord as their Saviour; patients in the hospital may be granted healing in body and spirit and that His humble servants may be given grace enough for the day to glorify Him. With Lord's prayer and benediction the devation service concluded.

The Presidents were then shown round the hospital by the doctor and the hospital staff. They were told how and from whence all that we have in the hospital were secured. Bed patients were introduced and were acquainted with their sufferings. We paused in our operation theatre and the shadowless lamp was switched on . President Mrs.K. Devasahayam was called upon to prayer and thank God for the same. They were also shown the visible marks of leakages in the roof of the hospital. They were really moved by the pa thetic conditions under which we were carrying on the work. They were then ushered to the ch apel plinth and they were told a brief history of the same. There also they were moved visibly and one of them  
was calle

was calle upon to pray to the Lord to provide to complete the same. There are many temples and mosques of false gods and the god who is unknowable at all in this town and area but not one for the true and only living God the Most High God or Abraham.

After this inspection President visited Shahdol bazaar for shopping.

The Mahila Samaj of Shahdol congregation had arranged an outdoor picnic for the Presidents. Under a Mahuwa tree on the 13 acfe site of the mission about 13 women of the Samaj gathered with the Presidents. Each of them cooked an M.P. specially in light refreshment and brought with them. This small function began at 3.30 P.M. Pastor Rao who is also the leader of the Mahila Samaj presided. We sang a bhajan and then I read fom Psalm 19 and gave a brief history of this valuable pieceo fmission property. They were also told that this was the future site for the proposed hospital to be built by LWF/CDS assistance. One of the Presidents was asked to pray for the same. Fifteen carriers were then opened and then we feasted on several specialities before us after thanks-giving to God. We were reakly satisfied for in the evening everybody was asking for carminitive mixture. These Mothers from AELC told our leadies of their acitivities and appreciated this outdoor programme very much. They also said that they would also introduce such outdoor meetings with picnic in their Samaj. With prayer Lord's prayer and benediction this programme concluded.

From the beginning of mission work in this place, we have felt the necessity of fasting and prayer to seek God's guidance and grace to face many problems which we encounter everyday. Thus Saturday everning was set aside for the purpose. Once again it wa s a more blessed occasion was when on our invitation Presidents joined us in this period of intercession after a very heavy day. In addition to this every day at 4 P.M. We have a brief period of intercession. We gathered round our family altar at 9 P.M. It was my privilege to remind ourselves that our prayer should be for those items which would go to perform the Lord's will here upon tge .

upon the earth. With us they interceded for many things needed to accomplish Lord's will. This session ended at 11.30 P.M. The Presidents commended this practice every much and became more eager to know about the humble beginnings of this work. Since it was too late then doctor advised that we would have a missionary breakfast on Sunday morning and then in brief she would relate the humble beginnings of this ministry.

Sunday the 16th gathered with us for missionary breakfast. We sang ' Holy Holy Holy Lord God Almighty'. Doctor offered prayer and then as we were eating our breakfast poached eggs and bread and coffee doctor told the Presidents of the humble starting of this ministry in Telugu. There were questions and supplementaries asked to gather more information about this work. Again they were touched very much and praised God with us for the wonderful way in which He led His children through the valley of the shadow of death to behold the glories of saving souls today.

At 8.30 A.M. Presidents joined the congregayion for Sunday worship service and at the Lord's table. Here again we experinced Lord's special blessings to us when we could celebrate the Lord's Day and Lord's Supper with our spiritual mothers.

After the worship service Presidents posed for a photograph with the staff.

They were then driven in cycle rickshaws to the Palace of the Royal Family of Shahdol. They were received there by the Rani who showed them round their small palace and its gardens. The distinguished ladies ate lunch with us. On this occasion Presidents were presented with a small gift from the congregation as remembrance of their visit to Shahdol Field.

We all gathered round our family altar when Dr. Rao prayed for them committing them in the Lord's hands as they journeyed forward to complete their remaining tour and then back home. Miss A. S. Gopal accompanied them up to Kotham.

At the station they were seen off by the staff and representatives men-fol of Mahila, yuvak yuwti Sunday School and congregation men folks. It was another moving scene of parting. We invite them

invite them to visit us again when it is convenient for them.

