Four things, please ---

Dear Mr. Cannaday,

I appreciate very much your letter and the welcome you give me back to Calcutta. I am looking forward to seeing you and hope that the opportunity will not be long deferred.

I can only attend meetings of Provincial Christian Councils when invited to do so but I take the opportunity afforded by the meeting of the Bihar & Orissa Council at Jamshedpur to write a rather hasty letter to Mr. Browne on subjects which are giving the London and local Committees considerable concern at this time.

I enclose a copy of my letter to Mr. Browne and am sure that I shall have your help in bringing it to the notice of the Council.

As regards colportage in the Lutheran Mission in Chota Magpur I am surprised that there has been some doubt on the score of permanency as our intention in securing the colporteur or colporteurs was to have the advantages of the services they can render in every month of every year and if their work proved good throughout all the years of their working life. From what I learned in London I can say that the London Committee are very anxious to appoint men of education and standing and willing to be set apart for Scripture selling as others are for evangelistic and educational work. But they must be men of the right stamp and able by their knowledge of the Bible and their exhibition of Christian character to commend the Scriptures that they carry. I do most sincerely hope that the Church Council of the Lutheran Church will find such men and while at first their appointment must be temporary in order to test them and the possibilities of the situation I can promise you that when they have proved their mettle they can come, if they wish, on the staff of the Bible Society and their future be governed by its regulations. More of this later.

Subject: - Observance of Armistice day.

I am directed to say that the Government of India have intimated that his Wajesty the King amperer has expressed the wish, that in commemoration of the armistice, complete silence should be observed for two minutes commencing at 11 a.m. on the 11th November 1927. In order that the ceremony may be simultaneous in all previnces, the Government of India have directed that 11 a.m. railway time should be adopted. Christian chruches throughout the province should be asked to hold their services at such hours as will enable the two minutes silence at 11 A.M. to take place during the services. This should not however --preclude the arrangement of a special service in addition for the Sunday preceding or succeeding the 11 November 1927, if it is felt that this is in consenence with local feeling or conditions. Wherever the suggestion is likely to be favourably received, leading personages of other communities may be invited to participate in accordance with their various rites. Care should be taken, however, that the intimations is mued are in ... appropriate form and in terms such as will avoid possibilities of offence or misapprehension. I am to add that His Majesty the -King Emperor has expressed the hope that for any ceremony arranged on the anniversary of the armistice day, in order to mark the . eccasion, war medals and decorations may be worn with divilian dresses by all ex-officers and ex-service men and by members of nursing service and other women to whem they have been awarded, while holders of war medals and decorations awarded to deceased's relatives have full permission to wear them on the right breast.
