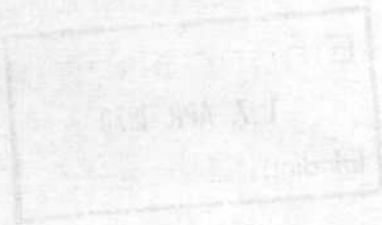
Re.: Proposed Constitution of the Church of Christ in South India

Dear Rev. Strong,

I am writing to you in my capacity of Secretary for Asia of the Church of Sweden Mission. We have recently received the Proposed Constitution for the Church of Christ in South India and this document has our full attention. Our board is indirectly involved in this union negotiations through the Tamil Evangelical Lutheran Church. Needless to say that church has to make the decision of its own whether or not to join this Church of Christ.

But all the supporting missions have certainly many reasons to meet and discuss questions that may facilitate a union and the CSM Board would like to see that such discussions take place at a very early stage. Among the problems arising out of this proposal are at least the following:

- 2 1. This Church of Christ will be non-confessional or non-denominational. What will be the relation of that church to the confessional churches and to W.C.C.?
2. What is the present relation between the Methodist Anglican Congregational and Presbyterian mission boards and the C.S.I. and its dioceses?
3. The relation between the Lutheran churches and the LWF?
4. How is at present the financial support from the mission boards to the different dioceses of the C.S.I. canalized?
5. How ought this support be organized as regards a proposed Church of Christ in South India?
6. What will be the policy of the mission boards as regards missionary personnel to a church of that kind?
7. What will be the relation between the mission boards and the different institutions of the churches i.e. hospitals, schools, theological institutions, etc.

Many other questions may arise and if the boards can arrive at a common strategy and present it to the churches this will certainly be of great help in the union negotiations of the churches involved in India.

Yesterday Dr C.J. Hellberg was on a short visit here and I was informed that you are invited to the C.W.M.-meeting in St. Louis this summer. The Indian Secretaries of the Lutheran churches will meet on July 2, for an Indian Consultation and I would like to propose that as many secretaries of the C.S.I. supporting boards be invited. This is of course a matter to which the DWME and LWF/DWM ought to take the initiative and I would like to stress that the CSM-Board is very much interested in discussions of this kind.

Further I may inform you that I had the opportunity of discussing this subject preliminary with the Leipzig Evangelical Lutheran Mission in Leipzig (DDR) and found that they had received this proposal very positively though they are considered to be rather orthodox in their views. Further discussions will take place in April and the beginning of June in East Berlin.

I also suggest that the secretaries concerned gather material for a meeting and if DWME and DWM have such material available it may be circulated among the secretaries before the meeting at St. Louis. The CSM-Board is rather ignorant as regards 2) and 4) and any information in these matters would be most welcome.

Lewohl!
I have been informed that some of the dioceses of the C.S.I. still are in bilateral relation to their former supporting boards which divides the dioceses in rich ones and poor ones. If the supporting missions could suggest some means of streamlining the financial aid to this proposed new church, much progress may be achieved.

My letter has become rather long but this subject seems to me to be of great importance and I hope we shall get an opportunity to discuss the problems at St. Louis and if you consider it worthwhile a small consultation between some of the secretaries, Dr Ji and yourself could be held in Geneva before June for an informal discussion.

The final reaction to the proposed constitution must come from the churches in India and actions of the supporting boards shall not influence the decision of the Indian churches. But still it may be useful to discuss matters of this kind and the supporting missions could arrive at a working strategy to be put into action if and when the proposed churchunion is a reality.

4. The Unity of the Church in Mission (new item)

The urgent matter of the unity of the church in mission was brought to the attention of CWM. After lengthy discussions the following resolutions were passed:

God's mission is one mission;

This mission is committed to the one body of Christ in the world;

The disunited church in mission contradicts its divine source and character;

We confess that our institutional inflexibility, our hesitation to re-examine our traditions, our pride and wilfulness have been contributing to the scandal of a fragmented church in mission; and that confessional positions often have been used to justify separatism and lack of communication with our Christian partners in the one mission. This is a distortion of the purpose of our Lutheran confession.

WHEREAS There are nevertheless theological and practical differences between us and other Christians which cannot be ignored but must be openly and honestly dealt with in concern for the Gospel and the furtherance of the mission

Be it RESOLVED:

- a. That all LWF-related churches and CWM-related mission agencies be urged conscientiously to re-examine their life and work in the light of the unity of God's mission and the fragmentation of Christian institutions;
- b. That they be urged to plan and work in a manner that will demonstrate to the world and all Christians the reality of the one mission;
- c. That they be urged to seek with Christians of other confessions a common understanding of the Gospel that will lead to solutions to the theological and practical problems that contribute to the fragmentation of the mission in their areas of work, so that they may confess their faith in the one Lord with one voice;
- d. That a progress report on these matters be given at the next meeting of CWM;

and be it further RESOLVED:

That CWM and the LWF as a whole be urged to intensify that work of theological study, practical problems and inter-church consultation that contributes to the unity of Christ's church in God's mission.