I thank the members of our congregayion and the Rewa Mission staff who helped me to make this visit of the Presidents so soccessful. My special thanks to my beloved wife Dr.(Mrs) R.Rao who did much to erect the pandal, cooking food herself to provide the best possible entertainment round the tables. Above all we are thankful to the Almighty God for His grace sufficient for us all<sup>1/2</sup> to glorify His name even through this visit of His daughters. May His name be praised for ever.



Dear Pramukh Adhyaksh,

Glad to welcome you back to India after the momentous meeting you attended in Europe and the renewed contacts with your Mission Board. A strenuous time awaits you in connection with the meeting of the All Asia Lutheran Conference. May this third conference prove to be a significant event for bringing the Churches in Asia into the full stream of world Lutheranism.

I have received from the Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh word that the appeal signed by Dr. G. Devasahayam on behalf of the Rewa Mission and the Bishop on behalf of the FELC to observe October 4 as Rewa Mission Day has been duly forwarded through the Anchals to all the pastors and that October 4 will be observed as Rewa Mission Day. I am sure the offertory on that Rewa Mission Day will be earmarked for the budget needs of the Rewa Mission.

You may remember that in addition to Rs. 1000/- contributed every year from the central funds you kindly accepted on behalf of the Gossner Church responsibility to raise this year's contribution by an additional sum and thereby we have budgeted for a contribution of Rs. 2000/- from the Gossner Church for the general work of the Rewa Mission. The Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh informed me that the K.S.S. was not aware of this understanding but if in addition to the sum of Rs. 1000 contributed from the central funds as hitherto the offertory taken on the Rewa Mission Day is earmarked for the budget needs of the Rewa Mission, I am sure you will be able to send to us even more than the promised amount.

Another matter of very real concern for us is that the six page report for the year 1963-64 re-printed from the Gospel Witness may be kindly translated into Hindi and reprints be provided for use in other Churches like Madhya Pradesh, Surguja and Rewa Fields and partly also in the Bihar section of the Northern Evangelical Lutheran Church. I wonder how many copies of Garbandhu is in circulation in the Gossner Church. We shall consider for the future reprints being taken also for wider distribution within the congregations of the GELC. But at this time we would need reprints in Hindi to be sent to Hindi speaking congregations outside the Gossner field.

I have in a recent letter suggested to the Acting Pramukh Adhyaksh that in case the two-page shorter report in typed script already sent for translation and publication has not been ready to go to the members, at least the one page reprint from the National Missionary Intelligencer and also the topics for praise and prayer could be pushed into the October issue of Garbandhu and given priority in view of October 4 being the Rewa Mission Day.

As you would be too very busy with many other duties, may I request you kindly to request either the Secretary to the President or the Head Accountant of the K.S.S. Office kindly to attend to this matter and be in touch with me until this brief material of which I enclose a copy could be pushed into the October issue and also reprints supplied to the Churches outside the Gossner Field.

Our Bishop's letter/Uppsala 24th August brought us the good news of the favourable action taken by the CWM in respect of the urgent need for renovating a part of the building of our hospital compound. I shall write to you more fully about our problems after the All Asia Conference is over.

Thank you for your kind letter of July 21 acknowledging the receipt of my letter sent to you earlier in July.

The Press Bill: I am sorry that this is still outstanding. I should have probably pursued the matter in reply to yours dated 12th February. May I request you kindly to make the payment by 5% reduction of the original bill and secure from the press a receipt for the said amount and enclose that receipt along with the balance of the special collections through envelopes etc. that is still with you.

In your letter of February 12, you have given details anchalwar for a sum of Rs. 2858.21 and you had hoped that you would remit the entire amount and adjust the press bill towards the collections that were still due. I do not know whether that entire amount has already been sent to our Treasurer.

In your last letter dated July 21 you say that you have still to the credit of the Rewa Mission special account Rs. 603/30. Is this to be added to the sum mentioned in your February letter? We shall be thankful for details anchalwar being given for this balance still with you. If you can send me a revised statement as to the total amount collected in response to this special effort giving, if possible, the details anchalwar, we shall be grateful.

