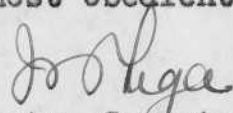

Sir,

I have the honour to ask your kind favour of recommending a monthly grant towards the maintenance of the medical work done in the hospital of the G-E-L Church at Takarna.

I am a nursing sister of 25 years experience, trained in the deaconess Home at Stettin, Germany. I took special training in midwifery and tropical diseases (Malaria research work) in the Institute for tropical diseases attached to the University at Tuebingen, Germany. My service in the mission extends from 1910-15 and again from 1930. In the meantime I worked as Red Cross sister on the Roumanian front and after this for 30 years as superintending sister in the above mentioned Tropical Institute at Tuebingen.

Under me is working an Indian trained compounder of long years service.

The work done covers a large area as the nearest dispensaries or hospitals are far away at Kolibira, Palkot and Kandara.

It serves all kind of people without regard of creed or caste.

We deal with all kind of diseases. Many cases of serious accidents connected with jungle life are brought to us. Again and again our help is called up in instrumental delivery cases.

The daily average of number of out-patients is 15-20.

To accommodate indoor patients as such mauled by bears, injured by accidents or other serious internal diseases we have opened this year with very poor means a hospital containing a treatment room, 2 bedrooms and a kitchen.

All this is done with the very meagre help of the German Mission Board. But now in this time of financial stringency the work is in danger to be closed down if help will not come forward. The hospital is not yet ready, badly needing a verandah on the southern side, as the north verandah is not suitable owing to the neighbourhood of a big M-E Boys School.

Knowing that the District Board of Ranchi has generously granted help to various missionary institutions of the same type we would feel greatly obliged if through your help the Board

would sanction us grant to continue or even extend our work done in this woody area.