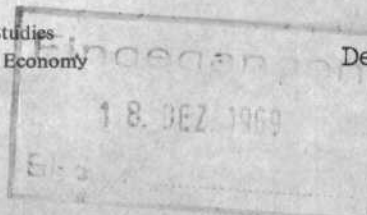

Please refer to letter d/ May 28 ' 1969 in respect of C.D.S. P 40 - Gelel Ras Lutheran Girls' High School, Govindpur by Mr. R.K. Knutson. In his letter he asked me some more informations which are furnished.

I am submitting original copies of endorsement one each for compensation from Govt. and church grant. This may kindly be borne in mind that the District Inspectress of Schools has used the term Adibasi for aboriginal.

In the last paragraph of the above letter I have been asked about electricity Charges, water supply, heat and general maintenance asto how costs on those items will be covered. As regards (a) electricity charges, (b) water supply and (c) heat I have to state that the school has not the facility of those requirements since it is located in a rural area. It is ~~sixx~~ calculated that unless some Govt. developmental scheme is carried out at Govindpur or its immediate vicinity supply of electric energy, heat and water will be a remote thing. It is not easy thing to forcast when they will be available. However, in their absence the school has to be built Under the above circumstances the question of how to cover the costs on those terms be deferred.

Regarding general maintenance of the building the Managing Committee will take a decision asto what amount be charged annually from each pupil. To begin with, I think, if Rs. 2=00 or 14.98 dollars per pupil be charged toward this cost it will fetch an income of Rs. 1,280.00 or 9,587.20 dollars (640 pupils x Rs. 2.00) or (640 pupils x 14.98 dollars). The rate may be raised.

Moreover, the State Govt. will subsidise the school from time to time by granting a lump sum in this regard as is the case with other schools.

Lastly, you are informed that the school has achieved partial recognition with effect from the 1st of January '69.

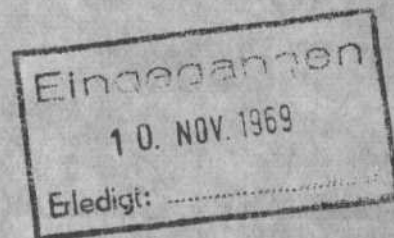

Dear Mr. Lakra,

On the basis of the material that you have sent us we have now prepared a Project Request for a Hostel for Gumla and submitted this request to our Staff Committee at its last meeting. The Committee raised a number of questions which you should please answer as soon as possible:

1. May we please have a map of Gumla town and some photos,
2. We should have a site plan indicating where on the premises of the G.E.L. Church the hostel is to be built,
3. We also need endorsements from the authorities,
4. You mention in the application that a college was recently opened and the name of the project reads: Gumla College Hostel. Is this college owned and run by the G.E.L. Church? If so how was it financed and what is its curriculum? Is it a technical college?
5. Is the hostel to serve exclusively students from the college?

6. You say in your letter that Mr. Hertel has been asked to prepare the cost plan for electrification and sanitary arrangements. May we please have these estimates as soon as possible.
7. Under operating costs you list an amount of Rs. 2,000 per annum. We assume that these are not the total costs but the subsidy that is to be paid by the church. Please send us a complete estimated operating budget showing how much the students have to pay and all other income and expenditures.
8. In the application you also state that no personnel is needed. We have seen on the drawing, however, that a caretakers flat is to be built with kitchen, dining room, two bedrooms, etc.
9. The hostel also includes a kitchen and a dining hall and we understand that there must be some personnel there too.
10. We have one more basic question: you state that the surroundings are inhabited by tribal people who are living from farming on small holdings and have very modest crops and very little income. Would there be no possibility to assist these people - the parents of the children who then go to school or even college and probably want to live in cities afterwards - in some way so that their standard of living could be raised a little? Or is this not within the aims and possibilities of the church? Please excuse this question but we are told again and again that there are just not enough jobs in India and we are quite concerned about what will happen to all the young people now attending schools and colleges once they have finished their education. We would be very grateful to get your opinion about this.
11. How many inhabitants live in Gumla?

The next meeting of our Staff Committee takes place on November 26 and we should, therefore, have your reply by November 22 if at all possible. Many thanks in advance.

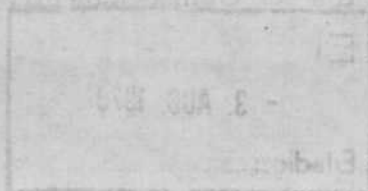

and they are absorbed in services on the reserve quota for the tribal people. So at the moment this is a chance for the tribal people to avail of the opportunity. Educational qualification is counted in all appointments.

Really the parents of the children are very poor. They are all petty cultivators with small holdings and no irrigation facilities. If each family can have a well and tanks and bunds in all villages production will surely increase. This is a question for the church as to how the lot of the poor cultivators will be improved. But in the tribal belt church members are only the poor tribals and a very few of them are qualified and those qualified are mostly engaged in Government service and really their parents need financial help to improve their agriculture by digging wells, tanks and by construction of bunds and fencing their plots. They are short of irrigation facilities and other modern equipments such as, spraying machines, some capital to purchase fertilisers etc. I am sure from your letter that you will help the poor tribal people for their upliftment particularly in agriculture. Please suggest me full particulars how you can help them. In the church there are short of personnel to look into the possibilities of such projects. But as you are very interested in this regard may I request you to let me know how you can help or suggest me in details how I can get help from you.