In addition to this special envelope collection for which 20000 envelopes and brief statements which went with these envelopes as enclosure were printed, the K.S.S. has authorised the Sunday offertory on the first Sunday in October being earmarked as an offering for Rewa Mission work and remit it towards the annual budget amount. Dr. Bage had assured us that in addition to Rs. 1000 that is granted from the L.W.F. money this year the annual offertory will be earmarked for the recurring budget. For 1964 the budget amount has been increased from Rs. 1000 to Rs. 2000. We have therefore to make earnest efforts to increase this annual offertory so that ultimately we need not take any amount from the L.W.F. subsidy. The Rewa Mission is to be supported entirely on the freewill offerings of our own people. May I, therefore, request you to let me know what amount was raised as offertory for the recurring expenditure of the Mission apart from the special effort that was made in 1963 to raise Rs. 25000 for the capital needs at Shahdol.



Dear Mr. Horo,

With reference to your letter No. 127/64 dated 12th February, I must confess that I was remiss in answering your letter. The reason was that I was away from about the 15th of February to March 30 10th on a deputation tour in Madurai and Coimbatore Districts and when I returned there was so much work to be attended to and I had to get things ready for the meeting of the Council of the Rewa Mission on 24th April. Subsequently I had to go to Coimbatore during the summer and on May 20th I underwent an operation for the cataract on the right eye and returned to Tambaram only on June 20th. I have been asked to go slow as I could give only an hour a day for reading and I have now slowly increased the hours of reading. I have to go for a second operation in September on the other eye which is now ripe for operation. But I am happy that I could be back at Tambaram to attend to Rewa Mission affairs especially in preparation for the F.E.L.C. meeting on July 17th and 18th and the observance of the Rewa Mission Day on the first Sunday in October.

You had asked me about the Provident Fund rules. Only recently as I was arranging the papers which had been not attended to, I found the above letter received from you in February and I feel ashamed that the rules had not been sent to you. They have been published as an appendix in the printed minutes of the Rewa Mission Council and I shall search for a spare copy and send it to you. It was my mistake that I did not ask the Secretary or the Treasurer to send it to you.

I must thank you for giving the details of the collections up to 12th February through the 1963 envelope efforts. You stated that Rs. 2853.21 had been received and you were also so good as to say that the press bill would be settled with the subsequent collections. I am sure that by this time all the envelope collection amounts would have come into the treasury and I shall be happy to receive from you a statement of subsequent collections out of which the press bills must have been settled. We printed, I believe, 20,000 envelopes so that every Gossner home could be reached. But probably this envelope matter can work well only in towns but I believe your church offertory every Sunday has been the mainstay of congregational support. The K. S. S. has designated the first Sunday in October 1963 as the Rewa Mission Day and all that collection must have been earmarked and sent to the treasury. I do not know whether that collection has been received separately. If the collection from every congregation has not been remitted, I shall be thankful for your advice to the Officers as to how best you can ensure the earmarked contributions reaching the central treasury. I am quite familiar with what is happening in the T.E.L.C. For example the New Year Day collection is earmarked as ~~Special~~ Rewa Mission ~~new~~ collection and in every congregation not only in the pastorate headquarters but also in every small village chapel the collection taken on that day is entered in the monthly account sheet and remitted by the Pastorate Treasurer to the central treasury and you know exactly how much has come into the treasury as New Year Day collection earmarked for Rewa Mission work. The Gossner Church is operating differently but now that the Anchals have become even more responsible than the K. S. S., I trust that some general method should be agreed on at the K. S. S. and every Anchal may do ~~us~~ us the great help of seeing that the contribution in money and in kind brought in as offertory on the Rewa Mission Sunday is given entirely for the support of the Rewa Mission and not diverted by any headquarters congregation or the smaller congregation of any ~~other~~ pastorate for any other purpose. On this matter I would earnestly request the Treasurer of the Church to take up the question in the first place with you and the Pramukh Adhyaksh and later bring it up to the K. S. S. and the Anchals for needed action. As you have been a longstanding devoted worker in the treasury, I shall be grateful for your advice and cooperation in this matter.



Sub: Cultivation of 13 acre site.

Dear Sirs,

After returning from leave, I visited the office of the Tahsildar Sohagpur Tahsil to pay kist for these two pieces of property owned by Rewa Mission at Shahdol. It was there the Tahsildar hinted that the State Government is looking for acquiring a suitable property as the Trunk Road Rewa-Amarkastak for development purposes. Our site easily ~~xxx~~ catches the attention of these officers concerned, as it is situated ~~xxx~~ favourably to their need and also lying without any use. The Tahsildar suggested that we should do something about it.

Immediately on receipt of this information, I engaged two men to start working on the site. Many bushes and trees have grown on it and so our immediate task is to get rid of them. Two acres were cleared and were made fit for cultivation. Meanwhile, our Medical-Officer-in-charge of the hospital approached Sri Badrinarayan Singh, ex-M.P. to lease his tractor for a few hours which he very kindly did and the two acre land was ploughed and was sowed with pulses (Mung and Urad). By God's grace they have come up very nicely.

Presently we are engaged in fencing this two acre piece with weed obtained from cutting down trees and wire which was given in kind by Burhar Colleery Manager a few years back. The property needs to be fenced along the road at once so as to give impression that something is being done on the land and that it is not lying waste.

It is proposed that we bring the entire property under cultivation. A grant of Rs. 3000.00 is requested for the following. This grant can be realised from the income of the property in the years to come.

J.D.A's Note.

Our Vice-President, the Rev. E. Raman recently visited Shahdol and has located a spot where two currents converge. A well to be sunk there will have a copious supply of water. We have provided Rs. 3,000 as one of the items listed under capital needs at Shahdol. When we know the outcome of our effort to raise by special collection Rs. 25,000 for Shahdol needs, we shall be able to ~~vote~~ this amount from available Rewa Mission funds. I have suggested to Rev. C.B.Rao that in consultation with the members of the Special Committee to administer the sum of Rs. 2,000 invested as THE HANNAH ASIRVADAM MEMORIAL FUND is Fixed Deposit at 5% a loan of Rs. 800 may be raised immediately for which the bank would charge 6% interest. As this is an invested fund the 5% interest must accrue to the fund and so I have suggested that provided 6% interest can be paid until the Rewa Mission funds are available to repay the loan to the Bank a maximum loan on the Fixed Deposit available viz. Rs. 1,800 be taken from the bank and the Rewa Mission Treasurer becomes responsible for payment of interest every quarter and the Rewa Mission could be reimbursed from income from the proceeds of vegetable garden that the land is to be turned into. The Secretary of the Rewa Mission has already communicated this suggestion to Rev. C.B.Rao. He has been informed that only Rs. 1,800 will be available as a loan from the bank and that we shall not be able to pay the balance of Rs. 1200 until sometime in 1964 when funds may be available. If he could make profitable use of Rs. 1,800 for the time being. The Executive may direct the needed action to raise a loan of Rs. 1,800 for this purpose.

This is an arrangement and has should be worked out by all concerned. It is a representative of the Rewa Mission & can work out a proper procedure for monthly collections in each branch, but till then the small amount of Rs. 1000/- as contribution of a Church (over 200,000 members) needs to be adjusted as hitherto. Speedy action is requested.

The Rev. Chandra Basu Rao as Business Manager of the hospital has sent his report for the months of September and October 1960.

Dr. Ramabai before she left Shahdol for Nagpur on maternity leave had already collected Rs. 700/- as hospital income from August 1-15, and even though it fell short of the usual limit of about Rs. 1200/- it still left a cash balance. But the hospital income was only Rs. 592/- in September and Rs. 381/- in October so that a heavy deficit has now accumulated.

The doctor is expecting to return by the end of this month and take over from the 1st of December. Though the confinement ~~is~~ was normal, things did not go quite smoothly with her and we are thankful that she is now well and is looking forward to return to Shahdol. The income in November also will be very much below the average and we are anxious to close the year without a deficit. We shall, therefore, be happy if this matter is brought to the attention and sympathetic consideration of N.M.S. friends and groups so that special efforts may be made immediately to help us out.
